Joanne Bevilacqua fondly remembered

Joanne Bevilacqua was remembered for her dedication to the Tilton School and the children she used to teach there. On Monday, June 10, a plaque was unveiled at the entrance of her former classroom, now converted into a conference room for faculty use: The Bevilacqua Family Teaching Collaboration Center. Mementos of her tenure still hang on the walls.

"When my sister attended school as a student in Haverhill, she knew exactly what she wanted to do later in life — become a teacher", said Haverhill School Committee Member Joseph Bevilacqua.

After graduating from Haverhill High School in 1978, and not before graduating from Merrimack College where she gained two bachelor degrees, one in education and one in psychology, she started working for the Haverhill School system. She died at age 48 in October 2008, while working as an elementary school teacher at Tilton.

Es solo un consejo

De los siete candidatos para ocupar la alcaldía de Lawrence, solo tres, que sepamos, tienen una página web donde tratan de responder las interrogantes de los presuntos votantes: Néstor De Jesús, Daniel Rivera y el actual Alcalde William Lantigua.

El primero, De Jesús, nos confunde cuando su página se titula: www.NestorDeJesusFormayor.com sin embargo, no tiene una palabra en inglés. ¿Por qué no [NestorDeJesusParaAlcalde.com](http://www.NestorDeJesusParaAlcalde.com)? En esta ciudad aunque los que hablamos español somos mayoría, no podemos ignorar a aquellos que no lo hablan y votan.

En su página, De Jesús desglosa cinco de los planes que implementaría de ser elegido Alcalde: circulación de tráfico, seguridad en las calles, proyectos y actividades comunitarias, impuestos a la propiedad y generación de empleos y desarrollo económico. En ellos involucra de lleno a la comunidad para resolver los problemas que según él afectan a la ciudad, sin necesidad de incrementar personal tanto en el ayuntamiento como en la policía y los bomberos.

Aunque hace años conocemos a Néstor De Jesús y sabemos de la reputación que goza dentro de la comunidad, su página no lo indica.

El caso opuesto es la página web del candidato Daniel Rivera. Danny, como le conocemos desde hace años, es el vivo ejemplo de la persona que se ha hecho por sí misma. Danny llegó aquí pequeño, creció pobre en los proyectos, estudió y se superó para llegar donde ha llegado y se quedó en Lawrence, pero los que no hablan inglés no lo saben ya que su página web www.makelawrencebetter.com no contiene nada en español.

La página del actual Alcalde William Lantigua, www.lantiguaformayor.com es un poco, aunque no totalmente bilingüe ya que la parte que explica acerca de su persona está sólo en inglés.

Esta observación no debe ser tomada en forma negativa. Creemos que las oportunidades de ellos se ampliarían si añadieran a su página web el idioma que le falta.

It's just an advice

Of the seven candidates for mayor of Lawrence, only three, that we know of, have a website where they try to answer the questions of voters: Nestor De Jesus, Daniel Rivera and current Mayor William Lantigua.

The first, De Jesus, confused us. His page is titled www.NestorDeJesusFormayor.com and does not have a word in English. Why not [NestorDeJesusParaAlcalde.com](http://www.NestorDeJesusParaAlcalde.com)? In this city the majority speak Spanish but we cannot ignore those who do not speak it and vote.

In his page, De Jesus breaks down five of his plans if he results in being elected Mayor: traffic flow, safety on the streets, projects and activities, property taxes and job creation and economic development. He reaches out to the community to help him solve the problems affecting the city, without having to increase staff in both, City Hall or the police and firefighters.

Although we know Nestor De Jesus for years, and know of the reputation he enjoys in the community, his page is not indicative of his qualifications.


The opposite case is the candidate Daniel Rivera's website. Danny, as we have known him for years, is a living example of the person who has made it on his own. Danny was very small when he arrived in this country, grew up poor in the projects, got an education and overcame all kinds of obstacles to get where he is today and stayed in Lawrence, but for those who do not speak English and do not know him, his www.makelawrencebetter.com website contains nothing in Spanish.

The current Mayor William Lantigua's page, www.lantiguaformayor.com is somewhat mixed though not completely bilingual, as the part with his personal information which is in English only.

This observation should not be taken negatively. We believe that their chances will expand if their website is bilingual.

Dan, tú no eres un candidato cualquiera

Si hay una persona que realmente, realmente (en serio) admiro en el Concejo Municipal de la ciudad de Lawrence, es Danny Rivera. Es una joya y lo decimos en el editorial de esta semana, pero ...

Puede dejar un mensaje y si el individuo estaba enojado, molesto, lo que sea, se habrá calmado cuando vaya a responder a su llamada con la respuesta a su problema o pregunta.

Es igual que cuando se introdujeron los cajeros automáticos, la gente decía que tendríamos que hacer una cita para poder hablar con un cajero. ¿Quién quiere ver un cajero! Las máquinas son rápidas, precisas y en ocasiones ni siquiera tenemos que salir del carro. No quiero volver a las viejas formas de hacer las cosas.

el Comité de Presupuesto y Finanzas en el Concejo municipal (haciendo un muy buen trabajo) así que él sabe mejor que nadie que para gastar \$5 aquí, usted tiene que conseguir \$5 de otra parte. Incluso aumentar cinco oficiales cada año es una cantidad exorbitante que los contribuyentes no pueden soportar.

Hace muchos años, durante uno de los despidos, el Alcalde Michael Sullivan cerró la estación de bomberos de Howard St. Cuando logramos volver a abrir la estación de Howard St. tuvimos que contratar a nuevos bomberos y actualizar el edificio a un ritmo de más de un millón de dólares. ¡No es fácil!

Todos queremos más de todo, pero cuando somos NOSOTROS los que estamos pagando las facturas a través de impuestos a la propiedad, decidimos pasar sin ellos.

Todos queremos sentir orgullo para nuestra ciudad, sobre todo los que han sido testigos de la decadencia, pero con más desfiles no lo harán. Rivera dijo que quiere traer de vuelta el desfile del Día de St. Patrick, fortalecer la Semana Hispana y traer de vuelta el Chili Cook-off. ¿Es que es esa su idea de desarrollo económico? Estos son eventos privados organizados por la comunidad y la única razón por la que no hemos tenido la Parada de St. Patrick, el Festival Dominicano y Festival de Puerto Rico es porque todo el mundo está recortando los gastos y la cantidad que deben presupuestar para la policía en esos eventos es prohibitiva. ¿Qué mejor ejemplo que el de los italianos? El festival de ellos en el fin de semana de Labor Day ha sufrido enormes cortes pero ellos culpan el costo de pagar a la policía.

Y por favor, Danny, no me diga que usted va a reunirse con los dueños de negocios trimestralmente. Eso puede durar sólo el primer trimestre. 



¿Qué hay en una disertación? La controversia sobre el IQ (cociente de inteligencia) de los Latinos.

Tesis: Los hispanos tenemos un nivel de inteligencia más bajo que el resto de la población.

¿Está ofendido ya? No lo esté. Recientemente hemos escuchado ruidos, me refiero a "ruidos de quejidos" que vienen del lado de Cambridge del Río Charles. Y ese ruido no tiene nada que ver con las recientes actividades terroristas de parte de dos de sus más desacreditados residentes. Esas son afortunadamente noticias trágicas ya pasadas para el resto de nosotros. Las quejas fueron expresadas por varios estudiantes de la Escuela de Gobierno de la Universidad de Harvard contra otra versión de terrorismo: discriminación racial, probablemente étnica sea una mejor descripción.

Parece ser que en el 2009 (¿Por qué tomó tanto tiempo salir a la palestra?) un estudiante de la Universidad de Harvard escribió una disertación doctoral concluyendo que los hispanos tenemos un cociente de inteligencia inferior al resto de la población (blanca), un defecto que debe excluir a los hispanos de políticas de inmigración favorables. Supongo que alguien intenta evitar la contaminación de la laguna racial blanca. Lo único que usted

tiene que hacer es echar un vistazo a los nombres de las figuras públicas que saltaron a la (anecdótica, ineducada) oportunidad de apoyar al disertante y se dará cuenta de la importancia a su causa.

Yo podría pasar el resto de mi vida tratando de desaprobar los puntos de la tesis de este señor, pero ese no es mi objetivo. Yo no me embarco en negar negativos. Ni siquiera nombro al autor o el título de su disertación, porque no quiero inundarlo con simpatizadores de su trabajo, pero sí creo que puedo ofrecer cierta luz en la controversia y permitirle a usted que lo juzgue.

Disertaciones: "la disertación es un documento suministrado como soporte de una candidatura para un grado académico (típicamente doctoral) o calificación profesional presentando la investigación del autor y los resultados". (Wikipedia). Pero no nos alejemos de lo que eso significa. Los autores no "investigan y presentan resultados" simplemente para obtener las ansiadas tres letras de PhD en sus diplomas. Es mucho más complicado que todo eso. Me tomó a mí para completar mi disertación dos de los siete años de mi trabajo doctoral, el veintinueve por ciento

del tiempo. Y antes de embarcar en la parte que es ese esfuerzo importante coronando una educación doctoral, hay que llenar ciertos requerimientos, todos estándares en su campo; déjeme evocar el ejemplo mío para usted.

Las disertaciones, cien páginas o más, sobre un asunto específico en el campo de su selección, su "pericia" por así decir, consumen mucho tiempo. Primeramente, usted necesita un comité de disertación compuesto de tres "expertos" en su materia, uno de ellos presidente(a) del comité. Usted necesita alcanzar una mayoría en las decisiones sobre lo que se presente. Tres votos permiten que eso ocurra. Si usted tuviera dos votantes que están en desacuerdo, las decisiones durante el proceso de la disertación durarían tanto como las leyes discutidas en el congreso: para siempre. Y tener un miembro de su comité sin ser perito en su campo es inapropiado; en realidad los inexpertos nunca aceptan pertenecer.

Pero respire profundamente y coja aire. Ahora que usted tiene un comité, tiene que escoger el sujeto de la disertación. Eso puede durar para siempre, y es uno de los obstáculos que impiden completar el PhD. Hay muchos estudiantes doctorales que se describen eternamente como TMT (Todo Menos Tesis). Y el tema tiene que ser único, típicamente algo que nos mueva en nuestra profesión, en dirección de un mundo mejor.

Hace varios años fui invitado a un acto en una universidad local donde se presentaba el tema de una disertación escrita por un estudiante doctoral de biología. El tema era el "comportamiento reproductivo de ciertas especies de gusanos". Yo no podía imaginar cómo era posible que el mundo fuera mejor después de esa presentación, pero en realidad ella lo probó cuando describió la proliferación de gusanos en nuestra vida agrícola. Uno jamás sabe lo suficiente.

La charla fue en realidad interesante. Yo aprendí más de lo que me interesaba sobre las maneras de hacer el amor de los gusanos, y me dio una oportunidad duradera de entender el daño que yo estaba causando cuando colocaba un pobre gusano en el anzuelo de mis cañas de pescar. Pero no crean por un instante que ese tema era limitado. Hay cientos de probabilidades en lo que se refiere a ese tema. Estudiantes doctorales desesperados pueden usar esos resultados para producir otras variedades del mismo tema en su trabajo.

Usted podría, por ejemplo, considerar el comportamiento reproductivo de ciertas especies de gusanos en la Florida, o en Massachusetts; ¿qué les parece durante la primavera? ¿O el verano? ¿O mientras ellos escuchan los bongós del carnaval cubano de la calle ocho? Bueno, usted se da cuenta de lo que quiero decir. Todos esos temas son dignos de estudio, cada uno un candidato para libro de bolsillo sobre el tema que ser comprado y leído por pescadores mientras esperan pacientemente

What is in a dissertation? The Latino IQ controversy.

Thesis: Hispanics have lower IQ's than the general population.

Are you shocked yet? Don't be. Recently, we heard a lot of noise, as in "complain noise" coming from the Cambridge side of the Charles River. And this noise wasn't related to the recently reported terrorist activities of two of its most infamous residents. That's old news fortunately for the rest of us. This complaint was voiced by Harvard School of Government students against a different version of terrorism: racial discrimination; ethnic probably being a better word.

It seems that in 2009 (why did it take so long to be publicized?) a Harvard University student wrote a doctoral dissertation concluding that Hispanics have a lower IQ than the rest of the (white) population, a defect that should preclude Hispanics from any favorable immigration policies. I suppose someone is trying to avoid contamination of the white racial pool. All you have to do is look at the names of the public figures that jumped at the (anecdotal, uneducated) opportunity to agree with the author of the dissertation and you will see its importance to their cause.

I could spend the rest of my life trying to disprove this man's thesis points, but that isn't my goal. I don't embark on negating negatives. I haven't even named the author or his dissertation title because I don't want to flood him with sympathizers of his work, but I think I can shed some light on the controversy and let you be the judge.

Dissertations: "a dissertation is a document submitted in support of candidature for an academic degree (typically doctoral,) or professional qualification presenting the author's research and findings." (Wikipedia.) But let's not be carried away. Authors simply don't "research, and find, write the dissertation and present it" in order to get the coveted PhD letters on their diplomas. It's more complicated than that. It took two of the seven years of my doctoral work to complete my dissertation, twenty nine percent of the time. And before you embark on that crowning and important part of your doctoral education, you must fulfill certain requirements, all of them standard in the trade; let me evoke mine with you.

Dissertations, a hundred pages or more, about a specific subject in your chosen field, your "expertise" so to speak, are time consuming. First, you must have a dissertation committee usually composed of three "experts" in your field, one of them the committee Chair. You need to be able to reach a majority decision about any issue that comes down the pike. Three voters allow that to happen. If you only had two voters who don't agree, decisions during the dissertation process would last as long as the laws discussed by Congress: forever. And having a member of your committee without expertise in your field is inappropriate; actually non-experts would never accept being in one.

The school success program is a high school prep program designed to help 7th and 8th grade students prepare for the HSPT and SSAT, standardized tests necessary to gain acceptance to Catholic and private high schools, respectively. The program also assists students with filling out high school applications, interview skills, public speaking, and culminates with select students receiving four-year partial scholarships to partner schools.

The Summer Success Program is a summer enrichment program where students work on reading and writing skills.

The Adelante Scholars program is for those students from the school success program who received scholarships. The scholars program provides academic support services such as college tours and SAT prep, and engages students in giving back to the community.

Students in the Adelante programs come from the Lawrence Public Schools, The Community Day Charter and Lawrence Family Development Charter School, Lawrence Catholic Academy and middle schools from surrounding communities.

Several high schools in the area partner with the Adelante program and match the amount of the scholarship that Adelante

gives the Scholars for four years. Partner schools include Notre Dame Cristo Rey High School, Central Catholic, and Presentation of Mary Academy.

This year, the Adelante Scholars Program was able to provide 10 scholarships to students from its school success program. Adelante Scholars will also graduate 10 students, all of whom will be attending college this upcoming fall at schools that include: Emmanuel College, Quinnipiac University, Barry University, and Brandeis University.

Chery Joel Victoria is a prime example of an Adelante Scholar. Chery emigrated from the Dominican Republic with his family at the age of 6; his two older brothers were also Adelante Scholars. Adelante provided Chery with an opportunity to go to Central Catholic. He now plans to earn a Bachelor's degree in Computer Science or Electrical Engineering and one day open his own firm.

Su vida financiera después de la graduación

A los millones de estudiantes secundarios y universitarios recién graduados (y a sus padres, que han compartido sus éxitos y fracasos): felicitaciones

por lo logrado. Una vez pasados los festejos, seguramente estarán ansiosos por embarcarse en el próximo capítulo de sus vidas, ya sea conseguir trabajo, prepararse para la universidad, enrolarse en la milicia o prestar servicios comunitarios.

Pero, antes de lanzarse a la aventura, permítame compartir algunas lecciones financieras que aprendí a los golpes cuando estaba arrancando. Podrían ahorrarle mucho dinero a la larga y ayudarlo a acercarse a sus metas, ya sea comprar una casa, formar una familia o incluso jubilarse antes, por lejano que suene.

Primero, haga de cuenta que todavía es un estudiante. Cuando consiga su primer trabajo de jornada completa, no podrá resistirse a la tentación de gastar el dinero en ropa nueva, un mejor departamento y un auto de esta década después de haber estado comiendo sopa de fideos por cuatro años. Pero, a menos que haya tenido una

beca generosa o una tía rica, probablemente ya tendrá la obligación de pagar miles de dólares del préstamo universitario.

(Nota para los que recién empiezan: Sean precavidos al tomar un préstamo universitario. La Agencia de Protección Financiera del Consumidor –CFPB- tiene una guía para tomar decisiones informadas sobre cómo pagar la universidad en www.consumerfinance.gov/students.)

Después de haberle restado el valor del alquiler, la cuota del automóvil, los seguros de inquilino y del auto, los cargos de la tarjeta de crédito, el saldo del préstamo universitario y otras facturas mensuales (sin mencionar los impuestos como el impuesto del Seguro Social, que subió un 2 por ciento este año), probablemente no le quede tanto sueldo como quisiera, especialmente si está tratando de ahorrar para alguna de esas metas importantes de su vida.

Aquí es donde los presupuestos pueden ser de gran ayuda. Hay muchas herramientas gratuitas en la web para hacer presupuestos, incluyendo calculadoras interactivas, como en el sitio web patrocinado por el gobierno llamado MyMoney.gov (www.mymoney.gov), National Foundation for Credit Counseling (www.nfcc.org), Mint.com (<https://www.mint.com>) y Practical Money Skills for Life (www.practicalmoneyskills.com).

com), un programa gratuito de administración financiera personal ofrecido por Visa Inc.

En segundo lugar, conozca su calificación crediticia. Mucha gente se entera demasiado tarde que una mala calificación crediticia puede arruinar su futuro financiero. Si no ha pagado alguna cuota de un préstamo, tuvo algún cheque rebotado o excedió el límite de su crédito, probablemente le cobrarán tasas de interés más altas en los préstamos o tarjetas de crédito y le ofrecerán límites de crédito más bajos (o directamente le negarán un crédito), a menos y hasta que mejore su calificación crediticia. Tal vez, hasta tenga que pagar cuotas de seguro más altas, no pueda alquilar un departamento o comprar un teléfono celular.

Para saber dónde está parado, revise sus informes crediticios en cada una de las tres agencias de crédito principales (Equifax, Experian y TransUnion) para ver si aparece alguna acción negativa y para encontrar errores o alguna posible actividad fraudulenta en sus cuentas. Puede solicitar un informe gratuito por año



Necesidad de la verdad

La verdad no forma parte de los principios sociales de nuestro tiempo. Como virtud humana, no tiene una apreciación muy alta. El drama social de nuestra época, es que parece no dejar tiempo suficiente para la esforzada y penosa pregunta sobre la verdad. Existe incluso la sospecha de que esa pregunta sirve en realidad para eludir los deberes humanos urgentes; de que no es sino el juego elitista de unos pocos que pueden permitirse especular sobre la misma.

¿Qué podemos decir pues, de la verdad? ¿Dónde la encontramos propiamente? ¿Qué significa la verdad? ¿Debemos vivirla, defenderla y manifestarla siempre? ¿Se puede decir la mentira siempre que haga falta? Quisiera proponer una respuesta a estas preguntas, sirviéndome de un pequeño episodio de la vida del Padre Rupert Mayer S.J.

Se cuenta que Rupert Mayer conoció a Hitler ya en el año 1919, como orador en una discusión que tuvo lugar en una reunión comunista. En ese momento, en esa época temprana en que nadie conocía al futuro dictador, podía estimarse que, a pesar de algunos aspectos desagradables, Hitler podría ser un aliado en la lucha contra la tentación comunista. El mismo había jugado esa carta. En el año 1923, envió al Padre

Rupert Mayer un telegrama de felicitación con motivo de la fiesta conmemorativa de sus 25 años de sacerdote, pues para él hubiera sido importante y le hubiera servido de gran ayuda en su propósito de granjearse las simpatías de los vacilantes -especialmente entre los católicos- que un sacerdote patriota con tan grandes servicios prestados a la patria y tan grande autoridad en la ciudad de Munich donde residía, estuviera a su lado. Sabemos cuán difícil fue para los intelectuales alemanes y extranjeros, escritores, investigadores, políticos, o teólogos, descubrir las intenciones de Hitler y percibir lo que verdaderamente estaba en juego en Alemania y algún tiempo después en Europa.

El Padre Rupert Mayer, que no era un intelectual, sino un sencillo sacerdote dedicado al servicio de las almas, comprendió inmediatamente la máscara del anticristo, especialmente en algo que cualquiera de nosotros, hubiera pasado por alto. Suprimera observación fue la siguiente: "Hitler fanfarronea constantemente y no retrocede ni siquiera ante la mentira. Y quien no respeta la verdad no puede hacer el bien. Donde no se respeta la verdad, no puede crecer la libertad, ni la justicia, ni la paz ni el amor".

La verdad, sobre todo la sencilla, humilde y paciente verdad de la vida diaria, es el fundamento de la justicia. Ahora no

trato en modo alguno de las grandes verdades sobre Dios, el mundo y el hombre, sino de las pequeñas verdades de todos los días, si bien ambas, se hallan inseparablemente unidas entre sí. Quien está dispuesto a despreciar la verdad y utilizar en su lugar cínicamente la mentira, no puede admitir ninguna de las grandes.

Podemos preguntarnos: ¿Cuál es nuestra actitud al respecto? ¿Cómo nos comportamos ante la verdad de los hechos día tras día cada uno de nosotros? ¿Procuramos decir siempre la verdad? ¿Tenemos el valor de defenderla también cuando es incómoda, cuando turba nuestra tranquilidad y nos acarrea alguna contrariedad? Estas preguntas pueden atestiguar que, con alguna frecuencia nos avergonzamos o tenemos miedo a decir la verdad. La verdad es muchas veces poco agradable de manifestar y defender, porque nos suele producir serios inconvenientes pues con frecuencia se opone a la utilidad. Por eso se la soslaya fácilmente: es poco útil lo que ella significa y mucho más lo que ganamos. Mas si habitualmente pensamos y obramos así ¿quién podrá confiar en los demás? Cuando la verdad no está presente, se resquebraja el suelo social sobre el que nos apoyamos. De ahí que esta virtud -la veracidad- aparentemente poco útil, sea en realidad la virtud fundamental de la vida social.

Middlesex Offers Expanded Online and Summer Courses

With Middlesex Community College's growing list of online degree and certificate programs – and an expanded offering of summer online courses – your classroom is as close as your computer!

Notes From LHS Class of 1949

In 1949, 2062 students were enrolled at the Haverhill St. school - an increase over last year this included 16 post graduates.

Many athletic students for the blue & white that have graduated are now candidates for their college teams.

Playing freshman football at UNH are Steve Perocchi now retired and a Methuenite, and former 3 sport star Tommy Ruffen, now both members of the LHS Hall of Fame. Steve in later years became a teacher and football coach at LHS. Tom became a great fast pitch player for the famous Holihans teams and watched with great pride his offsprings as they performed at Salem HS. Ted Vartimos and Frank Annaldo also played on this UNH team.

Don Sanderson and Dick Vose are regulars on the Colby Varsity team.

Big Ernie Gregowicz of So. Lawrence is on the freshman team at Columbia. Ernie survived a head injury at LHS and was fitted with a makeshift helmet that contained a lot of foam rubber to protect his head. His size and the oversized helmet made him look like a cartoon character in the Buck Rogers series. His injury would have kept him off the field these days and would probably be known as a concussion. He's in the LHS Hall of Fame and retired from teaching at Amebury HS.

Leon Van Bellingham was a starter on the Columbia football squad and led them to the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. He is thought to be an All American candidate.

These student/athletes brought much favorable credit to the city and their former school.

The LAWRENCIAN the school newspaper was popular with all classes and could be purchased for 2 cents. Thirty four girls and six boys attended this year's first meeting of the newspapers staff. Ellen McHugh was named Editor in Chief, Helen Praetz, Patricia Burke, Bernadine Kennedy, Carol Dwyer, Florence McDuffie, Jane Fredette, and Norma Finberg were name Associate Editors. Arwilda Grant the circulation manager and Claire Kennedy the treasurer.

The school is in the midst of some major repairs. The walls and the corridors are freshly painted. The statues throughout the school have been cleaned and put back in place; a new shower room for the boys' gym is almost completed.

The parking area on Oak St. has been leveled and resurfaced with hot top.

Mayor James P Meehan and Alderman Andrew Donahue led their associates on the school committee in getting these changes for the students.

The try outs to be LHS cheerleads brought out over 200 girls. The team was selected by an impartial panel of judges. The candidates faced 2 cuts in 2 weeks. The list was narrowed to 25 girls. Good posture, scholastic record, health, and attendance records were part of the consideration.

Those selected were Ida DiAdamo, Carol Dwyer, Ellie Fitzgerald, Frances Martellini, Ellen McHugh, Ginny Pageau, Kay Salvo, Lorraine Sarcione, and Claire Weber.

New uniforms were handed out and Ellen Mc Hugh was elected the team Captain.

The homeroom teacher to the student: "Your card states you were born in Lawrence."

Dan, you are not just another candidate

If there's one person I really, really (honestly) like in the Lawrence City Council, is Danny Rivera. He is a jewel and we said that on this week's editorial, but...

Of course you knew there was a 'but'! Last week there was a very nice interview in the local newspaper that left me very disappointed. Danny sounded like any other politician: 'Tell the people what they want to hear'. Everything he said were the typical things we hear over and over again from all of them about public safety, schools, nothing specific, or ways to solve our problems.

We would love to increase the employment base but he talked about manufacturing jobs. Those days are gone in which the labor force required only strength and desire to work. Even manufacturing plants are now employing technology and the workforce has to be brought up to that level. Northern Essex Community College is doing that – educating a community for tomorrow's jobs. He should know that; he's a member of the Board of Trustees at NECC.

I had to laugh when I read that he wants to eliminate voice mail in city departments. He's too young and doesn't remember the days when we had to talk to someone and that someone had a fight with the spouse that morning, it would be reflected in their behavior with the customer. Voice mail is a blessing! You can leave a message and if the individual was angry, upset, whatever,

they will be calmed down by the time you get a call back with the answer to your problem or question.

It's just like when ATMs were introduced; people said that you would need an appointment to see a teller. Who wants to see a teller! The little boxes are quick, accurate and sometimes we don't even need to get out of the car. I don't want to go back to the old ways of doing things.

The kicker was when he talked about bringing 40 additional police officers. He chairs the Budget and Finance Committee in the council (doing a very good job) so he knows better than anyone else that in order to spend \$5 here, you have to get \$5 from over there. Even five officers each year is an exorbitant amount that taxpayers cannot support.

Many years ago, during one of the layoffs, Mayor Michael Sullivan closed the Howard St. fire station. In order to be able to reopen it we had to hire new firefighters and update the building at a tune of more than one million dollars. It's not easy!

We all want more of everything but when it is WE paying the bills through property taxes, we choose to go without.

We all want to feel pride in our city, particularly those who have witnessed the decline but having more parades won't do it. Rivera said that he wants to bring back the St. Patrick Day Parade, strengthen Hispanic Week and bring back the chili cook-off. Is that his idea of economic development? Those are private events organized by the community and the only reason why we have not had the St. Patrick Parade, Dominican Festival and Puerto Rican Festival is because everyone



is cutting back in expenses and the amount they must budget for the police at those events is prohibitive. Do you want a better example than the Italians? The Feast of the Three Saints on Labor Day weekend has weathered severe cuts but they blame it on the cost of paying the police officers.

And please Danny, don't tell me that you are going to meet with the business owners on a quarterly basis. That may last the first quarter only. It reminds me when Sullivan wanted to open city hall on one night each week for anyone to talk to him about anything and the only one always showing up was John Dmytrow. That didn't last, either.

Sitting on the council you know very well that the mayor doesn't get everything he wants – it has to be approved by the majority. Are you going to use the council's rejection as the excuse for not getting things done?

INSURANCE FRAUD



When we think of insurance fraud we usually think of staged accidents with phony injuries. Insurance companies think of "premium" fraud when they think fraud.

Premium fraud is when a person buys insurance but does not tell the complete truth on the application to try to lower their cost. Fraud does not pay!

AUTO

Fraud is not telling that your child has a license when buying car insurance because you don't want your rate to change. The state says you must add your child to your policy within 60 days of them obtaining a license. Fraud is not listing a spouse or family member because they have points on their license but they will drive the car. Fraud is saying that you live in a different city so your rate is less. Fraud is anyone lying to the company after a claim. If an unlisted operator has an accident (even if it's not their fault) your company can refuse to pay collision damage to your car, they can lower Property Damage to \$5,000 and lower the Optional Coverages if they pay a claim. Fraud is reporting your car stolen when it isn't. 85% of fraud is done by owners. Don't resort to fraud to help anyone.

HOME

Fraud is not telling that you own a dog when buying home/renters/condo insurance. Certain dogs are not wanted by many companies due to dog bites. Fraud is purchasing "homeowners" insurance when you are not living in the building. Homeowners insurance is for owner occupied buildings. Fraud is not admitting there is existing damage or that your company has issued a cancellation notice. Fraud is having a home based business and telling your company there isn't one. Fraud is adding an apartment without telling your company. If you lie, you can be cancelled for fraud.

porque los peces muerden el gusano en su carnada.

La primera pregunta que los quejoso en nuestro caso tenían que hacer a los miembros del comité de disertación de este individuo, particularmente su director, era: ¿Quién aceptó este tema y por qué? ¿Acaso se perdió en la pila de materiales (irrelevantes) y se coló en la lista? ¿Iba el mundo a ser mejor después de leer sus conclusiones? ¿Iba un indocumentado menor de edad separado de sus padres a beneficiarse por políticas de inmigración que se adoptaran por los miembros del Congreso que creyeron en sus conclusiones? Y esta razón está al tope de mi lista: ¿es este nuevo PhD capaz de dormir mejor después de publicar las implicaciones de su trabajo? En realidad, su empleador lo cesanteó después que terminó.

El segundo aspecto de esta disertación, como de todas ellas, es la investigación de la literatura relacionada con el tema. Es el más importante, docenas, sino cientos, de artículos y libros que coinciden con el tema, tienen que ser citados. ¿Qué artículos y libros en el universo de opiniones e investigaciones que alimentó sus opiniones sobre los hispanos encontró este investigador? Si hubiera utilizado la misma cantidad de tiempo y metodología para tratar de encontrar las condiciones sociales que pueden resultar en un pobre rendimiento mental, cualquiera sea su nombre, porque ignoramos sus causas principales, entonces el tema se hubiera hecho relevante y el mundo, dentro o fuera de nuestras fronteras, sería mejor. Triste; algunas veces a los PhD nos describen con el nombre burlón de ASP: Apilada Superior y Profunda. Usted trate de figurar lo que eso significa. Ya sabe por qué.

Así que descansen: los hispanos no tenemos un cociente de inteligencia más bajo. La misma tontería se dijo de los irlandeses, los italianos, los griegos, los judíos y otros inmigrantes que vinieron a este país al comienzo del siglo veinte. Nosotros somos el nuevo acento del siglo veintiuno y sonamos diferente. El Congreso estadounidense aprobará una política de inmigración más tarde o más temprano y el autor de esta disertación va a tener un tiempo difícil explicando a sus hijos lo que hacia mientras América estaba siendo... bueno, América la Bella.

Y este es mi punto de vista hoy.

DISSERTATION

But breath-in; breath out. Now that you have a committee, you must choose the dissertation subject itself. That may take forever, and is one of the blocks to the successful completion of a PhD. There are many doctoral students who describe themselves forever as ABD (All But Dissertation.) It has to be unique, typically one that would move us, our profession, in the direction of a better world. Several years ago I was invited to attend a dissertation presented at a local university by a biology doctoral student. The subject was the "reproductive" behavior of certain worm species. I could not figure out how the world could be better after that, but she actually proved it could be when she described the proliferation of worms in our agricultural lives. One never knows enough.

The chat was actually interesting. I learned more about the mating practices of worms than I really cared about, and it gave me a lasting opportunity to understand the damage I was causing when I stuck a poor worm in the hook of one of my fishing rods. But don't even think that subject was arcane. There are hundreds of possibilities when it comes to such a subject. Desperate doctoral students may use those results to produce other varieties of the same issue for their own work.

You could, for instance, consider "reproductive" behavior of certain worm species in Florida, or Massachusetts; how about during the spring, the summer, or listening to the bongos coming from the Cuban carnival in Calle Ocho? Well, you get my drift. Those are worthy of study, each a candidate for a paperback on the subject to be bought and read by fishers while they wait patiently for the fish to catch the worm bait.

So the first question asked from the members of the dissertation committee by the complainers, particularly the influential Chair, about this fellow's dissertation was: who accepted this subject and why? Did it get lost in the pile of other (irrelevant) material in the in-box and pass muster? Was the world going to be better off after reading its conclusions? Was any child separated from his or her undocumented

parent going to benefit by the immigration policies that might've been voted up or down by members of Congress who bought the research results? And, this one tops my list, was this new "PhD" capable of sleeping better after learning of the implications of his work? He was actually fired by his employer after he was done.

The second aspect of this dissertation in question, as in all others, is the related literature research. It is the most important. Dozens, if not hundreds, of articles and books in support of the work must be cited. What articles and books in the universe of opinions and research in his subject did this fellow find that fed his opinion about Hispanics? He was not working on some sort of quantitative research where you weigh and measure a physical characteristic easy to catalog. I can measure hair or color easily, but not my opinion that fellows with my hair color are more attractive to the ladies. He was studying qualitative traits that vary and are impossible to trace because their roots are also different to locate: poverty, education, equality of opportunity.

The problem in this case was not the answer this fellow found. The tragedy is the question itself. If he had used the same amount of time and methodologies trying to find the societal conditions that may result in poor mental performance, whatever its name, because we ignore its mean causes, then the subject would become relevant and the world, in or outside our borders, would be the better for it. Sad; sometimes we PhDs, are humorously described as getting it Piled Higher and Deeper. Now you know why.

So relax: Hispanics don't have lower IQ's than the general population. The same nonsense was said of the Irish, Italian, Greek, Jewish and other immigrants who came to this country at the beginning of the twentieth century. We are just the new accent of the twenty first century and sound different. Congress will approve an immigration policy sooner or later and the author of this "dissertation" will have a tough time explaining to his children "what he was doing when America was being... well, America the beautiful."

And that is my Point of View Today.



(Note to entering freshmen: Tread carefully around student loan debt. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) has a great guide for making informed decisions about paying for college at www.consumerfinance.gov/students.)

After you've factored in rent, car payments, renter's and car insurance, credit card charges, student loan balances and other monthly bills (not to mention payroll taxes such as Social Security tax, which went up 2 percent this year), your new salary probably won't go as far as you'd like, especially if you're trying to save for one of those life events.

That's where a budget can help. Numerous free budgeting tools, including interactive calculators, are available at such sites as the government-sponsored MyMoney.gov (www.mymoney.gov), the National Foundation for Credit Counseling (www.nfcc.org), Mint.com (<https://www.mint.com>) and Practical Money Skills for Life (www.practicalmoneyskills.com), a free personal financial management program run by Visa Inc.

Next, know the score, credit-wise.






Cherokee: Gaited Horse: Male

Estimado Editor:

El verano no ha siquiera comenzado, y ya ha habido reportes en todo el país de perros sufriendo y muriendo luego de haber sido dejados en vehículos aparcados expuestos al calor. En Sacramento, California, una camada de nueve cachorros de un mes, junto a su madre y su padre, han debido ser rescatados de un automóvil aparcado, cerrado, y muy caluroso en su interior. En Tennessee, dos mujeres enfrentan cargos por crueldad luego de que uno de los tres perros que dejaron en un vehículo aparcado con calor murió mientras ellas hacían compras.

En apenas minutos un animal atrapado en un auto con calor afuera puede ser cocinado vivo: en un día caluroso, mismo con las ventanillas apenas abiertas, la temperatura dentro de un auto aparcado puede llegar a los 160 grados. Aparcar el automóvil a la sombra y/o dejar agua en el vehículo no ayudará. Los perros no pueden bajar su temperatura corporal tan eficientemente como los humanos, y pueden sucumbir a un golpe de calor en apenas 15 minutos, resultando en daño cerebral o muerte. Los síntomas incluyen agitación, sed excesiva, intenso jadeo, letargo, falta de apetito y coordinación, lengua oscurecida y vómitos.

Cuando hace apenas un poco de calor afuera, por favor nunca deje a su animal en un auto aparcado, ni siquiera durante "apenas un minuto". Si ve un perro en un auto detenido cuando hace calor, busque al propietario o llame al 911 inmediatamente, ya que la vida del perro depende de ello. Visite PETALatino.com para más información.

Dear Editor:

Summer has not yet even arrived, and already there have been reports from across the country of dogs suffering and dying after being left in hot vehicles. In Sacramento, Calif., a litter of nine 1-month-old puppies—along with their mother and father—had to be rescued from a locked hot car. In Tennessee, two women are facing cruelty charges after one of the three dogs they left in a hot vehicle died while they shopped.

It takes only minutes for an animal in a hot car to be cooked alive: On a warm day, even with the windows open a crack, the temperature inside a parked car can reach more than 160 degrees. Parking in the shade and/or leaving water in the vehicle won't help. Dogs can't cool themselves as efficiently as humans can, and they can succumb to heatstroke in just 15 minutes, resulting in brain damage or death. Symptoms include restlessness, excessive thirst, heavy panting, lethargy, lack of appetite and coordination, a dark tongue, and vomiting.

When it's even just a little warm outside, please never leave any animal in a parked car—even for "just a minute." If you see a dog left in a hot car, have the owner paged or call 911 immediately—the dog's life depends on it. Visit PETA.org to learn more.


