Tal como se anunció en la pasada edición, el martes, 16 de agosto, miembros del grupo que busca la destitución del alcalde se presentaron en el Ayuntamiento para retirar la petición que habían dejado allí previamente.

El Rev. Edwin Rodríguez se presentó en el ayuntamiento en compañía de Wayne Hayes, Coordinador del Recall alrededor de las 4:30 PM. Según el Rev. Rodríguez, ellos estaban esperando para reunirse con el Concejo de Registradores (Board of Registrars), a las 5:00 PM en su lugar sólo encontró al Coordinador de Elecciones, Rafael Tejeda.

"Cerraron temprano otra vez, todo el mundo se ha ido. Se fue el Escribano Maloney y el abogado de la ciudad, sólo Tejeda estaba en su departamento", dijo el Reverendo Rodríguez cuando abandonaba el edificio alrededor de las 4:45 PM. "Alguien llegó a pagar una factura del agua y el departamento estaba cerrado. Todo el mundo se ha ido", dijo.

Cuando fue contactado, Tejeda, dijo

que el City Hall cierra a las 4:30 PM todos los días.

"Yo soy el único aquí, porque el plazo para la impugnación de las listas era hasta las 5:00 PM. El Concejo de Registradores no estaba programado para reunirse hoy día y yo estoy aquí para recibir a los desafíos de ambos lados", dijo Tejeda.

"Yo cerré mi departamento a las 4:30 PM", dijo Nazario Esquea, un empleado del Departamento de Impuestos. Minutos más tarde a Esquea se le vio en un grupo con el Alcalde Lantigua frente al ayuntamiento.

It's your Right - Es tu Derecho se compromete a iniciar una nueva retirada, esta vez mejor organizados. En un correo electrónico Wayne Hayes escribió: "Vamos a reagruparnos en la próxima semana. Vamos a consolidar nuestro plan y se le invitará a unirse a nosotros. Vamos a necesitar cinco veces más voluntarios de los que había en el primer intento. Iremos con una estrategia estricta, segura y precisa que garantice la curación de Lawrence y la eliminación de Lantigua y sus compinches."

Expanding the Recall news

As announced in our latest edition, last Tuesday, August 16th, members of the Recall Petition showed up at City Hall to withdraw the Recall Petition previously filed with the City Clerk.

Rev. Edwin Rodriguez showed up at City Hall with Recall Coordinator Wayne Hayes around 4:30 PM. According to Rev. Rodriguez, they were expecting to meet with the Board of Registrars at 5:00 PM; instead, they only found Elections Coordinator Rafael Tejeda.

"They closed early again, everybody is gone, only Tejeda was in his department," said Rev. Rodriguez when leaving the building around 4:45 PM. "Somebody came to pay a water bill and the department was closed. Everybody is gone," he said.

When contacted, Tejeda said that City Hall closes at 4:30 PM every day.

"I'm the only one here because the

deadline for the challenges to the recall was until 5:00 PM. The Board of Registrars was not scheduled to meet today and I'm here to receive the challenges," said Tejeda.

"I locked my department at 4:30 PM," said Nazario Esquea, an employee of the Tax Department. Minutes later Esquea was seen in a group with Mayor Lantigua outside City Hall.

The group It's Your Right - Es tu Derecho vows to start a new recall, this time better organized. In an e-mail Wayne Hayes wrote: "We will be regrouping in the next week. We will solidify our plan and you will be invited to join us. We will need five times more volunteers than we had in the first attempt. We will go with a strict, safe and accurate strategy that will ensure the Healing of Lawrence and the removal of Lantigua and his cronies."

Piense: ¡Las elecciones vienen!

Esta comunidad ha estado tan involucrada en la petición de destitución que no se ha prestado atención a las elecciones preliminares que se llevarán a cabo en menos de un mes. Tememos que la votación será de acuerdo con quien estaba a favor o en contra del movimiento para sacar al alcalde, dejando a un lado las contribuciones que los actuales funcionarios pudieran haber hecho en la ciudad o las calificaciones de los políticos aspirantes.

Tenga en cuenta que no estamos mencionando nombres porque nunca hemos apoyado o respaldado a ningún candidato y no es nuestra intención en esta ocasión. Elegir a alguien bajo la rúbrica de una mente tan estrecha será un error de cualquier manera.

Este es el momento en que tenemos que pensar a nivel local, un distrito a la vez, teniendo en cuenta la representación que hemos recibido de nuestros concejales y miembros del comité escolar en el último año y medio. Algunos, sin duda, merecen ser expulsados, mientras que la labor de los demás merece nuestro reconocimiento para permitirles servir dos años más.

La petición de destitución terminó por ahora, si algo ha de ocurrir próximamente, tendrá que ser a través de los abogados y los tribunales, si fuera necesario. Vamos a concentrarnos en lo que nos afecta directamente a través de los servicios, beneficios y la representación ante nuestro gobierno municipal y tomar las decisiones que nos servirán a todos el día de las elecciones.

El resultado final demostrará la eficacia que tuvo el recall.

Think: Elections are coming!

This community has been so involved in the recall petition that no attention has been given to the preliminary election that will take place in less than one month. We fear that voting will be done according to who was in favor or against the recall movement, putting aside the contributions current officer holders may have done to the city or the qualifications of incoming politicians.

Notice that we are not mentioning names because we have never supported or endorsed any candidates and it is not our intention this time. Electing someone under the rubric of such narrow-minded field will be an error either way.

This is the time that we have to think locally, one district at a time, considering the representation we have had from our councilors and members of the school committee in the past year and one half. Some would undoubtedly deserve to be booted out while the performance of others deserves our recognition allowing them to serve two more years.

The recall petition is over for now; whatever new developments will take place from this point forward will be handled by the attorneys and the courts, if necessary. Let's concentrate on what affects us directly by way of services, benefits and representation before our city government and make the decisions that will serve us all on Election Day.

The end result will demonstrate the effectiveness of the recall petition.



Desde Mi Esquina

Señales de progreso en Lawrence

Desde que nos mudamos a nuestras oficinas en el 60 de Island St. en el centro de Lawrence, hemos estado muy contentos con el espacio, el edificio en sí, la gerencia, etc. No podemos decir lo mismo de la situación del aparcamiento. La primavera pasada, el estacionamiento grande que hay al final de la calle Island está siendo renovado como parte de la restauración de toda la zona conocida como Union Crossing y se ha convertido en un verdadero dolor de cabeza para encontrar un lugar cercano. Muchos de nosotros (¡soy culpable!) hemos contribuido a las arcas de la ciudad por concepto de multas de aparcamiento a lo largo del canal en frente del edificio, que no está permitido, con la única opción de caminar unas pocas cuadras.

Ahora el estacionamiento principal se encuentra en la etapa final de ser completado a finales de septiembre. En los últimos cuatro meses, ha habido un tremendo esfuerzo para eliminar los suelos contaminados, poner tuberías para nuevas líneas de servicio público, crear nuevos muros de contención y de pavimentar y preparar el sitio. Mientras todo esto ha estado ocurriendo, se han construido 60

unidades de vivienda asequible en la parte central del edificio que estará disponible para el 1ro de noviembre.

Ese trabajo también allanó el camino para varias mejoras a lo largo de la calle Island, incluyendo una nueva zona de asientos al aire libre, nuevas luces de las calles, jardines, vallas y, posiblemente, la repavimentación de la calle entera.

La entrada de la calle Canal conocida como el Gateway, también está siendo ampliada hasta unirse con la Union y un puente nuevo se instaló a través del canal, que conecta a Union Crossing y el área de estacionamiento que ha sido reformado que conecta la antigua fábrica de KGR, atravesando completamente hacia General St. y el hospital. Toda esa zona está luciendo preciosa con grandes árboles recientemente plantados. ¡Este será el lugar ideal donde estar en los próximos años!

Una prueba positiva de peso y ejercicio

¿Quién habría pensado que el ejercicio está tan estrechamente relacionado con su salud? Bueno, mucha gente no ve la conexión y yo soy la prueba viviente de que los resultados son casi instantáneos. A los pocos días se puede ver la diferencia e incluso si tengo que continuar con esta rutina por el resto de mi vida, es un precio cómodo de pagar



El martes, 16 de agosto, la Ciudad de Lawrence y Groundwork Lawrence (GWL) fueron los anfitriones de la ceremonia de inauguración de tres huertas comunitarias situadas en las calles Spruce y Myrtle, Cross y Cedar y Giuffrida Place. Con estos tres nuevos lugares la ciudad ahora cuenta con 126 parcelas dedicadas al cultivo.

La ceremonia tuvo lugar en el jardín comunitario situado en la esquina de las calles Spruce y Myrtle.

El Programa de Jardines Comunitarios ha sido un esfuerzo conjunto de planificación de la ciudad y los Departamentos de Desarrollo Comunitario y Groundwork Lawrence.

El Departamento de Planificación identifica terrenos propiedad de la ciudad adecuados para espacios abiertos y los utiliza como jardines comunitarios y administra el proceso de disposición; Groundwork Lawrence es una organización no lucrativa que ayuda a la ciudad con la planificación de espacios abiertos y la aplicación, práctica análisis medioambientales y diseño del sitio. El Departamento de Desarrollo Comunitario gestiona y administra los fondos de Massachusetts PARC combinado con el financiamiento de Community Development Block Grant.

de las calles Cedar y Cross. "Cuando este lote estaba lleno de basura y abandonado personas de todas partes venían a arrojar televisores, colchones viejos y gomas de carros, pero ahora las personas pasan a tomar fotos y a admirar lo hermoso en que esto se ha convertido", agregó Peña.

El Alcalde Lantigua agradeció a los financiadores del Estado y Federales por su apoyo a la Ciudad de Lawrence. Señaló: "Si usted pasó por este sitio el año pasado habrá visto un montón de vertidos ilegales y lleno de escombros. Ahora hemos dado la tierra a la comunidad para un uso positivo".

Los oradores en la celebración incluyeron al Alcalde William Lantigua; James Barnes, director del Departamento de Desarrollo Comunitario; Ann Carroll, de la Oficina en Washington de la Agencia

de Protección Ambiental (EPA), quien señaló que la Ciudad de Lawrence es un modelo nacional; el representante estatal David Torrisi, Tenis Lilly, presidente de la Comisión de Conservación de Lawrence y un residente del vecindario. También asistieron al evento June Black, en representación de la Congresista Nikki Tsongas, y Melissa Cryan, en representación de la Oficina de Massachusetts de Energía y Asuntos Ambientales y Heather McMann, Directora Ejecutiva de GWL.

El costo total del proyecto fue de \$612,528, \$187,608 provenientes de HUD Community Development y completando una dádiva de \$424,920 de PARC. "El programa de Jardines Comunitarios demuestra el uso efectivo del Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG

de HUD ya que se utiliza para atraer la financiación del Estado", dijo el Director de Desarrollo Comunitario James Barnes.

Los jardines comunitarios de Lawrence suelen cambiar el aspecto de los sitios baldíos y abandonados del barrio en activos productivos. Según un estudio reciente, la limpieza y las zonas verdes de terrenos baldíos pueden aumentar el valor de las propiedades adyacentes hasta un 30 por ciento. Por el contrario, barrios con mayor concentración de terrenos baldíos, abandonados muestran que los valores de las propiedades bajaron hasta en un 18 por ciento.

Gracias al liderazgo de la Ciudad de Lawrence, y a través de los fondos para el programa de terrenos contaminados del EAP, el Programa de fondos para el Desarrollo Comunitario de HUD, el Programa MA PARC, y la Comisión de Planificación del Valle del Merrimack, GWL velará que las huertas comunitarias de la ciudad crezcan el doble en cantidad. GWL con miras hacia el futuro espera poder apoyar la red de crecimiento de más de 250 jardineros comunitarios en la ciudad.

La ciudad, a través del Departamento de Desarrollo Comunitario continuará buscando fondos y asociados para expandir el programa de jardines comunitarios.

Mientras que las nuevas huertas ya han sido todas ocupadas, esperan poder crear nuevas huertas muy pronto. Estudiantes de Lawrence brillan en MIT

El 6 de agosto, el Edificio Stata de Massachusetts Institute of Technology, en Cambridge estaba lleno de estudiantes de escuela intermedia y robots, algunos de ellos muy entretenidos en un juego de pelota mientras que las familias y los profesores les animaban. Un selecto grupo de los estudiantes viajaron unos 45 minutos de Lawrence por última vez, ya que con orgullo saborearon sus últimos momentos con sus compañeros de Boston y Cambridge de la temporada que pasaron en el programa STEM.

STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Math), o Tecnología de Ingeniería Ciencias y Matemáticas es un programa de enriquecimiento de cinco semanas en MIT durante el verano para alumnos sobresalientes de sexto, séptimo, octavo y noveno grado de Cambridge, Boston y las Escuelas Públicas de Lawrence. El robot, que pasaron el verano construyendo y programando, llegó a primera base, pero no pudo detenerse para llegar a la segunda base. Ni siquiera eso pudo arruinar el momento para los graduados de STEM que gozaron de un trato especial durante su último año.

"Este fue un año increíble", dice Njoroge al describir los privilegios que el nivel cuatro les proveyo de tener un almuerzo temprano y conseguir tutoría afuera de clases.

Para una dieta equilibrada, aplique la fórmula del plato

Durante la mayor parte de nuestras vidas se nos ha indicado que siguiéramos el gráfico de la pirámide nutricional para tener una dieta saludable. Sin embargo, esta pirámide era un tanto complicada de entender con sus diferentes porcentajes y colores. Este verano, el Departamento de Agricultura de los Estados Unidos ha anunciado un nuevo símbolo que ha sustituido a la tradicional pirámide multicolor, que es mucho más fácil de poner en práctica y que se conoce como "ChooseMyPlate.gov".

El nuevo gráfico diseñado por el Departamento de Agricultura muestra un plato y un vaso en un mantel individual. El plato está dividido en cuatro secciones pero no todas las partes son iguales. La mitad de la comida debe estar compuesta por frutas y verduras y la otra mitad por granos o cereales y proteína.

Cuando hablamos de granos, incluimos todos aquellos alimentos que nuestro cuerpo procesa como fécula o almidón, incluyendo además del arroz, las patatas y el pan. La proteína debe componer menos de un cuarto del plato. Pero, ¿a qué nos referimos cuando hablamos de proteína? Lo que aporta

la mayor cantidad de proteína a nuestro organismo es la carne, los huevos y el pescado.

En cuanto a los lácteos también ha habido cambios, pues se sugiere tomar más leche y yogur, especialmente descremados, y menos queso. La parte de los aceites se ha eliminado por completo en este nuevo símbolo nutricional pues se sobrentiende que consumimos suficiente grasa cuando injerimos otros alimentos.

Este nuevo plato hace más evidente para muchos de nosotros, los latinos, que es hora de empezar a cambiar nuestra dieta. En muchos casos, y corréjanme si me equivoco, tendemos a representar un plato donde la mitad está compuesta por arroz y la otra mitad por algún tipo de carne. Limitamos el consumo de vegetales al acompañamiento o la salsa y el yogur o la leche no suele formar parte de nuestra alimentación. Éste es un buen momento

Retirement Drug Subsidy Funds

The Personnel Department is in the process of obtaining another \$65,000 of Drug Subsidy Reimbursement Funds to the City of Lawrence.

So far the Personnel Department staff has been able to have more than \$1.45 million dollars reimbursed to the city within the past couple of years from the Federal Retiree Drug Reimbursement Subsidy program.

The \$1.45 million, added to the already \$12 million dollars (turnover swing in regards to health insurance premium) and the savings of the retirement Medicare D process, that the Personnel Department has bought is over \$15 million dollars in savings. This was accomplished by reviewing programs and process in order to make efficient payment and savings to assist the city's financial situation.

"Of course, this money can only be replaced into accounts associated with health insurance, as I believe it cannot be placed legally into local funds. Needless to say, it's money that the city will not have to find or use elsewhere from local funding," said Frank Bonet, personnel director for the City of Lawrence. "We continue to review our process and hope to create more savings, cost avoidance or produce efficient operations," he added.

The 1912 strikers' monument

The 1912 Strikers' Monument Committee, in collaboration with the Lawrence Historic Commission and the Lawrence Community Works, intends to erect a monument on the Lawrence Common in the fall of 2012 to commemorate the struggles and successes endured by the Lawrence textile workers during the Great Strike of 1912.

This monument will be the first of its kind ever created in this country acknowledging the importance of the Lawrence 1912 Strike in the annals of American Labor History. The 1912 Strike was unique in its solidarity amongst its immigrant unskilled workers and subsequent improvements in working conditions, not only in Lawrence, but throughout New England and the entire United States.

The monument will consist of two bronze relief plaques set into a large natural stone boulder. The front plaque will depict a parade of hundreds of workers pouring out of the mills and marching through the streets of Lawrence, past an image of Lawrence's city hall, a site historically significant in regards to the strike.

The image of the strikers will be framed by a design of shuttles, woven threads, industrial gears, and two upright rifles with bayonets of the State Militia, with the words "Lawrence Strike of 1912", prominently displayed all in mid relief bronze.


The second bronze plaque will be set into the backside of the stone with the simple text acknowledging successes of the Lawrence workers in relation to all workers

of past, present, and future. The rear relief will also display the city flag of Lawrence, crowned by a circular banner imprinted with the word "Industria" which is also printed on the official seal of the city of Lawrence. The text is flanked by two rifles with bayonets of the State Militia pointing down symbolizing the end of the violence experienced and the end of the strike.

The sculptor selected for this project is the nationally recognized artist, Daniel Altshuler, of Gloucester, Massachusetts.

The 1912 Strikers' Monument Committee is committed to honoring those dedicated workers who sacrificed and toiled for the betterment of all. A museum quality monument erected on the very ground where they gathered to attend rallies and maintain a sense of solidarity through those cold nine weeks of winter will finally bring a permanent recognition to their trials and suffering and announce to all Lawrencians, as well as those visiting our city, the major role that Lawrence has played in American Labor History.

on all summer and to say goodbye to the level fours who won't be returning.

Jimmy Njoroge, 14, worked together with his teammates Xin Wen, 14 and Milton Vargas, 14, all of Lawrence, to compete in the level four final project, a robot kickball game. Their robot, which they spent the summer building and programming, got to first base, but could not stop to turn onto second. Even that couldn't ruin the moment for the pending STEM graduates who enjoyed special treatment during their final year.

"This was an awesome year," says Njoroge as he described level four privileges of having an early lunch and getting tutoring outside.

Njoroge, Wen, Vargas, and the eleven other Lawrence kids can attribute their success at STEM to the Youth Development Organization, or YDO, for introducing them to the program. The program didn't always include Lawrence students; until four years ago, it was exclusively for kids in Greater Boston. It wasn't until Howard Sticklor, the executive director of the Lawrence-based YDO connected with the Office of Engineering Outreach Programs, the office responsible for STEM, that Lawrence kids started heading to Cambridge for the summer.

One great supporter of Lawrence kids in STEM is Kate Youmans, Manager of Middle School Programs at OEOP. "Our Lawrence students always impress me with their enthusiasm for tackling difficult coursework and dedication to overcoming challenges. They are the students who raise their hand to ask questions or in class and

are selected by their classmates to present speeches," says Youmans.

Sticklor wasn't surprised at all by the kids' impact. "We had bright kids so we were looking to send them to a program that offered a more serious challenge, and STEM was the most engaging," says Sticklor. "We began by sending five kids, we sent fourteen this summer, and we hope to send more in summers to come."

Mn Wen, 14, one YDO kid who began after fifth grade, graduated on the 6th. She found great success when she began and did well through her time there.

"It was definitely worth the summer because I learned so much and met new friends," said Wen. "STEM taught me a lot of things that my school didn't."

As these veteran STEM students leave, other bright Lawrence kids rise to take their place. Tiani Ramos, 11, a level one student from the South Lawrence East Middle School who was chosen to speak on behalf of her class spoke fondly of her instructors. She also expressed feeling that all STEM students, could relate to.

"This program has shown me learning can be pleasurable," she said. "And to be the best, all you have to do is strive."

Although level fours have had a good run at STEM, their goodbyes were bittersweet. "Even though I had only been there for two years, I felt like I was a part of STEM," says Njoroge.

Wen, like the rest of her class, was disappointed that there is no level five.

YMCA Diabetes Prevention Program

YDPP is based on the landmark Diabetes Prevention Program funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), which showed that by eating healthier, increasing physical activity and losing a small amount of weight, a person with pre-diabetes or at risk can prevent or delay the onset of type 2 diabetes by 58%.

In a classroom setting, a trained lifestyle coach helps participants adapt a lifestyle by learning about healthy eating, physical activity and other behavior changes.

The program is organized as 16 one-hour sessions. Topics covered include nutrition, getting started with physical activity, overcoming stress, staying motivated, and more.

- * Have elevated Blood Pressure

Reembolsan Fondos de Medicamentos

El Departamento de Personal se encuentra en el proceso de obtención de otros \$65,000 de fondos de reembolso del subsidio de medicinas de ayuda a la Ciudad de Lawrence.

Hasta ahora, el Departamento de personal ha sido capaz de lograr más de \$1.45 millones reembolsados a la ciudad dentro de los dos últimos años del Programa Federal de Reembolso de Medicamentos para Jubilados.

Los \$1.45 millones, sumados a los ya 12 millones de dólares (cifra de ahorro en lo que respecta a la prima de seguro de salud) y los ahorros del proceso de jubilación de Medicare D, que el Departamento de Personal ya tiene más de \$15 millones en ahorros. Esto se logró mediante la

revisión de los programas y procesos con el fin de realizar el pago eficiente y ahorro para ayudar a la situación financiera de la ciudad.

"Por supuesto, este dinero sólo puede ser reemplazado en las cuentas asociadas a seguros de salud, como creo que no pueden ser utilizadas legalmente en los fondos locales. De más está decir que es dinero que la ciudad no tendrá que buscar en otra parte o sacar de fondos locales", dijo Frank Bonet, director de personal de la Ciudad de Lawrence. "Continuamos revisando nuestros procesos y esperamos crear un mayor ahorro, más reducción de costos o producir un funcionamiento eficiente", agregó.

GARDENS: Community Gardens Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

The Planning Department identifies city owned land appropriate for open space and community gardening reuse and manages the disposition process; Groundwork Lawrence, a local nonprofit which assists the City with Open Space planning and implementation, undertakes environmental analysis and site design, and the Community Development Department applies for and manages Massachusetts PARC funding combined with Community Development Block Grant funding.

Groundwork Lawrence has been making changes in places and lives in the city of Lawrence since 2001 by creating new and improving existing parks, building community gardens and organizing cleanups, and by turning destroyed and neglected Brownfield sites into public parks, gardens and other usable green spaces.

Community gardens unify neighbors and encourages them to grow fresh organic produce for their consumption, "They not only aid the environment but our pockets as well," said Freddy Pena new gardener at Cross and Cedar streets community garden, "when this lot was full of garbage and abandoned, people from everywhere came here to toss TVs, old mattresses and tires; people now instead come by to take pictures and admire how beautiful this place has turned out to be," stated Peña.

Mayor Lantigua thanked Federal and State funders for their support of the City of Lawrence. He noted, "If you came by this site last year you would have seen a lot of illegal dumping, littered with debris. Now we have given the land back to the community for a positive use."

Speakers at the celebration included Mayor William Lantigua, James Barnes, Director of the Community Development Department; Ann Carroll from the Washington Office of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) who noted that the City of Lawrence is a national model; State Representative David

Torrisi, Tennis Lilly, Chairperson of the Lawrence Conservation Commission and a neighborhood resident. Also attending the event were June Black, representing Congresswoman Niki Tsongas, and Melissa Cryan, representing the Massachusetts Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs and Heather McMann, GWL executive director.

The total cost of the project was \$612,528 with the HUD Community Development funding of \$187,608 leveraging a \$424,920 PARC grant. "The Community Gardens program demonstrates the effective use of HUD's Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) because it is used to attract State funding," said Community Development Director James Barnes.

Lawrence's community gardens typically reposition vacant and derelict sites into productive neighborhood assets. According to a recent study, cleaning and greening vacant lots can increase the value of adjacent properties by as much as 30 percent. Conversely, neighborhoods with higher concentrations of derelict vacant lots displayed lowered property values by as much as 18 percent.

Thanks to the City of Lawrence's leadership, and funding through the US EPA Brownfields Program, US HUD Community Development Block Grant Program, MA PARC Program, and Merrimack Valley Planning Commission, GWL's goal is to see the city's community gardens more than double in size. GWL looks forward to supporting the city's growing network of over 250 community gardeners.

The City, through the Community Development, will continue to seek funds and partners to expand the Community Gardens program. While the new gardens are already full, they hope to build more gardens soon. Lawrence's signs of progress

Since moving our offices to 60 Island St. in downtown Lawrence, we have been very happy with the space, the building itself, the management, etc. We cannot say the same for the parking situation. This past spring, the big parking lot at the end of Island St. is being renovated as part of the restoration of the entire area known as Union Crossing and it has become a real pain finding a spot nearby. Many of us (guilty!) have contributed to the city's coffers by way of fines for parking along the canal in front of the building, which is not allowed, with the only option of walking a few blocks.

Now the main parking lot is in the final stages of being complete around the end of September. Over the last 4 months, there has been tremendous effort to remove contaminated soils, lay piping for brand new utility lines, create new retaining walls and to re-grade and pave the site. While all of this has been going on, there have been 60 units of affordable housing under construction inside the center part of the building, all of which will be available for a November 1st move-in.

That work also paved the way for

several improvements along Island Street, including a new outdoor seating area, new street lights, landscaping, fencing and possibly the repaving of the entire street.

The Gateway of Canal St. is also being expanded, joining Union St. and a brand new bridge was installed across the canal, connecting Union Crossing and the refurbished parking area connecting the former KGR building, completely across towards General St. to the hospital. That entire area is looking great with trees recently planted. This will be the place to be in the next couple of years!

Positive proof of weight and exercise

For those of you following my weight loss program, for the past three weeks my weight had not changed and last week I panicked when I gained one-half pound! I continue with the same food choices (remember, it's not a diet) and even when I go out to restaurants, I can make intelligent choices and not feel deprived. I became more concerned when my blood sugar rose to 180, which had been a thing of the past.

So, I concluded that for the past three weeks I had not been going to the YMCA as often, showing up perhaps a couple of times per week. Even the sessions have not been as strenuous as before.

After realizing that this is where I fell off the proverbial wagon, I made it a point to go back to the previous workout routine and lo and behold, I lost three pounds this week but most important is that my sugar has also gone back to almost normal levels, closer to 100.

Who would have thought that exercise is so closely related to your health? Well, lots of people don't see the connection and I am living proof that the results are almost instantaneous. Within days you can see the difference and even if I have to continue this routine for the rest of my life, it's an easy price to pay for my well-being.

Check with your nearest YMCA for programs and services available in your community. In Lawrence, Methuen and the Andover/North Andover Y we have programs addressing the needs of diabetics and coming next month, the Food, Fun and Fitness Program at the Lawrence Branch.

A lesson from Chalas

Last week, Bienvenido Chalas passed away at only 51 years of age, a resident of Lawrence who left a large, close family. Besides knowing him as a decent, hard working man, we were only acquaintances but I befriended his sister Josefina and his cousin Carmen.

Carmen Chalas is well-known as the producer and host of a radio program on WCEC 1490 AM for the past 11 years and Josefina Chalas is an entrepreneur dabbling in business here and in Springfield, MA.

I was particularly fond of his son Joel, a young man who learned the value of work and responsibility from his father, making a mark in the city as the Recycling Coordinator and anyone who has known him can say that he is a reflection of the elder Chalas.

"He was at my house on Wednesday and by Sunday, he was dying," Carmen told me last week. Bienvenido fell ill and within days, the cancer had invaded his brain with no hope.

As I am getting older, I am becoming more in touch with my own mortality, appreciating how fickle life is. Chalas' passing told me that I may not have time to "fix" the wrongs I've done in my life, to show people that there's no capacity in my heart for hatred and above all, to demonstrate to others how much I love them.

While lingering in a slow ending is difficult for the entire family, not having time to say those 'goodbyes' is even worse.

That's the lesson I took from his short life and I thank him.



Mr. Santoro has been involved in a number of Public Safety initiatives that have led to an increased ability of officials to help manage an emergency and minimize the loss of life and property.


He has assisted in the development and continued coordination of the Methuen Emergency Management Team and the Methuen Community Emergency Response

POLL WORKERS NEEDED

The City of Lawrence continuously recruits the assistance of poll workers, poll clerks, and poll wardens to work in the preliminary and election dates held each year. In 2011, there are two election events to be held: Tuesday, September 20, 2011 [Municipal Preliminary – polls open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm]; and, Tuesday, November 8, 2011 [Municipal Election – polls open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm]. Although a full day commitment is preferred, half-day shifts of no less than 6 hours can be arranged. Each worker is expected to work no less than one, half-day shift.

In order to be considered for any poll worker position:

- 1) You must be a resident of Lawrence; and,
- 2) You must be a registered voter in the City of Lawrence. *Bilingual preferred

Each poll worker, clerk, and warden must also attend one mandatory training session which will be scheduled for various dates and times approximately one week prior to the preliminary or Election Day. Each session lasts about one hour.

Poll workers receive \$120.00 for a full day – Clerks receive \$160 [full day] – Wardens receive \$200 [full day]. Half days compensation rates are calculated based on the full day rate.

Each worker attending mandatory training receive an additional \$20.00 for training attendance [no more than \$20.00 will be paid regardless of how many sessions are attended and no payment will be made unless the individual works at least one half-day shift].


