## Editorial

# La selección del nuevo miembro del Comité Escolar

Nos alegra la decisión de Amy McGovern de dar prioridad a la familia en lugar de a la política, pero nos preocupa mucho el proceso de selección para llenar su puesto. Mientras que no tenemos confianza en la integridad del comité Escolar como organización, tenemos razones para creer que el concilio está por encima de eso.

Según las reglas, cualquier residente del Distrito E en Lawrence que desee ser considerado para completar el término necesita enviar una carta al concilio a más tardar el 20 de setiembre. Los candidatos serán entrevistados por el Comité de Personal el 25 de setiembre y la decisión final será hecha por los concejales en la reunión del 3 de octubre.

Aunque la responsabilidad cae sobre ellos, los residentes de Lawrence en general deben llamar a sus concejales para expresarles su opinión con respecto a los candidatos. # Selection of the new School Committee member

We are very happy for Amy McGovern's decision to put family matters ahead of politics, but we are very concerned with the selection process to fill her seat. While we have no confidence in the integrity of the School Committee as a body, we have reasons to believe that the City Council is above that.

According to the rules, any resident of District E in Lawrence who wishes to be considered to complete the term needs to send a letter to the City Council no later than September 20<sup>th</sup>. The candidates will be interviewed by the Personnel Committee on September 25<sup>th</sup> and a final decision will be made by the councilors during their next meeting on October 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Although the responsibility rests with them, the residents of Lawrence in general should call their councilors and express their opinions regarding the candidates. Once the individual becomes a member of the School Committee, his or her decisions will affect the entire city and they are entitled to letting their representatives know about their choices.

Once thing is clear: we need watchdogs in the school department; we don't need more rubber stamps on that board.

Esperanza Academy is a tuition-free, private, middle school for girls in the 5-8<sup>th</sup> grades based in the Nativity educational model, similar that Blessed Steven Bellesini OSA Academy – a middle school for boys also in Lawrence. Esperanza will increase by 20 students in each of the two subsequent school years. Esperanza is a partnership between Christ Church in Andover and Grace Church in Lawrence.

## 9/11 REMEMBERED WITH A REFURBISHED MURAL

On September 11, 2006, the fire bell at Ladder 4 on Broadway, in South Lawrence, rang 3-4-3 twice in honor of the 343 New York City Fire Department firefighters who died in the attack at the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001, followed by Amazing Grace, by Captain John Stokes on his bagpipe. On that terrorist attack, mainly targeting civilians, also 23 New York City Police Department officers and 37 Port Authority police officers lost their lives in the line of duty. That day's fatalities were in the thousands, with 2,973 total people killed, including 246 on the four planes who crashed in the two towers, the Pentagon and in the corn field in Pennsylvania. Many Fire Departments from across America sent volunteers to New York City to help their comrades, so did Lawrence. Ray Silva, a Fire Inspector with the Lawrence Fire Department was one of a group of 10, from Ladder 4, Fire Station 7, and Central Station, whom the next day joined that effort and stayed there for three days.

"We arrived there in the afternoon", said Silva. "What impressed me the most was to see the New York City firefighters walk like zombies in the middle of that disaster and when I saw the destruction, it gave me the impression that I was on the moon", said Silva and added, "That impression will never fade away from my memory".

Several times, we read and see in the news that men and women who participated in the rescue efforts are developing different affections, especially in their lungs. Fortunately, this is not the case with Silva, "I've been checked periodically by my physician and so far I haven't notice anything," said Silva.

Lieutenant James Flynn, from the Lawrence Fire Department, who acted as a Master of Ceremonies, related about the idea him and a group of firefighters had right after 9/11. "We want to do a mural, but have no idea how much time, material and the most important: money, would take to do it, when we meet Ronnie Gannon. He came into the fire station in his red Jeep, and told me that he would take care of everything. And he did just that! For the past 5 years this mural has been part of our lives in Lawrence, but due to exposure to weather it deteriorated. Ronnie passed away suddenly last year and in respect for all his hard work, a small tribute has been added to the mural", said Lt. Flynn before the unveiling of the refurbished mural with Gannon's portrait added to it.

# Recordando el 9/11 con un mural reconstruido

El 11 de septiembre, 2006, la campana de la Estación de Bomberos #4, de la Calle Broadway en el sur de Lawrence, sonó 3-4-3 dos veces, en honor de 343 bomberos de la Ciudad de Nueva York que murieron en el ataque a las torres gemelas del World Trade Center el 11 de septiembre, 2001, seguido por Sublime Gracia, interpretado en su gaita por el Capitán John Stokes.

En ese ataque terrorista, dirigido principalmente a civiles, también perdieron sus vidas en el desenvolvimiento de su deber, 23 oficiales del Departamento de Policía de la Ciudad de Nueva York y 37 oficiales de policía de la Autoridad del Puerto. Ese día, los muertos se contaron en los miles, con 2,973 personas en total, incluyendo 246 en los cuatro aviones que fueron a estrellarse en las dos torres, el Pentágono y en un campo de maíz en Penssylvania.

Muchos Departamentos de Incendio del país enviaron voluntarios a la ciudad de Nueva York para ayudar a sus camaradas, como lo hizo Lawrence. Ray Silva, un inspector de Incendios con el Departamento de Bomberos de Lawrence fue uno de un grupo de 10 de las Estaciones 4, 7 y Central, los cuales, al día siguiente, uniendo sus fuerzas y estuvieron allí por tres días. "Llegamos allí a mediodía", dijo Silva. "Lo que más me impresionó fue ver a los Bomberos de la Ciudad de Nueva York caminar como zombis en el medio de aquel desastre y cuando yo vi la destrucción, me dio la impresión de que estaba en la luna", dijo Silva y agregó, "Esa impresión jamás se borrará de mi memoria".

Muchas veces vemos o leemos en la noticia de que hombres y mujeres que participaron en los esfuerzos de rescate están desarrollando distintas afecciones, especialmente pulmonares. Afortunadamente, este no es el caso con Silva. "Yo he estado visitando a mi médico periódicamente y hasta el momento no me siento nada", dijo Silva.

El Teniente James Flynn, del Departamento de Incendios de Lawrence, que actuó de Maestro de Ceremonias, relató acerca de la idea que él y un grupo de bomberos tuvo a raíz del 9/11. "Queríamos hacer un mural, pero no teníamos idea cuánto tiempo, material y lo más importante, dinero, íbamos a necesitar para hacerlo, cuando conocimos a Ronnie Gannon. Él vino a la estación en su Jeep rojo y me dijo que él se iba a hacer cargo de todo. ¡Y eso fue lo que hizo! Por los últimos 5 años este mural ha formado parte de nuestras vidas en Lawrence, pero debido a las inclemencias del tiempo se deterioró. Ronnie falleció inesperadamente el año pasado y por respeto a él y a su trabajo, un pequeño tributo ha sido añadido al mural", dijo el Tte. Flynn antes de develar el reconstruido mural con la efigie de Gannon en él.

El Reverendo Scott Ness ofreció oraciones "para aquellos que perdieron sus vidas en el ataque de 9/11 y en una forma muy especial, para aquellos que perdieron sus vidas en el servicio desinteresado a sus hermanas y hermanos necesitados: bomberos, policías y personal de emergencia. Cuando miremos a este mural, comprométámonos a hacer la paz, no la



guerra. A servir, no a la indiferencia. A la reconciliación, no al odio o la venganza".

El Alcalde de Lawrence, Michael J. Sullivan alabó la dedicación de los oficiales de seguridad, el departamento de incendios, la policía y los paramédicos por el papel que juegan día a día. A los jóvenes estudiantes de la Escuela Wetherbee que vinieron a la ceremonia él les recomendó que miraran a este mural y que pensaran en la tragedia que afectó a este país cuando ellos ni siquiera estaban en la escuela y supieran que las personas que están alrededor de ellos están aquí para protegerlos y mantenerlos seguros.

Eso era exactamente lo que Edison Mercedes Jr. vino a hacer. Mercedes es uno de los alumnos de 4to grado de la clase de la Sra. Kathy Dube, de la Escuela

Wetherbee. Cuando se le preguntó si él sabía a lo que había venido a hacer, respondió, "Estoy aquí para escuchar al alcalde y a los hombres que fueron a Nueva York", dijo Mercedes sin vacilar.

El Jefe del Departamento de Incendios, Peter Takvorian, que asistió a los primeros funerales de los Bomberos de la Ciudad de Nueva York, dijo que, después de ver tanta destrucción, él sabía que la nación se recuperaría pero no se imaginó cómo iba a hacerlo. "Porque lo que pasó allí aquel día, tenemos el deber de no olvidar a aquellos que perecieron; tenemos el deber de nunca bajar la guardia con nuestra seguridad y tenemos el deber de siempre apoyar a nuestros militares y a los que respondieron primero".

At a ceremony at noon Thursday (Aug 31, 2006), on Lawrence's historic Campagnone Common, Mayor Michael J. Sullivan presented *Certificates of Completion* to sixty-one Lawrence youth who participated in the *Mayor's Summer Job's Program*. The participants, ranging from 14 to 21 years of age, worked in a variety of jobs in numerous sites throughout the City including the Department of Public Works, the Police Department, the Recreation Department, the Lawrence Boys & Girls Club, and the Greater Lawrence YMCA.

Along with their certificates, the young workers were treated to pizza, a "Mayor's Summer Jobs 2006" tee-shirt, and words of gratitude from Mayor Sullivan, who thanked them for their hard work and dedication to

Mantener un registro de los gastos por educación le puede ahorrar dinero a la hora de llenar su planilla.

Si usted no mantiene un buen registro de sus gastos por educación podría estar usted mismo robándose de dinero. Si usted va a la universidad o colegio o tiene hijos en la universidad usted podría beneficiarse grandemente por mantener los registros de los gastos por educación. Usted puede ser capaz de deducir más en su planilla de impuestos y reducir su deuda de impuestos.

La forma 1098T, Tuition Statement, es un documento de información usado por las universidades para reportar la cantidad que el estudiante pagó o la cantidad que adeuda de matrícula. Esta cantidad es a veces la que usted incluye en la planilla como la cantidad de gastos por educación pero a menudo incluye solamente la cantidad que aparece en la factura de gastos por matrícula que no es necesariamente la cantidad que debe incluir en la planilla. Usted necesita mantener un registro de lo que realmente gasta en matrícula y cuánto paga por gastos relacionados para justificar el crédito por educación y gastos reclamados en su planilla.

## Formas de educar

Se ha escrito sobre tres formas de educar: la espontánea, que consiste en "dejar hacer" al educando, en no intervenir, ni orientar, ni estimular. El chico se mueve según sus propias normas de conducta. En ocasiones, detrás de esta actitud está el abandonismo y el dimitir de las responsabilidades de educador.

Otra forma es el voluntarismo, según la cual el educando se autoeduca con esfuerzos personales, fortaleciendo su fuerza de voluntad. El educando no se dirige a lo que le gusta o apetece, sino a lo que a la larga es mejor para él. Esta forma de educar es aconsejable, aunque sin caer en los excesos.

La tercera forma de educar sería la vía intermedia entre las dos anteriores. El chico conoce y vive unas normas de conducta claras en la familia, en la escuela y en la sociedad y a la vez desarrolla su libertad responsablemente. El educando se mueve entre la autoridad de los educadores y la libertad personal. Ambos elementos son necesarios. Podemos decir que educar es convertir a alguien en una persona más libre e independiente. Si el proceso educativo esclaviza y no libera de verdad, a la larga tendrá un valor negativo.

El educador no sólo ha de transmitir conocimientos sino enseñar a vivir y de aquí emergen los valores.

Pero el hombre es un ser inacabado y siempre necesita estar haciéndose a sí mismo. En otras palabras, la formación no termina nunca. Es el eterno retornillo que comporta todo lo humano. Es un proceso gradual y ascendente que conduce a la realización más completa de la persona, tanto de sus facultades personales (físicas, intelectuales, afectivas y de la voluntad) como de sus relaciones con los demás (familia, amistades y sociedad).

El educador no sólo ha de transmitir conocimientos sino enseñar a vivir y de aquí emergen los valores. Se han de tener objetivos claros como dice esta máxima: Nihil volitum nisi praecognitum, es decir, no hay voluntad si no hay conocimiento de la meta. Y el objetivo es el conjunto de valores humanos y sobrenaturales, que los educandos han de conocer y asimilar. La labor del educador sería como la de un sabio en frase de Sócrates a su amigo Hipócrates: "Un sabio es un comerciante que vende géneros de los que se nutre el alma".





# Es un sistema que se muere, no solo un hombre

Hace algunos días, mientras esperaba pacientemente porque mi ordenadora portátil recibiera e instalara varios programas recientes provenientes telefónicamente de Microsoft, miré distraídamente a través de mi ventana en dirección del bien cuidado césped que existe entre el Centro de Tecnología donde enseño y la nueva y moderna biblioteca que se haya situada solo a unos cien pies de distancia.

Noté una corriente continua de estudiantes que salían y se alejaban de nuestro edificio y se dirigían en todas direcciones. Era evidente, por la forma que lucían y por el lenguaje de sus cuerpos al moverse, que eran todos novatos. Algunos se hallaban en shorts, otros en jeans, unos caminando con chanclas, otros en sandalias o zapatos. De los jóvenes, algunos tenían cortes de pelo militar, otros melenas, unos pocos el comienzo de barba fresca. Lucían muy informales, pero ninguno lucía igual.

También vi a muchos conversando a través de sus teléfonos celulares, una práctica internacional muy común en esta época. Supongo que estaban hablando con padres ansiosos y preocupados que solo unos días antes los habían dejado en la universidad optimistas por su futuro pero preocupados por sus presentes alejados de la supervisión paterna. O tal vez conversaban con otros compañeros de clases que se hallaban en otras partes de nuestro inmenso campo o conocidos o amigos en otros sitios lejanos.

Existía también algo que compartían en común. De sus hombros colgaba una mochila idéntica negra que yo sabía contenía la ordenadora portátil requerida y suministrada por la universidad. Habían entrado al edificio con una forma de registro en sus manos y salían completamente conectados a una experiencia educacional a través del Internet que les duraría cuatro

años en nuestra institución y toda la existencia en sus vidas. Comenzando en ese momento sus destinos habían cambiado para siempre y me preguntaba si acaso se lo sospechaban.

No pude resistir el momento revelador para pensar en otros hombres y mujeres jóvenes que, al mismo tiempo, estaban probablemente entrando como novatos en otra institución donde hacía más de cuarenta años traté de obtener una educación y no pude completarla: la Universidad de La Habana en Cuba. Es muy raro que yo me vea envuelto en especulaciones o discusiones sobre el sistema presente político en mi país de origen por una razón simple: No estoy allí y no lo he estado desde que emigré, y eso fue hace mucho tiempo. Pero conociendo la filosofía del sistema que todavía controla la sociedad cubana y como esa hegemonía impregna su sistema educativo me da el derecho, si no la experiencia, para comentar.

Los estudiantes cubanos son otra parte de una nación a la que no se le permite el uso de la tecnología: no teléfonos celulares, no ordenadoras de mesa o portátiles, no platos de satélite. En otras palabras, no fuentes no supervisadas de información son permitidas por la ley. Una de las fuerzas mayores de la juventud es su habilidad de generar nuevas ideas y poder expresarlas. El mundo las necesita. Cuando cortamos esas ideas o las manipulamos no solo violamos sus derechos humanos y su dignidad, sino su oportunidad de contribuir al bien común. En Cuba, los estudiantes no son voces; se han convertido en ecos de los eslóganes del momento.

No importa si cada niño en la nación tiene la oportunidad de asistir a la escuela, comer un almuerzo suministrado por el estado o vestir con uniformes iguales. Ese es un derecho que me gustaría ver disfrutar por cada niño de este planeta, pero la prueba del pudín no está en cocinarlo sino en el pudín mismo y tener el mismo color y sabor no hace que el pudín, o el flan tampoco, sean saludables. Fue en ese momento de mí pensar diletante cuando mi mente se dirigió hacia las noticias y especulaciones recientes sobre la salud de Fidel Castro, el siempre presente líder

no podrá evitar la presencia de los fantasmas de más de un millón de sus compatriotas que viven ahora en otras tierras o descansan enterrados en ellas por lo que él hizo.

Desafortunadamente hay una falsa impresión pública en algunos círculos confusos que a esos cubanos, incluyéndome a mí, se nos robó ganancias que habían sido mal apropiadas. Nada se menciona del robo de nuestras vidas en una nación que no habíamos escogido porque habíamos nacido en ella; nada de las oportunidades hurtadas para ofrecer a ese país lo mejor de nuestras habilidades. Los cubanos en los Estados Unidos y otros países somos famosos por nuestros éxitos y nuestro progreso, pero esas facultades han sido usadas y proveídas aquí o en otras partes y no en el lugar que se suponía fueran desplegadas: nuestra patria. Esa travestía y violación de nuestros destinos, no solamente la pérdida de libertad y el derecho de pensar como hombres y mujeres libres, son la herencia del hombre que ahora se dice está muriendo, un hombre que destruyó la cosecha de amor que las semillas de muchas generaciones habían plantado.

Yo sé que no es solo un hombre quien morirá cuando el señor Castro lo haga; es un sistema completo que se hundirá con él; un sistema que no deja futuro porque no tiene presente. Mientras los últimos de mis estudiantes dejaban mi edificio cargados con la tecnología de hoy y las esperanzas del mañana, me di el lujo de soñar con un día, no lejano tal vez, cuando se apoderen de sus teléfonos celulares para marcar el numero 1-800-Habana y escuchen en el otro lado de la línea la respuesta entusiastizada y alerta de una voz joven que simplemente dirá: "Hello. What is your name?"

Y ese es mi punto de vista hoy.





## CARIDAD DEL COBRE MASS

**C**On Sunday, September 10, 2006, the Reverend Jorge Reyes, O.S.A., Pastor of St. Mary of the Assumption Parish celebrated a mass to honor Our Lady of Caridad del Cobre, Patroness of Cuba. This is the day that thousands of Cubans all over the world bow their heads to honor the Virgin venerated for centuries.

Myth tells us that around the year 1680, two brothers, named Rodrigo and Juan de Hoyos, accompanied by Juan Moreno, a 10-year-old slave, were looking for salt needed to preserve the meat at the slaughter house which supplied the town of Santiago del Prado, now known as El Cobre.

The three were in a fragile canoe across the Bay of Nipe, in the Oriente Province, when they had to take refuge from a storm. The next day, with the calm, they continue their trip to the salt deposits when they saw in the distance something floating on the water. As they got closer, they found the statue of the Virgin Mary holding the child in her left arm and a gold cross in the right hand. The Virgin was on a piece of wood with an inscription: "I am the Virgin of Charity".

According to sworn testimonies of witnesses, despite being in the water, neither the statue nor her clothing was wet. A sanctuary was built at El Cobre, Oriente Province, Cuba, to house the 16 inches tall statue, instantly becoming one of the most venerated religious places in Cuba. Cuban-Americans living in Miami have built a church to honor La Caridad which they called La Ermita while in Boston, the Cuban Cultural Center built an altar in her honor, within St. Columbkille Church, located at 325 Market Street, in Brighton, MA.

For Cubans in exile, The Virgin of Charity is one of the only ties remaining that unifies them with their homeland.

# Little Sprouts Receives \$3.49MM Grant from U.S. Department of Education

Only location in Massachusetts to achieve this honor

Methuen, MA (September 1, 2006) – In May of this year, Little Sprouts Child Enrichment Centers submitted an Early Reading First grant application, and the staff has been waiting with fingers crossed to hear the results. On August 31, they received the good news.

“I’m ecstatic!” said Literacy Director and grant writer Meghan McGinley Crowe. “We will be able to do so much with this new literacy project!” Early Reading First is a national initiative, designed to respond to the President’s No Child Left Behind legislation. The Early Reading First Program supports preschools and early childhood education providers, especially those serving children from low-income families, so that they can become preschool centers of educational excellence, providing children with the foundational skills necessary to become successful readers. Little Sprouts received an Early Reading First award in 2003, but their \$1.5MM, 3-year grant expires this fall. In that time, Little Sprouts underwent a complete renovation of their classrooms and curriculum. “We created higher outcomes with our first Early Reading First project than we ever imagined,” said McGinley-Crowe. “But this

project will enable us to impact our community on a whole new level.”

Little Sprouts has 6 early education facilities in the Greater Merrimack Valley: Haverhill, Lawrence, Lowell, Andover, Methuen, and the newest center opening September 11<sup>th</sup> in Westford. This Early Reading First Project, designated “Sprout-Out,” will serve 14 preschool classrooms, 48 teachers, and over 260 children per year enrolled at Little Sprouts.

Founder and CEO of Little Sprouts Susan Leger Ferraro, never doubted the organization would be able to continue and enhance its literacy project. “I’m grateful for the opportunity to create on-going advancement for children, families and educators, not only in literacy but to make a difference in our communities and our world.”

Only 32 projects nationwide were awarded the Early Reading First Grant, and Little Sprouts was the only grantee in Massachusetts. Senator Ted Kennedy called Little Sprouts on Friday, September 1<sup>st</sup> to congratulate the staff. “As study after study has shown, early childhood education has a tremendous positive impact on our children, and it is essential that we provide the best resources for these efforts,” said Senator Kennedy. “I’m thrilled that these funds will support the Little Sprouts Child Enrichment Centers’ extraordinary work in enhancing the reading

# City & MVRTA Appoint Project Manager for Downtown Parking Garage

Mayor James J. Fiorentini and the Merrimack Valley Regional Transit Authority "MVRTA" made a joint announcement that a project manager has been chosen for the proposed new downtown parking garage. Last year the City and MVRTA obtained, with Congressman Martin Meehan's assistance, two federal grants totaling \$7.6 million to construct a new parking facility downtown. Since that time, the City has narrowed the possible locations to three.

The MVRTA obtained \$200,000 in preliminary design money to help choose the best location for the facility. August 1, 2006 the MVRTA, upon the recommendation of the technical subcommittee of the Mayor's Parking Garage Task Force, signed a contract with the engineering firm of STV, Inc., Boston, Mass. to do the preliminary engineering.

The City and MVRTA today announced that Peter P. Canny, Jr. of Real Estate Prospectives, LLC will be the project manager to move the project forward. Mr. Canny will work as a contract employee for the Merrimack Valley Regional Transit Authority. His job will be to work with STV, Inc. and the City to oversee the project and to expedite the site selection and the building of the garage.

Mr. Canny is currently the project manager of the Lawrence Gateway Project for the MVRTA. He is a licensed architect with many years of experience in the transportation and planning fields.

In making the announcement, Mayor Fiorentini said the City was committed to build a new parking facility downtown. The appointment of a project manager would help to expedite the process:

"The appointment of a project manager who will work virtually full-time on this facility will help to expedite the process of choosing a location and building the parking facility."

Fiorentini said that Mr. Canny's first task will be to meet with the owners of private parcels whose land is being considered for the parking garage.



Keeping records of education expenses can save you money at tax time.

If you don't keep good records of your education expenses you could be robbing yourself of money. If you are going to college or have children in college, you could greatly benefit from keeping records of educational expenses. You may be able to deduct more from your tax returns and reduce your tax liability.

Form 1098T, Tuition Statement, is an information document used by universities to report the amount paid by students or amounts billed for tuition. It is sometimes used for the education expense amount to include on a tax return, but often includes only the amounts billed for tuition, which is not necessarily the amount to include on your tax return. You need to keep records of what you actually spend on tuition and how much you pay for related expenses to justify the education credits and expenses claimed on your return.



## Mr. B's Sports Memories Frank Benjamin pinch hits for Curt Gowdy

I had been working on the radio for about a year and when John Moran got hurt in a skiing accident I filled in while he recuperated. On one of these mornings at about 6 am the then and still to this day program director Bruce Arnold, called me into his studio and told me of a taping I had to do. In those days the newness of being on the radio and rubbing elbows with Bruce, and the great station star Lou Marcel and of course the exciting and innovating Paul Seccaricco and the aforementioned John Moran had me feeling pretty good about my new part-time career.

Mr. Gowdy, it was explained to me, taped a show about all different sports from all over the world. He would come in every couple of weeks and tape 8 or 10 shows and come back weeks later and do more and this was done by scripts written by someone although I never knew who.

It seems that Mr. G would sometimes miss or blow off these sessions and seeing they had been sold to sponsors they had to be played.

Bruce hands me a script and say, "You are doing the Curt Gowdy show today" and I laugh at what I perceive is a joke. He assures me this is not a joke and now stomach cramps, shaking and sweating starts clicking in on this Crosby St. alumnus. Imagine one of the most recognized voices in the world is to be filled in by a voice that has been compared to a cross between Elmer Fudd and Truman Capote and a dash of Pee Wee Herman.

I retreat to a secluded studio to settle my nerves and read the script to be at the ready. To add to this dilemma this recording was to be aired on WCGY our FM station that would cover a much bigger area than WCCM the AM station. Our listeners knew I was a greenhorn and because I was a local guy they would put up with my mistakes and voice.

Upon reading the copy I was to use, it turns out it was about a Hawaiian swimmer of great fame especially on his island. His name was Duke Kuwanakanahula, at least I think it was that. After reading that name about thirty times in this 2 minute piece I go to Bruce with the thought that I am being part of a radio station joke. You know like sending the new guy on the job for a bucket of steam for laughs.

Bruce says, "This is no joke Frank and you have to do it." Well I did it after about 5 or 6 tries and to this day I don't know how and I'm not sure how it was received by the listeners or the sponsors but I do know that I was never asked to pinch hit for Mr. Gowdy again. I guess there was some sort of message in that. I can say though that I was one of the few people who pinch hit for the man who many, including me, considered the greatest sports announcer ever.

I bring this story to you because that

great voice has been stilled by his passing.

When you hear the song *That's Amore* you can recognize Dean Martin's voice; the song *New York, New York*, you could tell Sinatra's voice; and *Evergreen* the voice was Streisand's and nobody had to tell you. Well, it was the same with Mr. G his voice was unmistakable; no matter what sport you could identify him.

Since I have been part of the radio media for 20 years I crossed paths with many athletic stars, a few movie stars, and many civic leaders, but I have never met a bigger star and one whose personality was as unassuming as one could be.

I first met him at the dedication of the refurbished gym at Lawrence High School named after Ralph Wolfendale where he was the Master of Ceremonies. Former LHS and CCHS hoopsters from different eras would be playing periods of the game Mr. G welcomed the overflowing crowd and introduced John Moran and me as the announcers of this game to be simulcast on cable TV and WCCM radio. He introduced me as "Fred" Benjamin a name that people would remind me of quite often.

He would often visit the station on Franklin St. and when walking through the building you could hear that booming voice as he talked on the voice or to Bruce, Sac, or John Bassett key members of his local staff.

When reading of his exploits in the sporting world or listening to all the accolades bestowed on him I have noticed that nobody has stated that when Mr. G announced the first two Super Bowls they were simulcast on two major networks and I'm not sure if it was NBC & CBS or ABC. His partners on the air were Paul Christman and Al Dirogatis. I don't ever remember any other simulcasts and that includes presidential elections, NASA trips and lunar walks. When I get to be cocky and think of my being in three Halls of Fame, I am quickly brought back to earth with the knowledge that Curt Gowdy is enshrined in 20 Hof F's.

### A Wyoming Cowboy Curt Gowdy

It seems irreverent of me to call him Curt but well, then I can't. He'll always be Mr. Gowdy to me. I still have kids call me Mr. B and it feels good, and it is with respect and I certainly respected this man. Many are not aware that he was a better than average basketball player while growing up in Wyoming and yes that is why some people referred to him as the "cowboy." I remember as a young man listening to him announce the Red Sox games with different partners and one was the great retired lefty pitcher Mel Parnell and also future Sox great Ned Martin. He had a great relationship with the immortal Ted Williams and one of their great bonds was talking about fly fishing and different waters to ply this sport at.

He of course went on to star for years on a show called the American Sportsman where he would travel to all parts of the world to either hunt or fish with some of the world's most notable stars and dignitaries. His son Trevor, who until recently lived in No. Andover, followed in his footsteps by taping many fishing shows in recent times

and it was evident that his dad had taught him this sport very well and he possessed those great "pipes" that Mr. G was known for.

Curt Jr. went on to become the director of sports at ABC and produced many Kentucky Derbys and Little League World Series. When WCCM sent me to Williamsport to cover Andover in the LL Series, I introduced myself to young Curt and he brought me to his crew telling them to accommodate me for anything I needed or wanted. Baseball Hall of Famer Jim Palmer and New York big time announcer Al Trautwieg were there for ABC and working for young Gowdy and I asked him if they would tape a message saying that when in New England they listened to "Let's Talk Sports" with John Moran and Frank Benjamin and he said, "done". Boy did I feel like a big shot. His daughter Cheryl worked at the local station and now is part of a fashion magazine in Florida.

When once Dan Roche now of Channel 4 sports was at WCCM he set up an on air interview with Mr. G and invited me to sit in with him. Both Dan and I couldn't get over the ease at which this great star was with our questions and the names that he spoke of, most of them legends that we could only read about. Red Grange, Ted Williams, Duffy Daugherty, Johnny Lujack, Bobby Layne, Joe DiMaggio, Whitey Ford, Casey Stengel, Mickey Mantle, Vince Lombardi, he spoke of them as we would talk of the Callagans, the Rosmarinos, the Ed Buckleys, Will Hixons, Bob Licars, Jimmy Lewis and Don Tremblays, and Rigo Nuñez of local sports over a drink at a local pub. He flowed like silk and made two local yokels sound pretty good.

Bruce sent me to the opening of the Ristuccia hockey rink in Wilmington where the Bruins were to be holding their practices and to interview Mr. G who was to emcee the proceedings. Well, most people know I am not a great hockey fan and to interview my station owner about this sport was not something I was looking forward to. I was and still am a good soldier and with my trusty tape recorder I found my subject and after introducing him on tape I asked him how much interest he had in hockey and he let me know that he had announced an Olympic hockey game that featured the Russians and Germans and how he had to study real hard to get those foreign names

down, again he made the interview a snap.

One day, as I entered the old station on Franklin St. parked in front was a beautiful Jaguar car with the door open and the keys in the ignition. Across the street a shady looking character was eyeballing the situation and probably would have driven off with this impressive car, but probably thought it was a trap with the door open and with keys in it all set to go. A car thief's dream come true but maybe to good to be true. I took the keys, locked the door and entered the building and found Mr. G and asked him if he had left the car like that and he replied he did. He said thanks Frank when I told him I locked the car and I said Mr. Gowdy this is not Wyoming you can't tempt people like that in Lawrence or you'll be

reporting a stolen car. In his unassuming way he shrugs his shoulders and walks away.

When it was imminent the stations were going to be sold all of his records and pictures and scorecards of all star games both football, baseball and hoop were put in boxes in the conference room and there were boxes and boxes. When my show would end on Saturdays at noontime and I was the only one in the building I would go through these boxes and it was like being on the yellow brick road of all sporting events. The games, names, and picture too many to write here were amazing. He was pictured with Bing Crosby, Phil Harris, President Ford and Astronaut John Glenn and so many more. I don't know where those boxes wound up but it would be a shame if they are never brought to light again. I was at an appreciation night at the Weston Hotel for him and at the head table was Brooklyn Dodger great Tommy Lasorda and Teddy Ballgame.

He used to take John Moran around the country as he did all the major college games of the day. John told me of one game that John worked as Gowdy's right hand man and statistician that the day before the game that the Boss, Bobby Knight, John Havlicek and the Ohio State football coach who was a legend who later got fired for hitting a player and whose name was Woody Hayes were all there and Moran sitting in the corner was listening to them all talk about guess what? If you said fishing you are correct.

This story is about this American Super Star was when I was to be inducted into the Mass State High School Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame and Don Lydick still of the studios on Parker St. came to the station to take a professional picture of me for the program booklet (as if a professional

photographer could make me look good). Well, Don was at the top of his game and Mr. G was in the building and Don said, "Benj, see if you can get him to pose for a picture." When I asked him the Boss said, "Oh, Frank, I have jeans on, cowboy boots and my cowboy hat; I don't know."

I said, "Mr. G, he's a good friend of mine and this station and it would be a favor to me." He said OK, came out and in one take, took a great picture and when it was developed, Don had an enlarged copy in his studio and I had him autograph mine. I had some copies made and gave some to friends. The picture in Rumbo is of the original.

Finally, Paul Seccaricco had this resonant voiced all-star tape an answering tape for my phone at home. It went like this: "Hello this is Curt Gowdy for Frank Benjamin. Frank's not home; he's out covering a big sports story, oh boy. If you're one of Frank's few friends or one of his many "bimbos" please leave your number. He may get back to you."

Many people who called wouldn't believe it was him and some asked who this guy was that sounded just like him. Son Trevor couldn't believe his dad would do something like that. Well, I still have the tape and along with his autographed picture it is something I'll always treasure. I feel I was privileged to rub elbows with greatness and hope that his last months of pain are over and he is again reunited with the many people he made household names in the great athletic arena in the sky.

Thank you Mr. Gowdy for allowing me to be part of what Bruce Arnold used to refer to as a family. I know I will never forget our meetings, your humility, and the joy you gave me as a young man and as a grown up the fact that I got to know you.

When asked if he knew what was he was doing there, he responded, "I'm here to listen to the mayor and to the men who went to New York", said Mercedes without hesitation.

**A POINT OF VIEW****It is a system that is dying, not just a man**

Several days ago, as I waited patiently while my laptop computer was receiving and installing several software updates from Microsoft, I looked distractedly out the window towards the large manicured space that lies between the Technology Center where I teach and the shiny new Library just one hundred feet away.

I noticed a continuous stream of students leaving our building and going in all directions. It was evident to me, by their looks and body language, that they were all freshmen. Some were in shorts, others in jeans, a few walking in flip flops, others in sandals or shoes. Of the young men some had crew cuts, others longer hairs, a few still a short fresh beard. They all looked informal but none looked alike.

I also saw many of them carrying on a conversation through their cellular phones, a practice that seems to have become a fairly established international standard these days. I suppose they were talking to anxious parents who just a few days before had dropped them in the school hopeful for their futures and worried about their present away from parental supervision. Or perhaps they were simply talking to other classmates somewhere else in our large campus or to friends in others.

There was also something they shared in common. Hanging from their shoulders there was an identical black backpack that I knew had the assigned college required and supplied laptop computer. They had entered the building with a registration form in their hands and had left wired to an educational experience via the Internet that would last four years in our institution and an entire life in their existence. Starting at that moment their lives had changed forever and I wondered if they even suspected it.

I could not resist the eye-opening moment to think about other young men

and women who, at the same time, were probably entering college at another institution where more than forty years ago I tried to get an education and could not finish: the University of Havana in Cuba. I seldom get involved in speculations or discussions about the present political system in my country of origin for one simple reason: I am not there and have not been since I left, and that was a very long time ago. But knowing the philosophy of the system that still controls Cuba's society and how that hegemony permeates their educational system gives me the right, if not the expertise, to comment.

Cuban students are another part of a nation that is not allowed the use of technology: No cellular phones, no computers or laptops, no satellite dishes. In other words, no unsupervised sources of information are permitted by law. One of the greatest strengths of the young is their ability to generate new ideas and express them. The world needs them. When you cut those ideas or manipulate them you not only violate their human rights and their dignity, but also their opportunity to contribute to the common good. In Cuba, students do not become voices; they become echoes of the party slogan of the moment.

It does not matter whether every child in the nation has the opportunity to attend school, has a state supported lunch or dresses with the same garments. That is a right that I wished every child on this planet could enjoy. But the proof of the pudding is not in the making of it but in the pudding itself and same color and flavor makes for no healthy pudding, or healthy "Cuban flan" for that matter. It was at this point in my pondering of those thoughts that my mind went back to the recent news and speculations about the health of Fidel Castro, the ever present Cuban communist leader of the past forty seven years who is said to be dying of cancer.

I am not privy to the physical condition of Mr. Castro, so I cannot speculate about that issue, I leave that for others. I know

the ghosts of the more than one million of his countrymen who are now living in other lands or buried there because of what he did.

Unfortunately, there is a public misconception in some confused circles that those Cubans, me included, were only robbed of ill-gotten gains. Nothing is mentioned of the theft of our lives in a country we did not choose because we were born there; nothing of the stolen opportunities to offer that country the best of our abilities. Cubans in the United States and elsewhere are famous for our successes and our progress, but those skills have been used and provided here or somewhere else and not in the place where they were meant to be: our country. That travesty and trampling of our destinies, not just the theft of liberty and the right to think as free men and women are the legacy of the man who is said now to be dying. He destroyed the harvest of love that the seeds of many generations had planted.

I know it is not only a man who will die when Mr. Castro does; it is an entire system that will go down with him; a system that leaves no future because it has no present. So as the last of the students were leaving my building loaded with the technology of today and the hopes of tomorrow, I started to dream of a day, pretty soon, when they will get their cellular phones to dial 1-800-Havana and will hear on the other side the response of a young thrilled voice that will simply say: "¡Hola, cómo te llamas?"

And that is my point of View today.
