

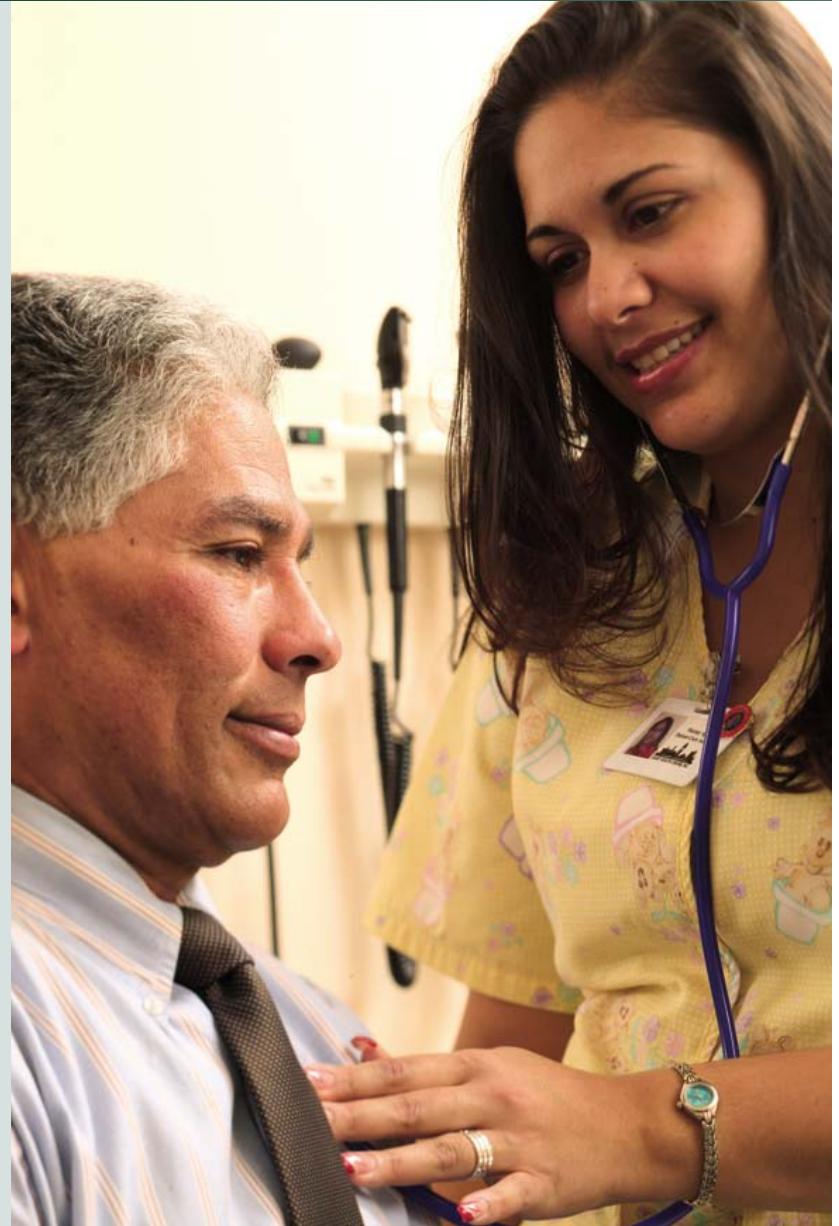



"Cuando yo estaba en la escuela primaria pasé muy malos ratos debido al abuso infantil. La escuela no era una prioridad para mí. Yo fallé desde el 1ro hasta el 5to grado, teniendo que ir todos los años a la escuela de verano.

Las monjas y los maestros me humillaban y me degradaban. Había una monja que me llamaba estúpida. Otra monja me preguntó si yo era adoptada porque yo era muy estúpida para ser una L'Italien.

Mis hermanos eran estudiantes que siempre sacaban A, pero yo me ponchaba. Cuando estaba creciendo, mi apodo era

'Boba'. Todo el mundo me preguntaba, ¿Por qué no puedes ser como tus hermanos? – Porque yo no era 'ellos'. Nadie me dejaba ser como yo era.

Yo recuerdo que cuando estaba en el 5to grado yo pensaba 'si todos esperan que yo falle, ¿por qué tratar de tener éxito?'

En 1990 fui diagnosticada con Mayor Depresión, Borderline Personality Disorder y PTSD. Mientras estaba en el hospital, los médicos siempre me hacían la misma pregunta: ¿Dónde tú te vez dentro de 5

Un grupo de lawrencianos fue a la Casa de Estado para ofrecer su testimonio de por qué piensan que la petición que exige identificación antes de votar debe ser aprobada por la Legislatura. En una conversación telefónica con Dottie Incropora, me explicó que miembros de la American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), la Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN), la mayor organización comunitaria en la nación trabajando en pro de justicia social, y MassVOTE, una organización sin fines lucrativos fundada en 1999 que dice ser una voz para los votantes, estaban allí testificando en oposición a la propuesta.

Marcos Devers habló apoyándolo así como Dottie y el Representante William Lantigua, pero ella quedó particularmente

impresionada con el testimonio del Representante Barry R. Finegold. “¡El fue fantástico! No sólo que él los animó a aprobarlo sino que quisiera que Lawrence sea líder en el estado. El dijo que hay más a favor que en contra,” explicó la Sra. Incropora.

Dottie me dijo que al Representante Lantigua le preocupan los residentes ancianos que no tengan manera de pagar por el costo de una identificación con foto, particularmente aquellos viviendo en asilos de ancianos.

Ahora lo único que queda es esperar y ver qué deciden. El Secretario de Estado William F. Galvin está opuesto a la identificación de votantes mientras que el Gobernador Deval Patrick lo apoya.

Los viernes en CrossOver

El viernes pasado, Richard Aybar y yo estábamos discutiendo el presupuesto de la ciudad con la Concejala del Distrito B Grisel Silva y la ex Concejala del Distrito C Bárbara González cuando el ex Concejal del Distrito B Carlos Matos llamó con unas muy acertadas observaciones.

Carlos tiene razón cuando dice que a lo único que le están prestando atención en el Reporte de DOR es a la sugerencia de que contraten a un administrador para la ciudad pero no están haciendo nada sobre más de 30 otras recomendaciones en ese reporte.

Algunas de estas recomendaciones incluyen el establecimiento de un sistema de evaluaciones anuales a los empleados. Cuando alguien consigue trabajo con la ciudad es para siempre. Ellos nunca tienen que atravesar una evaluación, ni siquiera para justificar un aumento de salario — eso viene automáticamente. Hace mucho tiempo que el Director de

Lantigua y Finegold se unen para lograr fondos locales

Los Representantes Estatales William Lantigua (D-Lawrence) y Barry R. Finegold (D-Andover) anunciaron la aprobación de dos peticiones de fondos locales para el presupuesto estatal del año fiscal del 2009.

El programa de servicios comunitarios de Greater Lawrence Community Action Council recibió \$75,000 en el presupuesto de la Cámara. De La Mano, un programa de prevención de violación doméstica con una línea telefónica de emergencia en español recibió \$20,000. De La Mano recibió la misma cantidad en el presupuesto del año pasado, mientras que GLCAC fue fundado por última vez en el 2005.

“Trabajando juntos pudimos traer dinero muy necesitado a Lawrence en un clima económico muy difícil”, dijo Lantigua. “Soy dichoso de tener a un compañero como Barry de mi lado.”

Finegold dijo cosas por el estilo. “Ambos programas están haciendo grandes cosas por las comunidades”, dijo. “Ellos están ayudando a la gente y es por eso que estamos aquí hoy.”

Ambos Finegold y Lantigua presentaron enmiendas a favor de GLCAC mientras que Lantigua se dispuso a co-auspiciar la enmienda de Finegold para De La Mano. A pesar de que las cantidades aprobadas por la Cámara fueron menos de lo que habían pedido, ambos legisladores dijeron sentirse afortunados de recibir estos fondos.

Las ganancias que se reducen y otras penas económicas han dejado al estado frente a un déficit en el presupuesto que excede \$1 billón.

“En momentos como estos, usted aprovecha y agarra lo que pueda,” dijo Lantigua. “No tenemos de qué quejarnos.”

“Estos programas continuarán operando y nos complace eso,” dijo Finegold.

La Cámara de Representantes ha completado su debate preliminar sobre el presupuesto el cual ahora se mueve al Senado. El plan de gastos final será revelado antes de terminar el corriente año fiscal del 30 de junio.



Elecciones dominicanas

El dominicano Guarionex Simón, se levantó bien temprano en el mañana del viernes, 16 de mayo, 2008, dispuesto a votar en las elecciones presidenciales dominicanas programadas para llevarse a cabo ese día, dentro y fuera del país.

Muchos dominicanos, al igual que Simón, llenos de entusiasmo llenaron los dos colegios habilitados para votar en Lawrence; Casa Dominicana, en el 160 de la Calle Garden y en el antiguo local de Casa Dominicana, 225 de la Calle Essex, segundo piso.

Aunque contentos de poder ejercer el derecho al voto, los votantes se mantuvieron callados en cuanto al candidato de su predilección. Este reportero no encontró a ninguno dispuesto a confesar. El único que confió su secreto fue Guarionex Simón. "Yo voté por Leonel Fernández", dijo Simón minutos después de votar. "El representa la continuidad del progreso en el país y es el único líder con características de estadista".

Al día siguiente, sábado, 17 de mayo 2008, el Listín Diario Digital daba como ganador al Presidente Leonel Fernández, candidato de la alianza que encabeza el Partido de la Liberación Dominicana (PLD). Según el Listín, el Presidente Fernández fue reelegido en la primera vuelta por una mayoría de 53% de los votos.

En segundo lugar quedó Miguel Vargas, candidato del Partido Revolucionario Dominicano (PRD) el cual alcanzó el 41% de los votos. En un lejano tercer lugar quedó Amable Aristy Castro, candidato del Partido Reformista Social Cristiano (PRSC), con 4.54%.

Lantigua, Finegold team to win local funding

State Representatives William Lantigua (D-Lawrence) and Barry R. Finegold (D-Andover) announced House approval of two local funding requests in the fiscal 2009 state budget.

Greater Lawrence Community Action Council's community services program, received \$75,000 in the House budget released Friday. De La Mano, a Spanish-language domestic violence prevention hotline, was awarded \$20,000. De La Mano received the same amount in last year's budget, while Greater Lawrence Community Action Council was last funded in 2005.

"Working together, we were able to bring much-needed money to Lawrence in a difficult economic climate," Lantigua said. "I'm lucky to have a colleague like Barry in my corner."

Finegold voiced similar sentiments. "Both programs are doing great things for the community," he said. "They are helping people and that is what we're here to do."

Both Finegold and Lantigua filed amendments on behalf of Greater Lawrence Community Action Council, while Lantigua agreed to co-sponsor Finegold's amendment for De La Mano. Although the amounts approved by the House were less than requested, both legislators said they felt fortunate to have received funding. Shrinking revenues and other economic woes have left the state facing a budget deficit in excess of \$1 billion.

"At times like these, you take what you can get," Lantigua said. "We have nothing to complain about."

"These programs will continue to operate and we're pleased with that," Finegold said.

The House of Representatives has completed its preliminary debate on the budget, which now moves on to the Senate. The final spending plan will be unveiled before the end of the fiscal year on June 30.

Voter ID – House #4704

A group of Lawrencians went to the State House to offer testimony as to why they believe the Voter ID Petition should be approved by the Legislature. In a telephone conversation with Dottie Incropera, she said that members of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN), the nation's largest community organization working for social justice, and MassVOTE, a non-profit organization founded in 1999 claiming to be a voice for voters, were testifying in opposition to the Voter ID proposal.

Marcos Devers spoke in support as well as Dottie and Representative William Lantigua, but she was particularly impressed with Representative Finegold's statement. "He was fantastic! He not only encouraged them to approve it but he wants Lawrence to be the leader in the Commonwealth. He said that there are more ups to this than downs," explained Mrs. Incropera.

Dottie said that Representative Lantigua is concerned about elderly residents not being able to afford the cost of a photo identification, particularly those living in nursing homes.

We now have to wait and see what they decide. William F. Galvin, Secretary of the Commonwealth is opposed to the Voter ID while Governor Deval Patrick supports it.

Fridays on CrossOver

Last Friday, Richard Aybar and I were discussing the city budget with District B Councilor Grisel Silva and Former District C Councilor Barbara Gonzalez when former District B Councilor Carlos Matos called in

with some very accurate observations.

Carlos is correct when he says that the only item in the DOR Report that is being addressed is the hiring of a City Administrator but nothing is being done about any of the more than 30 other recommendations in that report.

Some of those recommendations included establishing a system of employee annual evaluations. When someone gets a job with the city it is forever. They never have to go through a review, not even to justify getting a raise in salary – those come automatically! A long time ago, Personnel Director Frank Bonet told me that he wants to implement it but has found too many stumbling blocks.

Let's not mention all the suggestions in that report regarding the Tax Collector/Treasurer's Office.



El año pasado tomé el entrenamiento de CPS y durante el mismo, se habló de

un tema muy importante. Ellos decían 'la ausencia de mensajes negativos son más importantes que la presencia de uno positivo. Success

Speech given by Carol L'Italien

When I was in grammar school I had a very difficult time because of the child abuse. School was not a priority for me. I flunked 1st grade through 5th grade having to go to summer school every year.

The nuns and teachers would humiliate me and degrade me. I had a nun who called me stupid. Another nun asked me if I was adopted because I was too stupid to be a L'Italien.

My siblings were straight A's students but I would flunk. Growing up my nickname was "Dummy." Everyone always asked me, "Why can't you be like your brothers?" Because I'm not them. No one would let me be me.

I can remember by the 5th grade thinking, "If everyone expects me to fail why bother trying."

I was diagnosed in 1990 with Major Depression, Borderline Personality Disorder and PTSD. While I was in the hospital, the doctors would always ask me the same questions: "Where do you see your life in 5 years." As soon as I said, "I want to go back to school or work," the doctors would say, "You'll never go back to work. You'll never go back to school."

I finally got tired of hearing that answer so I would say, "Oh yea! Watch me."

Last year I took the CPS training and in that training they had talked about an important point. They said, "the absence of negative messages are more important than the presence of positive one. If you are constantly being put down you won't want to try. Or when you try and fail you hear, 'See I told you, you're so stupid you can't do anything.' Human beings only learn from their mistakes but if the atmosphere is so negative, they won't try."

If you are trying to teach a child to ride a bike and he falls off the first time. You are not going to tell him that's it. You can never ride a bike because you fell off one? No, you support him, you encourage him.

The Point After Club was the first place I had positive role models. The staff and members encouraged me to try again. I had to leave college about 4 or 5 times because of my illness but I kept going back. I saw members working and being successful in their jobs. And that gave me the courage to try again.

Thanks to the Point After Club I have such a great positive support system. There are no negative messages – whether it is through words or action. You see people going back to work or school and succeeding. The club has been a safety net allowing me to try again.

In 8 years I've gone from homeless to homeowner. I have not been on any psych meds for about 2 years and I am doing great. Last year I graduated from Hesser College with a 3.92 GPA. I am now going to Granite State College where I am doing a double major.

I built the Point After Club's web site. I help teach computers to the club members. I am now an ICCD faculty member. I am part of a group along with Mary Ann Moran to start a clubhouse in NH and I am also writing a book on how I survived child abuse.




The City of Lawrence's Community Development Department joined more 6,000 international attendees at this year's Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) National Brownfields Conference in Detroit, Michigan from May 5 - 7th.

Held at Detroit's premiere downtown Cobo Center, the conference featured 150 educational sessions, 200 exhibitors, and numerous mobile tours in and around the city. Completed mobile tour projects included a redeveloped waterfront used for community activities and business and housing development, "green roofs" which help insulate buildings and prevent energy loss, and, transformation of inner city properties to cultural destinations.

EPA Brownfields funds help communities assess contamination at abandoned and vacant sites and can also provide clean-up or revolving loan funds for redevelopment. Redeveloped Brownfields sites add quality of life for neighborhood residents and businesses, as well as bringing properties back to the tax roles.

Lawrence's Community Development Department was a 2008 recipient of \$150k in EPA Brownfields grant funding to convert the former Covanta site in the Arlington district into a neighborhood park. In 2007, the Community Development Department was awarded all three of its Brownfields grant applications for hazardous substance and petroleum assessment, as well as a clean up grant for the former Oxford Paper Site, totaling \$600k.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE VOTER IDENTIFICATION

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 59 of Chapter 51, sections 35A, 76, 76B, 85, and 85A of Chapter 54 and sections 29, 30 and 31 of Chapter 56 of The General Laws or any other general or special law or rule to the contrary, each voter desiring to vote at a polling place shall give his name and his residence and shall produce a valid photographic identification of the type approved by The Lawrence Board of Registrars. Proper identification shall be a valid Massachusetts Driver's License, a valid

photographic identification card issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or a valid United States Passport. If such name is found on the voting list the election officer shall check and repeat the name and shall admit the voter to the space enclosed by the guard rail and, in case official ballots, other than those marked "Challenged Ballots" as provided by said section 35A of Chapter 54 of the General Laws, are used, such voter shall be given one ballot.

SECTION 2. Any person desiring to vote who fails to present suitable photographic identification when so requested by an election officer, shall be permitted to vote, provided, however, that such person's right to vote may be challenged under section 85 of Chapter 54 of The General Laws.

SECTION 3. Upon passage this act shall become effective as a mandatory requirement for all voters in the year 2008 and thereafter.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.




