"Frishman was born to parents who were 'people of service' and Kay has lived her life in the same spirit. She has built Family Service into one of the city's most important providers of service to strengthen families. She has helped to build and lead a cohort of agency directors who work together to strengthen the broader social fabric of our city.

And as a lover and painter of the Merrimack and its vistas, she has captured the vibrancy of our city in her own work, and won her persistent battle to preserve the city's most iconic vista, the view of the dam from the Falls Bridge, for future generations to enjoy."

Inconcebible

Para nadie es un secreto que en estos últimos años hemos criticado mucho a la administración anterior por la forma en que administraban el departamento escolar. Constantemente recibíamos información acerca de cosas que sucedían en las escuelas, tales como carencia de material escolar, equipo, ventanas rotas, mientras que el superintendente generosamente regalaba computadoras por docenas a sus amigos y se beneficiaba de lo que podía coger del sistema escolar. Muchas veces la información venía desde dentro de las mismas escuelas.

Todas las informaciones eran verificadas antes de ser reportadas; desafortunadamente, la administración solía calificarlas de rumores y las ignoraba.

Esta vez, ha sucedido lo inconcebible. Acabamos de recibir información acerca de las condiciones de dos de nuestras escuelas (la escuela de Estudios Excepcionales y la Escuela Francis M. Leahy) en un correo electrónico de una tienda por departamentos, no una tienda de vecindario sino de una cadena nacional, Big Lots.

Big Lots está donando \$100,000 para ser repartidos entre 46 escuelas de la nación y Lawrence tiene a dos de sus escuelas compitiendo por un premio de \$10,000 cada una. Para participar, las escuelas deben enviar un video explicando sus necesidades.

En su video, el director de la escuela de Estudios Excepcionales dice que para asegurar que el estudiante tenga éxito, necesitamos computadoras, software (programas) y material de enseñanza que los ayuden a alcanzar su máximo potencial. Evidentemente, la administración que ha gastado millones en otras escuelas abandonó a esta.

Y se pone peor. Tres estudiantes de la Escuela Francis M. Leahy, grabaron su video desde un 'Trailer con Goteras', con la esperanza de que si ganaban, podrían arreglar el techo y así podrían asistir a clases sin sombrillas.

No sabemos cuando estos videos fueron hechos. Lo que si estamos seguros es que el antiguo superintendente nunca los hubiera autorizado y estamos convencidos de que estos videos son un resultado directo de la mala administración anterior.

Solo nos queda la esperanza de que la nueva administración tome serias medidas para corregir inmediatamente esta situación. Y si alguna de las escuelas gana, el dinero sea invertido en cortos viajes de placer para los estudiantes.

Después de todo, ellos se merecen una A por su esfuerzo. Ellos trataron de hacer como niños lo que los adultos no supieron hacer por ellos.

Unthinkable

Over the years, it was not a secret that we have been very critical of the way the former administration managed the school department. Constantly we received information about wrongdoing in the schools, such as lack of supplies, equipment, broken windows, while the superintendent generously gave away computers to his friends by the dozens and benefitted from all he could take from the school system. Many times the information came from within the very same schools.

All information was checked for accuracy before it was reported; unfortunately, the administration used to call it rumors and chose to ignore them.

This time, the unthinkable just happened. We just received information about the condition of two Lawrence schools (the School for Exceptional Studies and the Francis M. Leahy School) in an e-mail from a department store, not your neighborhood department store but from a big national department store chain, Big Lots.

Big Lots is donating \$100,000 to be shared among 46 schools across the nation and Lawrence has those two schools competing for a prize of \$10,000 each. To participate, the schools must submit a video explaining their needs.

In their video, the School for Exceptional Studies' principal says that In order to ensure the students' success we need computers, software, and life skills materials to help them reach their full potential. Evidently, the administration that has spent millions in other schools left this one out.

And it's getting worst. Three Francis M. Leahy School students shot their video from a 'Rainy Trailer', hoping to win in order to fix the leaky roof of the trailer so they can attend class without umbrellas.

We don't know when these videos were shot. We know for sure that the former superintendent of schools would have never authorized such a thing, but we are convinced that the videos are a direct result of the mismanagement of that administration.

We can only hope that the new administration will take a serious look at this situation and fix it immediately. And if any school wins, use the money for a field day trip for the students.

After all, they deserve an A for their effort. They try to do as kids what adults didn't do for them.






Asamblea Anual de MVHP

"Hemos estado operando durante los últimos trece años en negro", dijo Jim Wilde, director ejecutivo del Merrimack Valley Housing Partnership al mismo tiempo que agradeció al personal de su agencia y miembros de la junta directiva durante su reunión anual el 27 de mayo 2010 la cual se celebró en Boott Cotton Mills Museum en Lowell.

El Presidente de la Junta Robert Omoyeni, elogió el entusiasmo de Jim llamándolo "infectiosa", y agregó que, "nosotros, los miembros de la junta directiva somos los beneficiarios de trabajar con el mejor personal que cualquier organización pudiera aspirar a tener."

En su referencia a la economía, Omoyeni pasó a explicar que "cuando las empresas que nos apoyaban comenzaron a aguantarse, nos dimos cuenta de lo mala que estaba la situación." La agencia se ajustó a las condiciones actuales y continuó sirviendo a 750 familias en 2009.

Más de 11,000 familias han completado el programa de entrenamiento del Proyecto Génesis para comprar una vivienda. Las clases comienzan todos los meses y se ofrecen en inglés, español y khmer.

MVHP También presta apoyo administrativo y técnico para los programas

de asistencia con el pago de entrada para los primeros compradores.

También agradecieron a Middlesex Community College por permitirles espacio para ofrecer las clases del programa de primeros compradores.

Para hablar sobre el mercado inmobiliario y la propiedad de una casa en Massachusetts invitaron a Prabal Chakrabarti, AVP y director y Ana Patricia Muñoz, Analista de Políticas de Desarrollo Comunitario de la Reserva Federal de Boston. Su exposición ofreció un estudio claro de las prácticas actuales y la participación de las comunidades minoritarias en Massachusetts.

La prevalencia de los préstamos de alto costo entre las minorías

"Los precios de la vivienda en Massachusetts han disminuido considerablemente menos que en los EE.UU. en general," said Ana Patricia Muñoz.

Un estudio realizado por el Centro para Préstamos Responsables (Center for Responsible Lending - 2006) muestra en la mayor parte de los préstamos hipotecarios de

alto riesgo, los prestatarios afro-americanos y latinos tienen un mayor riesgo de recibir préstamos de alto índice que prestatarios blancos, incluso después de controlar factores de riesgo (incluyendo los puntajes de crédito). Las tasas de rechazo para los negros y los latinos son más grandes que las tasas de rechazo de los blancos en todos los niveles de ingresos.

En varios tipos de productos de préstamos, los afroamericanos y los prestatarios latinos fueron más del 30% más probabilidades de recibir un préstamo de tasa fija más alta tasa que prestatarios blancos. Las posibles explicaciones fueron

préstamos dispares de fijación de precios - "el rendimiento de margen" (el 59% de los préstamos originados de alto riesgo en 2005 fueron hechos por agentes hipotecarios), y la segmentación del mercado: prestamistas con mayor tasa dirigidas a los prestatarios afro-americanos y latinos (en 2001, 64% de los prestatarios afro-americanos recibió su préstamo de un corredor comparado al 38% de los prestatarios blancos).



1990 al 2008, mientras que la comunidad negra se ha incrementado un 33.2% y los blancos (no hispanos) se ha reducido en un 3.3% debido a que se mudaron", dijo el Sr. Chakrabarti.

El censo proyecta que el segmento hispano de la población total en los EE.UU. crecerá del 16% en 2010 a 19% en 2020 y al 28% en 2050 (en virtud de las constantes inmigraciones). Incluso en caso de una inmigración baja, las minorías étnicas encabezarán el 73 por ciento de crecimiento de los hogares entre el 2010 al 2020, con los hispanos a la cabeza por un 36 por ciento.

Los hispanos pueden carecer de una buena información acerca de compra de vivienda

Según una encuesta de Fannie Mae (2009) sólo el 36% de los hispanos son muy seguros de que conseguiría la información necesaria para elegir el producto apropiado préstamo y el 44% de los hispanos creen que una de las principales razones de no comprar una casa es que el proceso de comprar una casa parece demasiado complicado.

Pero, según otro Fannie Mae Encuesta Nacional de Vivienda en el 2010, el 85% de la población general (82% de los hispanos y el 83% de los afroamericanos) siguen creyendo que ser dueño tiene más sentido que el alquiler.





Desde que las tormentas y la inundación de primavera azotaron el Estado Libre Asociado, la Agencia Federal para el Manejo de Emergencias (FEMA, por sus siglas en inglés) y sus colaboradores estatales y federales han trabajado mancomunadamente para ayudar a comunidades afectadas. La cifra total de subvenciones y préstamos a bajo interés aprobados llega a más de \$81 millones, según las autoridades encargadas de la recuperación.

- 4,691 residentes visitaron un Centro de Recuperación por Desastre (DRC, por sus siglas en inglés) antes de que los esfuerzos de estos centros concluyeran el 4 de junio. Un total de 12 DRCs se abrieron en la zona de desastre comprendida por siete condados.

Manzi Accepts Historic World War II Flags

Flags Will Be Displayed in City Hall Later This Month

On June 7, 2010 Methuen Veterans Services Officer Thomas Hargreaves assisted Joseph Bella, Secretary of the Methuen Historical Commission and James Smith, member of the Methuen Historical Commission in presenting to the City of Methuen two (2) flags that had flown over Merchant Marine ships that were transporting American and allied forces across the English Channel on D-Day, June 6, 1944.

The flags were donated to the City by Mr. & Mrs. Michael Markey, who currently reside in Georgia. The flags were previously displayed in the museum at the Nevins Library until the library was expanded and the museum taken down. They have been in storage since that time. They will be displayed as part of the Freedom Shrine in City hall.

These flags are tattered and soot coated as they were flying over the ships as the battle to land the American and Allied forces raged on around them. World War II is the only time that the Merchant Marine has been recognized for military purposes and the sailors who served on those ships were granted veterans status.

Joseph Bella explained how the Historical Commission came into possession of the flags and James Smith introduced Mr. Markey's daughter, Ms. Michelle McCormick, who still resides



in Methuen. Members of the Historical Commission and those who were involved in finding a proper location to display the flags were also on hand. Bella also

explained the significance of the flags and why their display is important to present as well as future Methuen residents.

Mayor Manzi thanked the Markey

family for their generous donation and is planning to display the flags later this month.

Dog Bite Prevention for All Ages

Many of us share our homes with dogs and think of them as members of the family, which is why it's easy to forget that they are animals—with their own ways of understanding and reacting to their surroundings. In order to live keep people and dogs safe, we need to understand how they communicate and respect what they are trying to tell us.

Almost 5 million dog bites are reported every year in this country, and there are many more that go unreported. About 70% of dog bites happen to kids, and the majority of bites are from dogs who know the child. Because of this, it's important to practice safe behavior around all dogs, including our own. While you may guess that young children are the most frequent victims, the truth is that kids in the 10-14 age range are more frequently bitten (especially boys).

Any dog with teeth has the potential to bite, because biting isn't something a "bad" dog does—dogs are dogs, and any one of them can bite if they feel in danger or threatened. It's up to us as responsible adults to teach each other and our children to respect dogs, and understand that growling, snapping, and biting are a dog's way of saying "make it stop."

What should every dog owner do to prevent their dogs from biting?

- Choose an appropriate dog for your family. Dogs that are tolerant and comfortable being handled, without signs of food or possession aggression, make appropriate family pets. There is no "perfect" breed—good dogs are made, not born.
- Socialize your dog. Dogs that have an opportunity to spend time with different people in different situations are less likely to be nervous in normal circumstances.
- Spay or neuter your dog. Dogs that are altered are about three times less likely to bite than intact dogs.
- Train your dog and teach her appropriate behavior. Reward your dog for her "good" behaviors. Do not reinforce aggressive behavior by teaching your dog to chase or play rough, even in fun.
- Be a responsible dog owner. Make sure your dog is licensed in your town and up-to-date on his rabies vaccine. For everyone's safety, abide by leash laws.

Make your dog a member of your family; dogs that spend a great deal of time alone in the backyard or tied on a chain often become dangerous.

How can I avoid being bitten by a dog (and teach my children to avoid bites)?

Never disturb a dog while she's:

- eating
- chewing on a toy
- caring for puppies (not a concern if she's spayed!)
- sleeping
- ill or injured
- nervous or seems afraid (signs of discomfort vary, but usually include lowered head and ears, tail tucked, and wide eye gaze)

The most important lessons for children to learn are not to chase or tease dogs they know and to avoid dogs they don't know.

What is the best way to greet someone else's dog (and teach my children to do the same)?

Before petting someone else's dog, ask the owner for permission. Hold your hand in a fist, fingers down, and let the dog sniff you.

Most dogs are comfortable being stroked under the chin or on the side of the torso. Remind children that they should be careful to avoid a dog's eyes, ears, mouth, feet, and tail when petting them.

It is never safe to approach a strange dog, especially when tied in a yard or behind a fence. If you encounter a strange dog, do not turn your back and run away or scream. Screaming and running will excite a high energy dog and cause them to chase. It is safer to look forward (not into the dog's eyes) and back away slowly.

Ethics Commission Fines Former Lawrence School Official Mark Rivera for Conflict of Interest Law Violations

Repeatedly accessed a licensed database to view personal information unrelated to his duties

The State Ethics Commission ("Commission") approved a Disposition Agreement ("Agreement") in which Mark Rivera ("Rivera"), the former Lawrence School Department Urban Affairs Liaison and Special Assistant to the School Superintendent, admitted to violating G.L. c. 268A, the conflict of interest law, by improperly using his position to repeatedly obtain unauthorized access to personal information that was not related to official school business. Pursuant to the Agreement, Rivera agreed to pay a \$5,000 civil penalty.


According to the Agreement, the Lawrence School Department paid a \$120 monthly fee to access LexisNexis, a database that contains both public and non-public information about individuals. The school department purchased access to the database to allow Rivera and one other school department employee to obtain contact information for parents no longer living in the district, and to contact parents and students regarding attendance issues. The Agreement states, "[f]rom

2007-2009, Rivera repeatedly misused his School Department authority to access the LexisNexis database through the School Department's account to conduct hundreds of searches of non-public information on individuals, including state and local elected officials, professional athletes and Hollywood celebrities, for his own private purposes" Section 23(b)(2) prohibits a municipal employee from, knowingly, or with reason to know, using or attempting to use his official position to secure for himself or others unwarranted privileges or exemptions, which are of substantial value, and which are not properly available to similarly situated individuals. By using his official position to access the database and conduct hundreds of searches of non-public information on individuals, Rivera repeatedly violated section 23(b)(2).

"Databases and other information technology resources are for the conduct of official business, and may be accessed and used only for legitimate business purposes," stated Commission Executive Director Karen L. Nober.

When you are a farmer at heart and happen to live in a city, once you find a piece of workable soil where to plant and grow vegetables, you feel rich, as rich as if you have found gold.

This is the case with Carlos Gonzalez, native of Nagua, Dominican Republic, now a Lawrence resident, who stroked gold at the corner of Hampshire and Alder St.

For the past 3 years, Gonzalez has been planting tomatoes, eggplants, lettuce,

peppers, cilantro and other produce for his own family consumption and for sale around the neighborhood in order to make up for the expense of buying seeds, plants, fertilizer, etc.

"I grow from seeds as much as I can, but since my space is very limited, I have to buy the plants in nurseries, and that is mighty expensive," said Gonzalez, while going back to work on his garden.

Some girls seem to like hi flying better than and getting yelled at by the coaches that are demanding perfection, crisp passing, dribbling and defense from a group of youngsters that shouldn't be construed as machines. 



DÍAZ: MVHP Annual Meeting



have completed the Project Genesis home buyer training program. Classes begin every month and are offered in English, Spanish and Khmer.

MVHP also provides administrative and technical support for down payment assistance programs for first time home buyers.

They also thanked Middlesex Community College for providing classroom space to allow their First Time Home Buyer program to take place.

To discuss the housing market and home ownership in Massachusetts they invited Prabal Chakrabarti, AVP and Director and Ana Patricia Muñoz, Policy Analyst Community Development of Federal Reserve Bank of Boston. Their presentation provided a clear study of current practices involving minority communities in Massachusetts.

Prevalence of high-cost loans among minorities

"Housing prices in Massachusetts have declined less sharply than in the US as a whole," said Ana Patricia Muñoz.

A study by the Center for Responsible

Lending (2006) shows that for most part of subprime home loans, African-American and Latino borrowers are at greater risk of receiving high-rate loans than white borrower, even after controlling for risk factors (including LTV and credit scores). Denial rates for Blacks and Latinos are larger than denial rates for whites in every income level.

For several types of loan products, African-Americans and Latino borrowers were more than 30% more likely to receive a higher-rate fixed rate loans than white borrowers. Possible explanations were disparate loan pricing—"yield-spread" (59% of subprime originations in 2005 were broker-originated), and market segmentation: higher-rate lenders targeting African-American and Latino borrowers (in 2001, 64% of African-American borrowers received their loan from a broker versus 38% of white borrowers).

"There has been an 87.3% growth among Latinos in Massachusetts between 1990 and 2008, while the Black community

has increased by 33.2% and the White (non-Latinos) has decreased by 3.3% because they moved out," said Mr. Chakrabarti.

The census projects that Hispanics' share of total population in the U.S. will grow from 16% in 2010 to 19% in 2020 and to 28% in 2050 (under constant immigration). Even under the low immigration assumptions, minorities will fuel 73 percent of household growth in 2010–20, with Hispanics leading the way at 36 percent.

Hispanics may lack good information about home-buying

According to a Fannie Mae survey (2009) only 36% of Hispanics are very confident they'd get the information needed to choose the right loan product and 44% of Hispanics think that a major reason of not buying a house is that the process of buying a home seems too complicated.

But, according to another Fannie Mae National Housing Survey in 2010, 85% of the general population (82% of Hispanics and 83% of African Americans) continue to believe that owning makes more sense than renting.

In the Fannie Mae Survey, about 6 in 10 minorities said that if they moved, they would seek to own, compared to roughly 3 in 10 who would look to rent. But in the current crisis, middle income households face an increased housing cost burden. Credit remains tight, the tax credit is ending and some report they will have to defer.
