Northern Essex Community College (NECC) presentó su nuevo campus localizado en el Riverwalk, en Lawrence, el jueves, 26 de agosto 2010. El evento se realizó en el Salón de Funciones de Salvatore's, Edificio 1, Riverwalk.

Aquellos que asistieron al evento fueron informados de cómo adquirir un grado de asociado o un certificado en uno de sus 11 programas de comercio y computadoras.

También escucharon acerca de desarrollo profesional sin crédito, oportunidades de enriquecimiento personal y de clases de idioma inglés diseñadas a preparar a inmigrantes que no hablan el idioma para que puedan entrar al colegio o conseguir empleo.

El público fue invitado a echar un vistazo al nuevo espacio de NECC, que será abierto al público cuando comience el semestre de otoño, el 8 de septiembre y a hablar con los profesores universitarios y personal acerca de los programas y servicios que se brindarán en la nueva instalación.

"Estamos muy entusiasmados con lo que estamos trayendo a Lawrence", dijo Lane Glenn, vicepresidente de asuntos académicos. "Las personas que viven y trabajan en la zona ahora tendrán muchas más opciones a su disposición, incluyendo programas de crédito y sin crédito. Ellos pueden ganar un título universitario asociado o certificado en negocios o ciencias de la computación, tomar un curso sin créditos para el crecimiento de carrera o de enriquecimiento personal, y estimular sus habilidades del idioma inglés," terminó Glenn.

Ocupando aproximadamente 26,000 pies cuadrados dentro de la antigua fábrica recientemente renovada, el centro contará con 20 aulas, cinco salas de capacitación en computación, una sala de conferencias y oficinas del personal albergando el Center for Adult Education Programs and Practitioners (CAEPP), actualmente localizado en el Louise Haffner Education Center en Lawrence.

Desde Mi Esquina

Nombramientos permanentes

El Comité de Personal del Concilio de la Ciudad de Lawrence se reunió el pasado martes, 24 de agosto para nombrar a varios miembros de juntas directivas y comités recomendados por el Alcalde William Lantigua, así como tres posiciones administrativas.

Frank Bonet fue el primero en ser llamado y una gran cantidad de tiempo se dedicó a él para terminar posponiéndolo hasta la próxima reunión. La razón fue porque él es un candidato a Representante Estatal por el Distrito 17 y en caso de ganar las elecciones, tendrán que buscar un nuevo Director de Personal otra vez. No he encontrado nada racista o discriminatorio en la moción del Concejal del Distrito F, Marc Laplante para posponerlo. Tiene mucho sentido.

Luego vino el nombramiento de Patrick Blanchette como director permanente de Desarrollo Económico para la ciudad. Empezó de una manera muy contundente diciendo los concejales que tenía una declaración que leer y procedió a leer una breve biografía de sus diez años y medio al servicio de la ciudad, la experiencia adquirida y la forma en que se relaciona con su posición actual. Ellos escucharon y después de algunas preguntas no conflictivas, fue enviado a la próxima reunión del Concilio en pleno para su confirmación.

Luego, le tocó el turno Melix Bonilla como Jefe Diputado del Departamento de Policía. Como yo esperaba fuegos artificiales durante esta sesión, fui a buscar un poco de helado a la cocina y cuando volví ya se había terminado. Este también fue pospuesto hasta que el Comité de Ordenanzas se reúna de nuevo.

Lo qué hizo que esto sucediera fue que el Comité de Ordenanza se iba a reunir la semana anterior y discutir la eliminación de la posición de jefe diputado de la policía. Si se hubieran reunido y aprobado dicha medida, no habría necesidad de pasar por este paso de nombrar para ese puesto a Bonilla y habría sido degradado de nuevo a su rango de sargento.

Curiosamente, teníamos un diputado solamente hace unos años cuando el jefe de la policía John Romero optó por un segundo y así es como Emil DeFusco fue ascendido de sargento y se convirtió en el segundo jefe diputado. Para esa fecha, ya el tenía la edad de jubilación obligatoria y pidió al concilio que aprobara una prórroga para que pudiera continuar "serviendo a la ciudad", mientras que aumentaría su cheque de jubilación.

Emil DeFusco fue objeto más tarde de un reportaje investigativo en el canal 5 por trabajar un par de horas y volverse a casa a media mañana. Incluso lo siguieron durante varias semanas y señalaron que iba todos los viernes por la noche a un restaurante en Salem, MA en un automóvil propiedad de la ciudad con la gasolina pagada por nosotros. El escándalo fue tan grande que terminó retirándose. El Jefe de Policía Romero negó las acusaciones de Channel 5.

Después de eso, el concilio decidió eliminar la segunda posición de jefe diputado. Ahora ellos quieren cancelar el único que queda lo cual me hace pensar que puede que no sea necesario después de todo.

Pero, no deje que le digan que se trata de una medida para ahorrar dinero. Cuando Mike Driscoll fue degradado de nuevo a capitán en enero pasado, pasó de ser un empleado asalariado a uno con derecho a horas extraordinarias y pago adicional por trabajar en diferentes turnos, lo cual significa que él va a ganar más dinero que cuando estaba a salario. Lo mismo se aplica ahora a Melix Bonilla si ha de convertirse en sargento de nuevo.

Cena VIP del Desfile Dominicano

Como parte del Festival y Desfile Dominicano, siempre hay una cena de gala y se llevó a cabo el pasado viernes, 27 de agosto. Me gusta asistir a estos eventos culturales, porque siempre aprendo algo nuevo y me mezclo con personas agradables que no veo a menudo. Es un hecho muy conocido que no parecen entender el

sentido del tiempo y que aparecerse hasta dos horas más tarde está bien porque la mayoría de la gente va a llegar justo a esa hora.

Eso plantea un problema para los servicios de catering, hoteles o restaurantes esperando para servir una comida caliente y para la gente que como yo, tiende a ser puntual. A las 8:30, se produjo una oleada de gente que entró a la vez. Hubo cierta confusión pues los menús colocados en las mesas leían, "Bebidas por orden en bar abierto", pero en inglés decía " Beverages by order in open bar". Los estadounidenses escriben de una manera mucho más sencilla y simplemente dicen "cash bar", pero algo se perdió en la traducción y la gente pensó que no tenía que pagar porque "open bar" quiere decir que es gratis.

No hace falta decir que fue una noche muy larga de discursos y premios y algunos de nosotros ya estábamos haciendo planes para ir a comer en Denny's o Wendy's, cuando a las 10 de la noche los primeros platos salieron. Poco después de haber comido salimos corriendo antes del postre temerosos de que habría más discursos.

Entonces, tenemos el libro de anuncios. Yo tengo un ritual cada año y es marcar todos los errores en él. Me sorprende que la persona que lo produce ha estado haciendo esto durante tantos años, a pesar de mis severas críticas. 

Ellos presentaron un festival lleno de color y sabor, no solo de su cocina, sino por la música y danzas populares de Latinoamérica y España que actuaron.





No es fácil el regreso

En 2007, después de haber sido físicamente heridos en Irak, Kevin Lambert se retiró del ejército con honores. Sufriendo con huesos rotos en su columna vertebral y una lesión cerebral, Kevin tuvo que aprender a adaptarse a la vida civil de vuelta en los Estados Unidos. Cuando Kevin llegó a casa tuvo la suerte de poder encontrar los servicios que requería. Desafortunadamente para algunos, esto no es una tarea fácil. Algunos vienen de vuelta sufriendo de Trastorno de Estrés Postraumático (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder - PTSD) o una Lesión Cerebral Traumática (Traumatic Brain Injury - TBI), algunos continúan recuperándose en un hospital, o se encuentran sin hogar o en la cárcel. Y, por desgracia para algunos, no regresan y dejan una familia insegura de los beneficios y servicios disponibles para ellos. Aprender acerca de los beneficios, y acceder a ellos puede ser más difícil para los miembros de la familia que no hablan inglés y necesitan un traductor.

Kevin volvió a Massachusetts y comenzó a trabajar como Coordinador de Extensión para el programa SAVE (Statewide Advocacy for Veterans Empowerment) que es Abogacía Estatal para Veteranos del Departamento de Servicios para Veteranos Discapacitados de Massachusetts y el Departamento de Salud Pública. El principio fundamental

del programa SAVE es abogar por los veteranos que no les es posible obtener los beneficios que han ganado debido a las barreras institucionales o personales. La misión principal del programa es la prevención del suicidio y la angustia de la salud mental a través de la identificación de los problemas que enfrentan los veteranos cuando vuelven del servicio y de forma proactiva proporcionándoles el acceso a los servicios que puedan abordar estas cuestiones y el resultado positivo en las transiciones a la vida civil.

El crecimiento del programa SAVE ha llegado a su nuevo papel trabajando con poblaciones específicas de los veteranos que requieren servicios especializados y de apoyo, incluyendo a los veteranos sin hogar, los estudiantes que son veteranos, y los veteranos que han sido recientemente encarcelados. Como Coordinador de Extensión de esta población de veteranos especializados, Kevin trabaja con los miembros sin hogar y centros de extensión, de la comunidad de justicia penal, y el Departamento de Educación Superior de Extensión dando a conocer los beneficios disponibles a través del estado.

Con el retiro de las tropas de los EE.UU. previsto para finales del 2011 y el fin de la reciente Operación Libertad Iraquí (Operation Iraqi Freedom) el 31 de agosto, uno de los problemas más difíciles que

In 2007, after being physically injured in Iraq, Kevin Lambert was honorably discharged from the Army. Suffering from broken bones in his spine and a brain injury, Kevin had to learn to adjust to civilian life back in the States. When Kevin came home he was fortunate enough to be able to find the services he required.

Unfortunately for some, this is not an easy task. Some come back suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), some continue recovering in a hospital, or find themselves homeless or incarcerated. 

Recientemente el Gobernador Patrick firmó una ley patrocinada por mí con el fin de estabilizar los vecindarios más afectados por las ejecuciones hipotecarias.

La nueva ley protege a los inquilinos que no están envueltos en desalojos arbitrarios cuando las propiedades son embargadas, incentiva a los prestamistas a trabajar con los prestatarios para encontrar alternativas a la ejecución siempre que sea posible, establece el fraude hipotecario como un delito, y crea nuevas protecciones para los consumidores que hayan hecho una hipoteca inversa.

A lo largo de esta crisis de ejecuciones hipotecarias, muchos inquilinos han sido desalojados debido a causas ajenas a su voluntad. Como Presidente de la Comisión de Vivienda del Senado, escuché una historia tras otra de familias que habían

pagado su renta a tiempo y se enteraron que estaban siendo desalojados porque su propietario había perdido la propiedad a la ejecución hipotecaria. Como resultado, las propiedades han quedado vacantes, dejando a los barrios vulnerables al deterioro del valor de la propiedad, vandalismo y delincuencia. Esta nueva ley permitirá a los inquilinos al día en su renta a seguir viviendo en sus casas hasta que la propiedad se venda.

Esta nueva ley también pretende acercar a los prestamistas y los prestatarios para encontrar alternativas a la ejecución. La legislación está equilibrada y de ninguna manera supone que todas las hipotecas pueden o deben ser protegidas. No obstante, confronta el escenario que se produce cuando los prestatarios no pueden ni siquiera lograr tener una conversación con la entidad acreedora, a pesar de esfuerzos

heroicos para hacerlo.

Debido a que la ceremonia para firmar el proyecto de ley fue en Brockton, muchas personas que fueron fundamentales en el éxito de esta medida en el Valle de Merrimack no pudieron asistir. Quiero reconocer públicamente las muchas horas de reuniones y consejos de personas de nuestra zona, que trabajan con los prestatarios y los prestatarios a diario para detener la ola y estabilizar los vecindarios.

Cuba.



1969 FAST PITCH PLAYOFF TITLE


Before a jam packed crowd at the Hayden Schofield, the Funky Broadway team that won the league's title and the Hancocks took the field.

To the Editor:

Recently Governor Patrick signed into law legislation I sponsored to stabilize neighborhoods hard hit by foreclosures. The new comprehensive law protects renters in good standing from arbitrary evictions when properties are foreclosed, incentivizes lenders to work with borrowers to find alternatives to foreclosure when possible, establishes mortgage fraud as a crime, and creates new consumer protections for reverse mortgages.

Throughout this foreclosure crisis, many renters have been evicted due to no fault of their own. As the Senate Chair of the Housing Committee, I heard story after story of families who paid their rent on time and found out they were being evicted because their landlord had lost the property to foreclosure. As a result, properties have been left vacant, leaving neighborhoods vulnerable to deteriorating property values, blight, and crime. This new law will allow tenants in good standing to continue to rent their homes until the property is sold.

This new law also aims to bring lenders and borrowers together to find alternatives to foreclosure. The legislation is balanced, and in no way assumes that all mortgages can or should be saved. It does, however, address the "black hole" scenario which occurs when borrowers cannot even get a conversation with the lending institution, despite heroic efforts to do so.

Because the bill signing was in Brockton, many Merrimack Valley people who were instrumental in this bill were unable to attend. I want to publicly acknowledge the hours and hours of meetings and advice from those in our area who work with borrowers and lenders everyday to stem the tide and stabilize neighborhoods.

A huge "thank you" from me and my staff to Juan Bonilla and Tamar Kotelchuck from Lawrence Community Works, Len Raymond at Homeowner Options for Massachusetts Elders, the staff at Arlington Community Trabajando and Community Teamwork, Inc, and the Home Preservation Coalition.

Playing musical chairs

The Personnel Committee of the Lawrence City Council met last Tuesday, August 24th to appoint a few members to boards and committees recommended by Mayor William Lantigua, as well as three full time positions.

Frank Bonet was the first one to be called and a great deal of time was spent on him only to table the matter. The reason was because he is a candidate for State Representative for District 17 and in the event of winning the elections, they will have to search for a new Personnel Director all over again. I didn't find anything racist or prejudiced in District F Councilor Marc Laplante's motion to postpone it. It made sense.

Then came Patrick Blanchette's appointment as permanent Economic Development Director for the city. He began in a very forceful way telling the councilors that he had a statement to read and proceeded to read a brief biography of his ten and one half years serving the city, the experience acquired and how that relates to his present position. They listened and after a few non-confrontational questions, he was sent

to the next meeting of the full council for confirmation.

Then, it was Melix Bonilla's turn as Deputy Chief of the Police Department. Expecting fireworks during this session, I went to get some ice cream in the kitchen and went I returned it was over. This was also tabled until the Ordinance Committee meets again.

What caused that to happen was that the Ordinance Committee was to meet the previous week and discuss the elimination of the position of deputy chief all together. Had they met and approved that measure, there would be no need to go through this step of appointing Bonilla to that post and he would have been demoted back to his old rank of sergeant.

Curiously, we had one deputy chief a few years ago when Chief John Romero chose to have a second one and that is how Emil DeFusco was promoted from sergeant to became the second deputy chief. By that time, he was of mandatory retirement age and he requested the city council to approve an extension so that he could continue "serving the city" while padding his retirement check.



Deputy Chief DeFusco was later the focus of an investigative report on Channel 5 for working a couple of hours and going home at mid-morning. They even followed him for several weeks and pointed out that he would travel every Friday night to a restaurant in Salem, MA in a city-owned car with gasoline paid for by us. The scandal was so huge he ended up retiring. Chief Romero denied Channel 5's allegations.

After that, the city council decided to eliminate the second deputy chief position. Now they want to cancel the only one left which leads me to believe that it may not be necessary after all.

But, don't let them mislead you that this is a money-saving move. When Mike Driscoll was demoted back to Captain last January, he went from being a salaried employee to one entitled to overtime and shift differential which means that he'll make more money than when he was on salary. The same applies now to Melix Bonilla if he should become a sergeant again.

How do I adopt a child from foster care?

To adopt a child from foster care, you must go through a training, interview and matching process that can take one to two years. To begin, call the Massachusetts Adoption Resource Exchange (MARE), for referrals to agencies in your area. A social worker will meet with you, then refer you for the Massachusetts Approach to Partnerships in Parenting (MAPP) training. After completing the MAPP course, you'll have meetings with a social worker who will conduct your "home study" to explore adoption possibilities with you and begin to match you with a waiting child. It's important to balance patience with persistence to make a match that will build a lifelong family.

Innovative Training Initiative Offers Career Support for Allied Health Jobs

The Merrimack Valley Healthcare Career Partnership, led by the Merrimac Valley Workforce Investment Board, has been awarded a Healthcare Skills Gap grant through The Commonwealth Corporation to address challenges facing local residents interested in careers in the allied health field.

This grant will be used to bridge educational gaps and provide training programs for area residents. The initiative hopes to more comprehensively address the growing need for qualified registered nurses, home health aides and certified nursing assistants, by developing individuals who are currently challenged by insufficient academic proficiency, especially in math and reading. Through a variety of academic and skill training programs, workers can prepare for meaningful careers and can even achieve a college education.

The Merrimack Valley Healthcare Career Partnership will use the grant funding to:

- Enhance an existing and already successful CNA program with academic programming, customer service training and advanced education on the aging process
- Design a "Bridge to Allied Health Careers" program in partnership with

Northern Essex Community College that prepares workers to enter college-level certificate and degree programs

- Offer academic remediation to individuals seeking entry or advancement in the workforce to develop the skills and training needed to succeed

Mary Immaculate Health/Care Services has teamed up with Notre Dame Education Center and WorkSource Partners to offer its employees access to these educational and training opportunities. "We view this as another way we can reach out and invest in our staff," says Kristine DiFiore, MIHCS director of human resources. "One of the things that set MIHCS apart is our ability to retain long term employees who develop relationships with our residents. Through this initiative, we can offer staff members training programs that help them realize their personal dreams while strengthening their professional skills and experience." "We are providing workplace support through education for frontline employees," says Neil Silverston, president of WorkSource Partners. "Our goal is to move people toward post secondary employment through the mastery of the academic and technical skills they need in today's workplace."

- Specific offerings include:
- Access to GED preparation and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) classes
 - Enhanced Nursing Assistant training
 - Opportunity to earn a National Career Readiness Certificate through ACT
 - Access to the Bridge to Allied Health Careers program at Northern Essex Community College, designed to help students prepare for and enter college-level programs in healthcare
 - Career coaching and support to all participating individuals

MIHCS has piloted this program over the spring and summer and currently has several employees participating. "We have staff members who are working on their GEDs and taking ESOL classes," reports DiFiore. "We expect several more to enroll in the program this fall to pursue allied health training."

In addition to MIHCS, WorkSource and Notre Dame, the Merrimack Valley Healthcare Career Partnership includes the Merrimack Valley Workforce Investment Board, Notre Dame Education Center, Northern Essex Community College, Lawrence General Hospital, and HomeCare Inc.



Plug Pond, Haverhill, MA Annual Intertribal Pow-Wow

The 22nd Annual Intertribal Pow-Wow, sponsored by the Mass. Center for Native American Awareness (MCNA) and the Haverhill Recreation Department, will be held on Saturday and Sunday, September 11 and 12, 2010. It will take place at Plug Pond, Mill Street, Haverhill, MA. Gates open to the public from 11AM to 6PM daily. Suggested donation is \$5.00 Adults; \$4.00 for Seniors & MCNA Members; \$3.00 for Children (4-12 years); and 3 years and under: FREE. Parking is FREE.

This year, after a five year absence, they will feature the return of the Tlacopan Aztec Indian Dancers, a traditional dance group that was formed about 50 years ago. The performances are narrated which help the audience interpret the dances and the symbolism of the Aztec's spectacular and colorful regalia.

Ritual dances dating back to the pre-Spanish conquest are performed by the group in their handmade, beaded costumes and colorful headdresses which are adorned with macaw feathers and rare five foot long pheasant feathers. The dancers accompany themselves with age-old percussion instruments. They mark the rhythm of their dances with chachayote seeds worn on the ankles.

The performance of the Aztec Dancers is very exotic in nature and enables the spectators to step back in time and envision the beauty and cultural richness of the ancient Aztec Indians.

You will also be entertained by the Wolf Cry Singers. They are an intertribal women's hand drum group made up of members living in Massachusetts. The music they sing includes traditional and contemporary Mi'kMaq, Cherokee, Navajo, Abenaki and Delaware songs and chants.

Native American Drumming & Singing will be performed by the Iron River Singers and the Urban Thunder Singers. Dance demonstrations (lady's fancy shawl dance, jingle dress dance, grass dance, crow hop, lady's traditional dance, men's fancy dance, and men's traditional dance) as well as general inter-tribal dancing will be featured at this cultural awareness event.

Another cultural-educational component of the event is the set up of a Native home. Visitors will watch as a tipi is being erected. They will then be invited inside to view the old-age decorations and



ask questions. The home is a dwelling for transient people like the Plains Indians. The framework is arranged in a cone shape. It is purposely asymmetrical. The covering is made of canvas but years ago it was made from buffalo hide.

Loril Moondream and Peter White Fox of Shutesbury, MA will be set up for craft making throughout the day. This year they will offer feathered arm band to the children and their families. (\$2 for materials).

They will also engage the children in storytelling in front of (or inside) the tipi. They will also set up numerous Native games that can be played throughout the day.

Dave Little Tree of Rhode Island will be on hand to share Iroquois Songs and Social Dances. He will invite you into the Circle to join in the dances.

Arts and Crafts will be on sale for the weekend. Some of the craftwork and items include: Wampum jewelry, beaded jewelry, Silver and turquoise jewelry, corn husk dolls, furs, stones, wall paintings, leather-fringe jackets, native-themed clothing and hats, bamboo musical instruments, ponchos, rattles, blankets, and so much more.

A resource, information, and membership table will be set up.

Listen to the emcee – Marvin Burnette (Many Horses) of the Oglala Sioux Nation. He will give all of the information you need about the program and its activities. He will educate and make you aware of some of the Native traditions as it relates to this event.

Haverhill receives Jobs Bill money

Mayor James J. Fiorentini announced that under the Jobs Bill recently approved by Congress, Haverhill public schools will receive \$1.29 million. These funds are in addition to the Race to the Top Money announced earlier this week.



DÍAZ: From My Corner**Dominican VIP dinner**

As part of the Dominican Festival and Parade, there is always a VIP dinner and it was held last Friday, August 27th. I like attending these cultural events because I always learn something new and mingle with nice people that I don't get to see often. It is a known fact that they don't seem to understand the meaning of time and showing up two hours late is OK because most people will be arriving just about that time.

That poses a problem for catering services, hotels or restaurants waiting to serve a hot meal and for people like me who tends to be punctual. When I spoke to Brian De Peña, president of this year's Festival the night before to check on the time we should be there, he told me that it was slated to begin at seven o'clock. I told him that it meant to me that dinner would be served around nine. Brian emphatically insisted that dinner would be served between 7:30 and 8:00 PM.

Knowing that Brian has been trying to change that ugly habit in all the events he runs, we showed up at 7:25 and there were maybe 20 people there. At 8:30, there was a surge of people coming in all at once. There was confusion because the menus placed on the tables read, "Beverages by order in open bar." Americans write in a much simpler way and just say "cash bar," but something was lost in the translation and people thought they wouldn't have to pay.

Needless to say that it was a very long night of speeches and awards and some of us were making plans to eat at Denny's or Wendy's when at 10 o'clock the first few dishes came out. Soon after that we ate and rushed out before dessert afraid there would be more speeches.

Then, there is the ad book. I have a ritual each year and it is circling all the errors in it. I am amazed that the person producing it has been doing so for so many years in spite of my heavy criticisms. This year, Brian assured me that I wouldn't find any errors because there were three other individuals proofreading it. Well, in just the first 12 pages of 44, there are hundreds of mistakes beginning with the cover missing a comma, a question mark and the accent on the 'ú' as part of the title. Then, the credits on page 3, where the word "traducción" was translated as "traduction" instead of "translation." They are now contributing to the expansion of the English language by inventing words. When it comes to the English version of the articles, most of them are impossible to understand; it seems they were translated by some online service and no one proofread it.

There are entire paragraphs repeated back to back and not one of the three individuals proofreading it caught it and the article featuring the executive director of Casa Dominicana, her name was written in three different ways.

I am being very critical of this because that book becomes our image. Well educated people would pick one up some day, perhaps 100 years from now at the Lawrence History Center and wonder what educational level "those people had" doing such a poor job in both languages.

I am not Dominican so, why should I care? Because most ignorant Americans cannot tell the difference between the many

With their expansion into the Riverwalk, the college has sufficient space to house the program right here. By having ARC located at Northern Essex Community College allows them to understand that they can be successful in college as well.

Moving it to the high school won't result in any savings to the school department and the students will lose the college environment that inspires them to succeed.

be increasingly difficult for family members that do not speak English and require a translator.

Kevin returned to Massachusetts and began working as an Outreach Coordinator for the SAVE (Statewide Advocacy for Veterans Empowerment) Program at the Massachusetts Department of DVS and the Department of Public Health. The fundamental principle of the SAVE program is to advocate for veterans who are not able to obtain the benefits they have earned due to institutional or personal barriers. The program's primary mission is prevention of suicide and mental health distress through the identification of issues facing veterans when they return from service and proactively providing them with access to benefits and services that may address these issues and result in positive transitions back to civilian life.

The growth of the SAVE program has led to his new role working with specific populations of veterans that require specialized services and support including homeless veterans, students veterans, and those veterans who have been recently incarcerated. As the Outreach Coordinator for this Specialized Population of veterans, Kevin works with the homeless and outreach centers, members of the criminal justice community, and the Department of Higher Education Outreach letting them know about benefits available through the state.

With US Troop Withdrawal set for the end of 2011 and the recent end of Operation Iraqi Freedom on August 31st, one of the most difficult issues facing some veterans is the adjustment and reintegration to civilian life. This adjustment affects both veterans and their families.

According to VA statistics, veteran suicides rose by 26 percent between 2005 and 2007. According to Veterans Today, 14,000 soldiers in 2008 were diagnosed with PTSD, twice as many as two years before.

This is where the SAVE program comes in. The SAVE team is comprised of recently returned Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom (OIF/OEF) Veterans and family members of veterans. Peer-to-peer interaction and support is an integral part of the program's validity and success. The program's success is attributed to the peer support offered by outreach coordinators as well as the effective collaborations with other state agencies, federal, and private programs. The team is completely mobile, outfitted with laptops and cell phones so that they may work at locations throughout the Commonwealth, this also allows them to meet veterans at their home or other locations to talk with them and escort them where they need to go for assistance, should the immediacy for treatment or help arise.

The SAVE program is inspired in large part by the story of Jeff Lucey, a Marine who took his own life after returning home from the War in Iraq. As a returning combat veteran, Jeff dealt with issues he had never faced before. The Lucey family had done everything they could for Jeff, but were unable to find help for him. Jeff fell victim to his battle with PTSD after struggling to find the assistance he needed. "If Jeff had complete access to, and been made aware of, the resources and benefits available to him, perhaps he could have been saved."

Massachusetts offers the most comprehensive benefits and services to veterans and their families. The Department administers needs-based benefits programs

through local Veterans' Service Officers (VSOs) throughout the Commonwealth, each city and town must have a designated VSO to assist veterans in their community. Additionally, the state provides funding to organizations offering shelter, transitional housing, and outreach services to veterans. Through great leadership and advocacy from the Patrick- Murray Administration, Massachusetts continues to be a leader in offering comprehensive benefits and services.

Along with services provided by DVS, assistance can be obtained by contacting your local VSO or Outreach Center. The following offices provide assistance in Spanish as well:

sin carácter propio, sin criterio y sin opiniones personales. Algo parecido es lo que se pretende con la asignatura 'Educación para la Ciudadanía' impuesta en el sistema educativo.

En la convivencia sana entre los hombres han de existir puntos de vista y conductas diferentes que se apoyen sobre los valores comunes, que han de ser un fondo de garantías y de exigencias fundamentales de la naturaleza humana. De aquí que una libertad sin ningún fin, sin norma objetiva y sin responsabilidad es el libertinaje claramente rechazable. Tampoco son aceptables el escepticismo relativista y el pragmatismo de los que escribiremos en otra ocasión.

Aunque en una sociedad pluralista haya discrepancias importantes, mediante un diálogo cordial y constructivo es posible llegar a un consenso para organizar la convivencia. El poeta Salinas puso en boca del labriego castellano: 'Todo lo sabemos entre todos'. Hay diferentes descripciones de las cosas y soluciones diversas a los problemas. Pero no hay una única descripción verdadera, sino que las diferentes opiniones presentan aspectos parciales, que incluso a veces pueden ser complementarios, aunque a primera vista pudieran parecer incompatibles. Aunque no todas las opiniones son igualmente verdaderas, si han sido formuladas seriamente, en todas ellas hay algo de lo que podemos aprender.

El premio Nobel de literatura Imre Kertész en su 'Diario de la galera' (Acantilado, Barcelona, 2004) señala que "una civilización que ha llegado a algo a pesar de todo se basa en que la verdad moral, científica y lógica se ha abierto paso en ella y se ha convertido en medida y al mismo tiempo en organizadora de la vida social".

En una sociedad pluralista lo más importante es escuchar a quienes tienen opiniones diferentes de la nuestra. Ésa es la señal más clara de que amamos la libertad y defenderemos de verdad el pluralismo porque aprendemos de los demás.

ST. MARIE: No es fácil el regreso

Según las estadísticas de la Administración de Veteranos, los suicidios de veteranos aumentaron en un 26 por ciento entre 2005 y 2007. De acuerdo a los veteranos de hoy, 14,000 soldados en 2008 fueron diagnosticados con trastorno por estrés postraumático, el doble que dos años antes.

Aquí es donde el programa SAVE, entra en juego. El equipo SAVE se compone de veteranos que recientemente regresaron de la Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom, veteranos y familiares de los veteranos. La interacción entre los veteranos y el apoyo es una parte integral de la validez y el éxito del programa. El éxito del programa se atribuye al apoyo de los compañeros ofrecidos por los coordinadores de extensión, así como la colaboración efectiva con otras agencias estatales, federales y los programas privados. El equipo es completamente móvil, equipado con computadoras portátiles y teléfonos celulares para que puedan trabajar en diferentes lugares del estado, esto también les permite cumplir con los veteranos en su casa o en otros lugares para hablar con ellos y acompañarlos a donde tengan que ir para recibir asistencia, si el tratamiento inmediato o la ayuda surge de repente.

El programa SAVE se inspira en gran parte por la historia de Jeff Lucey, un marino que se quitó la vida después de volver de la

guerra en Irak. Como veterano de combate que regresaba, Jeff abordó problemas a los que nunca se había enfrentado antes. La familia Lucey había hecho todo lo posible por Jeff, pero fueron incapaces de encontrar ayuda para él. Jeff fue víctima de su batalla con el trastorno de estrés postraumático después de luchar para encontrar la ayuda que necesitaba. "Si Jeff hubiese tenido acceso completo a los recursos y beneficios disponibles para él y hubiese estado al corriente de los mismos, quizás se podría haber salvado."

Massachusetts ofrece los beneficios y servicios más completos a los veteranos y sus familias. El Departamento administra los programas de beneficios basados en las necesidades locales a través de Oficiales de Servicio a Veteranos (VSOs) en todo el estado, cada ciudad y pueblo debe tener un VSO designado para asistir a los veteranos en su comunidad. Además, el estado proporciona fondos a organizaciones que ofrecen albergue, vivienda de transición y servicios de extensión a los veteranos. Pero ahora nos enteramos de que Lawrence hará un contrato similar con U/Mass o Merrimack College para hacer lo mismo. Pues bien, eso va a requerir el transporte, también. Tenemos una universidad en la ciudad y Northern Essex ya no tendrá que transportarlos a ninguna

"We're very excited about what we're bringing to Lawrence," said Lane Glenn, vice president of academic affairs. 




