Sullivan está hablando de crear un comité para estudiar los asuntos que pudieran considerarse como un "Plan Maestro".

Tal parece que aquí lo hacemos todo al revés. Estamos a punto de volver la Calle Essex en dos vías de nuevo; ¿cómo encaja eso dentro del plan maestro? ¿Decidirán más tarde que fue un error y lo cambiarán de nuevo?

Eso es lo que todos le han estado diciendo y en lugar de planear, él prefirió el camino más fácil siguiéndole el paso a ciertos precursores que vinieron arriesgando su propio capital.

¡Más vale tarde que nunca! Mientras más pronto él comience, más pronto podremos empezar a arreglar el lío que tenemos entre manos.

Finally, a Master Plan!

For many years, Lawrence residents have been complaining of the lack of planning in this city and the absence of the master plan. Now, after five years as Mayor, Michael J. Sullivan is talking about creating a new task force to study issues that could be considered as a "Master Plan."

Seems that we do everything backwards here. We are getting ready to turn Essex St. into a two-way street again; how would that fit into the master plan? Would they decide later that it was a mistake and change it again?

We needed a master plan before the new high school was built.

We needed a study of the traffic flow before deciding where to build that school and we have not seen the surprises that will undoubtedly come up once the school opens – whenever that may be. Things that could have been avoided if we had a master plan.

Mayor Sullivan is now talking about what opportunities are available in the city and what businesses do officials need to attract to Lawrence. That's what everyone has been telling him and instead of planning, he has chosen the easy path following only the trail blazers risking their own investments.

Well, better late than never. The sooner he gets started, the quicker we can start making sense of the mess in our hands.

After many months of intensive renovations, Sovereign Bank reopened its branch located at 555, Broadway and Park Street, in Lawrence.

With the classic ribbon cutting ceremony, bank executives and elected city officials, surrounded by a group of employees, declared the building officially open for business, on Wednesday, February 7, 2007.

The Branch, which, according to Cathie M. Pierce, Vice-President, Area Manager was slated for renovations, was inundated in May 2006 by the raising waters of the Spicket River in one of the worst floods the City of Lawrence ever suffered. "The renovations were planned and budgeted, the waters just speeded-up the work", said Pierce.

Gladys Mencia, who has been the manager of that branch since 1999, when it used to be First Essex Bank, doesn't remember the water ever coming so close to the building. "We all came to work that morning, it was raining and we were taking care of a few customers when the police came with orders to evacuate," said Mencia. "Immediately we began to put everything from the floor on top of desks, cabinets and counters, secured the building and left," she said.

"Thanks to the diligence of our maintenance crew and team members all customers' records were preserved," said Pierce, and added, "No customers' records were ever jeopardized by the flood," said Pierce.

According to Mencia, the Branch was closed for about a month, until June 16th when they installed a trailer, which served the area customers until mid December 2006. "We are a very busy Branch," Mencia said. "We serve Malden Mills employees, residents from the housing complex across the street on Park Street and especially our ATM is very busy because of its location."

"We are here again, to serve our customers even better. More comfortable in our new building, and with the same disposition", ended Mencia.

Mencia also wants to extend an open invitation to all customers and friends of Sovereign Bank, to drop by on Saturday, February 10, between 10 a.m. to 12 noon for some refreshments, face paintings and live radio with the good people of WNNW Power 800 AM for a grand opening celebration of their branch located at 555 Broadway.

Celebran Reapertura de Sovereign Bank

Después de meses de intensas renovaciones, la sucursal del Sovereign Bank, localizada en el 555 de Broadway y la Calle Park, en Lawrence, MA, abrió de nuevo sus puertas.

Con la clásica ceremonia del corte de cinta, el miércoles, 7 de febrero, 2007, ejecutivos del banco y oficiales electos, rodeados de un grupo de empleados, declararon el edificio oficialmente abierto para servir a sus clientes.

La sucursal, la cual según Cathie M. "Inmediatamente comenzamos a poner todo lo que estaba a nivel del piso sobre las cosas más altas, como escritorios, gabinetes y mostradores, cerramos las puertas y salimos", dijo.

"Gracias al trabajo diligente de nuestro equipo de mantenimiento y compañeros de trabajo, los récords de todos nuestros clientes nunca estuvieron en peligro por la inundación", dijo Pierce.

De acuerdo con Mencía, la sucursal estuvo cerrada por espacio de un mes, hasta junio 16, cuando instalaron un trailer, el cual sirvió a los empleados de Malden Mills, a los residentes del complejo habitacional del otro lado de la Calle Park y especialmente, nuestra ATM, que siempre está muy ocupada debido a la localización en que está".

"Estamos aquí de nuevo, para servir a nuestros clientes aún mejor. Más confortables en nuestro nuevo edificio y con la misma disposición de siempre",



CONSEJO DEL IRS EN LA TEMPORADA TRIBUTARIA DE 2007

¿Qué ingresos están sujetos a impuestos? ¿Cuáles no lo están?

Por lo general, casi todos los ingresos que recibe están sujetos a impuestos. Pero hay situaciones en que algunos tipos de ingresos sólo están sujetos a un impuesto parcial o a ningún impuesto. Una lista completa está disponible en la Publicación 525 del IRS, Taxable and Nontaxable Income (Ingresos Tributables y No tributables).

Algunos ejemplos comunes de artículos que no se incluyen en sus ingresos son:

- El Reembolso de Gastos de Adopción para los gastos calificados
- Pagos de la manutención de niños
- Obsequios, legados y herencias
- Beneficios de compensación laboral
- Comidas y Estadías para la conveniencia de su empleador
- Compensación por Daños otorgada por lesiones físicas o enfermedad física
- Beneficencia Social (Welfare)
- Reembolsos de Efectivo de un distribuidor o fabricante
- Intereses Exentos de Impuestos de

bonos municipales y bonos de fondos mutuos. Aunque este interés no es tributable debe ser reportado en la línea 8b de la Forma 1040 o la 1040a.

Ejemplos de artículos que pueden o no ser incluidos en sus ingresos son:

- **Seguro de Vida** - Si usted entrega una póliza de seguro a cambio de dinero efectivo, usted debe incluir entre sus ingresos cualquier ganancia que sobrepase al costo de la póliza de seguro de vida. 
Kicking off the event will be a presentation from students of the Lawrence YMCA’s Music Clubhouse.

The goal for the 2007 campaign is over \$400,000 through the annual appeal and special events, and an additional \$600,000 through public and private grants, including the United Way of Merrimack Valley dollars. Last year, the “Reach Out for Youth” campaign raised more than \$350,000 through individual giving and special events to provide financial assistance to nearly 2,000 children and families in need. These annual fund dollars provide financial assistance to needy and deserving children and families residing in the Greater Lawrence community to participate in YMCA programs. The goal of the “Reach Out For Youth” program is to assure that no one is turned away from the YMCA for inability to pay.

The YMCA’s Reach Out for Youth annual appeal and its special events represent the vehicles through which

charitable dollars are raised each year to help make all of this possible:

- Offer financial assistance for children and families who would not otherwise be able to participate in YMCA programs and services.
- Provide funding to support camping experiences for low income youth within the Merrimack Valley, southern New Hampshire and throughout the northeast region.
- Subsidize outreach programs at all branches that serve specific needs and are not fully supported by fees. Some examples include: Junior and Teen Achievers, Mentoring, Youth & Government, Teen Leaders, Bright Futures, youth sports and family programming.

The Merrimack Valley YMCA is a multi-faceted not-for-profit social service organization providing programs and services to preschoolers through senior citizens in the towns of Lawrence, Andover, North Andover, Methuen and Salem, New Hampshire. The Merrimack Valley YMCA is comprised of three facility branches: the Lawrence Branch on Lawrence Street in Lawrence founded in 1880; the Andover/North Andover Branch on Haverhill Street in Andover built in 1975 and the Methuen Branch opened in 2003. National Latino Scout Council Visits Lawrence

During the past year, the Boy Scouts of America have been recruiting Latino children in Lawrence and their efforts have earned them attention from their national office in Texas.

Bob Mazzuca, Assistant Chief Scout Executive has announced in a letter to City Attorney Charles Boddy that, "We are pleased to share with you that the National Council has engaged the services of Hispanic Communications Network and its President, Carlos Alcazar, to assist us in the development of a comprehensive strategy for marketing and delivering the Scouting program to our nation's rapidly growing Latino community."

This effort is a direct result of last October's Summit on Latino Scouting, a special meeting of national, regional, and council level volunteer and professional Scouters convened by BSA President Rick Cronk. An article on the summit appeared in December's issue of *Pro Speak*. An important component of the Latino Initiative is the visitation to select councils in each region that have experienced success in a specific area in the delivery of the Scouting program to Latino youth and families. The Lawrence council has been selected for visitation by both Carlos Alcazar and a member of the national staff for a brief one to one and a half days of interviews of both staff and volunteers next week, February 12 and 13.

The National Council identified seven charters making remarkable progress in the country and Lawrence is among them. They are: Harlingen, TX; Dallas, TX; Denver, CO; Omaha, NE; Santa Ana, CA; and Houston, TX. A peculiarity in our case is that they all have a largely Mexican community and Lawrence is the only one from Caribbean nations.

The purpose of our local council site visits is to determine, through interviews with the Scout executive, key staff, and volunteers, the main contributing factors to their excellent service to Latino youth and families. The end result is to develop a national template that would enable other local councils to achieve similar results.

LAWRENCE RESIDENTS ENROLL IN NEW MASSACHUSETTS HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAMS

Landmark health reform legislation passed last April made many more adults eligible for health coverage from the state; an estimated 150,000 individuals may be eligible for the new Commonwealth Care Health Insurance Program. However, it is not enough to expand eligibility- people need to know what they can get.

That's why Health Care For All partnered with Esperanza Academy, a new tuition-free all-girls private school in Lawrence, to arrange a day for residents to learn about and apply for Commonwealth Care and other health insurance programs. It is also why Grace Episcopal Church, affiliated with Esperanza Academy, was pleased to lend use of their Parish Hall for the day. As Rachel Winch, the teacher at Esperanza who spearheaded the project explained, "We wanted to help people apply for programs and support them while they do the applications. Some questions can be confusing, and people may not understand what documents they need to send in. That's why it's great to have volunteers help with the forms."

11 volunteers came from several organizations, including Health Care For All, ¿Oíste?, the Latino political organization, Esperanza Academy, Grace Episcopal Church, and Christ Church in Andover. 20 people applied for Massachusetts health insurance programs at Esperanza Academy today, and another 10 came with questions about insurance that volunteers helped to answer.

Although enrollment events do not happen every day, help with applications is available over the phone at all time. Health Care For All's health care Helpline can answer questions and walk people through applications in under 20 minutes. 
