Los estudiantes de Community Day Charter Public School participaron en un Walk-a-thon a beneficio de las víctimas del tsunami y el terremoto en Japón

El viernes, 29 de abril, 275 estudiantes de la Escuela Pública Community Day Charter participó en una caminata en Storrow Park en Lawrence para beneficio de las víctimas de los recientes terremotos y tsunamis en Japón. Dirigido por Start Something, el club de la escuela de la comunidad de aprendizaje de servicio, los estudiantes en los grados 1-8 caminaron entre $\frac{1}{2}$ y 3 millas con el objetivo de recaudar \$2,500 para ayudar a los niños afectados por los desastres. Todos los fondos recaudados por este evento fueron enviados a UNICEF.

"Los estudiantes superaron su meta de recaudación de fondos - recaudaron \$4,450 y todos los fondos recaudados por este evento de la escuela, el primer walk-a-thon, fueron enviados a UNICEF", dijo Laura Barbieri, asistente ejecutiva y coordinadora de marketing.

El proyecto fue iniciado por los estudiantes en los grados 4-8, que querían crear una oportunidad para ayudar a los afectados por los desastres recientes. Como parte del proyecto, los estudiantes de la escuela participaron en las clases de aprendizaje de servicio a la comunidad. Los estudiantes en grados 6-8 del club Start Something dieron clases con grupos de estudiantes en los grados 1-8.

Community Day Charter Public School Students Participated in a Walk-a-thon to Benefit Earthquake and Tsunami Victims in Japan

On Friday, April 29th, 275 students from Community Day Charter Public School participated in a school walk-a-thon at Storrow Park in Lawrence to benefit victims of the recent earthquakes and tsunami in Japan. Led by Start Something, the school's community service learning club, students in grades 1-8 walked between $\frac{1}{2}$ and 3 miles with the goal of raising \$2,500 to help children affected by the disasters.

"The students surpassed their fundraising goal--they raised \$4,450 and all funds raised by this event, the school's first walk-a-thon, were sent to UNICEF," said Lauren Barbieri, executive assistant & marketing coordinator.

Vergonzosa decisión del Comité Escolar

El Comité Escolar de Lawrence votó a favor de realizar una búsqueda de un superintendente escolar para reemplazar a Mary Lou Bergeron el 12 de mayo de 2011. El Alcalde William Lantigua, James Vittorioso, Mark Gray y Pavel Payano votaron a favor de la búsqueda.

¿Cómo pueden justificar su voto después de darle una B en la evaluación, (a pesar de Mark Gray darle un "1" en todo) después de dos años haciendo el trabajo? ¡Ellos están contradiciéndose!

Si el plan es contratar a alguien para el próximo año escolar, pudiéramos terminar con una situación similar a los últimos 12 años.

La forma correcta de hacer estas búsquedas es comenzar durante los meses de verano a fin de tener todo el año para anunciar la posición, recibir hojas de vida, sacar a los que no califican y seleccionar unos cuantos solicitantes. A partir de ese punto, algunos finalistas deben ser seleccionados y traídos aquí a la entrevista. El candidato escogido entonces tendría tiempo suficiente para dar aviso en su trabajo actual y mudarse a este área. El costo de la publicidad y viajes será exorbitante para nuestra ciudad.

El temor es que esto se convertirá en un nombramiento político y eso será otro día triste para Lawrence. Si la Dra. Bergeron se niega a continuar en ese papel después del 30 de junio, tendrán que designar a otra persona a toda carrera.

Los que votaron a favor de hacer una búsqueda aún tienen la oportunidad de reconsiderar su voto en la próxima reunión del Comité Escolar. Los votantes en la mayoría tienen el derecho de abrir el debate de nuevo y volver a votar para nombrar a la Dra. Bergeron una vez por todas como Superintendente Escolar.

Lawrence necesita estabilidad y las Escuelas Públicas de Lawrence están bastante estables ahora. La ciudad no necesita más prensa negativa.

Shameful decision by School Committee

The Lawrence School Committee voted to conduct a search for a new school superintendent to replace Mary Lou Bergeron on May 12, 2011. Mayor William Lantigua, James Vittorioso, Mark Gray and Pavel Payano voted in favor of the search.

How can they justify their vote after giving her a B in the evaluation (in spite of Mark Gray giving her a "1" on everything) after two years performing the work? They are contradicting themselves!

If the plan now is to hire someone for the next school year, we may end up with a similar situation as the past 12 years.

The correct way of doing these searches is to start during the summer months in order to have the entire year to advertise the position, receive resumes, weed them out and select a few applicants. From that point, some finalists should be selected and brought here to interview. The selected candidate would then have sufficient time to give notice at his current job and move to this area. The cost of advertising and travel alone will be exorbitant for our city.


The fear is that this will turn into a political appointment and that will be another sad day for Lawrence. If Dr. Bergeron refuses to continue on that role after June 30th, they will have to appoint someone else in a rush.

Those who voted in favor of doing a search still have the chance to reconsider their vote at the next School Committee meeting. Those voting in the majority have the right to bring it up again for discussion and a vote to appoint Dr. Bergeron once and for all as School Superintendent.

Lawrence needs stability and the Lawrence Public Schools is pretty stable now. The city doesn't need any more negative press.

Sorpresa: Estoy de acuerdo con Morris

Nunca pensé que tendría que elogiar a Gregory Morris por sus acciones en la reunión del Comité Escolar de 12 de mayo, pero me impresionó la forma en que pidió a otros miembros que fueran sensatos antes de tomar un voto en la selección de un nuevo superintendente.

El Sr. Morris insistió en voz alta que se debe tratar de llegar a un plan para el procedimiento de selección y el calendario, pero los demás hablaron por encima de él y rápidamente pasaron a una votación con el Alcalde William Lantigua, James Vittorioso, Mark Gray y Pavel Payano votando a favor de la búsqueda.

Jim Vittorioso fue repugnante en su discurso y la forma en que se dirigió a los profesores en la audiencia. Continuó refiriéndose a las veces que solicitó un puesto que la Superintendente Mary Lou Bergeron le impidió conseguir. ¡Fue una venganza puramente personal y no tuvo vergüenza de decirlo él mismo!

Mientras tanto, el sindicato de maestros está pidiendo un voto de confianza en la Dra. Bergeron entre los miembros. El voto del sindicato de censura fue fundamental en la eliminación del predecesor de Bergeron,

Wilfredo Laboy.

Además, algunos padres y miembros del personal del departamento escolar están organizando una demostración pacífica por la educación, el jueves, 26 de mayo a las 5:30 en frente de las Escuelas Públicas de Lawrence, Oficina Central en el 255 Essex Street.

Programa ARC

También en esa reunión del Comité Escolar, el restablecimiento del programa Another Route to College (ARC) fue aprobado. Este ha sido un programa muy exitoso debido a que en los ocho años que ARC ha existido, la tasa de éxito ha sido del 100% en la graduación de los estudiantes con un diploma de escuela secundaria. El programa está diseñado para 30 estudiantes a tiempo completo.

En términos de números de graduación más de 240 estudiantes regulares han recibido sus diplomas de Lawrence High School a través de este programa y más de 50 estudiantes han convertido sus certificados en diplomas.

La parte universitaria de ARC es lo

que permite al programa administrar el trabajo académico riguroso necesario para que estos estudiantes tengan éxito. Al tener ARC situado en Northern Essex Community College (NECC) les permite preparar a estos estudiantes para el éxito del MCAS en el otoño y en primavera, cuando están tomando clases en la universidad les permite entender que ellos pueden tener éxito en la universidad también. El ambiente universitario permite un número de cosas positivas que suceden que contribuyen al éxito de los estudiantes.

Limpieza en Tombarello & Sons

El trabajo está comenzando para limpiar una antigua propiedad industrial en Marston Street en Lawrence. El trabajo a realizar es la limpieza de contaminación en la antigua planta de Tombarello & Sons, así como en varias casas que estaban contaminadas por las actividades realizadas en la propiedad industrial.

En virtud de un acuerdo con la Agencia de Protección Ambiental de los EE.UU., First Lawrence Financial, LLC ha acordado excavar el suelo contaminado con sustancias peligrosas en la zona industrial. First Lawrence también pagará a la EPA por el costo de supervisar los trabajos de excavación del suelo. Al mismo tiempo, la EPA va a sacar la tierra contaminada en varias propiedades residenciales adyacentes.

El sitio incluye toda la limpieza alrededor de 14 hectáreas que se utilizaron anteriormente para uso industrial y las casas colindantes de propiedad privada. La parte antigua industrial del sitio ha sido usado históricamente para el reciclaje de chatarra. Otras actividades se llevaron a cabo también en esta parte del sitio, incluyendo la excavación y separación magnética de metales de los suelos en el sitio, y daban clases en la operación de camiones.

Investigaciones de la EPA en el local confirmaron la presencia de bifenilos policlorados (PCBs) y metales pesados, como plomo, cadmio, cromo y arsénico, en el suelo.

Caruso culpables

¿Recuerdan a Darren Caruso, el que se vio atrapado lanzando nieve en el Río Merrimack? El Departamento de Protección Ambiental de Massachusetts (DEP por sus siglas en inglés) o atacó con todo dentro de la ley. En su Orden de Consentimiento y Penalidad, se especifican todas y cada ley que fue violada por el Sr. Caruso cuando el Alcalde William Lantigua lo descubrió descargando camiones cargados de nieve detrás de Island St.

INCENDIO/PELIGROS Si usted pide prestado dinero para iniciar su negocio o comprar un inmueble, el banco requerirá que usted tenga seguro contra incendios (igual que cuando usted pide prestado para comprar una casa).

ROBO: La cobertura de robo por lo general se puede adquirir junto con el seguro contra incendios. A menudo es necesario contar con una alarma antirrobo para comprar cobertura de robo.

TRABAJADORES DE COMPENSACIÓN: Si usted decide contratar a alguien o tiene familia que ayuda, es necesario adquirir un seguro de indemnización laboral. Esto protege al trabajador si se lesionan en el trabajo. No sólo son los gastos médicos pagados, sino los salarios también se pagan al empleado lesionado en caso de tener que faltar al trabajo. El costo se basa en el tipo de negocio y la nómina real. Las empresas deben adquirir esta cobertura. Empresas LLC y los propietarios no tienen que protegerse a sí mismos, pero deben comprar una póliza para los trabajadores que contratan.

PÉRDIDA DE ALQUILERES/ENTRADAS: Si su ingreso de alquiler o producto de ventas paga las facturas entonces usted necesita para asegurarse de que su póliza incluya esta cobertura. ¡Esto no se incluye automáticamente!

I thought I would be doing better than just one pound, although the folks at Advanced Weight Loss System are happy that the scale is going in the right direction. But, on a positive note, as the days progress while following this new lifestyle, I am noticing things that were not observed before such as other people's eating habits. At a restaurant recently, there was a man asking the server to put more rice on the mound already on his plate. I thought it could be enough to feed a large family, not just one person. That rice turns to sugar and fat in the body.

There were people pouring salt on everything and half bottle of salad dressing. I could only think of the rise in my blood pressure with the sodium and the unnecessary empty calories on the salad.

I have continued to visit the YMCA, walking briskly for a little over one mile and then lifting weights. That has been the most difficult part for me. I have never made exercising a priority and getting ready to go there is a real task.

Richard eats small portions, doesn't eat between meals and never touches junk foods. When he feels like having nuts from the big container on Alberto's desk, he takes one or two almonds. Hmmm! Richard is very fit; he must be doing something right. He also reminded me of someone I used to work with in the 80s. When offered a

Dalia Changes Lifestyle El Nuevo Estilo de Vida de Dalia




These weights are just 8 lbs. each but they do wonders for my shoulders. I really feel the difference.

Aybar porque "no come lo suficiente". Richard come pequeñas porciones, no come entre comidas y nunca toca la comida chatarra. Cuando se siente con deseos de comer nueces del contenedor grande en el escritorio de Alberto, él toma una o dos almendras. Hmmm! Richard está muy en forma; él debe estar haciendo algo bien. También me recordaba a alguien con quien solía trabajar en los años 80. Cuando le ofrecían una galletita, la partía por la mitad. Ella era agradable al no rechazar la oferta y se daba el gusto de probarla sin sentirse privada o arruinar su figura.

Comer es un hábito y uno malo. Bueno, necesitamos alimentos, pero puede ser objeto de abuso al igual que cualquier droga. Aprender a comer para la salud es la mejor educación! Eso es precisamente lo que estoy haciendo ahora. Algo notable es que yo sufría de indigestión ácida constante y que ha desaparecido. Tal vez tenía que ver con los tipos de alimentos que comía.

No hay duda de que este es el área donde debo prestar atención ahora. Hacer más ejercicios y más a menudo.

Me siento muy bien. No he tenido ningún episodio con mi presión arterial y mi nivel de azúcar sigue siendo inferior a 160, que sigue siendo alto pero estable.







Walk for the homeless

On Sunday, May 15th, The Psychological Center held its 1st Annual Walk for the Homeless event. The funds raised by almost 150 people participating in the Walk will go towards the rehabilitation of the Daybreak Shelter.

The Daybreak shelter is a 50 bed, transitional 30 days 'wet' shelter (one of 3 in the Commonwealth) that is funded for 30 beds by the Department of Public Health and the Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA). Although only funded for 30 beds, we routinely house and feed 50 guests per night.

Daybreak Shelter serves over 400 homeless persons annually. The Psychological Center is able to provide the additional beds through generosity of local individuals and businesses that understand the importance of Daybreak and want to contribute.

"Our guiding principles at Daybreak are to serve our guests with dignity, compassion, kindness, and respect regardless of the person's currently situation, gender, race, color, or creed," said Dahanara Moran-Liranzo, acting executive director of the Psychological Center. "We treat them all equally and our goal is to provide a safe, comfortable, and clean environment for our guests. Aside from raising funds, we also want to raise awareness of homelessness and homelessness prevention."

Ms. Moran-Liranzo stated that the Walk raised well over \$3,000 and her staff was very pleased with the results.

cookie, she would break it in half. She was pleasant by not refusing the offer and got to taste it without feeling deprived or ruining her figure.

Eating is a habit and a nasty one. Well, we need nourishment but it can be abused just like any drug. Learning to eat for health is the best education! That's precisely what I'm doing now. Something remarkable is that I suffered from constant acid indigestion and that has disappeared. Perhaps it had to do with the types of feed I ate.

For the past three weeks I have not felt deprived (except for ice cream at night) but once I get to the desired weight, I'll be able to have it again – with moderation. Having a good breakfast holds me all morning and I can always depend on fruits in the morning and afternoon, if needed.

I have continued to visit the YMCA, walking briskly for a little over one mile and then lifting weights. That has been the most difficult part for me. I have never made exercising a priority and getting ready to go there is a real task. Besides, I don't look good in tight fitness wear. There's no doubt that this is the area that I should pay attention to now. Exercise longer and more often.

I feel very well. I have not had any episodes with my blood pressure and my sugar remains under 160 which is still high but steady.

On May 10th, 2011, ten programs from the Massachusetts YouthBuild Coalition (MYBC) and three out of state YouthBuild programs, one from Rhode Island and two from Vermont, gathered at the Home Depot in Methuen for the 15th Annual MYBC Carpentry Challenge. The challenge was hosted by YouthBuild Lawrence, YouthBuild Lowell and the Massachusetts YouthBuild Coalition.

Teams of YouthBuild participants from each program competed in a Carpentry Challenge that tested their technical, accuracy and safety skills and allowed them to showcase the construction skills they have learned in the program. All teams were given instructions and materials to build wood frame walls with plywood

sheeting and drywall. The team from Fall River took top honors for the third year in a row. Brockton came in second followed by the team from YouthBuild Lawrence in third place.

Additional teams of students also built 10 handicapped accessible picnic tables and benches that were donated to VA hospitals in program communities as part of the Coalition's "Serving Across the State" AmeriCorps Week project. The service element of the Carpentry Challenge was funded in large part through a service mini-grant from the Massachusetts Service Alliance. This service project highlighted the Coalition's Service Learning Model and enabled students from across the state to attend as YouthBuild and AmeriCorps

members and to serve in appreciation of the men and women who have served our country.

YouthBuild offers young people between the ages of 16 and 24 a unique combination of academic instruction and workforce development training. Young people work to attain their GED or high school diploma while building affordable housing in their communities. This approach allows students to develop important workforce and academic skills while they enrich their communities. The Massachusetts YouthBuild Coalition provides resources for its member programs in the following areas; peer support and evaluation, technical assistance, coordination of statewide events, and application for State Line Item or other

sources of funding. It also facilitates cross-program collaboration and sharing of best practices.

The Massachusetts Service Alliance, Established in 1991, is a private, nonprofit organization serving as the state commission on community service and volunteerism. Its mission is to catalyze the innovation and growth of service and volunteerism by creating partnerships that maximize resources, expertise, capacity, and impact. Surprise: I agree with Morris

I never thought that I would have to praise Gregory Morris for his actions in the School Committee meeting of May 12, but I was impressed with the way he asked for other members to make sense before taking a vote on selecting a new superintendent.

Mr. Morris insisted loudly that they should try to come up with a plan for the selection procedure and timeline but they spoke over him and quickly moved to taking a vote with Mayor William Lantigua, James Vittorioso, Mark Gray and Pavel Payano voting in favor of the search.

Jim Vittorioso was disgusting in his remarks and the way he addressed the teachers in the audience. He kept referring to the times he applied for a position and Superintendent Mary Lou Bergeron prevented him from getting them. It was

a purely personal vendetta and he had no shame saying that himself!

Meanwhile, the teachers' union is calling for a vote of confidence in Dr. Bergeron among the full membership. The union's vote of no confidence was instrumental in removing Bergeron's predecessor, Wilfredo Laboy.

Also, some parents and school department staff members are organizing a peaceful community stand for education on Thursday, May 26th at 5:30PM in front of Lawrence Public Schools Central Office at 255 Essex Street.



ARC Program

Also at that meeting of the School Committee, the reinstatement of the Another Route to College (ARC) Program was approved. This has been a highly successful program because in the eight years that ARC has existed, the success rate has been of 100% in graduating students with a high school diploma. The program is designed for 30 full time students.

In terms of graduation numbers over 240 regular students have received their LHS diplomas through this program and an additional 50 plus certificate of achievement students have turned those into diplomas.

The college part of ARC is what allows the program to administer the rigorous academic work necessary to have these students be successful. By having ARC located at Northern Essex Community College (NECC) allows them to prepare these students for MCAS success in the fall and in the spring when they are taking college classes allow them to understand that they can be successful in college as well. The college atmosphere allows for a number of positive things to happen that contribute to student success.

Cleanup at Tombarello & Sons

Work is beginning to clean a former industrial property on Marston Street in Lawrence. The work will involve cleaning contamination at the former Tombarello & Sons property, as well as at several houses that were contaminated by activities conducted on the industrial property.

Under an agreement with the US Environmental Protection Agency, First Lawrence Financial, LLC has agreed to excavate soil contaminated with hazardous substances at the industrial site. First Lawrence will also pay EPA for its cost to oversee the soil excavation work. At the same time, EPA will be removing contaminated soil on several adjacent residential properties.

The entire cleanup site includes about 14 acres that were formerly used for industrial purposes and the abutting privately-owned houses. The former industrial portion of the site was historically used for scrap metal recycling. Other activities were also conducted on this portion of the site, including excavation, screening and magnetic separation of metals from on-site soils, and lessons in operating tractor-trailer trucks.

EPA's investigation of the site confirmed the presence of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and heavy metals, including lead, cadmium, chromium and arsenic, in soil.

The Russell 4 Unit was presented with a challenge of creating and implementing a new approach for "hourly rounding" program for their patients, and they accepted it with energy and enthusiasm. The staff knew that they were already in each room at least once an hour. The difference implemented is that now each time a staff member was to enter a patient room, their interactions with the patients would be much more meaningful. They were to "round with a purpose", assuring that their patients had all their needs met before leaving a room, telling the patients that they were there to check on them, reinforcing with them that they were concerned for their comfort and safety by asking the patients if they had pain, or needed to use the bathroom. Three months after the trial of this new rounding approach began on Russell 4, and the dramatic results observed, the expansion of the project spread to other areas of Lawrence General. As other teams joined forces with the initiative, R-4 continued to perfect the process and practiced rounding with relative ease motivated by patients' own comments of satisfaction, and evidence of decreasing fall rates.

The results speak for themselves; since the inception of rounding, this unit saw a fall rate reduction of an incredible 71%. The unit also decreased patient call light use by 50%, and improved Lawrence General Hospital patient satisfaction scores dramatically. These successes were achieved because a group of outstanding nursing professionals came together and dedicated themselves to improve patient safety for the Merrimack Valley. This new rounding model has now been replicated through Lawrence General, and with this national recognition by ADVANCE for Nurses, will now likely be replicated throughout community hospitals across the country.




