Obedecer la ley o pagar las consecuencias

En nuestro editorial de la edición #383L del 22 de abril, 2012, hacíamos notar la necesidad de hacer cumplir las disposiciones de tránsito vigentes y dábamos algunos ejemplos de violaciones comúnmente cometidas por algunos de nuestros conductores.

Como ejemplo citábamos la forma como algunos conductores ignoran el significado de las luces en los semáforos que parecen haber sido estudiadas sólo para pasar el examen de conducir y luego convenientemente olvidadas.

Este no es el caso de las señales de No Izquierda colocadas a lo largo de la Calle Essex desde que se convirtió en dos vías. Estas recuerdan constantemente por escrito, la prohibición de hacerlo.

A estas violaciones es importante agregar la velocidad con que algunos conducen, que parece haber aumentado en calles recién pavimentadas, que ya suman muchas.

Dos jovencitas fueron atropelladas la noche del pasado domingo en la intersección de las calles High y Pleasant. Aunque desconocemos los detalles del incidente, algunos vecinos comentan de la alta velocidad con que se conduce en la calle High.

Y para complicar aún más la situación, no debemos ignorar el descuido con que muchos peatones, especialmente la gente joven, deambula por las calles muchas veces cruzándolas entretenidos mientras envían mensajes de texto en sus teléfonos.

Concluyendo, todos debemos obedecer la ley o pagar las consecuencias.

Obey the law or pay the consequences

In our editorial of April 22, 2012, (issue # 383L) we felt the need that the existing traffic rules must be enforced and we gave some examples of common violations committed by some of our drivers.

As an example we cited the way some drivers seem to ignore the meaning of the lights at traffic lights. It seems that they were studied just to pass the driving test and then conveniently forgotten.

This is not the case for the No Left Turn signals positioned along Essex Street since it was converted into a two-way traffic. There are signs galore reminding drivers, that it is prohibited to do so.

To these violations is important to add the speed at which some people drive, which seems to have increased now that many streets have been newly paved; actually, too many now.





Solicitud de Propuestas

Hay una gran oportunidad para cualquier persona interesada en el manejo de la cafetería en el aeropuerto, pero sólo ha sido anunciado en el diario local. Algunos miembros de la Comisión Aeroportuaria sugirió colocarlo también en Rumbo pero ellos declinaron.

La cafetería actual ha sido operada por la misma persona durante los últimos diez años. Originalmente firmó un contrato de arrendamiento de cinco años que puede prorrogarse cada año durante otros cinco años. Ahora que el tiempo máximo se terminó, se está anunciando de una manera que favorece a la persona que lo ha estado haciendo, bloqueando a los posibles lectores de este aviso.

El anuncio dice: "La Ciudad de Lawrence invita a presentar propuestas de proveedores calificados e interesados en el arrendamiento de aproximadamente 853 pies cuadrados de espacio en su edificio de Lawrence Municipal Airport en el 492 Sutton Street, North Andover, MA para su uso como un establecimiento de restaurante..." y continúa con todos los detalles para aplicar.

Rumbo tiene una copia del anuncio publicado, pero cualquier persona interesada debe recoger las especificaciones en la oficina del Agente de Compras, City Hall, 200 Calle Common, Sala 301, Lawrence, MA.

Se insta a los proponentes interesados a asistir a una visita guiada previa a la licitación el viernes, 20 de abril 2012 a las 2 pm en el Aeropuerto Municipal de Lawrence.

Las propuestas de los proveedores deben llegar a la oficina de la Sra. Rita V. Brousseau, Agente de Compras, no más tarde de las 11:00 de la mañana del viernes, 4 de mayo 2012.

South Lawrence West Little League

Este fin de semana fue el comienzo de la temporada de béisbol de las Pequeñas Ligas de Lawrence. South Lawrence West Little League abrió en Mt. Vernon Park, con casi 400 niños inscritos. La cuota de

inscripción incluye los uniformes, los cuales fueron distribuidos en la noche del viernes, pero muchos padres se enteraron la noche antes que no se le permitiría recoger los uniformes de sus hijos a menos que pagaran \$25 por boletos de la rifa. En algunos casos, no habían recibido aún los boletos de la rifa por lo que no estaban al tanto de tener que venderlos.

Dan Selenius, el presidente de Tower Hill Little League, escribió en su página de Facebook lo siguiente: "Ha llegado a mi conocimiento que South Lawrence West Little League, que se encuentra en la sección de Mt. Vernon en Lawrence, está obligando a los padres a pagar una tasa adicional de \$25 por niño por encima de su cuota de

inscripción anunciada para vender boletos para la rifa obligatoriamente. Esta rifa no fue publicada o mencionada a los padres en el momento de la inscripción. Me han dicho que su junta directiva está básicamente aguantando a estos niños como rehenes a pesar de los padres ya están pagando por los uniformes en la cuota de inscripción. Ellos están dispuestos a discriminar a estos niños de sus celebraciones del día de la apertura de mañana, si sus padres no pagan el rescate. He consultado con varias fuentes y han determinado que las acciones de la SLWLL están al borde de ser ilegal.

Ellos no pueden obligar a los padres a pagar esta cuota "obligatoria" de recaudación de fondos ya que nunca fue incluido en el registro público. Así que les pido a todos los padres, jugadores, donantes o cualquier persona involucrada con la SLWLL para hacerles saber que esto no será tolerado y boicotear su puesto de comida de mañana. Tome una posición, esta es una liga para el beneficio de nuestros hijos. No es para el beneficio de su junta directiva."

Yo pensé que los comentarios del Sr. Selenius fueron muy fuertes, así que fui al parque en la noche del viernes y en la conmoción de los padres que se saludaban y los niños felices de ver la estación comenzando, también se encontraban varios padres que estaban enojados. Algunos se sacrificaron y pagaron los \$25, otros me dijeron que simplemente, no lo tienen. Eso significaba que sus hijos no tendrían su uniforme al tomar las fotos a la mañana siguiente, como estaba previsto.



El ex presidente de la Liga Dan Halloran me presentó a Wil Medina, el actual presidente y Danny se tomó su tiempo mostrándome los alrededores mientras me explicaba la necesidad de recaudar fondos. Hace dos años, tuvieron un sorteo mediante el cual los padres tuvieron que vender \$100 para la rifa. El próximo año, teniendo en cuenta que la economía había creado un agujero en el bolsillo de la gente, se redujo a \$50 y una vez más, este año, los padres que asistieron a la reunión votaron para bajarla aún más a \$25. El problema es que sólo los padres que asisten a las reuniones de la junta directiva estaban conscientes de ello. Se descuidaron en la comunicación con el resto de ellos.

Dan también explicó que la South Lawrence West Little League es absolutamente responsable de la conservación y mantenimiento de los campos y cada año se gastan casi \$10,000 en actualizaciones, reparaciones y mejoras.

También hablé con Cindy Rebinskas que me dijo, "Cuando se tiene en cuenta el estado del parque, el trabajo que requiere hacer que las cosas funcionen, los uniformes, los árbitros, trofeos, bolsas de hielo, baños, alimentos, etc., pedir a los niños que vendan 5 boletos de la rifa parece justo." En este momento, su refrigerador se rompió y están utilizando hielo suelto en contenedores.

Este parque es la envidia de toda la ciudad por su belleza, las excelentes condiciones de los campos, un puesto de comida muy cómodo y el único parque que cuenta con cuartos de baño. Lo que el resto de la ciudad tiene que entender es que el gobierno de la ciudad no tiene nada que ver con eso. Sólo abren el agua y la cierran al final de la temporada y los padres hacen el resto.

"Si ellos no pueden vender boletos de la rifa, deben estar dispuestos a trabajar en el puesto de comida o limpiar los baños", la Sra. Rebinskas me dijo.

Más tarde esa noche, recibí un mensaje de Dan Halloran explicándome los acontecimientos del día siguiente que incluían el izamiento de la nueva bandera del parque con el ROTC de LHS. Fred Carberry cantando el Himno Nacional, la introducción de los equipos tomándoles fotos, y los perros calientes y bebidas. El nuevo letrero de la calle de la entrada al parque en honor al fallecido Dennis Bistany que entrenó en el parque desde hace muchos años, fue exhibido por primera vez.

Y Danny terminó diciendo que: "¡Ningún niño se quedará sin uniforme!"

Si bien entiendo sus esfuerzos de recaudación de fondos para subvencionar los gastos relacionados con el mantenimiento del parque, creo que esta controversia fue causada por la falta de comunicación. Publicar algo en un sitio web o página de Facebook no es el camino para llegar a todo un grupo. Un esfuerzo mayor debe hacerse para informar sobre las decisiones adoptadas por el pequeño grupo de padres que asisten a las reuniones de la junta directiva.

SEGURO PARA PEQUEÑAS EMPRESAS

Cuando usted decide comenzar un negocio, hay muchas cosas referentes a seguros que debe tener en cuenta. Aquí están algunos que usted necesita comprar:

RESPONSABILIDAD: El seguro conocido como "liability" lo protege si alguien se lastima en su propiedad o en su negocio. Si usted alquila, el propietario querrá que usted tenga seguro de responsabilidad civil y el nombre como asegurado adicional. Si usted vende comida, un producto o servicio, el seguro de responsabilidad civil es muy importante. Si usted es propietario y alquila, el seguro de "liability" es necesario para protegerlo de demandas de inquilinos y se requiere para la Sección VIII de los inquilinos. Los contratistas lo necesitan para proteger a sus clientes. Muchas ciudades y pueblos requieren Certificados de Seguros de los contratistas cuando solicitan permisos.

INCENDIO/PELIGROS: Si usted pide prestado dinero para iniciar su negocio o comprar un inmueble, el banco requerirá que usted tenga seguro contra incendios (igual que cuando usted pide prestado para comprar una casa).

ROBO: La cobertura de robo por lo general se puede adquirir junto con el seguro contra incendios. A menudo es necesario contar con una alarma antirrobo para comprar cobertura de robo.

TRABAJADORES DE COMPENSACIÓN: Si usted decide contratar a alguien o tiene familia que ayuda, es necesario adquirir un seguro de indemnización laboral. Esto protege al trabajador si se lesionan en el trabajo. No sólo son los gastos médicos pagados, sino los salarios también se pagan al empleado lesionado en caso de tener que faltar al trabajo. El costo se basa en el tipo de negocio y la nómina real. Las empresas deben adquirir esta cobertura. Empresas LLC y los propietarios no tienen que protegerse a sí mismos, pero deben comprar una póliza para los trabajadores que contratan.

PÉRDIDA DE ALQUILERES/ENTRADAS: Si su ingreso de alquiler o producto de ventas paga las facturas entonces usted necesita para asegurarse de que su póliza incluye esta cobertura. ¡Esto no se incluye automáticamente!

Asegúrese de revisar su póliza comercial para más detalles.

Para Sebastián Amenta de Salem, New Hampshire y Heriberto Reynoso de Lawrence, MA, su diagnóstico de diabetes fue una llamada de atención. Con la educación, la ayuda de sus cónyuges, medicamentos, cambios significativos en sus hábitos alimenticios y el ejercicio físico regular, estos hombres han logrado controlar su diabetes y se sienten bien.

El Hospital Holy Family (Hospital de la Sagrada Familia) se complace en compartir sus experiencias en dos videos de 16 minutos cada uno titulado "Diabetes Tipo 2: El Sonido de Alarma." La historia de Reynoso está contada en español, y la historia del Amenta es relatada en inglés.

Estos videos fueron presentados a un grupo de personas durante una exquisita cena ofrecida por el Hospital de la Sagrada Familia preparada por el chef ejecutivo Nicolás Moreira el jueves, 26 de abril 2012.

Después de ver estos videos es perfectamente comprensible que Heriberto Reynoso sólo sirve comidas saludables en Yummy, su restaurante, después que escuchara comentarios de personas que le decían que sufrián cuando iban a un restaurante y no encontraban los alimentos

Living with Diabetes

For Sebastian Amenta of Salem, NH, and Heriberto Reynoso of Lawrence, MA, their diabetes diagnosis was a wake-up call. With education, the help of their spouses, medication, significant changes in their eating habits, and regular exercise, these men are successfully managing their diabetes and feeling great.

Holy Family Hospital is pleased to share their stories in two, 16-minute videos entitled "Diabetes Type 2: Sound the Alarm." The Reynoso story is told in Spanish; the Amenta story is told in English.

These videos were presented to a group of people during an exquisite dinner prepared by Holy Family Hospital Executive Chef Nicholas Moreira on Thursday, April 26, 2012.

After watching these videos is perfectly understandable why Heriberto Reynoso serves only healthy meals at Yummy, his restaurant, having heard comments from people of how they suffered going to a restaurant and not finding the right foods for a healthy lifestyle.

"These individuals had the courage to face diabetes head on and in front of the camera for thousands of people to see. They dedicated time, commitment and a complete openness to change. They did this for their health and the health of others in the communities we serve," explained Lester Schindel, President of Holy Family Hospital. "I believe these stories will have a lasting impact on so many lives. Instead

of feeling stuck and alone, individuals and families will find hope, courage, confidence and the knowledge they need to take charge of this disease and their lives."

Educational Resource in Response to a Growing Epidemic:

Hospitalization rates for diabetes in Andover, North Andover, Haverhill, Lawrence and Methuen exceed the state average by 21%, according to Holy Family's last health needs assessment. The idea to create these videos was conceived by Alberto Sobrado, MD, president of Community Medical Professionals in North Andover and clinical advisor to Holy Family Hospital's Community Benefits program. Diabetes is one of the program's main priorities.

"As a physician, I've seen an alarming rise in diabetes over the last several years. And I know my colleagues in the Merrimack Valley have witnessed the same. Diabetes can have a devastating impact on individuals and families. But it doesn't have to be this way," said Dr. Sobrado.

He continued, "These videos teach patients diagnosed with diabetes or pre-disposed to it, and the community-at-large, that you can take control of this disease, and even prevent it, to live a long, active, healthy life. I am so grateful to Sebastian, Heriberto and

Over 250 youth from across Massachusetts participate in Annual Kick Butts Day Event at Massachusetts State House

Over 250 young people from across the Commonwealth gathered at the Massachusetts State House for a Kick Butts Day event to celebrate their role in reducing the influence of the tobacco industry in their communities.

While at the State House youth visited with lawmakers, attended a rally with United States Surgeon General Regina Benjamin, and a closing event with Massachusetts Department of Public Health Medical Director Dr. Lauren Smith. The young people used their time with lawmakers to discuss the ways the tobacco industry continues to target young people: through a range of new non-cigarette tobacco products, cheap prices, flashy packaging, and product placement in venues young people visit, including convenience stores

near schools. The industry then prices the products cheaply to encourage impulse buys by youth.

"It is important for our lawmakers and the public to know that the tobacco industry is continuing to target our communities and youth," said John Nguyen, statewide planning committee member for The 84. "The 84 Chapters from across Massachusetts are working hard to highlight the dangers of tobacco use and to ensure that young people never start."

Each of the 45 organizations participating is a member of The 84 Movement, which helps mobilize youth to take action to protect their communities from the influence of the tobacco industry. The event celebrated the work these young

Six Local Builders join forces with Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity for the Home Builders Blitz 2012

Two homes to be built in Lawrence during week in June

Home Builders Blitz 2012 is a partnership between Habitat for Humanity and the building industry to build homes across the country during the week of June 4 – June 10, 2012. During that week, over 200 homes will be built, helping families who could not otherwise afford to buy a home. Two homes in Lawrence, MA will be constructed as part of the Blitz, thanks to the commitment of six local building companies who are donating their services to lead, plan and execute this effort.

The partnership between Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity and the six building companies exemplifies the power of people working together for a common cause and is indicative of the commitment to giving back, building hope, and supporting the City of Lawrence. This particular effort highlights many of the positive aspects of the Greater Lawrence community: a local family donated the home sites to Merrimack Valley Habitat, a young local architect donated his service to design the homes; dozens of local businesses have donated supplies, labor, expertise, and meals to support this ambitious undertaking. Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity is one of only a few MA Habitat affiliates participating in the Builders Blitz 2012.

The economic downturn did not spare the building community. Yet these six local builders have joined together to

donate their services to build safe, decent, affordable housing in Lawrence. Two families, working with Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity, will call the new houses on Market Street "home". Prior to joining forces on this project, some of these builders competed for the same construction projects while, in other cases, the builders did not even know each other. These days, they work as one, well-oiled team and have been doing so since they kicked off the initiative last fall.

The six building companies leading the Merrimack Valley Habitat Home Builders Blitz 2012 include: Howell Custom Building Group, Meadowview Construction, Cote & Foster Construction, Premier Builders, JSR Adaptive Energy Solutions and Correct Temp, Inc. Each firm is donating its time, energy and skills to build these two homes with projected out of pocket costs of approximately \$230,000 and 15,000 hours of donated labor. Two-thirds of the cost will be covered by donations of materials from the builders and the support of many local businesses sponsoring the effort.

"It is exciting to take on this complex project: Complex both in terms of compressed timelines and lot dimensions. We have a great team bringing specific expertise and a shared commitment to the city of Lawrence – some of the team grew up here, while others, like us, have our businesses in Lawrence," said Steve Howell, Merrimack Valley Habitat Board Member and Chairman of the Home

It was the 4th game for the local nine and at that time they were competing in the Essex County League. English is considered to be one of the top teams in the league and the blue and white will know that in order to win the league championship this is one team they must beat.

Lawrence has been working out daily at O'Sullivan's Park on Water St. and recently were very impressive against a strong Phillips Academy team Coach Jimmy Jordan who is also the football coach his ace Gerry Callagy to be his mainstay as he was on the gridiron and will most likely take the mound in this game.

Captain Eddie Pecorella is a good hitter and also a good outfielder. Frankie Calobrisi is one of the league's top players, they called him "Fundo." He later played minor league ball and is in the LHS Hall of Fame.

Bobby Fitzgerald would become a legendary coach of football and wrestling in our area it's a shame he didn't live to see his son Bob Jr. get elected this year to be a principal in a Dracut School. Fitz senior played 3rd base for the locals. Billy Pedrick a neighbor of Fitz on Tower Hill shared

3rd base duties with him. Billy is a retired detective for the LPD, and still resides in the City with his wife Sandy who works at the Claddagh Pub.

The late Jerry Dineen was the 2nd baseman. Coach Jordan played Callagy and former Andover school department board member Jerry Silverman at base. Behind the plate were the late Billy Ford of So Lawrence who had a cannon for an arm and was as tough as nails and a fine hoopster.

Mike Taibbi would share the catching duties with Ford. Mike retired from Honeywell. The outfield had Capt Pecorella who also proved he had not only a good eye at the plate as later in life he married his high school sweetheart a great looker from Amherst St. in Southie, her name Nancy Gearin.

Stanley Zaremba of Border St. and the Wetherbee School (yes, that's the correct spelling). Bernie Zenewitch came from the So Lawrence East area and is a retired mailman in the City. Bernie could hit the long ball with any of the greats; he spent the last few years with his wife watching his grandchildren perform for CCHS and they are rightfully proud of both the girl and the boy getting free rides at major colleges. Bernie played youth ball at the So

Common with the great "Dapper Donovan," Billy Timmons," Bee Connors and Archie Conroy.

Both Coach Jordan and Capt Pecorella felt very confident going into this big game on April 28th 1950.

Request for Proposals

There is a great opportunity for anyone interested in handling the cafeteria at the airport but it has only been advertised in the daily newspaper. Some members of the Airport Commission suggested placing it also in Rumbo but they declined.

The current cafeteria has been managed by the same person for the past ten years. Originally he signed a five-year lease which can be extended each year after that for another five years. Now that the time is up, it is being advertised in a way that he will continue to be favored, locking out potential respondents to this RFP notice.

The ad reads, "City of Lawrence invites proposals from qualified vendors interested in leasing approximately 853 sq. ft. of building space at its Lawrence Municipal Airport at 492 Sutton Street, North Andover, MA for use as a restaurant establishment..." and continues with all the details to apply.

Rumbo has a copy of the ad published but anyone interested should pick up the specifications at the Purchasing Agent's Office, City Hall, 200 Common Street, Room 301, Lawrence, MA.

Interested proposers are urged to attend a pre-bid walkthrough on Friday, April 20, 2012 at 2 p.m. at the Lawrence Municipal Airport.

Proposals from vendors are due at the office of Ms. Rita V. Brousseau, Purchasing Agent, no later than 11:00 a.m. on Friday, May 4, 2012.

South Lawrence West Little League

This weekend was the beginning of the baseball season for the Little Leagues of Lawrence. The South Lawrence West Little League opened at Mt. Vernon Park with almost 400 children registered. The registration fee includes the uniforms, which were distributed on Friday night but many parents found out the night before that they would not be allowed to get their children's uniforms unless they paid \$25 for raffle tickets. In some cases, they had not even received those raffle tickets so they

were not aware of having to sell them.

Dan Selenius, President of the Tower Hill Little League wrote on his Facebook page the following: "It has come to my attention that The South Lawrence West Little League, located in the Mt. Vernon section of Lawrence is forcing parents to pay an additional fee of \$25 per child above their advertised registration fee to sell mandatory raffle tickets. This raffle was not advertised or brought to the attention of the parents at the time of registration. I have been told their board is basically holding these children's uniforms hostage despite parents already paying the registration fee. They are willing to ostracize these children for their Opening Day celebrations tomorrow if their parents don't pay the ransom. I have consulted with several sources and have determined that the actions of the SLWLL is bordering on illegal. They cannot force parents to pay this "Mandatory" fundraising fee as it was never publicly listed at registration. So I am asking all parents, players, or donors of anyone involved with the SLWLL to let them know that this will not be tolerated and boycott their concession stand tomorrow. Take a stand, this is a League for the benefit of our children. Not for the benefit of their board."

I thought that Mr. Selenius' comments were harsh so I went to the park on Friday night and in the commotion of parents greeting each other and children happy to see the season starting, I also found several parents who were angry. Some sacrificed and paid the \$25, others simply told me that they just didn't have it. That meant that their children would not be having their pictures taken the next morning, as planned.

Former League President Dan Halloran introduced me to Wil Medina the current president and Danny took the time to take me around explaining the need for the fundraisers. Two years ago, they had a raffle by which parents had to sell \$100; the next year, considering that the economy had created a hole in people's pockets, it was lowered to \$50 and yet again, this year, parents who attended the meeting voted to lower it even more to \$25. The problem is that only those parents attending the board meetings were aware of it. They neglected

in communicating it to the rest of them.

Dan also explained that the South Lawrence West Little League is absolutely responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the fields and every year they spend almost \$10,000 in updates, repairs and improvements.

I also spoke to Cindy Rebinskas who told me that, "When you consider the condition of the park, the work that goes into making things run, uniforms, umpires, trophies, ice packs, bathrooms, food, and so on asking for children to sell 5 raffle tickets seems fair." Right now, their refrigerator broke down and they are using ice and coolers.

This park is the envy of the entire city for its beauty, the excellent conditions of the fields, a very comfortable concession stand and the only park that has bathrooms. What the rest of the city needs to understand is that the city government has nothing to do with it. They only turn the water on and off and parents do the rest.

"If they cannot sell raffle tickets, they should be willing to work on the concession stand or clean the toilets," Ms. Rebinskas told me.

Later that evening, I received a message from Dan Halloran explaining the next day's events which included the LHS ROTC raising the park's new flag, Fred Carberry singing the National Anthem, the introduction of the teams with photos taken, and hot dogs and drinks. The new street sign naming the entrance to the park after the late Dennis Bistany who coached at the park for many years, was displayed for the first time.

And Danny ended by saying that, "No kid will be left without a uniform!"

While I understand their fundraising efforts to subsidize the expenses connected with the upkeep of the park, I believe that this controversy was caused by the lack of communication. Posting something on a website or Facebook page is not the way to reach to an entire group. A better effort should be made to inform the decisions taken by the small group of parents attending board meetings.

Rigging elections

Remember the criticisms when Mayor William Lantigua recruited friends to run in the last elections against people that he wanted displaced from the City Council and the School Committee?

Former School Committeemember Mark Gray wrote on his Facebook page the following: "Still looking for 4 people to rid the school system of the administration and replace it with people who care about our kids and want to educate. Some people are already engaging in smear campaigns to protect their buddies in the central office. 4 people to run who will get rid of the politics and corruption."

Seems that since he is no longer on the school committee, he has disconnected himself from reality. Mark doesn't realize that the current school committee has no power. The state's intervention removed budgetary responsibility and all decision powers from them so they neither protect nor fire anyone.

Loiseau Becomes First Warrior to Sign NFL Deal; Signs with Houston Texans

Shawn Loiseau became the first Warrior in school history to sign with an NFL franchise on Saturday afternoon following the NFL draft. Loiseau signed his undrafted free agent contract less than an hour after the completion of the draft.

"My whole life has been about opportunity and being overlooked," said the newest Houston Texan. "There is nothing more that I wanted than a chance to live my lifelong dream and now I have that with the Houston Texans. Now it is about taking this opportunity and making the most of it. Life isn't about where you come from it's about where you want to go and how hard you are willing to work to get there."

Loiseau received offers from nearly every NFL team by the conclusion of the draft and the Texans were his choice.

Loiseau became the first Merrimack College player to sign a NFL deal on Saturday. Offensive lineman Mackenzy Bernadeau from Bentley University remains the only Northeast-10 player ever drafted in the NFL being selected in the seventh round, pick number 250, by the Carolina Panthers.

Loiseau leaves Merrimack as one of the most decorated student-athletes in school history. He was a consensus All American last fall after piling up 121 tackles, breaking the 100 tackle plateau for the third straight season.

"We are so proud of Shawn and all that he has accomplished," said head coach John Perry. "We wish him all the best in his future with Houston. His future is bright and so is Merrimack's with the legacy he left behind."

Loiseau finished his career with 382 tackles, including 377 in his final three seasons, ranking him first all-time in school history. He broke the school record for tackles in a season with 133 in 2010 and was named 2nd team All-American. Loiseau



was twice named Northeast-10 Conference Defensive Player of the Year, marking the first time a Merrimack player earned that award on two occasions.

Loiseau played in the East-West Shrine game following his senior season, marking the first ever Warrior to be invited and to participate in the game. He also took part in the NFL Scouting Combine, the lone Northeast-10 Conference player invited to participate.

Houston finished 2011 with a 10-6 overall record, earning a playoff spot. The Texans defeated the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round before falling to the Baltimore Ravens by the score of 20-13 in the conference semifinals.

Siete puntos para tener éxito en cultivar sus propios vegetales y hierbas

Ya llegó la estación de jardinería y muchos se pueden sentir abrumados por todas las selecciones de plantas que tienen en el vivero. Reduzca el estrés de su visita al vivero y sea más productivo al seguir estos puntos simples.

Comience con un plan. Haga una lista de las cosas que a usted y a su familia les gustan comer. Despues, seleccione un espacio para cultivar sus favoritos. No olvide que se puede crecer los vegetales y las hierbas en contenedores, mezclados con otras plantas, o en su propio jardín.

Escoja plantas que puedan crecer en las condiciones de la tierra que selecciona. Cultive los vegetales que se comen y frutas, como tomates, pepinos, y melones, o las flores que se pueden comer, como brécol o coliflor, en un área donde tengan sol por el día completo (8 ó más horas). Los cultivos de raíz como cebollas, zanahorias, y rábanos solo toleran un medio día de sol (4-6 horas). Los cultivos frondosos como Swiss chard, espinacas, y lechuga toleran la sombra mejor (solo requieren 3-4 horas del sol).

Las plantas que prefieren las estaciones de calor, como tomates, pepinos, y calabazas necesitan aire y tierra cálida para tener los mejores resultados. Espere a cultivar hasta que pase la helada peligrosa o utilice fundas de "floating row" para proteger cualquier cultivo que ha plantado temprano durante las temperaturas frescas y la helada.

Las plantas que prefieren las estaciones frescas, como brécol, lechuga, y guisantes, tienen más éxito en las temperaturas frescas de la primavera y el otoño. Pero no se preocupe si ya las temperaturas están calentando. Todavía se puede añadir estos cultivos a su jardín en verano para que estén listos para ser cosechados en el otoño o principios del invierno.

Asegúrese de traer la lista que hizo y comience su visita al vivero a de un paseo por la tienda. De esta manera, puede obtener una idea general de las diferentes ubicaciones de los vegetales y las hierbas. Usualmente, se organizan los tipos individuales de plantas en orden alfabético.

Chequee las etiquetas de las plantas para más detalles de la planta. Normalmente, la etiqueta tiene información del tamaño, la separación de las plantas, y la estación de cosecha.

Ahora, con la ayuda de tecnología, también se puede usar su Smartphone para obtener más información extensiva que tiene la etiqueta. Esta información es muy útil en ayudarle a cultivar sus plantas y seguir los puntos de este artículo. Compradores encontrarán también que algunas de las etiquetas de sus plantas ahora tienen códigos de QR que se pueden escanear con su teléfono para obtener mucha más información de la planta.

Otro ejemplo, Bonnie Plants ha diseñado una página de internet móvil "Gardening at Your Fingertips" en español que tiene información y puntos de jardinería para jardineros que no tienen mucho tiempo. También esta página tiene descripciones de diferentes plantas, recetas y planes gratis de



cultivo, el sitio es m.bonnieplants.com/es

Haga la jardinería una actividad familiar. Involucre a toda la familia en cultivar, cuidar, y cosechar los vegetales y las hierbas. Aun aquellos a los cuales no les gustan los vegetales son más probables de comerlos si son vegetales que ellos mismos cultivaron.

"Hair of the Dog" event to benefit homeless animals

Love wine? A light lunch will follow the service. This event is free and open to the public. Please join us for this special interfaith service.




