

La tasación no es una ciencia exacta

La tasación en bienes raíces es un estimado u opinión profesional del valor de la propiedad. Usualmente, es presentado en un reporte narrativo que indica el valor de la propiedad en una fecha determinada y es corroborado por el análisis de datos verídicos correspondiente a la propiedad. El tasador no establece, crea ni determina el valor de la propiedad, sino que da una opinión profesional de su valor. La exactitud de esta evaluación depende de la experiencia y los conocimientos del tasador y de la disponibilidad de datos para comparación.

El proceso de tasación no es una ciencia exacta por lo que dos tasadores, por lo general, llegarán a conclusiones diferentes con relación al valor de una propiedad. Tasar es considerado un arte que puede ser aprendido y desarrollado mediante entrenamiento y experiencia. A pesar de que el agente de bienes raíces posee conocimientos generales del proceso de tasamiento, es necesario contratar a un tasador profesional para obtener una evaluación oficial.

El propósito de tasar la propiedad es evaluar el valor que tiene la propiedad en el mercado. El valor en el mercado es considerado como el precio más alto que a un comprador le gustaría pagar por la propiedad actuando libremente y el valor más bajo que un vendedor aceptaría sin recibir ningún tipo de presión, asumiendo que ambos tienen toda la información correspondiente a la propiedad y que esta ha estado en el mercado por cierto tiempo. El valor en el mercado de la propiedad es usualmente estimado tomando en cuenta el precio de propiedades similares que han sido vendidas recientemente.

El valor de una propiedad no es una característica intrínseca de la misma, sino que está estrechamente relacionado al deseo

que un posible comprador tenga por la misma y a la necesidad de viviendas y el ingreso, de manera que cuando aumenta la necesidad de viviendas y se reducen las ofertas el valor de la propiedad aumenta.

La propiedad también puede ser tasada para determinar el valor que una compañía financiera estaría dispuesta a prestar si se pone la misma como garantía, el valor que una compañía de seguro estaría dispuesta a asegurar o para determinar el valor de la renta.

El costo de la propiedad y su valor en el mercado pueden ser diferentes, por ejemplo, una propiedad que costó 180,000 dólares podría ser vendida por 240,000 dólares debido a una localización preferida.

La oferta y demanda, el uso y las reparaciones que se le haya hecho a la propiedad son principios económicos que afectan su valor. El valor de los perfeccionamientos y reparaciones hechos a una propiedad de bienes raíces no es medido por el costo de los mismos sino por el aumento en la productividad de ingresos que estos provean a la propiedad. Por ejemplo, la construcción de una piscina por 20,000 dólares en una casa de una familia podría aumentar el valor de la casa por 10,000 dólares, mientras que la construcción de la misma piscina en un edificio de apartamentos podría aumentar el valor del edificio por 30,000 dólares porque se podría aumentar el precio de la renta de cada apartamento en la propiedad.

El poder y la autoridad

Observando la vida familiar nos encontramos con madres y padres que no consiguen que sus hijos les obedezcan. Una madre se quejaba de que su hijo le contestaba, le respondía con palabrotas y no hacía nada de los que le decía. Otra madre le preguntó: ¿Qué edad tiene el chico? Pues tres años -le contestó. A lo que interpuso: Pues si ahora no logras educar a tu hijo, ¿qué pasará cuando tenga catorce o dieciséis años?

Este mismo problema de falta de autoridad también se da entre los profesores. ¿Por qué unos son respetados y consiguen una clase silenciosa donde se trabaja y se estudia con aprovechamiento y otros profesores no consiguen hacer callar a sus alumnos, se insultan entre ellos, hacen ruidos y apenas puede dar la clase en condiciones aceptables?

Hay una serie de factores que desembocan en la pérdida de autoridad tanto de los padres como de los profesores. Una de ellas es dar muchas órdenes, sin esperar que se cumplan. Alguien decía que la escuela es el lugar donde más órdenes se dan y donde menos se cumplen. Los alumnos o los hijos adquieren el hábito de no hacer caso a lo que se les dice.

Otro factor que perjudica la autoridad es mostrarse dubitativo, son convicciones personales fuertes con poca seguridad en

sus razonamientos.

Pero el aspecto más negativo es imponer la dictadura familiar. Empeñarse en que los chicos obedezcan "porque sí", sin darles las necesarias razones para ello. En este caso se confunde el poder con la autoridad. El poder se recibe, por la gracia de estado, ya sea por ser padre o profesor. Pero usar ese poder para conseguir "a la fuerza" que los pequeños obedezcan siempre sin rechistar es mala estrategia.

La autoridad, por el contrario, hay que ganarla y se puede adquirir y mejorar. Los chicos han de aprender a obedecer en un clima de libertad. Cuando son pequeños, ven a sus padres con toda su autoridad y es fácil obedecerlos. Pero cuando llegan a la adolescencia hay mayor contestación y se rebelan cuando se les mandan cosas que no entienden. Si los padres han abusado de imposición, el fracaso educativo está asegurado.

A lo largo de la infancia y adolescencia habrá que prepararlos para que puedan elegir libremente lo mejor. Es difícil en un clima de libertad, pero es el único camino.

Unos padres, llevados por una falsa idea de la tolerancia, dejan caer a los hijos en el permisivismo y otros padres, abusando de su poder (no de su autoridad), se empeñan en convertir su casa en un cuartel. Ambos extremos son



El Alcalde Michael J. Sullivan se complace en anunciar otra instalación de una Estación de Seguridad en el recién expandido Parque Pemberton en Lawrence, MA. Producto de la tragedia de los cuatro niños que se ahogaron en el Río Merrimack unos años atrás, estas estaciones son una respuesta más práctica a la otra opción de poner una cerca de lo largo del río. Fue decidido que la mayoría de los muchachos podrían encontrar la forma de por debajo, por arriba o de alguna manera vencer la cerca o cualquier tipo de barrera pudiera impedir los esfuerzos de rescate del personal de seguridad pública.

"Tenemos muchos peligros que son típicos de nuestro ambiente y debemos aprender a estar vigilantes para que todos los residentes estén a salvo. Sin embargo, al igual que las carreteras de trenes y autopistas proveen buena transportación, nuestros ríos proveen buenas oportunidades de recreación cuando se tratan con cautela," dijo el Alcalde Sullivan.

Las estaciones de seguridad fueron diseñadas incorporando las técnicas de salvavidas de la Cruz Roja y cuentan con un componente crítico de alertar ayuda profesional en caso de que haya un rescate.

Las estaciones pueden ser activadas halando una alarma de incendio, la cual está conectada directamente a la estación de bomberos de Bodwell St. y también suena una alarma local con una luz intermitente roja.

división de alarmas del Departamento de Bomberos de Lawrence y es a prueba de mal tiempo ya que operará aún cuando se vaya la electricidad. Los fondos para esto es cortesía del Club de Rotarios de Lawrence quienes han adoptado este programa después que sus miembros se lo ofrecieron al alcalde con su usual generosidad.

"Los hombres y mujeres del Club de Rotarios de Lawrence vienen de todas partes del Valle de Merrimack y cada vez que saben de un evento trágico nunca piensan en de quién es la culpa sino en qué forma pueden ayudar", dijo el Alcalde Sullivan. "Estoy realmente satisfecho de continuar este programa tan meritorio de seguridad pero no sé si hubiera sido posible sin el apoyo de los Rotarios de Lawrence."

Mayor Promotes Safety on our Rivers

Mayor Michael J. Sullivan is pleased to announce another installation of a Safety Station at the newly expanded Pemberton Park in Lawrence, MA. Born out of the tragedy of four boys who drowned in the Merrimack River just a few short years ago, these stations are a more practical answer to people calling for the river to be fenced in. It was decided that most children could find a way under, over or around a fence and that any type of barrier would actually hamper a rescue effort by public safety personnel.

"We have many potential dangers that are just inherent to our environment and we must learn to stay vigilant so that all our residents remain safe. However, just as railroads and highways provide great transportation opportunities, our rivers provide terrific recreational opportunity when approached with caution," Mayor Sullivan stated.

The safety stations were designed to incorporate the Red Cross lifesaving techniques of "Reach-Throw-Row-Go" and have the critical component of alerting professional help to a rescue in progress.

The stations are accessed and activated by pulling the fire alarm, which is directly wired to the Bodwell Street Station and also sounds a local alarm with a flashing red strobe light.

These sturdy cabinets were constructed by the Lawrence Department of Public Works and contain the following equipment: An extendable reach pole with shepard crook, two ring toss buoys with floating line, life jacket for rescuer or victim, a well stocked First-Aid-Kit, two thermal blankets for hypothermia, and a lifeguard whistle with lanyard.

The wiring and fire alarm technology was done by the Alarm division of the Lawrence Fire Department and is weather proof and will even operate during a rare power outage. The funding comes courtesy of the Lawrence Rotary Club who has adopted this program after their membership reached out to the Mayor's Office with their usual generosity.

"The men and women of the Lawrence Rotary Club come from all over the Merrimack Valley and whenever they learn of a tragic event they never want to assess blame but just want to know how they can help," Mayor Sullivan stated. 

S"Saving Private Ryan," director Steven Spielberg's World War II drama, is the fictional account of the rescue of an enlisted man after three of his brothers die in the European theater. The movie has evoked painful memories of how the war shattered families and left parents to watch helplessly as, in some cases, their sons died one by one.

In Lawrence, Massachusetts, "Private Ryan" has been a poignant reminder of the plight of the four Campagnone brothers. Albert, 21, died in Germany around Christmas 1944. Carmen, 18, was blown apart by a minefield in the Rhineland's in March 1945. The following month, Bernard, 32, died in Holland when a German plane bombed his truck.

In four short months, Mary and Stephen Campagnone saw the war claim three of their four sons. As each son died, the Campagnones, aided by Representative Thomas J. Lane, asked the Army to keep their remaining sons off the battlefield. The couple's requests were turned down by Army brass, since military policy provided that a soldier would stay in the U.S. if he was his family's sole surviving son. Only after Bernard was killed did the Army return Private Anthony Campagnone to his parents.

Today, the Lawrence Common is named after the Campagnone brothers and a memorial stands in their honor.

Note: Provided by Stephen C. Campagnone, Anthony's son, there are 1945 letters and telegrams detailing the efforts by the Campagnones and Representative Lane to stem the family's casualties. Meehan Announces \$98,000 for Merrimack College Community Service Based Education Projects

Congressman Marty Meehan today announced \$98,345 in federal funding for Merrimack College's community service based educational programs.

"The Merrimack College Community Service program gives Lawrence middle-school students a unique opportunity to work with college students and gain exposure to higher education," Meehan said. "It's encouraging to see college students share their math and science skills and experiences with younger children. I am pleased to announce that Merrimack has received funds to continue this program."

Merrimack's program brings together undergraduate students and middle-school youth from Lawrence, who gain first hand knowledge on future life choices such as college and career options as well as the importance of science and math. Directed by undergraduates, middle-school youth involved in the program design and carryout their own physical and life science

experiments; collect and manage data; and report findings.

"Over the past two years, we have been fortunate to partner with five agencies to use this grant to bring hands-on learning opportunities to many middle-schoolers in Lawrence," said Merrimack College President Richard J. Santagati. "The program helps to connect middle-schoolers to future life choices, such as college and career options, as well as to demonstrate that science and math are important and engaging. It also offers important service learning opportunities to our students who share their knowledge and time in the community."

Over 100 Merrimack undergraduate students have undergone training to mentor and deliver an inquiry-based math and science curriculum to more than 150 youth in after-school programs. All middle-school students involved in the Merrimack College program are from Adelante! Youth Center, Asian Center of the Merrimack Valley, The Blessed Stephen Bellesini Academy, The Lawrence Boys and Girls Club, and the Spar and Spindle Girl Scouts Council; all organizations are located in Lawrence, Massachusetts.

The federal funds will be provided by the Corporation for National and Community Service.

Fiorentini to join Gov. Romney to support expedited permitting

Mayor James J. Fiorentini said today that he would join Governor Mitt Romney at the State House on Thursday June 16th, at 1:30 at the State House in Boston to express support for a new State law the Governor is submitting on expedited permitting.

On Thursday, Governor Romney is expected to unveil his proposed amendments to the expedited permitting law, Massachusetts General Laws chapter 43D. Mayor Fiorentini has been invited as one of only a few Mayors in the State to attend the event.

Fiorentini said today that he would join with the Governor in supporting the expedited permitting legislation. "We have made expedited permitting a priority here in Haverhill," said Fiorentini. "We have sped up permitting for outdoor dining, for building permits, death certificates and food service licenses. However, there is only so far we can go as a community working on our own. This legislation takes us to the next level. This legislation allows us to amend our laws to provide for consolidated and expedited permitting hearings, consolidated appeals, and generally guarantees that permitting for new businesses in an expedited zone will be handled in an expeditious manner.

Numerous studies have shown that one of the primary barriers to new business is permitting. Businesses have told me, repeatedly, that the number one thing we can do for business is to make the permit process easier. This law provides us with the roadmap and the tools to accomplish our goals. I am happy to join with Governor Romney in a bi-partisan effort to speed up permitting."

Mayor thanks council for support of auction

Mayor James J. Fiorentini tonight thanked the city council for its continuing support of auctioning city land. This evening, the council voted 7-1 to declare land surplus so that real estate closings could take place and the city receive \$600,000 that was scheduled to take place because of the auction. Fiorentini said that the council did the right thing in supporting the auction: "The city had two choices this evening, to allow real estate closings to take place or to place the city in dire legal jeopardy. The city council made the right decision in moving forward.

This auction has always been a joint effort of the Mayor's office and the city council. I campaigned on the issue of having a land auction to sell off vacant land we no longer needed. Many councilors campaigned and worked on the same issue. Working together, we were able to have the most successful land auction in the history of the city. Other Mayors have called me and asked how we did it.

The auction was a great success, but it was not perfect. There are things that need to be improved, and I will work with the council to improve them. The City Council did the right thing tonight. They put politics aside and worked for the good of the city. I thank them for their support."

2005 NH Latino Summit a Success

New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson Served as Keynote Speaker

Fostering New Hampshire's Latino businesses, promoting economic opportunities and building community connections were the focus of the 2nd Annual New Hampshire Latino Summit, presented by Visión Hispana-NH and Vote Now NH Hispanics. The 2005 New Hampshire Latino Summit, "Building Latino Businesses, Building a Better New Hampshire," was held on Tuesday, June 7 and received national media coverage.

Over two hundred people attended the Summit, which attracted elected officials and personalities such as Bill Richardson, Gov. of New Mexico, and the only Hispanic governor in the United States, N.H. Gov. John Lynch, former Gov. Walter Peterson, former Manchester Mayor and Governor's Council member Ray Wiczorek, Manchester Mayor Robert Baines, Andy Leach representing Sen. John Sununu, the Consul General of Mexico Porfirio T. Muñoz Ledo, Laura Knoy of NHPR's "The Exchange" and statewide Latino leaders. Also on hand were Reps. Carlos González and Héctor Vélez.

The Summit's panelists and speakers addressed the economic opportunities and challenges for the more than 26,000 Latinos living in New Hampshire. 

Mr. B's Sports Memories

Methuen Field Hockey in 1959

Dorothy Chadwick was the coach and was on her way to a place in the Methuen High School Hall of fame. One of the area's finest female athletes Chadwick had some good and athletic girls on this year's squad and they were eager to show their "Rangerette" ability and pride.

The high school was called the Tenney High School in those days and now the junior carries that name. This season was to be very special because it was to be

Methuen's first ever venture into this sport. It remains to be very popular under the tutelage of Karen McLaughlin who has recently been named the new hoop coach after serving as an assistant hoop coach under legendary coach and woman athlete Mimi Hyde who is a Hall of Famer, as well. Karen's daughter played for her mom and won many awards and a trip to college. Her dad, Frank, is president of the Lawrence Teachers Union. In those days not many schools were featuring girls' sports and field hockey was not yet popular, thus the crowds were sparse.

Chadwick was fortunate that a brave and adventurous group decided to give this new sport a try. Her hopefuls included Dot Marquette, Diana Sleeper, Mary Pierce and a future city league fast pitch softball player Sandy Seglin. Sandy starred for the Ace of clubs perennial champs of that league. Other pioneers of this sport included Barbara Lancaster, Jane McQuillan, Vera Martell, Elsie Esperian, Lorna Mailhot, Barbara Lavolette, Sharon Lane and Ursula Stundza.

The blue and white won 3 and lost 2 with 5 games being cancelled due to sickness to one team or the other. The Rangerettes shut out North Andover twice 1/0 and 2/0; big wins as the red and black were big rivals in those days. They took the measure of Topsfield 2/1 and suffered a loss to Wilmington 2/1.

With a contest looming with the defending State Champs Marblehead, the Methuen coach knew her kids had to be at

the top of their game. Imagine the scene, it's your first season ever at field hockey and you are to meet the best in the State. Chadwick's kids were equal to the task but the champs eke out a 1/0 win. The winners were picked to win big but the Rangerettes displaying lots of heart and courage would not give in.

Dot Chadwick, a name to remember in Methuen sports was also a physical education teacher and later the supervisor of that division in the school system was pleased at the showing of her charges against such great odds. She singled out Seglin who scored every goal except one in the season. Barbara Lancaster registered that one. Dot Marquette was the goalie only her second year at that position. Last year she was the netminder as a junior varsity player before field hockey became a varsity sport.

Ursy Stundza was a star at right wing. Others wearing the blue and white and making big contributions were Dot Budd, Sheila Pierce, Carole Androski, Susan Alt, Nancy Worth, Marie Toohey, Charlotte Whiteside, Julia Dwyer, Gail Budd, and Susan Whiteside. Frances Foster was the Captain, Dot Budd and Phyllis Whittaker were the team Managers. This team will be able to say we probably weren't the best ever at Methuen but we will always be the first ever.

The legendary Dot Chadwick was the proud coach of that first field hockey team in 1959. They compiled a 3 win 2 loss season.



Fiorentini to take out papers

Mayor James J. Fiorentini today announced that he would take out papers for re-election this Friday at 8 am.

Fiorentini said that starting this weekend his campaign committee would begin gathering signatures.

I would like to thank you all for attending this evening and supporting my candidacy for Mayor of Methuen.

I would especially like to thank the V.F.W. for allowing me the use their hall for my mayoral kick-off.

My opponent has been collecting money and running for mayor for the last 15 years. He is the perpetual mayoral candidate. Can you imagine how many favors he owes?

My opponent has been sputtering around tactics from the old political playbook, touting the fact that he is going to run a "POSITIVE" campaign.
