# Las tradiciones son importantes

**E**l primer desfile del Día de San Patricio no tuvo lugar en Irlanda, sino en los Estados Unidos. Según History.com, los soldados irlandeses sirviendo en el Ejército inglés marcharon a través de Ciudad de Nueva York el 17 de marzo de 1762. Junto con su música, el desfile de los soldados ayudó a volver a conectarlos con sus raíces irlandesas, así como con compatriotas irlandeses sirviendo en el ejército inglés.

Hoy, ese desfile es el más antiguo del mundo civil y el más grande de los Estados Unidos, con más de 150,000 participantes y millones de espectadores.

Desde allí se propagaron por todo el país y el mundo, entre ellos a Irlanda.

Aún cuando no tenemos una fecha del momento en que la tradición llegó a Lawrence nos luce razonable creer que se produjo cuando miles de inmigrantes irlandeses vinieron durante la revolución industrial, lo que hizo de esto un evento de los más coloridos de la ciudad.

Con el paso de los años y el cierre de las fábricas, muchos irlandeses se vieron forzados a salir de la ciudad en busca de mejores puestos de trabajo, haciendo difícil para los organizadores de la celebración anual, poder planear uno.

Afortunadamente, la ciudad cuenta con un grupo de personas que están decididas a mantener viva la tradición, dirigido por una mujer que ha borrado la palabra "imposible" de su diccionario. Su nombre es Marie Gosselin.

¡Este último desfile lo demuestra! Hace tres meses comenzó a organizar el desfile sin dinero en el banco. Ella y su equipo comenzaron a tocar puertas, el dinero empezó a llegar y así también los participantes del desfile, muchos de ellos no esperaron a ser invitados, pidieron ser incluidos.

Recientemente, Women in Business Magazine escribió sobre Marie: "... y ella es testaruda cuando de Lawrence se trata, con tal de mejorar su imagen; una lawrenciana de verdad."

## Traditions are important

**T**he first St. Patrick's Day parade took place not in Ireland but in the United States. According to History.com, Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched through New York City on March 17, 1762. Along with their music, the parade helped the soldiers reconnect with their Irish roots, as well as fellow Irishmen serving in the English army.

Today, that parade is the world's oldest civilian parade and the largest in the United States, with over 150,000 participants and millions onlookers.

From there it spread all over the country and the world, including Ireland.

Even when we don't have a date as of when that tradition came to Lawrence, it's fair to believe that it was when thousands of immigrants from Ireland came here during the industrial revolution, making that event one of the most colorful of the city.

With the passing of the years and the closing of the mills, the Irish moved out of the city in pursuit of better jobs, making it difficult for organizers of the yearly celebration to plan one.

Fortunately, the city has a group that has made it their business keeping the tradition alive, led by a woman that has erased the word "impossible" out of her dictionary. Her name is Marie Gosselin.

This last parade proved it! Three months ago she began organizing the parade with no money in the bank. She and her team started knocking on doors, the money started coming and so the parade participants, many of them didn't wait to be invited, they called her to be included.

Recently, Women in Business Magazine wrote about Marie: "... She is stubborn when it has to do with Lawrence and the improvement of its image; a true Lawrencian."

We totally agree.

# Comprender el Sistema Medicare

**L**a mayoría de las personas están familiarizadas con el sistema Medicare ya que probablemente ellas o algún miembro de su familia ya tengan la cobertura del programa de seguro de salud del gobierno. Pero con esta sopa de letras de opciones y reglas complejas, Medicare puede resultar abrumador para los no iniciados.

Si está cerca de los 65 años, estas son algunas de las cuestiones básicas del Medicare que debe saber:

Medicare provee beneficios a personas mayores de 65 años y a aquellas menores de 65 que tengan ciertas discapacidades o enfermedades renales en su etapa final. El período de enrolamiento inicial de la mayoría de las personas es de siete meses desde tres meses antes de cumplir los 65 años. Si no se inscribe en ese momento, entonces podrá hacerlo entre el 1 de enero y el 31 de marzo de cada año, con cobertura a partir del 1 de julio.

Medicare ofrece numerosos planes y opciones de cobertura, que incluyen:

**El Plan Parte A** ayuda a cubrir los gastos de hospitalización, servicios de hogares de reposo y hospicios, y atención domiciliaria. La mayoría de las personas no pagan una prima mensual y son inscriptas automáticamente al cumplir los 65 años o

después de haber recibido los beneficios por discapacidad de la Seguridad Social por 24 meses.

**El Plan Parte B** ayuda a cubrir los honorarios médicos, los servicios de atención ambulatoria y algunos servicios preventivos. Es opcional y tiene una prima mensual. La mayoría de las personas son inscriptas automáticamente junto con el Plan Parte A. Para rechazar esta opción, siga las instrucciones que vienen junto a su tarjeta de Medicare (enviada por correo aproximadamente tres meses antes de cumplir los 65 años). Evalúe cuidadosamente el hecho de rechazar esta opción ya que, por lo general, tendrá una penalidad si decide inscribirse más tarde, a menos que actualmente esté cubierto por un plan laboral.

**Los planes Parte C** (Ventaja Medicare) son planes HMO (Organización para el Mantenimiento de la Salud) o PPO (Red de Prestadores Preferidos) privados que proveen una cobertura similar a los Planes Parte A y B, pero que pueden incluir beneficios adicionales, como cobertura de medicamentos recetados, odontológica y oftalmológica. A cambio de tener que pagar menos dinero de su bolsillo y gozar de mayores beneficios, generalmente se

requiere que utilice la red de prestadores del plan, la cual puede ser más limitada en comparación con la cantidad de prestadores a los que podría acceder con los Planes Parte A y B.

**El Plan Parte D** cubre los medicamentos recetados. Es opcional y tiene una prima mensual. Estos planes privados varían mucho en términos de costos y medicamentos cubiertos. Al igual que en el Plan Parte B, se le podrá cobrar una penalidad por inscripción tardía si no se inscribe cuando le corresponde y decide hacerlo más tarde. Si usted tiene un Plan Parte C con cobertura de medicamentos, no necesita un Plan Parte D.

Muchas personas adquieren un seguro de salud Medigap (o Medicare Suplementario), ofrecido por aseguradores privados y que cumple estrictamente con las pautas de cobertura impuestas por el gobierno. Medigap ayuda a pagar muchos de los ítems no cubiertos por Medicare, incluyendo deducibles, co-pagos, co-seguros y, a veces, cobertura médica en el exterior.

La cobertura de Medigap ya está incluida en los planes de Ventaja Medicare Parte C; además, algunos empleadores y sindicatos lo ofrecen a sus jubilados. Los planes de Medigap pueden variar en términos de costos, beneficios cubiertos y estados participantes, por lo que debe comparar sus opciones cuidadosamente.

## Understanding Medicare

**M**ost people are somewhat familiar with Medicare, since it's likely they or a family member are already covered by the government-provided health insurance program. But with its alphabet soup of options and complex rules, Medicare can be daunting to the uninitiated.

If you're approaching 65, here are some Medicare basics you'll need to know:

Medicare provides benefits to people age 65 and older and those under 65 with certain disabilities or end-stage renal disease. Most people's initial enrollment period is the seven months beginning three months before the month they turn 65. If you miss that window, you may enroll between January 1 and March 31 each year, with coverage beginning July 1.

Medicare offers numerous plans and coverage options, including:

**Part A** helps cover in-patient hospital, nursing facility and hospice services, and home health care. Most people pay no monthly premium and are automatically enrolled upon turning 65, or after receiving Social Security disability benefits for 24 months.

**Part B** helps cover doctor's services, outpatient care and some preventive services. It's optional and has a monthly premium. Most people are automatically enrolled at the same time as Part A. To opt out, follow the instructions that accompanied your Medicare card (mailed about three months before your 65th birthday). Weigh opting out carefully because there's often a sizeable penalty if you enroll later, unless you're currently covered by an employer's plan.

**Part C** (Medicare Advantage) plans are privately run HMO or PPO Medicare plans that provide coverage similar to Parts A and B, but may also include additional benefits such as prescription drugs, dental and vision coverage. In exchange for lower out-of-pocket costs and additional benefits, you're usually required to use the plan's provider network, which may be more restrictive than providers you could access through regular Parts A and B.]

**Part D** helps cover prescription drugs. It's optional and carries a monthly premium. These privately run plans vary widely in terms of cost and medications covered. As with Part B, you may be charged a late-enrollment penalty if you don't sign up when first eligible and later decide to enroll. If you're in a Part C plan with drug coverage, you don't need Part D.

# Movimiento Estudiantil Sobre Inmigración en Lawrence

Las emociones fueron muy fuertes en el Movimiento Estudiantil Sobre Inmigración (Student Immigration Movement -SIM), celebrada el pasado martes, 16 de marzo. Varios jóvenes se reunieron en la Biblioteca Pública de Lawrence a compartir su dolor y el miedo de vivir como niños "indocumentados". Estos jóvenes están pidiendo la igualdad de acceso a la educación superior y para que el estado apoye el Dream Act que les permitiría temporal en la residencia del estado. En la residencia de estado les hace elegibles para la reducción de la matrícula de residente y de los préstamos estudiantiles.

Un muchacho joven vino a los Estados Unidos con sus padres cuando tenía 12 años de edad. Iba a ser deportado y lo llevaron a un centro de correcciones. Lo obligaron a usar un uniforme anaranjado. No había hecho nada malo, sin embargo, estaba siendo tratado como un criminal. Su caso llegó a la Legislatura y con la ayuda del Senador Ted Kennedy fue puesto en libertad. Se siente traicionado. "Este país es mi hogar, mi comunidad", dice, y sin embargo no puede ser ciudadano. "No puedo ir a la escuela."

Otro de 17 años de edad, Roberto, pertenece al ROTC y es un comandante de una unidad de Infantería de Marina, sin embargo, no está documentado. Vino de



Guatemala cuando tenía 5 años de edad. Sus padres trabajaban dos o tres empleos para poder recibir una educación. Su padre trabajó en una fábrica de papel. Roberto trabajó muy duro y fue aceptado en St. Mary's, una escuela privada y luego en Central Catholic High School.

Todo iba bien hasta que solicitaron ayuda económica. Su solicitud fue devuelta porque no dio el número de Seguro Social. Habló con su familia sobre cómo obtener un número de Seguro Social. Sus padres le

explicaron que no sería posible conseguir uno, así que renunció a la oportunidad y se fue a Lawrence High School. Ahora quiere continuar con su educación, pero hasta que reciba un número de Seguro Social no puede hacerlo. Él no puede ser admitido a una escuela o conseguir ayuda financiera.

"La educación es clave, que lo saca de la

# Student Immigration Movement in Lawrence

The emotion ran high at the Student Immigration Movement (SIM) meeting last Tuesday, March 16th. Several young adults gathered at the Lawrence Public Library to share their pain and fear from living as "undocumented" children. These young people are asking for equal access to higher education and for the state to support the Dream Act that would allow them temporary in-state residency. In-state residency makes them eligible for the reduced in-state tuition and student loans.

One young man came to the United States with his parents when he was 12 years old. He was going to be deported and was taken to a house of corrections. They forced him to wear an orange jump suit. He had done nothing wrong, yet he was being treated like a criminal. His case made





## FINEGOLD: School-to-Career Program Showcased for Local Dignitaries

William Kelley, Lawrence Field Office Director for the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. Both Rep. Finegold and Director Kelley spoke about the importance of education, what employers expect from the employees they hire, and asked questions of the students about future career goals.

"So much of what we do in public service is critical to our future as a country; that future starts with you," Rep. Finegold told the kids. "Figure out what you love to do, work hard, and get a higher education." Rep. Finegold spoke about the important public services that government provides, and by extension, the importance of voting in local, state and federal elections. Drawing from his own experiences, he urged the students to consider a career in public service as they begin to think about their post high school years.

Mr. Kelley shared what he and his staff learned from the students, Jimmy Castro and Keiry Melo, who visited the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services office for Job Shadow Day in early February. Several students offered Representative Finegold business cards they had designed as part of the workshop series.

Additional guests for this fourth workshop in a series of six workshops were Frederick T. Carberry, Executive Director of the Merrimack Valley Workforce Investment Board (MVWIB), and Arthur Chilingirian, Executive Director of the ValleyWorks Career Center. Mr. Carberry, during his remarks, noted that the program, which is funded by the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), and offered in conjunction with Lawrence High School,

the MVWIB, and the ValleyWorks Career Center, is to help students make clear connections between what they learn in school and how early work experience and opportunities like Job Shadow Day, unpaid internships, and summer jobs help youth to be better prepared to enter the workforce and underscore the importance of staying in school.

This workshop series is only a small component of the overall connection provided to students who participate in the program during the school year, and provides a great opportunity to make the connection between schools and work that is beneficial for students and employers. Students explore interests, explore future careers, prepare a resume, and connect with potential future employers.

One student shared that during the Connecting Activities/School to Career Program the knowledge she gained was "how to deal with others, even if the person didn't agree at all times with me". Another student shared: "The most helpful part of the program was learning to introduce yourself to others and to meet new people."

Each of the students and many others will continue to work with Matt Qualter, ValleyWorks Career Center Youth Counselor, to explore careers, formulate a plan for career success, and seek part-time after school employment and/or summer jobs.

it to the Legislature and with help from Senator Ted Kennedy he was released. He feels betrayed. "This country is home, my community," he says, and yet he cannot be a citizen. "I cannot go to school."

Another 17-year-old, Roberto, belongs to ROTC and is a commander of a Marine Corps Unit, yet he is undocumented. He came from Guatemala when he was 5 years old. His parents worked two and three jobs so he could get an education. His dad worked in a paper mill. Roberto worked very hard and was accepted at St. Mary's, a private school and later at Central Catholic High School.

All was going well until he applied for financial aid. His application was returned because he gave no Social Security number. He talked to his family about getting a Social Security number. His parents explained that he wouldn't be able to get one, so he gave up the chance and went to Lawrence High School. Now he wants to continue his education, but until he gets a Social Security number he can't do that. He can't be admitted to a school or get financial aid.

"Education is key; it takes you from poverty... knowledge is power." These are phrases one student used to express the importance of his continuing his education beyond high school. Going on is difficult financially. Without lower tuition, access to loans and a chance to earn a wage, it is virtually impossible for him to meet this dream.

When she was twelve, Francisca, came

to the States with her family from Mexico. Learning English was very difficult. Living here was hard. Even more difficult was being undocumented. She can't go to college, but she couldn't talk about it with her friends. All of them were going, and she would hide from her teachers in the hallway so she wouldn't have to tell them she wasn't applying. She felt so embarrassed that she couldn't apply to schools and even more so that she couldn't pay for a school. Being undocumented makes you feel like a bad person, and that she has no opportunities or rights to an education or to work.

At age six, Clarita emigrated from Brazil. She didn't want to leave her country and was enticed by her mother telling her that Mickey Mouse lived in the US. Her father did also. When they arrived, Clarita was thrilled to be reunited with him. In high school she won the Abigail Adams Scholarship and had to sit through two hours of honors speeches, knowing the whole time that she would not be able to accept it because she was undocumented.

Immigration came to the house and took her brother. They said they would be back for her. Her mother turned herself in to the authorities in hopes of protecting the rest of her children and she was deported for 20 years. Clarita cannot leave because she wouldn't be able to return to the US. She misses her relatives and mother and it will be many years before she can see them. She has found solace in the SIM program and in working with other students for the

"Dream Act".

Another student from the Dominican Republic encountered similar problems. She came when she was eight and promised all her neighbors that she would bring them back presents. Later Rena realized that she could never return without papers and her father couldn't go home to his mother's funeral. Rena worked hard in school and kept thinking that her papers would come. Wanting to apply to colleges, she fearfully approached the counselor who made her feel worse, saying, she had "never met anyone with such a 'big problem.'" She found a job in a dentist's office, but had to leave because she didn't have a Social Security number. Fortunately, she has found support from other students in similar situations through her work with SIM.

The fear of raids, of being deported, of families being split up makes one angry and courageous. Living as an undocumented person is like living always in a shadow. These students are coming out to let everyone know what it is like to be treated as a criminal and to not have access to the same education and rights as other Americans. These young people see themselves as American and expect to be treated without discrimination. They are courageous to be boarding a bus for Washington DC on the 20th and to be standing up for their rights to be recognized as any other American citizens.

## INMIGRACIÓN: Movimiento Estudiantil Sobre Inmigración en Lawrence

pobreza... el conocimiento es poder." Estas son frases que un estudiante utiliza para expresar la importancia de su continuar su educación más allá de la escuela secundaria. Seguir adelante es difícil económicamente. Sin matrículas más bajas, el acceso a préstamos y la oportunidad de ganar un salario, es prácticamente imposible para él cumplir con este sueño.

Cuando tenía doce años, Francisca, vino a los Estados con su familia desde México. Aprender inglés fue muy difícil. Vivir aquí era difícil. Aún más difícil es ser indocumentado. Ella no puede ir a la universidad, pero no podía hablar de ello con sus amigos. Todos ellos iban y ella se escondía de sus maestros en el pasillo para no tener que decirles que no estaba aplicando. Se sentía tan avergonzada por no poder aplicar a las escuelas y más aún por no poder pagar por una escuela. El ser

indocumentado la hacía sentir como una mala persona que no tiene oportunidades o derechos a una educación o al trabajo.

En los seis años, Clarita emigró de Brasil. Ella no quería salir de su país y su madre la convenció diciéndole que Mickey Mouse vive en los Estados Unidos. Su padre también lo hizo. Cuando llegaron, Clarita estaba encantada de reunirse con él. En la escuela secundaria ganó la Beca de Abigail Adams y tuvo que sentarse a través de dos horas de discursos sabiendo todo el tiempo que no iba a poder aceptar porque era indocumentada.

Inmigración llegó a casa y se llevaron a su hermano. Dijeron que estarían de vuelta por ella. Su madre se entregó a las autoridades con la esperanza de proteger al resto de sus hijos y fue deportada por 20 años. Clarita no puede salir porque no podría volver a los Estados Unidos. Echa de

menos a sus familiares y madre, y pasarán muchos años antes de que ella los pueda ver. Ella ha encontrado consuelo en el programa SIM y en el trabajo con otros estudiantes a favor de la ley del "Dream Act".

Otro estudiante de la República Dominicana se encontró con problemas similares. Llegó cuando tenía ocho años y prometió a todos sus vecinos que les traería regalos cuando regresara. Más tarde, Rena cuenta que nunca podría volver sin papeles y su padre no pudo ir al funeral de su madre. Rena trabajó muy duro en la escuela y pensaba que sus papeles iban a venir. Queriendo aplicar a la universidad, se acercó con cierto temor a su consejera quien la hizo sentir peor, diciéndole que, "Nunca había conocido a alguien con un problema 'tan grande.'" Ella encontró un trabajo en la oficina de un dentista, pero tuvo que dejarlo por no tener un número de

Seguro Social. Afortunadamente, ella ha encontrado el apoyo de otros estudiantes en situaciones similares a través de su trabajo con SIM.

El temor de las redadas, de ser deportados, de las familias que son divididas da rabia y coraje. Vivir como una persona indocumentada es como vivir siempre en la sombra. Estos estudiantes están hablando para que todos sepan lo que es ser tratado como un criminal y que no tienen acceso a la misma educación y los derechos de los demás. Estos jóvenes se ven a sí mismos como americanos y esperan ser tratados sin discriminación. Son valientes abordando un autobús rumbo a Washington, D.C. el 20 de marzo y pidiendo ser reconocidos como cualquier otro ciudadano estadounidense.





# Summer camp registration is underway

Open house to learn about camps is Sunday, March 28

On Sunday, March 28, the Merrimack Valley YMCA will host an open house at the Andover/North Andover YMCA (165 Haverhill Street, Andover) from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. Parents and prospective campers can meet the camp directors, view camp PowerPoint presentations, and ask questions. Current campers will also be on hand to discuss their YMCA camp experiences.

Registration is underway for the YMCA's two residential summer camps — Camp Lawrence for Boys and Camp Nokomis for Girls, as well as for YMCA Day Camp Otter in Salem, New Hampshire.

Both resident camps, located on Bear Island, Lake Winnipesaukee, New Hampshire, offer fun-filled, educational experiences for youth ages 8 to 16. Each year, the YMCA enrolls more than 1,000 children in these residential camps, hosting many local youth from the Merrimack Valley. Campers hail from as far away as Europe, as well as from all over the United States.

Camp Lawrence and Camp Nokomis sessions are two weeks long, beginning during the week of June 26, 2010. Enrollments are accepted in 2, 4, 6 or 8 week periods only. Both camps, located on separate acreage on Bear Island, are situated on tranquil settings of sandy beaches and wooded trails, the perfect environment to offer educational experiences which encourage creative expression, develop new interests, promote sportsmanship, improve skills, foster spiritual awareness, and establish physical fitness.

Day Camp Otter begins the week of June 21 and runs through the week of August 23. Campers can register for each

week separately. Established in 1957, YMCA Day Camp Otter is a scenic, daytime get away for boys and girls ages 6 to 13 and over 40 staff from the Merrimack Valley. Camp Otter is made up of 13 acres and is located on the sandy shores of Captain Pond in Salem, NH. Camp Otter is a co-ed day camp with daily transportation provided throughout the Merrimack Valley and Southern New Hampshire.

Nestled among pine trees and protected wetlands, Camp Otter consists of 10 camper cabins set up in a village manner to promote community. Our health director heads the medical program and a local doctor is always on call. Program areas include a swimming area for both instructional and free swim time, boating, basketball/volleyball courts, baseball/soccer field, archery and air rifle range, arts and crafts, and low and high ropes courses.

Along with the weekly themes, Camp Otter days are filled with all-camp activities and visits from special guests. Although competitive opportunities may occur in some of these special programs, the emphasis is always on fun.

The Merrimack Valley YMCA camps celebrated 100 years of camping in 2007.

All three YMCA camps are accredited by the American Camp Association. ACA-accredited camps meet up to 300 standards for health, safety, and program quality.
