# Nuevo Jefe de Policía

El Alcalde William Lantigua emitió una orden ejecutiva que indica que el Capitán James Fitzpatrick asumió el papel de jefe de policía el martes, 3 de septiembre 2013. En esa fecha, el Jefe John Romero renunció a todos los poderes y deberes de su posición.

"Con el retiro del Jefe Romero tenemos un gran vacío que llenar en este departamento y estoy trabajando diligentemente para seleccionar una persona que me parezca mejor para el Departamento de Policía de Lawrence y de los ciudadanos de Lawrence", declaró el Alcalde Lantigua. "El Capitán Fitzpatrick es un miembro digno de confianza de nuestro departamento y estoy seguro de que hasta que tome una decisión final va a servir bien a nuestra ciudad",

declaró además Lantigua.

El Capitán Fitzpatrick es un veterano de 20 años del Departamento de Policía de Lawrence y actualmente se desempeña como Oficial de Fiscalía.

"Durante los últimos dos meses me he centrado incansablemente en este proceso de selección y estoy satisfecho con el calibre de profesionales de la ley que han expresado interés en ser nuestro próximo jefe de policía. Les agradezco a todos ellos y aprecio su paciencia mientras continúo haciendo mi decisión", destacó Lantigua.

El Alcalde Lantigua espera nombrar a un jefe de la policía permanente dentro de los próximos 30 días.

## New Chief of Police

Mayor William Lantigua issued an executive order indicating that Captain James Fitzpatrick assumed the role of Chief of Police effective Tuesday, September 3, 2013. On that date, Chief John Romero relinquished all powers and duties of the position.

"With Chief Romero's retirement, we have a large void to fill in this department and I am working diligently to select a person that I feel is best for the Lawrence Police Department and the Citizens of Lawrence," stated Mayor Lantigua. "Captain Fitzpatrick is a trusted and worthy member of our department and I feel confident that until I make my final decision

he will serve our City well", further stated Lantigua.

Captain Fitzpatrick is a 20 year veteran of the Lawrence Police Department and currently serves as the Prosecuting Officer.

"Over the past two months I have focused tirelessly on this selection process and I am energized with the caliber of law enforcement professionals that have expressed interest in being our next Police Chief. I thank all of them and appreciate their patience as I continue with my decision making process," emphasized Lantigua.

Mayor Lantigua expects to appoint a new Police Chief within the next 30 days.

### El papel de los legisladores

Muy a menudo, el público cree que un político se coloca en su posición para votar de acuerdo a nuestro gusto y se enoja cuando toma el voto "equivocado". Votamos a su favor para ese cargo debido a que durante la campaña nos han demostrado que son pensadores independientes y gente de principios y ética. Ponemos nuestra confianza en ellos para que cuiden por nuestros intereses, ateniéndose a las leyes vigentes.

Apoyamos a cualquier político que tome una decisión basada en la información disponible que les permite decidir, sea o no compatible con nuestra propia opinión. Después de todo, tienen acceso a documentos, información, conversaciones y testimonios que no hemos visto, lo que les permite ver el efecto general que tendrá. Ahí es donde la confianza se basa: en su honor a la hora de tomar una decisión que es – conforme con la ley.

El Senador Ed Markey, miembro del Comité de Relaciones con el Extranjero, ha estado en el Congreso desde hace 37 años, no es un recién llegado a la escena política, sin embargo, votó "presente" en la decisión de si invadir Siria o no. Esta ambivalencia es un signo de cobardía y es inaceptable. Tendría que haber votado de una manera u otra lo que demuestra que él tiene una opinión sobre el tema.

A nivel local, hubo algo que sucedió durante la reciente reunión del Concejo Municipal mientras discutían los candidatos a las juntas y las comisiones de la ciudad. Siempre hemos defendido el derecho de los concejales de la ciudad para votar su conciencia por las mismas razones explicadas anteriormente. Cuando el Concejal por el Distrito D, Kendrys Vásquez dijo que no va a votar por ningún empleado municipal que sea nominado a una junta o comisión, ya que es una regla que creó para sí mismo desde que fue elegido para el concilio, nos preguntamos por qué ningún otro concejal saltó a corregirlo.

A los concejales no se les permite hacer sus propias reglas en la votación de algo. Se supone que deben cumplir con la ley. Hay una ley de Massachusetts, 930 CMR 6.02 que permite a los empleados municipales servir a sus comunidades en los puestos no remunerados en juntas y comisiones. ¿Está el Concejal Vasquez rebelándose contra las leyes del estado?

Varios concejales expresaron la misma opinión con respecto a los empleados de la ciudad en vez de felicitarlos por su esfuerzo extra para ver que la ciudad funcione correctamente. No tenemos una multitud de personas que solicitan estos puestos y, mientras tanto, el trabajo de algunos de esos grupos se ha estancado debido a la falta de miembros.

Los residentes de Lawrence se merecen una disculpa por jugar a la política con el futuro de la ciudad y se preparen para aprobar a los candidatos si es que realmente se preocupan por nuestro progreso.

### The role of legislators

Very often, the public believes that a politician was placed in his or her position to vote according to our liking and get angry when the 'wrong' vote is taken. We vote them into office because during the campaign they have shown us that they are independent thinkers and people of principles and ethics. We place our confidence in them to watch for our interests, abiding by existing laws.

We support any politician that based on the information privileged to them makes a decision whether or not it is compatible with our own opinion. After all, they have access to documents, details, conversations, testimonies that we have not seen, allowing them to see 'the big picture'. That's where our confidence relies: in their honor in making a decision that is just – according to the law.

Senator Ed Markey, a member of the Foreign Relations Committee has been in Congress for 37 years; he is not a newcomer on the political scene yet he voted "present" in the Syria decision to invade or not. That ambivalence is a sign of cowardice and it is unacceptable. He should have voted one way or the other demonstrating that he has an opinion of the subject.

At the local level, something happened during the recent City Council meeting while discussing the nominees to board and commissions in the city. We have always defended the right of our city councilors to vote their conscience for the same reasons explained above. When District D Councilor Kendrys Vasquez said that he will not vote for any city employee being nominated to a board or commission because that is a rule he set up for himself since he was elected to the council, we wondered why no other councilor jumped up to correct him.


Councilors are not allowed to make their own rules when voting on anything. They are supposed to abide by the law. There is a Massachusetts law 930 CMR 6.02 that allows municipal employees to serve their communities in unpaid positions on boards and commissions. Is Councilor Vasquez now rebelling against the laws of the Commonwealth?

Several councilors expressed the same opinion regarding city employees rather than commend them for their extra effort to see the city function properly. We don't have throngs of people applying for these boards and in the meantime, the work of some of those groups has become stagnant due to the lack of members.

The residents of Lawrence deserve an apology for playing politics with the future of the city and get ready to approve the nominees if they really care for our progress.







# The City of Lawrence fighting obesity

## The City of Lawrence and the Mayor's Health Task Force Announce Commitment to Fight Obesity

### Healthy Active Living Resolution pledges partnerships to improve health among residents

Mayor William Lantigua of Lawrence has announced the city's commitment to fight obesity. Together, the Mayor's Health Task Force, the Lawrence Board of Health and other community partners are collaborating to put a recently-adopted Healthy Active Living Resolution into action.

Among the priorities outlined in the resolution are improving recreational areas of the city to promote physical activity; increasing access to affordable, healthy foods; reviewing vending machine contracts across the city; and implementing a municipal employee wellness program.

"There is amazing work already being done to improve health in our city," said Mayor Lantigua. "The Healthy Active Living Resolution cements our goals to create work, school and neighborhood environments that give our residents healthier choices."

The resolution charges the Mayor's Health Task Force (MHTF) and various city departments to submit recommendations to

the mayor within a year. Potential proposals might include policy changes, recruitment of public and private partner organizations, and planning specific locations for community gardens and new parks.

A generous grant awarded to Merrimack Valley YMCA will help fund the strategies identified by the task force and its partners. Merrimack Valley Y is one of 16 Ys to participate in the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's national Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) initiative. REACH targets Y communities which have a population under 500,000, are low-income, and are at least 50 percent racial/ethnic minority.

Being selected for the REACH initiative allows the Merrimack Valley YMCA to work collaboratively with and support the Mayor's Health Task Force's Healthy Active Living Working Group, co-chaired by representatives from the MVYMC and Groundwork Lawrence, to address barriers to good health. The local portion of the grant is \$150,000 over two years.

"REACH funding will help our collaboration implement evidence-based strategies and support new programs that enhance proper nutrition and physical activity, ultimately decreasing the incidence

of obesity in Lawrence," said Vilma Lora, coordinator of the Mayor's Health Task Force. "All of the partners are excited about being part of the solution."

One initiative to come from the REACH grant and efforts by the Mayor's Health Task Force is the start of a public awareness campaign called SALSA. The acronym stands for "Supporting Active Life Styles for All," and will promote standards for healthy living, educating community members about the importance of eating nutritious foods and exercising.

Since its inception in 2002, the Mayor's Health Task Force has been promoting healthy living and addressing health inequities through a variety of efforts, including community-wide education and awareness campaigns, health fairs, and health screening events. The MHTF Healthy Active Living Working Group was established in late 2010, bringing representatives from approximately 20 area organizations together to evaluate the assets and the needs of the community related to nutrition and physical activity. Group members created a community action plan, which aims to increase access to healthy food options and to promote opportunities for recreation and to stay active. The Healthy Active Living Resolution and the REACH grant are an extension of this wonderful work.

Many preventable risk factors—tobacco use, poor nutrition and lack of physical activity—are more common in communities of color, often resulting in higher prevalence of chronic diseases, such as heart disease, stroke, diabetes, cancer and asthma, among others. The Massachusetts Department of Public Health reports that nearly 45 percent of children and 69 percent of adults in Lawrence are overweight or obese.



The City of Lawrence has had additional successes in revitalizing the city's status as a great place to live, work and play, such as the opening of the Spicket River Greenway in June. The Greenway is a three and a half mile long "emerald bracelet" of green spaces and walking paths connecting parks and open space through multiple neighborhoods. The Greenway project earned Lawrence honorable mention recognition from the 2013 U.S. Conference of Mayors City Livability Awards. The awards honor mayors and their city governments for developing programs that enhance the quality of life in urban areas.

"Where you live should not affect your health," said Peter Blanchette, of the Lawrence Board of Health. "Unfortunately, it is the reality of urban areas such as ours. This partnership to implement the Mayor's Healthy Active Living Resolution will make a positive difference."

### Resolución para Vidas Activas y Saludables se compromete a colaboraciones para mejorar la salud entre residentes

El Alcalde de Lawrence, William Lantigua, ha anunciado el compromiso de la ciudad para luchar contra la obesidad. barreras que impiden la buena salud. La porción local de la dádiva es \$150,000 por el promedio de dos años.

"Los fondos de REACH ayudarán a que nuestra colaboración implemente estrategias basadas en evidencia y apoyar nuevos programas que aumentan la nutrición adecuada y la actividad física, y a la larga disminuir los incidentes de obesidad en Lawrence," dijo Vilma Lora, Coordinadora de La Unidad a Beneficio de la Salud de la Alcaldía de Lawrence. "Todos los socios están muy contentos de ser parte de la solución."

Una de las iniciativas que saldrá de esta donación de REACH y los esfuerzos de La Unidad a Beneficio de la Salud del Alcalde es el comienzo de una campaña pública llamada SALSA. Las siglas representan su nombre en inglés lo cual es "Supporting Active Life Styles for All". En español esto significa "Apoyando un Modo de Vida Activo para Todos." Esta iniciativa promueve normas para una vida saludable, educando a miembros de la comunidad sobre la importancia de comer comidas nutritivas y hacer ejercicios.

Desde su comienzo en el 2002, La Unidad a Beneficio de la Salud de la Alcaldía de Lawrence ha estado promoviendo vidas saludables y buscando soluciones a los problemas de desigualdad de la salud a través de una variedad de esfuerzos, incluyendo educación comunitaria y campañas de concienciación, ferias de salud, y eventos para evaluar la salud. El Comité de Trabajo Vidas Activas y Saludables fue establecido a finales del 2010, atrayendo a aproximadamente 20 organizaciones de la comunidad para evaluar los fortalezas y las necesidades de la comunidad relacionadas a la nutrición y la actividad física. Los miembros del comité crearon un plan de acción para la comunidad el cual tiene

como objetivo aumentar acceso a alimentos saludables y promover oportunidades para recreación y actividad física. La Resolución de Vidas Activas y Saludables y la donación de REACH representan una extensión de esta labor maravillosa.

Muchos factores de riesgo que pueden ser prevenibles—uso de tabaco, mala nutrición y falta de actividad física—son más comunes en comunidades de color, muchas veces resultando en más frecuencias de enfermedades crónicas, tales como enfermedad del corazón, derrames cerebrales, diabetes, cáncer, y asma, entre otros. El Departamento de Salud Pública de Massachusetts reporta que casi el 45 por ciento de niños y 69 por ciento de adultos en Lawrence están sobre peso u obesos.

La ciudad de Lawrence ha tenido éxitos adicionales en la revitalización de la condición de la ciudad como un lugar maravilloso de vivir, trabajar y jugar, como la apertura del sendero Spicket River Greenway en junio. ## MassHousing working to provide affordable loans for minority buyers

In the housing crisis, minorities were targeted by predatory lenders. Now, the state's affordable housing bank is offering safe, affordable loans and reaching out to minority homebuyers.

As the real estate market improves, the public lending agency MassHousing is working to make its products better known to minority homebuyers who once were a prime target for predatory lending.

"Leading up to the real estate crash in 2007, predatory and subprime lenders unfairly targeted neighborhoods of color, especially African American and Latino neighborhoods" said Tom Gleason, MassHousing's Executive Director. "As a public agency created to help low- and moderate-income families buy homes, we have always offered loans that people can truly afford. We want people to know we're here and that we are a lender they can trust."


The "Reforming Mortgage Lending" research by University of Massachusetts-Boston economics professor Jim Campen revealed "Reforming Mortgage Lending", that in the year 2006 - the year preceding the crash - 49 percent of all home-purchase loans to African-Americans in Greater Boston and 48 percent of all home-purchase loans to Latinos in Greater Boston were high-cost loans compared to just 11 percent of all loans to Whites.

"The subprime and predatory lenders who were around 5 or 10 years ago are for the most part gone," said Gleason. "But with people ready to buy homes again, we want to make sure that families who were likely to be talked into a high-cost loan before now have a much more affordable option with a MassHousing loan."

With a decades-long commitment to promoting diversity and economic opportunity, MassHousing remains loyal to its public mission to make home ownership as affordable as possible, providing equal access to mortgage loans with features and benefits that customers will not find at a traditional lender: low down payments, no mortgage insurance premiums, job-loss protection on certain loans, and a customer service staff that will work to make the investor feel at home while explaining everything and educating them, helping the borrowers to understand their loan and work with them if they fall behind on payments. In May 2013, MassHousing was also named a finalist for two Rosoff Awards presented by The Ad Club to companies with meaningful diversity, mentoring and inclusion programs. 







The first Feast was held in 1923 and it has been an annual event. Since then, the Saints Alfio, Filadelfo and Cirino Society has maintained the tradition of honoring the Three Saints in the same manner as the original Festa in Trecastagni, Sicily.

During the early part of the 20th century, immigrants who came from that region of Sicily used to work under unsafe conditions, medical insurance was not provided and there was no social welfare for these employees and their families.

To help each other, these Sicilian immigrants formed a mutual benefit organization to provide medical needs, a death benefit and offer food assistance when needed. In short, the immigrants created their own social security.

The Merrimack Valley Hospice House was licensed for a 21 suite facility when the Capital Campaign was initially launched in 2007. It was deemed at the time that the

seven additional suites would be built when occupancy and demand exceeded capacity. With the expansion of their new wing, it will enable the Hospice House to meet the demand for comprehensive end-of-life care of approximately 800 additional patients annually.

Since Merrimack Valley Hospice House opened in June 2009 it has been operating at or near capacity, serving more than 1,600 patients. Licensed by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health for a 21 suite facility, the Hospice House was designed for a two-phase construction: the initial 14 suites, then, a final phase of seven suites at a time when occupancy and demand for services exceeded capacity. No one anticipated that time would come so quickly.

The addition of the new wing will allow for 21 private patient suites in total, of which two can accommodate pediatric patients. All suites feature skylights, a private bathroom and seating and space for loved ones to visit at any time of day or night. The wing will reflect the existing peacefulness of a home setting with patios, family gathering area, a care station and



several common areas.


## Special Field Games September 21st at NECC's Haverhill Campus

An insurance policy is not a maintenance agreement. If your roof is old you must pay to replace it. The insurance company does not pay for a new roof if it starts to leak. You must maintain your property to avoid having losses and to avoid having your insurance cancelled.

A company may non-renew your insurance if you file a claim.

A company may cancel or non-renew your policy if the condition or use of your building changes.

If you move from one home to another you must change the type of policy on the home you do not live in. If you have a loss, and you have the wrong type of insurance you may not be paid for a loss.

## Grant Writing Workshop to be offered at NECC

Nonprofit organizations and individuals eager to break into the grant writing arena can attend a series of three workshops, hosted by the Grant Resource Center at Northern Essex Community College.

The center and its workshops are supported in part by funding from The United Way of Massachusetts Bay & Merrimack Valley and Associated Grant Makers and in collaboration with Jericho Road Lawrence.

The workshop series will be held in October at Northern Essex Community College's Lawrence Campus, Riverwalk at 360 Merrimack Street, Building 9, Entry K.

The first class, "Introduction to Grants Research," will be held on Wednesday, October 9 from 2 to 4 p.m. This workshop introduces participants to the world of philanthropy and covers grants research and how to approach foundations. In addition, participants will learn how to tell an organization's story for best effect. There will be discussion of several databases that are critical to finding the right grant maker for an organization.

The second class, "Introduction to Grant Writing for Beginners," will be held Tuesday, October 22, from 2 to 4 p.m. Participants will learn how to create a winning grant proposal. Different types of grant proposals will be examined and the typical components of a proposal as well as the steps in the process will be discussed.

The third and final class, "Introduction to Grant Writing II for Beginners," will be offered Thursday, October 31, from 2 to 5 p.m. This workshop is for individuals who have completed "Introduction to Grant Writing for Beginners" or those who already have some experience in grant writing, but would like to expand their knowledge. During this three-hour workshop,

individuals will learn how to plan a grant for maximum funding success, the secret language used by successful grant writers, how to think like a reviewer, simple ways to package a grant for maximum effect, and grant writing do's and don'ts based upon well-written sample grants. The workshop will provide time for interaction with lively discussion and concrete examples.

Seats in these courses fill up quickly so those interested are encouraged to register early. The cost for each of the first two workshops is \$30 plus a \$5 materials fee; the cost for the third workshop is \$40 plus a \$5 materials fee.

## Grant Funds Program to Accelerate Education of English Language Learners

There are still 10 spaces available in a free Career Pathways Bridge Program offered through Northern Essex Community College to advanced English language learners hoping to enter the health or information technology fields.

Thanks to a \$100,000 Smith Family Foundation grant, NECC has developed a Career Pathways Bridge Program that will place a total 30 advanced English language learners, on the fast track to reaching their goal of a career in health care or information technology.

This new, two-semester program, meets Mondays and Wednesdays from 6 to 9 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. beginning September 4 through December 14 and January 22 through May 10 at NECC's Riverwalk on Merrimack Street in Lawrence. The program, which is taught by faculty with backgrounds in these career fields in addition to being experienced language instructors, integrates intensive English reading and writing, math, career, and college readiness skills. Northern Essex will receive \$100,000 a year for the next three years.

This program was designed specifically to accelerate the education of advanced English language learners from the Merrimack Valley, who, are not quite ready to enter a college degree or certificate program.

The Career Pathways Bridge Program will fast track these individuals.

"Many adults don't have the time or the money to persist," says Amanda Kelly, coordinator of the Career Pathways Bridge

Program. "This program will accelerate their English skills and bridge them to certificate programs and eventual gainful employment."

This will be a hybrid program in that the participants will be required to complete additional hours of work outside of the classroom.

"This is a very intensive program," says Chalek. "It is designed for the serious student."

# IRS Ofrece Consejos Sobre Cómo Enmendar su Declaración de Impuestos

## Consejo Tributario de Verano del IRS 2013-20

Si usted descubre un error después de presentar su declaración de impuestos, se puede corregir enmendando su declaración.

Aquí hay 10 consejos del Servicio de Impuestos Internos (IRS) sobre cómo enmendar su declaración federal de impuestos:

### 1. Cuándo enmendar una declaración.

Usted debe presentar una declaración enmendada si necesita corregir su estado civil, número de dependientes, ingresos totales, deducciones o créditos tributarios. Las instrucciones del Formulario 1040X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return (en inglés), enumeran razones adicionales para enmendar su declaración.

### 2. Cuándo NO enmendar una declaración.

En algunos casos, usted no necesita enmendar su declaración de impuestos. Por ejemplo, el IRS generalmente corrige errores matemáticos cuando procesa la declaración original. Si omitió un formulario o anexo requerido, el IRS le enviará una notificación solicitando el faltante.

### 3. Formulario que debe usar.

Use el Formulario 1040X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return (en inglés), para enmendar un Formulario 1040,

1040A, 1040EZ, 1040NR o 1040NR-EZ previamente presentado. Asegúrese de marcar en el Formulario 1040X la casilla para el año de la declaración que está enmendando. No se puede enmendar una declaración de impuestos electrónicamente. Debe presentar la enmienda de la declaración de impuestos en papel.

### 4. Múltiples declaraciones enmendadas.

Si está enmendando más de un año de declaraciones de impuestos, prepare un Formulario 1040X para cada declaración. Envíelas por correo en sobres separados al centro de proceso del IRS correspondiente. (ver "Where to File" en las instrucciones del Formulario 1040X (en inglés)).

### 5. Formulario 1040X.

El Formulario 1040X tiene tres columnas. La columna A muestra las cifras originales de la declaración. La columna B muestra los cambios que se están efectuando. La columna C muestra las cifras correctas. Hay un área en el dorso del formulario explicando los cambios específicos y la razón de los cambios.

### 6. Otros Formularios o Anexos.

Si los cambios implican otros anexos o formularios, adjúntelos al Formulario 1040X. No hacerlo retrasará el proceso.

7. Reembolso adicional. Si espera un reembolso de su declaración original, espere hasta recibir su reembolso antes de presentar la enmienda. Puede cobrar el cheque de reembolso de su declaración original. El IRS le enviará cualquier reembolso adicional si le pertenece.

### 8. Enmienda para pagar impuesto adicional.

Si está presentando una declaración de impuestos enmendada porque adeuda impuestos adicionales, debe presentar el Formulario 1040X y pagar el impuesto tan pronto le sea posible para reducir los cargos, intereses y multas.

### 9. Cuándo presentar.

Generalmente, para reclamar un reembolso, debe presentarse el Formulario 1040X en los tres años siguientes a la fecha en que presentó su declaración de impuestos original o en dos años a partir de la fecha en que pagó el impuesto, la fecha que sea más tarde.

### 10. Tiempo de procesamiento.

El procesamiento normal de declaraciones enmendadas es de 8 a 12 semanas.

# IRS Offers Tips on How to Amend Your Tax Return

## IRS Summertime Tax Tip 2013-20

If you discover an error after you file your tax return, you can correct it by amending your return.

Here are 10 tips from the Internal Revenue Service about amending your federal tax return:

**1. When to amend a return.** You should file an amended return if you need to correct your filing status, number of dependents, total income, tax deductions or tax credits. The instructions for Form 1040X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, list additional reasons to amend a return.

**2. When NOT to amend a return.** In some cases, you don't need to amend your tax return. For example, the IRS usually corrects math errors when processing your original return. If you did not include a required form or schedule, the IRS will send you a request for whatever is missing.

**3. Form to use.** Use Form 1040X to amend a previously filed Form 1040, 1040A,

## TX TIPS

1040EZ, 1040NR or 1040NR-EZ. Make sure you check the box to show the tax year that you are amending on the Form 1040X. You cannot e-file an amended return. You must file an amended tax return on paper.

**4. Multiple amended returns.** If you're filing an amended return for more than one year, prepare a separate 1040X for each return. Mail them in separate envelopes to the appropriate IRS processing center. (See "Where to File" in the instructions for Form 1040X.)

**5. Form 1040X.** Form 1040X has three columns. Column A shows figures from the original return. Column B shows the changes you are making. Column C shows the corrected figures. There is also an area on the back of the form where you should explain the specific changes and the reasons for the changes.

**6. Other forms or schedules.** If the changes involve other tax schedules or forms, attach them to the Form 1040X. Failure to do this will cause a delay in processing.

**7. Amending to claim an additional refund.** If you're expecting a refund from your original tax return, don't file your amended return until after you have received that refund. You may cash the refund check from your original return. The IRS will send you any additional refund you are owed.

**8. Amending to pay additional tax.** If you're filing an amended tax return because you owe additional tax, you should file Form 1040X and pay the tax as soon as possible to limit any interest and penalty charges.

**9. When to file.** To claim a refund, you generally must file Form 1040X within three years from the date you filed your original tax return or within two years from the date you paid the tax, whichever is later.

**10. Processing time.** Normal processing time for amended returns is 8 to 12 weeks.




