
Obtuvieron un segundo lugar, pero aún están entre los tres mejores.

Tanto que decir; tan poco espacio

D espués de mirar la sesión del concilio la semana pasada nos hemos quedado algo desconcertados.

Primero, fue el interrogatorio por el Comité de Personal a Thomas Schiavoni, director provisional del Departamento de Desarrollo Económico por los últimos ocho años, en su lucha por tratar de obtener una buena recomendación ante el concilio pleno.

Mientras que todos estamos de acuerdo de que no fue su culpa de que el Alcalde Michael J. Sullivan no haya tratado de hacer oficial su posición hasta ahora, muchas personas también piensan que es muy tarde en su término para tratar de hacerlo ahora y que debe dejarse a la decisión de la próxima administración. Evidentemente esa fue la posición que tomó el Comité de Personal cuando elevó el tema al concilio pleno sin recomendación.

Una vez ante el pleno del concilio, la teoría de dejar el asunto para ser resuelto por la próxima administración prevaleció y la nominación fue rechazada. Muchos jefes de departamento vinieron a hablar a favor del Sr. Schiavoni, excepto su jefe, Michael J. Sullivan lo que nos ha dejado pensando si Sullivan realmente aprecia su devoción, ya que no se presentó a endosar a su candidato.

Y en segundo lugar, cuán irracional se comportó el Jefe de Policía John J. Romero cuando el Presidente del Concilio Patrick Blanchette trató de implantar un plan para reducir el uso de los vehículos que se llevan a casa lo cual resultaría en algún ahorro para la ciudad. Romero no parece comprender que son los residentes de la ciudad, muchos de ellos viviendo de un retiro, los que tienen que pagar por esa flota de más de 40 carros yendo y viniendo en todas direcciones 24/7, incluyendo gas y seguro.

Tenemos que recordarle que nosotros los que pagamos impuestos no fuimos los que creamos esta situación que él quiere que sostengamos, sino él y sus leales seguidores vestidos de azul. Si ellos decidieron mudarse lejos, es su problema el venir al trabajo todos los días, a tiempo. No olvidemos los altos salarios que todos ellos devengan, en muchos casos, doble del average de los residentes locales, y así todo, él quiere más de nosotros. ¿Es esa la protección a los ciudadanos de que él habla?

So much to say; such little space

Watching last week's city council's activities left us with a lot of unconnected thoughts.

First, was the grilling by the Personnel Committee of Thomas Schiavoni, acting director of the Economic Development Department for the past eight years, fighting the fight of his life, trying to get a good recommendation before going to the full council.

While everybody did agree that it was not his fault that Mayor Michael J. Sullivan didn't try to make the position official before now, a lot of people also think that it is too late in his term to try to place him and that should be left for the next administration. Evidently, that was the position the Personnel Committee took when the matter was sent to the full council with no recommendation.

Once before the full council, the theory of leaving the matter to the next administration prevailed and the nomination was rejected. Many department heads came to speak favorably about Mr. Schiavoni's skills, except his boss, Mayor Michael J. Sullivan, which left us thinking if Sullivan really appreciates Schiavoni's loyalty since he didn't come forward to endorse his own nominee.

And second, Chief of Police John Romero acted quite irrationally when Council President Patrick Blanchette tried to implement a plan which would restrict the use of take-home cars that could result in some savings for the city. Romero doesn't seem to realize that the residents of this city, a lot of them living on retirement, who have to support this fleet of 40 plus vehicles going and coming in every direction 24/7, gas and insurance included.

We have to remind him that we, the taxpayers, did not create this situation he wants us to support, but him and his loyal blue followers. If they decided to move far away, that should be their problem to commute to work every day, on time. Let's not forget the high salaries they all make, in some instances, double the average local residents make, and still, he wants more from us. Is that the protection to the citizens that he is talking about?





Saludos Amigos Lectores. Nuevamente contamos hoy con otro hermoso día. Es irónico que cuando está tan bello afuera, todos en la ciudad están nerviosos por dentro por la situación crítica del presupuesto y los cortes del estado. Si vamos a ser sinceros, la situación es un poco alarmante. Todos enfrentamos la posibilidad de que continuemos con el programa de furloughs durante el próximo año fiscal. Esto hace que perdamos una gran parte de nuestros salarios.

Ana Santos, mi asistente, yo estuvimos la semana pasada en una conferencia de dos días, la cual fue patrocinada por Opportunity Online, el cual es una organización que se encargará de escribir la beca para la Fundación Gates de parte del estado de Massachusetts. (Sin entrar en muchos detalles, la Fundación Gates ha escogido a nuestro estado, y a otros seis, como una de las áreas que necesitan ser estandarizadas en cuanto al acceso computarizado en las bibliotecas se refiere. Esta fundación tiene mucho dinero; así que esperamos que algo bueno salga de esto.)

Esta conferencia fue muy interesante en términos de que pudimos comunicarnos con otras bibliotecarias de nuestro estado, de ciudades y pueblos con demográficas muy diferentes a las de nosotros. Algunas de las bibliotecas de pueblos rurales pequeños cuentan con muchos problemas. La mayoría no puede contar con acceso fácil al Internet, mucho menos con proveerles a sus clientes con lo que necesitan para mantenerse al día. Nadie va a salir de esta economía sin ser afectado de alguna manera u otra; y esta falta de fondos hace que enfrentemos cada problema con soluciones innovadoras.

Siempre he dicho que durante tiempos difíciles es cuando las bibliotecas son más importantes y relevantes. La gente de Opportunity Online es del mismo pensar. Ellos nos enseñaron unos números impresionantes con respecto al desarrollo de la tecnología en los últimos años y lo

que está proyectado para el futuro. La información disponible para el público está creciendo constantemente al igual que los medios para el acceso a esta. Nos guste o no, si las bibliotecas desean satisfacer las necesidades básicas de sus clientes, tienen que mantenerse al día con la tecnología y al acceso de información. Si no, todos los que dependen de nosotros (estudiantes, personas buscando empleos, etc.) se quedarán atrás y no podrán competir contra otros que tengan este acceso. Uno de estos ejemplos es que hoy en día la mayoría de las compañías solo aceptan solicitudes para empleo a través del Internet.

A mi entender, todo esto demuestra que el acceso al Internet en las bibliotecas debe ser tratado como una utilidad por cualquier institución que determina la financiación de las bibliotecas. Para nosotros es una responsabilidad y necesidad que tenemos que cumplir hacia nuestra comunidad—no un lujo con el cual se puede negociar en los tiempos difíciles. Nadie hace del agua o electricidad un punto conflictivo, así debe también tratarse el servicio de Internet en la biblioteca. La Biblioteca Pública de Lawrence es muy afortunada porque contamos con una buena relación con el Departamento de Tecnología de la ciudad y así evitamos muchos de los problemas que tienen otros pueblos y ciudades.



Hello Rumbo readers. What a beautiful day again. It is ironic that when it is so lovely outside everyone in the city is in such chaos inside regarding the budgets and state aid cuts. It is all a bit alarming if truth be told. We are all facing the possibility of furloughs continuing through next year. That's a big bite from our salaries to cope with.

Assistant Director Ana Santos and I attended a two day conference last week sponsored by Opportunity Online which is an organization that will be writing the grant for Gates Foundation funding for the state of Massachusetts. (Without going into excessive detail on the subject, the Gates Foundation has targeted Massachusetts and six other states as key need areas for statewide standardization of library broadband access. This foundation has lots of money so good will be coming to all libraries if a progressive package is presented and funded.)

The conference was very interesting in terms of speaking with other Massachusetts librarians from cities and towns whose demographics differ significantly from our own. Some of the small rural libraries in the state really have their hands full. They can hardly get broadband access at all let alone what they need to keep their libraries and patrons up to speed. Nobody is coming out of this economy unscathed so each problem is exacerbated by lack of funding for innovative solutions.

I always say that hard times make libraries more important and relevant. The folks from Opportunity Online really backed this up. They showed us amazing numbers

regarding the development of technology over the past few years and projected into the future. The upshot is that information available is increasing geometrically as is the sophistication of the means to access that information. Like it or not, if a library is to meet the basic needs of its customers it must be up to date on current technology and information retrieval. If not, then those who depend on us (students doing research, job hunters, etc.) will be behind the curve and less and less able to keep up. One telling example: many companies now will only accept online applications.

To my understanding, this all proves that broadband access in libraries should be treated as a utility by whatever institution is determining library funding. It is a necessity for us to fulfill our function in the community—not a luxury to be bargained for and compromised in hard times. No one makes electricity or running water a disputed point and broadband should be the same. We are fortunate at the Lawrence Public Library to enjoy a good relationship with the city's IT department so we avoid a lot of these issues but they are real in other cities and towns.

I promised an update on Fr. Reyes from St. Mary's and his appointment to our board of trustees: he was voted in unanimously at the last council meeting. We are all thrilled and look forward to having him on board.

So, Go Sox, Celts and Bruins. I hope the latter two are still alive when you read this. See you at the library.

On Sunday, May 31st, from 11am to 4pm, the MSPCA at Nevins Farm will be the site of the newly formed Merrimack Valley Partnership for Cats' Adopt-a-thon, featuring 11 New England animal welfare groups in attendance with adoptable cats and kittens. Organizers anticipate more than 400 felines will be available for adoption.

"Every participating organization recognizes the need for us to work together to end homelessness for animals, particularly cats," said Mike Keiley, Manager of the MSPCA's Noble Family Animal Care and Adoption Center. "The homeless cat population in New England is so immense that no group can accomplish this goal alone. It is only with our combined efforts that we can begin to tackle the homeless cat problem."

"The merged resources will be a powerful collaboration to educate the public about the issue of feline overpopulation and the need for spaying and neutering cats," added Stacy LeBaron, President of Merrimack River Feline Rescue Society.

The groups have established a common adoption fee for the event, \$125 for adult cats (over six months of age); additionally some kittens will be available in the adoption center. All adoptable cats will be spayed or neutered, micro-chipped and up-

Community Supported Agriculture (CSA)
Makes Eating Locally Easy
Share-a-Share Program Spreads the Health

Groundwork Lawrence (GWL), a non-profit organization focused on building healthy communities, and Farmer Dave's, a progressive, sustainable farm of Dracut, MA, have teamed up for a third season to bring locally-grown, fresh fruits and vegetables to Lawrence with a community supported agriculture (CSA) program. A convenient solution for people who love the taste of farm-fresh produce, but lack the time to shop, or wherewithal to grow it, CSA shares come fresh-picked, packed and ready to go for as little as \$22 per week. Payment plans are available. Groundwork Lawrence is still offering shares for the 2009 season, with pick-ups every Tuesday beginning June 30 at 60 Island Street in Lawrence.

Every week, from late June through October, CSA members will receive a crate of fresh vegetables grown exclusively at Farmer Dave's fields in Dracut and Tewksbury. Every share includes generous portions of the season's bounty, each in its due time, including summer favorites such as tomatoes and corn, cooking staples like onions, carrots and potatoes, as well as chefs' picks like chard, beets, and other novelties to experiment with throughout the season. Farmer Dave employs organic farming methods to ensure products that are healthy, nutritious, tasty and responsibly grown.

The CSA also offers a fruit share featuring strawberries, blueberries, melons,

peaches and apples. The fruit is perfect for a healthy dessert. Businesses will often purchase a fruit or vegetable share to split amongst the employees in the office.

As part of its mission to make fresh, healthy food accessible to all, Groundwork Lawrence has introduced its Share-a-Share donation program. Donations to the Share-a-Share program help subsidize the cost of shares for individuals and families in Lawrence who are experiencing financial hardship. All donations are tax-deductible as allowable by law. Subsidized shares are available by request to Groundwork Lawrence, while funds are available. Groundwork Lawrence CSA members may use food stamps (EBT) to purchase their shares.

In addition, Groundwork Lawrence donates all unclaimed shares at the Lawrence site to the Neighbors in Need network of eight local food pantries. Almost 6,000 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables from the Lawrence site have been donated in the last two years. Similarly, over the past ten years, Farmer Dave's has donated over a half million pounds of produce to the needy in the area through the Merrimack Valley Food Bank and other hunger relief agencies.


