La Ciudad de Lawrence y la Unión de bomberos de Lawrence, Local 146, han llegado a un acuerdo que traerá de vuelta por lo menos a 8 bomberos al servicio con efecto inmediato. "Me gustaría poder decirles que son 23", dijo el Alcalde Lantigua.

El Alcalde William Lantigua se involucró personalmente en las negociaciones después de una conversación uno-a-uno con el Presidente del Local 146, Patrick Driscoll a principios de agosto. Debates positivos han tenido lugar a través de septiembre y la votación 57-7 por miembros de la Unión de bomberos es una señal de fortalecimiento de las relaciones entre todas las partes.

"La prioridad de los bomberos de Lawrence siempre ha sido, ante todo, proteger a los ciudadanos que viven y trabajan en esta ciudad", dijo Patrick Driscoll, presidente del Local 146. "Nuestros miembros están dispuestos a hacer concesiones para mejorar el personal del departamento por una mejor seguridad general de Lawrence. Esperamos poner el proceso de negociación detrás de nosotros y trabajar para restaurar completamente las 15 posiciones perdidas en julio pasado."

El contrato existente se ampliará al 30 de junio de 2011 con las siguientes modificaciones votadas por la Unión del Departamento de Bomberos de Lawrence:

- 1 La Unión renunciará a todos los estipendios contractuales en materia de formación académica contra incendios para el año fiscal 2011.

- 2 La Unión trabajará 24 horas extraordinarias en el año fiscal 2011, sin compensación o costo para la Ciudad de

The City of Lawrence and the Lawrence Firefighters Union, Local 146 has come to an agreement that will bring back at least 8 firefighters to the department effective immediately.

"I wish I could tell you it's 23," said Mayor William Lantigua who became personally involved in negotiations after a one-on-one conversation with Local 146 President Patrick Driscoll in early August. Positive discussions have been taking place through September and the 57-7 vote by the Lawrence Firefighters Union is a sign of stronger relations between all parties.

"The Lawrence firefighters' priority has always been first and foremost to protect the citizens who live and work in this city," Patrick Driscoll, president of Local 146, said. "Our members were willing to make concessions to better

Las conversaciones deben continuar

Una buena conversación es el mejor remedio para resolver una queja. Prueba de ello es el reciente acuerdo alcanzado entre la Ciudad de Lawrence y los líderes de la Unión de Bomberos de Lawrence.

A veces los acuerdos se alcanzan en un día o dos de las negociaciones, a veces se tarda más. En este caso, nadie está diciendo. Lo importante es que funcionó y con un sacrificio de ambas partes, la ciudad está preparada para dar la bienvenida de vuelta a ocho de los bomberos de la lista de desempleo.

"La prioridad de los bomberos de Lawrence siempre ha sido, ante todo, proteger a los ciudadanos que viven y trabajan en esta ciudad", dijo Patrick Driscoll, presidente del Local 146. "Nuestros miembros están dispuestos a hacer concesiones para mejorar el personal del departamento por una mejor seguridad general de Lawrence. Esperamos dejar atrás el proceso de negociación y trabajar para restaurar completamente las 15 posiciones perdidas en julio pasado."

Con el sindicato de bomberos solicitando una dádiva federal SAFER de \$6.5 millones (Staffing for Adequate Fire Emergency Response, que significa personal adecuado para casos de emergencia) para ayudar a restaurar algunas de las posiciones perdidas a los despidos, hay esperanzas de que 38 posiciones en el Departamento de Bomberos sean restauradas a finales de este otoño.

Por otra parte, según el Alcalde William Lantigua, "La Unión de la Policía se niega a continuar las conversaciones, pero queremos mantener una actitud positiva hasta lograr traer a los oficiales de vuelta."

Tras el éxito de las conversaciones anteriores, la ciudadanía no puede esperar menos de nuestros hombres de azul.

Talks must continue

A good talk is the best remedy to solve a grievance. Proof of that is the recent agreement reached between the City of Lawrence and the Lawrence Firefighters Union leaders.

Sometimes agreements are reached within a day or two of negotiations, sometimes it takes longer. In this case, nobody is saying. What is important is that it worked, and with some sacrifice from both sides; the city is ready to welcome back eight of the firefighter roster.

"The Lawrence firefighters' priority has always been first and foremost to protect the citizens who live and work in this city," said Patrick Driscoll, president of Local 146, during a recent press conference. "Our members were willing to make concessions to better staff the department for the overall safety of Lawrence. We look forward to putting the negotiation process behind us and working to fully restore the additional 15 positions lost this past July."

With the firefighters union applying for a \$6.5 million federal SAFER (Staffing for Adequate Fire Emergency Response) grant to help restore some of the positions lost to layoffs, there is hope that 38 positions in the Fire Department will be restored later this fall.

On the other hand, according to Mayor William Lantigua, "the Police Union is adamant to continue conversations but we want to stay positive until we bring the officers back."

After the success of the previous talks, the citizenry can't expect less from our men in blue.

Ley prohíbe enviar mensajes de texto y conducir

Desde hoy, octubre 1ro, las personas que envíen mensajes de texto por el celular mientras conducen un vehículo en Massachusetts se arriesgan a recibir fuertes multas, un movimiento que ha ganado fuerza a nivel nacional buscando limitar la conducción distraída.

La nueva ley que entró en vigor este jueves también prohíbe el uso del Internet en un teléfono o dispositivo móvil mientras se conduce un vehículo y prohíbe a menores de 18 años hablar por un teléfono celular mientras se conduce.

La ley prohíbe el uso de todos los dispositivos móviles, como celulares y GPS, mientras se maneja para conductores de 17 años o menos, excepto en emergencias, y prohíbe a cualquier chofer el enviar o recibir mensajes de texto mientras se está frente al volante.

La ley llamada en inglés "Safe Driving Law", o "Ley de Manejo Seguro", también establece que si tienes 18 años o más, debes mantener por lo menos una mano todo el tiempo en el volante mientras conversa por el teléfono.

Durante el sábado 18 y domingo 19 de septiembre, 2010, Lawrence dio un paso atrás en la historia, con la conmemoración de la 8va Celebración Anual de la Guerra Civil durante el fin de semana. Hombres y mujeres vestidos con uniformes de la época de la Guerra Civil acamparon en el Parque Campagnone.

Ellos durmieron en tiendas de campaña, cocinaron en una hoguera, cuidaron de sus caballos, dispararon arcabuces y cañones, mientras contaban historias de la Guerra Civil.

"Algunos de los que interpretan esos papeles tenían otros compromisos", explicó Joe Bella, uno de los organizadores del evento, de por qué este año no hemos tenido la fortuna de recibir la distinguida visita del Presidente y la Sra. Abraham Lincoln, ni del Teniente General Ulysses S. Grant y su esposa Julia.

"Este año estamos manteniendo un perfil bajo porque el año que viene, cuando estaremos celebrando el 150 aniversario de la Guerra Civil, todos ellos estarán aquí y mucho más. Ese va a ser un gran evento", aseguró Bella.






5 No aumento salarial para el año fiscal 2011.

6 La Ciudad proveerá un día para asuntos personales para el año fiscal 2011 que no debe utilizarse durante el "prime time" (junio - septiembre). Este día personal debe usarse antes de 31 de diciembre de 2011.

7 Asignaciones para ropa debe ser incluida por contrato dentro del salario base, pero no deben calcularse hacia cualquier pago adicional en virtud del contrato (por trabajo nocturno, horas extraordinarias, longevidad).

El alcalde Lantigua rehusó decir cuantas veces y donde ellos se reunieron durante este tiempo y solo dijo: "Teníamos que mantener en privado algunos detalles, alejados de la prensa para no dañar las negociaciones. Nos reunimos varias veces, algunas por teléfono y otras en persona", añadió.

Las modificaciones mencionadas

anteriormente ascienden a un estimado de \$ 241.000 en ahorros para la Ciudad de Lawrence. Como resultado, el Alcalde Lantigua se comprometió a traer de nuevo al personal uniformado al Departamento de Bomberos de Lawrence. Con ingresos superiores a los inicialmente presupuestados el alcalde Lantigua tomará las medidas necesarias para igualar la suma de \$241,000 en concesiones, dando como resultado que 8 bomberos sean reintegrados al su trabajo. "Esto fue parte de los ingresos colectados por concepto de agua y alcantarillado que estaban pendientes de pago", explicó Lantigua.

Driscoll agradeció a los departamentos de bomberos de los pueblos y ciudades aledañas, que colaboraron en la ayuda mutua este verano cuando el personal estaba en su punto más bajo con apenas 72 bomberos para una ciudad como Lawrence que tiene una población de aproximadamente 72.000, repartidas en ocho millas cuadradas. "Estamos muy agradecidos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas de los departamentos de bomberos de toda la región, que intervinieron para ayudarnos durante este verano cuando las alarmas de incendios múltiples desafío a un personal peligrosamente pequeño. No se perdieron vidas y eso es testimonio de la valentía y el compromiso de nuestros colegas."

El sindicato de bomberos ha solicitado una dádiva federal de \$6.5 millones



llamada SAFER, (Staffing for Adequate Fire Emergency Response que significa dotación de personal adecuado en caso de fuego y emergencia) para ayudar a restaurar algunas de las posiciones perdidas por los despidos. Los beneficiarios de las subvenciones se darán a conocer a finales de este otoño. Si este fondo por dos años es aprobado, restauraría 38 posiciones en el Departamento de Bomberos, un nivel

mucho más alto que antes de los despidos y la ciudad no tendrá obligaciones después de esos dos años. "Queremos soluciones permanentes, no temporales", explicó el alcalde. "La Unión de la Policía se niega a continuar las negociaciones pero queremos mantenernos positivos hasta lograr traer a los oficiales de regreso", dijo el Alcalde Lantigua.

100th Anniversary of the Ayer Mill Clock Tower

On the North Canal, at the present site of the Washington Mill, stood the original Bay State Mills. Its owners were the Abbotts, and one of its investors was the Ayers. In 1857, there was a financial panic in the US which devastated Lawrence's textile industry. By 1860, the Bay State Mills had been taken over by the Washington Mills. The new owner was Fredrick Ayer and he began to replace the complex with modern structures and new machinery. By 1885, the textile industry was confronted with financial difficulties, and the Washington Mill was nearly bankrupt.

Frederick Ayer, president of the Washington Mills, took on a bold and innovative manager, Mr. William M. Wood. Under his direction and experience which he obtained in the New Bedford and Fall River Mills. He turned the mill around, eventually became its new president and married into the Ayer family.


By late 1890s he had incorporated the American Woolen Company and built a new office building on One Mill Street. Thus began his plan of consolidation of the textile industry in Lawrence. By 1905, he had bought off other mill complexes in Lawrence and throughout New England.

In 1909, across from the Wood Mill, Mr. Wood began construction of a new mill on the South canal, under the direction of the architect, Charles T. Main. In honor of his father-in-law, the new mill was to be known as the Ayer Mill. Originally planned to have older smaller towers in its four corners, Mr. Main opted for a large central tower. The new clock tower would be 267 feet high, 40' x 40' tower and a four sided clock. The clock face would be 22-1/2 feet in diameter, with a new E. Howard Clock of Boston.

The new 5000 pound bell was placed into the Palladian window. The Neo-Georgian style tower was constructed with granite pediments, trimmed-in granite, coined granite blocks, blind brick columns with granite capitals and crowned with a bowed copper roof and a Viking ship weathervane. On October 3, 1910 the Wood and Ayer families, plus their guests, attended a gala where Frederick Ayer had the honor to switch on the Ayer Mill's illuminated clock.

Annual Intertribal Pow-Wow

The 22nd Annual Intertribal Pow-Wow, sponsored by the Mass. Center for Native American Awareness (MCNAA) and the Haverhill Recreation Department, was held on Saturday and Sunday, September 11 and 12, 2010. It took place at Plug Pond, Mill Street, Haverhill, MA.

This year they featured the return of the Tlacopan Aztec Indian Dancers, a traditional dance group that was formed about 50 years ago. The performances were narrated which helped the audience interpret the dances and the symbolism of the Aztec's spectacular and colorful regalia. Ritual dances dating back to the pre-Spanish conquest were performed by the group in their handmade, beaded costumes and colorful headdresses which are adorned with macaw feathers and rare five foot long pheasant feathers.

The dancers accompanied themselves with age-old percussion instruments. They marked the rhythm of their dances with chachayote seeds worn on the ankles. The performance of the Aztec Dancers is very exotic in nature and enables the spectators to step back in time and envision the beauty and cultural richness of the ancient Aztec Indians.

The Wolf Cry Singers are an intertribal women's hand drum group made up of members living in Massachusetts. The music they sing includes traditional and contemporary Mi'kMaq, Cherokee, Navajo, Abenaki and Delaware songs and chants. Native American Drumming & Singing was performed by the Iron River Singers and the Urban Thunder Singers. Dance demonstrations (lady's fancy shawl dance, jingle dress dance, grass dance, crow hop, lady's traditional dance, men's fancy dance, and men's traditional dance) as well as general inter-tribal dancing was featured at this cultural awareness event.

Another cultural-educational component of the event is the set up of a Native home. Children watched as a tipi was being erected and then were invited inside to view the old-age decorations and ask questions. The home is a dwelling for transient people like the Plains Indians. The framework is arranged in a cone shape. It is purposely asymmetrical. The covering is made of canvas but years ago it was made from buffalo hide.

Dave Little Tree of Rhode Island was on hand to share Iroquois Songs and Social Dances inviting the audience into the Circle to join in the dances.



Mayor, Welcome 6 New Firefighters to Haverhill Fire Department

All six firefighters were sworn in today by City Clerk Margaret Toomey in a brief ceremony attended by City and Fire Department officials and family members. Four of the firefighters hired already possessed many years of professional and technical experience after being recently laid off from the Lawrence Fire Department due to budget cuts in that community.

These four former Lawrence firefighters include Timothy L. Boutin, Joseph N. Carberry, James E. Driscoll and Michael J. Swarwick. Firefighters Boutin and Driscoll are both Haverhill residents.

Two other hires are beginning their

firefighting careers and will be immediately assigned to the State Fire Academy. They are Keith Baldwin and Corey Willis, both of Haverhill.

"Adding these firefighters represents a great source of pride for our city," proclaimed Mayor Fiorentini.

"These gentlemen are welcome additions to our department. Other communities have needed to cut fire services to respond to budget cuts. In the past seven years, we have added three new fire trucks-- one new ladder truck and two pumper trucks. We have managed to keep all of our fire stations open, and we have not laid off a single firefighter in the last seven years," noted the Mayor.

"Lawrence's loss is our gain," stated

Fire Chief Richard Borden. He noted that the four experienced firefighters were basically "ready to go."

"The Mayor promised us that he would add six new firefighters to bring down overtime costs, and the Mayor kept his promise," stated City Councilor David Hall, Chairman of the Council's Public Safety Subcommittee.

The Mayor added: "These hirings did not happen by accident. It happened because the City carefully held the line on spending, refused to give in to pressure to hire when it was unsustainable, and today we are in a position to hire these six firefighters. I am particularly proud that we were able to help out some Haverhill residents who were laid off in another community."

Mayor honors local men for action at Harrison St. fire

Today, Mayor James J. Fiorentini presented citations from the City to Geraldo Pagan and Robert Carrier for their heroic and lifesaving actions at the Harrison Street fire on September 10th. Mr. Pagan was present along with his wife Paula and his mentor, Sandra Kerwin. Mr. Carrier was unable to attend.

Mr. Pagan, who lives on Harrison Street, entered the burning building along with Mr. Carrier and assisted Constance Silvio out of the fire, saving her life. Mr. Carrier helped out Aja Silvio, who is still in the hospital recovering from burns received in that fire.

Mayor Fiorentini stated: "When tragedies such as this occur, seconds can sometimes mean life or death. I commend these two men for stepping into danger and risking their own lives to save this mother and daughter. It is not often that one sees such acts of bravery and selflessness and I commend Robert Carrier and Geraldo Pagan for their actions on September 10th."



Goldsmith Named Ethics Chair



Dr. Michele Goldsmith, of Manchester, has been named the university's Christos and Mary Papoutsy Chair in Ethics and Social Responsibility. The two-year appointment commences in the fall.

The purpose of the chair is to educate the SNHU community about the social and ethical issues in today's global environment.

For the first year, Goldsmith has been awarded a sabbatical-type leave to conduct research. The second year of the appointment will focus on fostering campus and community-wide dialogue and debate about ethical practices.

Goldsmith is highly regarded worldwide for her contributions in science, especially in the field of primatology. As a biological anthropologist, she has been studying gorilla behavior and well-being in Africa since 1991. For her doctoral research she was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship to examine poorly known populations of western lowland gorillas in the Congo Basin. Later, as a National Geographic researcher, she was the first primatologist to analyze the impacts of ecotourism on mountain gorillas in Bwindi Impenetrable National Park, Uganda. During the summer she spent a month in Africa researching the impact of tourism on the gorilla population in the Uganda region.

Goldsmith, an associate professor, joined the Department of Science at Southern New Hampshire University in the fall of 2008.

About the Ethics Chair

The Christos and Mary Papoutsy Distinguished Chair in Ethics and Social Responsibility was established in 1999 to assist students in learning about and leading ethical professional and personal lives, drawing upon the works of ancient Greek intellectuals whose teachings have shaped the history of Western civilization from antiquity to the present.

staff the department for the overall safety of Lawrence. We look forward to putting the negotiation process behind us and working to fully restore the additional 15 positions lost this past July."

The existing contract will be extended through June 30, 2011 with the following modifications voted upon by the Lawrence Fire Department Union:

- 1 Union will waive all contractual stipends regarding fire academy training FY2011.
- 2 Union will work 24 hours of overtime in FY2011 with no compensation or cost to the City of Lawrence.
- 3 Union agrees to waive any contractual vacation buyback rights for FY'2011.
- 4 Union shall not challenge the City's right to transfer health insurance into Group Insurance Commission (GIC), however maintains the right to impact bargain on such.
- 5 No wage increase for FY 2011.
- 6 The City will provide 1 additional personal day for FY2011 not to be utilized during "prime time" (June — September). This personal day must be used prior to December 31, 2011.
- 7 Contractual clothing allowance shall be included in base pay but will not be calculated towards any premium pay under the contract (night differential, overtime, longevity).

Mayor Lantigua refused to say how many times and where they met during that time only to say that, "We needed to keep some details private from the media in order not to jeopardize the negotiations. We met several times by phone and in person," he added.

The modifications listed above amount to an estimated \$241,000 in savings to the City of Lawrence. As a result, Mayor Lantigua is committed to bringing uniformed personnel back within the Lawrence Fire Department. With projected revenue streams coming in higher than originally budgeted and expected, Mayor Lantigua will move to match \$241,000 in concessions resulting in 8 firefighters being brought back to work.

"This was part of the revenue collected from water and sewer outstanding bills," explained Mayor Lantigua.

Driscoll thanked the surrounding fire departments who assisted with mutual aid this summer when staffing was at an all-time low with just 72 Lawrence

firefighters for a city that has a population of approximately 72,000 spread over eight square miles. "We are grateful to our brother and sister firefighters from across the region who stepped in to help this summer when multiple alarm fires challenged a dangerously small staff. No lives were lost and that is testament to the bravery and commitment of our colleagues."

The fire union has applied for a \$6.5 million federal SAFER (Staffing for Adequate Fire Emergency Response) grant to help restore some of the positions lost to layoffs. Grant recipients will be announced later this fall. If granted this two-year grant will restore 38 positions in the Fire Department, much higher levels than before the layoffs and the city will have no obligations after the two years. "We want permanent solutions, not temporary ones," explained the mayor.

"The Police Union is adamant to continue conversations but we want to stay positive until we bring the officers back," said Mayor Lantigua.



STUNDZIA: 100th Anniversary of the Ayer Mill Clock Tower

The Bell struck 9 PM and oddly enough in some paternal intent, it was to herald some sort of curfew for the workers.

The Ayer Mills functioned as a textile mill until the departure of the American Woolen Company in the mid 1950s. It is said the bell was lowered down and sold for scrap. They attempted to demolish the Howard clock for scrap, but were unable to crack its frame. This trophy tower became a symbol of the decline of the textile industry.

In the late 1980s, Chris Balzer saw the tower from Route 495 and requested his parents, Rick and Linda Balzer of Freeport, Maine, to investigate. They got in contact with Mr. Richard Lawrence and Mr. Donald George, and via Hotline with Bruce Arnold, they stimulated public interest.

The Ayer Mill endowment campaign

was established and an ad hoc committee of the Merrimack Valley Community Foundation. Under the direction of Thomas Caffrey, Donald George and The Eagle-Tribune, private donations met the goal of \$750,000 by selling minutes and hours of the week in memory of loved ones who worked in the mills. It was a tribute to the generosity of the citizens of greater Lawrence. Mr. Charles Waits has remained the clock keeper since its restoration in 1991.

The dies and replacement gears were recut at G&A Machines, now of Salem NH. Linda and Rick Balzer and their son Chris of Balzer Clockworks reconstructed the clock. The new clock hands were made of redwood and the glass was cleaned and cut for the dial faces. The green toned glass is original and the bluish tint glass is

replacement glass.

Prior to the glass being reset, the clock dial face remained open in the upper deck was water damaged by Hurricane Bob.

There were two architects who worked on the two restoration projects. William Lewis Barlow, IV worked on phase I, and George Nammour in phase II in 1999. The first phase was the clock and bell and the second was the bowed copper roof. The new bronze bell was cast in Holland and weighs 3,800 pounds at the cost of \$42,000. \$3000 was refunded for a spelling error of the word "restauration".

The clock tower has become a landmark and symbol of Lawrence. A silk screen poster depicting the tower was created by Robert Preston. Local businesses have used that tower as their logo such as tax services, restaurants, insurance companies and stationery for the immigrant city archives. When the first date stamp of Leonard Bernstein was canceled in Lawrence, it was done with the caché of the Ayer Mill Tower.

With the support from New Balance, Ayer Family, Wood Foundation, Stevens Foundation and the Catherine McCarthy Memorial Trust.

We know that this glorious edifice will remain as a reminder of Lawrence's textile heritage. In the safe hands of the Essex County Community Foundation, may the tower stand for hundreds of years. May future generations ponder its beauty and recall all those who worked in these iconic mills.


