Farsa de Comunidades Seguras

¡Qué nombre más engañoso! ¿Quién no quiere vivir en una comunidad segura? ¡Todos lo queremos! Nadie podría oponerse a la deportación de criminales a sus países.

Cuando Curtis Wood de la Oficina Ejecutiva de Seguridad Pública habló, dejó en claro que se trata de una política federal que se llevará a efecto en el 2013. El dijo que las comunidades pueden o no adoptarlo, aunque en 2013 se llevará a cabo a nivel nacional.

¿Por qué viajar por todo el estado fingiendo tener en cuenta la opinión del público como si pudieran controlar el resultado. Esa percepción dio lugar a discusiones y malentendidos que en la mayoría de los casos eran irracionales. Por ejemplo, en la radio en español, e incluso en esa reunión, les pidieron que dieran la oportunidad a las personas sin documentos válidos de ajustar su estatus en lugar de ser deportados. Ese no es el propósito de esta política, ¿por qué quiera mencionarlo?

Mary Beth Heffernan de la Oficina de Asuntos Comunitarios no estaba preparada y contestó, "No tengo la respuesta a eso", o "No sé" en varias ocasiones hasta que fue abucheadas por el público. Cuando se le preguntó por qué si esto tiene que ver con inmigración, no había nadie de ICE allí, ella respondió, "La próxima vez voy a invitar a ICE".

Y Richard Chacón de la Oficina de Refugiados e Inmigrantes no podía permanecer por mucho tiempo y se levantó y se fue a mitad de la reunión.

Rumbo habló con varias personas que asistieron a las reuniones celebradas en Framingham y Worcester, incluyendo Grace Ross de Worcester. Ella nos dijo que las dos reuniones anteriores fueron muy diferentes. No tenían traducción como la que tuvimos aquí y dijo que la historia cambió comparada a lo que hicieron en Worcester porque Mary Beth Heffernan no estuvo allí.

Un simple juego de política.

Secure Communities farce

What a misleading name! Who doesn't want to live in a secure community? We all do! No one could object to deporting criminals back to their countries.

When Curtis Wood from the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security spoke, he made it clear that this is a federal policy that will be taking effect in 2013. He said that communities may or may not adopt it but in 2013 it will be implemented nationally.

Why go around the state pretending to take into consideration the public's opinion as if they could control the outcome. That perception led to arguments and misconceptions that in most cases were irrational. For example, on Spanish radio and even at that meeting, they were asking that people without proper documents be given a chance to adjust their status instead of being deported. That is not the purpose of this policy; why even bring it up?

Mary Beth Heffernan from the Office of Community Affairs was ill prepared answering, "I don't have the answer to that," or "I don't know" several times until she was booed by the audience. When asked why if this has to do with immigration, there was no one from ICE there, she responded, "Next time I'll invite ICE."


And Richard Chacon of the Office of Refugees and Immigrants could not stay for long and got up and left about half way through the meeting.

Rumbo spoke to several people who attended the meetings held in Framingham and Worcester, including Grace Ross of Worcester. She told us that the two previous meetings were very different. They had no translation like we had here and she said they changed their story from what was said in Worcester because Mary Beth Heffernan was not there.

Just playing politics.

El Alcalde Lantigua terminó la entrevista diciendo que su gobierno es diferente. ¡Eso lo sabemos! Él hace las cosas de una manera diferente, pero prometió que para el 1ro de mayo se emitirá una especie de estado-de-la ciudad, aunque él lo llamo un "informe" con sus logros y un informe financiero.

Una compañía puede no renovar el seguro si usted presenta un reclamo.

Una empresa puede cancelar o no renovar su póliza si las condiciones o el uso de su edificio cambia.

Si se muda de una casa a otra, debe cambiar el tipo de póliza sobre la vivienda en la que no vive. Si usted sufre una pérdida y tiene el tipo equivocado de seguro puede que no lo paguen por una pérdida.

Ira y enojo presente en foro sobre Comunidades Seguras

"Estoy decepcionado con la administración del Presidente Obama y yo no quiero decepcionarme con el Gobernador Deval Patrick," dijo el Representante Estatal Marcos Devers al Secretario de Seguridad Pública de Massachusetts Mary Beth Heffernan, en la reunión comunitaria acerca del Programa Federal de Comunidades Seguras llevado a cabo el sábado, 2 de abril en el auditorio de Lawrence High School.

"No queremos delincuentes indocumentados, pero aquí tenemos ciudadanos decentes, duros trabajadores del mundo, que han sido deportados por esta ley", dijo Devers en oposición a la ejecución en Massachusetts del Programa Federal de Comunidades Seguras.

Devers fue uno de los muchos ciudadanos locales que hicieron cola durante más de una hora para hablar en contra del programa. Pocos locales levantaron la voz en apoyo de la medida, pero aplaudieron ruidosamente cuando algunos miembros del Tea Party dieron apoyo al programa federal.

"No estoy de acuerdo con la aplicación de Comunidades Seguras aquí. Entiendo que este programa es para detener y deportar a criminales, pero también entiendo que a través de este programa, muchos inmigrantes

que no tienen antecedentes penales han sido deportados injustamente", concluyó el Rep. Devers.

Anger prevails at Secure Communities Forum

"I'm disappointed with President Obama's administration and I don't want to be disappointed with Governor Deval Patrick," State Representative Marcos Devers said to Massachusetts Public Safety Secretary Mary Beth Heffernan at the community meeting about the Federal Secure Community Program held Saturday, April 2 at the Lawrence High School auditorium.

"We don't want undocumented criminals but here we have decent, hard working citizens of the world who have been deported because of this law," said Devers in opposition to the implementation in Massachusetts of the Secure Communities Federal Program.

Devers was one of the many local citizens who stood in line for over an hour to speak in opposition of the program. Few locals raised their voice in support of the measure, but

apuntarán a los precios que se pagarán por el programa propuesto, pero que escuchen con el alma a los precios mayores que ya estamos pagando cada vez que elegimos beneficios 'imaginarios o reales' sobre victimización y deshumanización de los seres humanos", rogó la Rev. Wendy von Zirpolo, ministro de la Iglesia Unitaria Universalista de Marblehead.

"Hemos estado aquí antes: Selma, Auschwitz, Ruanda, Darfur. Veces cuando la gente buena se descuida de ver, escuchar, hablar y actuar desde ese lugar sagrado llamado nuestra alma colectiva. Un lugar que algunos llaman Dios. Momentos en que un acto aparentemente inocente forma parte de una agenda muy clara.

"He visto los precios que pagan las personas que son de color marrón y negro capturados en esta agenda muy clara. (Impulsado por la CCA y otros que tratan de 'asegurar' este país por la 'protección' de la mayoría blanca. Fui testigo de un hombre latino arrastrado por delante de nosotros, que fue golpeado. He conocido a los niños, las abuelas y los estudiantes dirigidos por este tipo de programas.

"Yo pido que escuchen sus propias voces y las de nuestros hermanos y hermanas atrapados en una agenda de odio similar a la de años recientes. Jimmy Lee Jackson, Rosa Parks, James Reeb, Elie Wiesel, y dejar que Massachusetts muestre el camino como lo ha hecho antes, diciendo aquí no, ni ahora ni nunca", leyó la Rev. Wendy von

Zirpolo en lo que respecta a Comunidades Seguras.

Marty Lamb, de Holliston, que llegó con un grupo de miembros del Tea Party, reaccionó a la palabra 'Auschwitz' mencionada por la Rev. von Zirpolo en su declaración. "¿Cómo se atreve a comparar Auschwitz con esta situación", dijo y agregó: "Yo he venido hoy aquí por otra razón pero me siento ofendido con lo que usted acaba de decir." El Sr. Lamb dijo que millones de su pueblo fueron exterminados en ese campo. (Auschwitz fue una red de campos de concentración y exterminio construidos y operados en las zonas de Polonia anexada por la Alemania nazi durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial).

Comunidades Seguras es un programa federal que se pondrá en efecto en Massachusetts. Este programa seguirá adelante, independientemente del consentimiento de los gobiernos estatales y locales, explicó el subsecretario Kurt Wood, Adjunto de Estado de Seguridad Pública.

SURÍS: Anger prevails at Secure Communities Forum

applauded loudly when some members of the Tea Party pledged their support to the Federal program.

"I disagree with the implementation of secure Communities here. I understand that this program is to arrest and deport criminals, but I also understand that through this program many immigrants who do not have any criminal record have been deported unjustly," concluded Rep. Devers.

"We need the police to continue doing the work that they are doing, without getting involved with immigration. Please, do not divide families. Do not destroy them. We do not want programs that divide and destroy our community," said Luis David Hiraldo, president of New England Puerto Rican Alliance (NEPRA).


"Today, I ask you to listen with your head to the testimonies that will surely point to the price we will pay with the proposed program, but to listen with your soul to the greater price we are already paying whenever we choose 'imagined or real' benefits over victimization, dehumanization of fellow human beings.

"We've been here before. Selma, Auschwitz, Rwanda, Dafur. Times when good people neglected to see, to listen, to speak and to act from that sacred place called our collective soul. A place some call God. Times when one seemingly innocent act was part of a very clear agenda.

"I've seen the price paid by people who are brown and black caught in this very clear agenda. (Fueled by the CCA and others seeking to 'secure' this country by

'protecting' the white majority. I witnessed a Latino man dragged past us, who was then beaten. I've met the children, the grandmothers and the students targeted by this type of program.

"I call on you to listen to their voices and those of our brothers and sisters caught in a similar hateful agenda in recent years. Jimmy Lee Jackson, Rosa Parks, James Reeb, Elie Wiesel, and let Massachusetts lead the way as it has before, saying not here, not now, not ever," concluded reading Rev. Wendy von Zirpolo, regarding Secure

Communities.

Marty Lamb, from Holliston, who came with a group of Tea Party members, reacted to the word 'Auschwitz' mentioned by Rev. Zirpolo in her statement. "How you dare to compare Auschwitz with this situation," he said and added, "I came here today for other reason but I took offence in what you just said." Mr. Lamb said that millions of his people were exterminated in that camp. (Auschwitz was a network of concentration and extermination camps built and operated in Polish areas annexed by Nazi Germany

during the Second World War).

Diseñando el camino de educación financiera

Los jóvenes de hoy están bombardeados con una multitud de opciones financieras y responsabilidades a una edad cada vez más joven. Uno de cada tres adolescentes tiene una tarjeta de crédito, y aún más tienen una tarjeta de cajero automático.

Sin embargo, muchos adolescentes están mal equipados para tomar decisiones informadas sobre los asuntos financieros. Ellos no entienden los principios fundamentales de la administración del dinero y la economía en general. Como resultado, los adolescentes están en desventaja al tomar sus primeras importantes decisiones financieras: comprar un coche, aceptar un empleo a tiempo parcial o a tiempo completo, y el uso de tarjetas de crédito.

Los estudiantes universitarios de primer año tienen una deuda promedio de \$1,500 en tarjetas de crédito personales. Cuatro de cada 10 estadounidenses admiten que están viviendo fuera de su alcance, principalmente debido a su mal uso y mala interpretación de crédito. Los estadounidenses menores de 25 años son los que con más frecuencia se están declarando en quiebra que cualquier

otro grupo por edad.

Al mismo tiempo, las transacciones financieras son cada vez más complicadas. Como vimos con el reciente colapso del mercado de la vivienda, los que carecen de educación financiera pueden ser dirigidos hacia préstamos de alto riesgo y las hipotecas de los prestamistas sin escrúpulos.

Está claro que tenemos que hacer un mejor trabajo en enseñar a nuestros hijos los conceptos financieros básicos de educación, desde cómo crear un presupuesto o manejar una tarjeta de crédito hasta la forma de solicitar un préstamo y entender un puntaje de crédito.

Basándose en el liderazgo de la ex Senadora Estatal Sue Tucker, hemos presentado la legislación en el Senado del estado de Massachusetts en esta sesión que integrar las lecciones de educación financiera en el actual currículo de matemáticas de todos los estudiantes en la comunidad, desde el kindergarten hasta el grado 12. Esto ayudará a dar a nuestros estudiantes las herramientas para trazar una ruta hacia una base financiera sólida.

Los componentes del programa de educación financiera personal indicado en

el proyecto de ley incluyen: comprendiendo lo que es un préstamo, los intereses, el saldo de tarjetas de crédito y el comercio a través de la Internet; los derechos y responsabilidades de alquilar o comprar una casa, ahorrar, invertir y cómo planear para la jubilación; también los servicios bancarios y financieros. Además, el proyecto de ley crea un comité asesor para investigar y estudiar el desarrollo del plan de estudios y directrices. Creemos que mediante la incorporación de este material en el currículo de matemáticas, habrá una transición sin problemas para los estudiantes.

Asegurar que nuestros graduados tengan los conocimientos financieros es fundamental para el futuro económico del estado. Los problemas económicos que enfrenta nuestra nación nos recuerdan lo importante que es preparar a nuestros hijos a navegar en un mundo financiero cada vez más complejo. Encontrar su camino en este mercado requiere más inteligencia

Charting a Course to Financial Literacy

Today's youth are bombarded with a multitude of financial options and responsibilities at an increasingly young age. One out of every three teenagers has a credit card, and even more have an ATM card.

Yet many teenagers are ill-equipped to make informed decisions about financial matters. They don't understand the fundamental principles of money management and the larger economy. As a result, teenagers are at a disadvantage when making important first financial decisions: buying a car, taking part or full-time employment, and using credit cards.

New college freshman have an average debt of \$1,500 on personal credit cards. Four out of 10 Americans admit they are living beyond their means, primarily because of their misuse and misunderstanding of credit. Americans under 25 are filing



Lantigua on CrossOver

When Richard Aybar screened the telephone call during our show last Saturday, he started waving his arms, interrupting my conversation with Altagracia Mayí, to let me know that Mayor William Lantigua was on the line. We were surprised and wished we had intelligent questions to ask of him but fortunately, he was very talkative.

The mayor started with the recent news of the attempt to run him over outside of City Hall. We reported on that incident the day before in an article entitled "Mayor Lantigua fears for his life" and he wanted to explain the reason for this.

Soon after that, he was willing to point out the progress with the fire department saying that thanks to the \$6.6 million SAFER grant, the city was able to bring back all the firefighters that had been laid off. Also, some police officers have been brought back but then, he moved to his criticism of the police department which lead to his comments about being afraid for his life and fearing that they might plant something in his car to compromise him.

Mayor Lantigua realized that he went overboard and a few days later issued an apology. You can read it on page 17.

While the English-language press has had a field day quoting him, the reaction in the Spanish-language community has been quiet praise. Many people with whom I have spoken said that Lantigua dared to say the things most of us feel but are afraid to say.

We asked him regarding the recall petition that is going around and he was very philosophical about it saying that they have the right to collect signatures.

So far, there have been rumors of people signing them by the hundreds but nothing has been turned in to City Hall.

Mayor Lantigua ended the interview saying that his administration is different. We know that! He does things in a different way but he promised that by May 1st he

will issue a sort of state-of-the-city address, although he called it a "report" with his accomplishments and financial report.

Secure Communities

I predicted on the radio that these meetings across Massachusetts are nothing but a farce and I was right.

But I was wrong about the number in attendance. I bet Richard Aybar a sandwich that it would be standing room only judging by all the noise on Spanish radio. If you move from one home to another you must change the type of policy on the home you do not live in. If you have a loss, and you have the wrong type of insurance you may not be paid for a loss.

Needless to say, conversation pretty much revolves entirely around the state budget. Libraries have taken some pretty bad cuts in the last several years but we need to stop this trend. As cities and towns struggle to stay afloat financially, libraries end up with a smaller and smaller piece of the municipal pie. We cannot afford to have our state monies being eroded yearly as well.

I think the problem we suffer as libraries stems from the notion that we are a luxury to a community rather than a necessity. I can counter that on two levels. First, when an economy is bad people count on the library to provide services necessary for economic survival. Try to imagine conducting a job search in the twenty first century, for example, if you don't have access to a computer. How would a student do research for a paper or report with no access to the information sources available through the library?

Even more important, to my mind, is the access to all that is great in the literature of the world. The public library as we know it today—a free institution available to all equally and possessing the means to provide virtually any piece of literature to anybody—is a relatively recent concept. We are privileged to live in a time and place that affords all of us access to the greatest works of literature, philosophy, history, science and art. To say we are privileged to have public libraries is not, however, to say that libraries are a luxury to be given up in

hard times. Instead libraries are like art and music. They are essential to the civilized soul. It is our duty as citizens to see that libraries remain forever available in every community and for all people.

I would ask all Rumbo readers to please take a moment to drop an email to your representative and senator asking them to protect libraries when voting on the governor's budget. In Lawrence Barry Finegold is the state senator. The three representatives are Marcos Devers, David Torrisi and Paul Adams.

Don't forget our upcoming Friends of the Library events. Wednesday April 13th is paranormal night in our local history room on the third floor. Time to find out if your house is haunted. Thomas Spitalere of the Essex Ghost Project will be our guest speaker. The talk begins at 6:30. Saturday April 19th we will be hosting a concert by the barbershop style Gentlemen Songsters. People loved them last year so come early to be sure of a seat. The program starts at 2:00 in the Sargent Auditorium.



The Merrimack Valley Chapter of Parents of Murdered Children, (POMC) invites you to the third annual Candlelight Vigil on April 11, 2011, in recognition of National Crime Victim's Rights Week. This year's theme, Reshaping the Future, Honoring the Past.

The event opens at the Lowell Memorial Auditorium at 4PM with informational booths and a social gathering. We then will culminate outside at 7:00PM for a candle light walk to City Hall.

Speakers who will be in attendance are Senator Eileen Donoghue, Sheriff Peter Koutoujian, State Rep. Dave Nangle and Community VOICES, Laurie Myers. 2011 National Crime Victims' Rights Week will recall the ideals that inspired the decades-long struggle of the victims' rights movement and challenge all Americans to honor victims' rights. "This event is in support of all crimes, not just homicides! If you are a victim of a crime or in support of any victim of a crime please join us in our walk." "We will have information booths for anyone seeking help," said Arnie Muscovitz, Chapter Leader of the Merrimack Valley Chapter of POMC. Mr. Muscovitz went on to say "This is a great awareness tool and hopefully it would make people more educated and prevent these horrible crimes from happening."

Only a few decades ago, unfairness, indignities, and disrespect confronted many victims of crime. Victims of Crime in America, the 1984 report of the President's Task Force on Victims of Crime, described a "hellish" justice system, focused on offenders and indifferent to victims' needs.

In the 25 years since Victims of Crime in America was published, a grassroots movement began to combat such unfairness and launched decades of progress for victims of crime. As of 2010, every state has passed victims' rights laws, and 32 states have constitutional victims' rights amendments. All states have victim compensation funds, and more than 10,000 victim assistance programs exist throughout the country. Such changes have made victims participants, rather than bystanders, in the criminal justice system.

Yet much work remains. Victims' rights are not always enforced. Some victims receive no notice when a trial is scheduled or an offender released. Some courts deny victims' right to be heard at sentencing or to be present at trials, or they fail to order restitution or issue protection orders to keep victims safe. Some victims never learn about victim compensation or receive victim services, an increasing reality during our current economic downturn. Such failures block victims' access to their rights.

Community members are encouraged to join in the week's activities and get involved in helping victims of crime. LITERACY: Who is responsible for educating our children: Parents or the school?

for bankruptcy faster than any other age group.

At the same time, financial transactions are becoming more and more complicated. As we saw with the recent collapse of the housing market, those lacking financially literacy can be steered into risky loans and

mortgages by unscrupulous lenders.

It's clear we need to do a better job of teaching our children financial education basics, from how to create a budget or manage a credit card to how to apply for a loan and understand a credit score.

Building on the leadership of former

State Senator Sue Tucker, we have filed legislation in the Massachusetts State Senate this session that would integrate financial literacy lessons into the current math curriculum of all students in the Commonwealth, from kindergarten through grade 12. This will help give our students

the tools to plot a course toward strong financial footing.

The components of the personal financial literacy program outlined in the bill include: understanding loans, interest, credit card debt, and online commerce; the rights and responsibilities of renting or buying a home; saving, investing and planning for retirement; and banking and financial services. Additionally, the bill creates an advisory committee to investigate and study the development of curriculum and guidelines. We believe that by incorporating this material into the math curriculum, there will be a seamless transition for students.

Ensuring that our graduating seniors are financially literate is critical to the Commonwealth's economic future. In light of the economic problems facing our nation, we are reminded of how important it is to prepare our children to navigate an increasingly complex financial world. Finding their way in this marketplace will require more financial savvy than ever before. By teaching children the financial education basics in school, we will help them make educated financial decisions in the future, preventing future bankruptcies, foreclosures, and unmanageable debt.

This is a result that's good for society as well as for individuals. Over the long term, the investment we make in teaching children financial literacy now will help strengthen our economy, prevent future economic crises, and improve economic security for all Massachusetts residents.

Importantly, financial education programs have a proven track record of helping working families. In Massachusetts, 7,707 foreclosure deeds were recorded in 2009 through October. Foreclosure-prevention education offered by community based organizations, such as Lawrence CommunityWorks in Lawrence, MA, have done significant work in improving local foreclosure rates. Of the 388 people who received foreclosure counseling from Lawrence CommunityWorks in 2009, only 5 foreclosed on their homes—that's less than 1 percent of participants. Introducing similar education through this legislation into our children's curriculum will magnify and increase their financial success rate in the future.

We have heard loud and clear from dozens of teachers, financial institutions and students that the long-term health of our economy will be determined by how well we educate young people today. In an increasingly complex financial marketplace, we need to set a strong financial course for our youth. It is our hope that our colleagues in the House of Representatives and the Senate acknowledge the fundamental need for financial literacy programs and enact "An Act Establishing a Financial Literacy Curriculum" during this legislative session.

this deplorable action. I want to make sure you all know that I have worked tirelessly, and will continue to do so, to make certain that every teacher with professional status has a job next year.

This year teachers, students, and parents will face the unnecessary and unfortunate consequences of the superintendent's decision. I have been told that 15 teachers, (8 at the Arlington and 7 at the South Lawrence East Middle) have decided to exercise their right to "opt out" due to family and personal reasons. They will be reassigned to other positions. Additionally, the superintendent has not accepted the reapplication of 20 teachers. These teachers (10 at the Arlington

and 10 at the South Lawrence East Middle) will also be reassigned to other positions in the school system. Most regrettably, 7 teachers without professional status (3 at the Arlington and 4 at the South Lawrence East Middle) will not be reappointed to their positions this year.

Despite this disappointing news, I know that the committed members of the Lawrence Teachers Union will continue to show the same vigor, commitment, and professionalism they have consistently brought to the classroom. It is vitally important that we stick together at this challenging time. I am confident that next year the reassigned teachers will be

welcomed to their new positions and school communities.

I intend to meet with representatives from AFT Massachusetts later today. I will be reporting the results of those discussions at the next union meeting, next week, Wednesday, April 6, 2011. I encourage everyone to attend.

Now we must look forward and come together. I remain committed to our teachers, fighting to keep every job.




