Rumbo on the Radio!

Alcalde de Lawrence recibe prensa hispana

El miércoles, 27 de abril 2011, el Alcalde de Lawrence William Lantigua se reunió con los medios locales hispanos en su oficina ubicada en el Ayuntamiento por más de hora y media. De una lista de 27 representantes de programas de radio, televisión y periódicos locales, 13 asistieron. (Lea la lista completa en la página 31).

Lantigua no permitió grabar la conferencia de prensa en video. Sólo en audio y TV (Mass TV) y explicó que quería seguir el mismo formato que hizo con los medios de comunicación tradicionales (los medios de comunicación de habla inglés).

"La razón de esta reunión se debe a que en mi opinión, la población de habla española de Lawrence no está consciente de lo que está pasando", expresó el alcalde en sus palabras de apertura. Lantigua se refirió a los numerosos artículos publicados en los medios de comunicación tradicionales en inglés, durante las últimas dos semanas, sobre una investigación de corrupción en su administración por organismos federales y locales.

"Todo lo que en los periódicos se ha estado informando es totalmente falso", destacó Lantigua.

Su decisión de llamar a esta reunión fue bien acogida por la mayoría de los asistentes, sobre todo porque la mayoría de ellos no dominan el inglés. Ernesto Bautista, productor de Mass TV expresó su agradecimiento personal al alcalde y hablando en nombre del grupo dijo que, "Estoy cansado de encontrar la información de lo que está pasando en mi ciudad en los medios de comunicación en inglés."

"Por eso yo quería tener este encuentro con vosotros, sin la necesidad de un traductor", dijo el alcalde asegurándoles que este tipo de reuniones no será la última.

Sin mencionar los nombres de los periódicos, Lantigua se estaba refiriendo a los informes que aparecieron por primera vez en The Boston Globe:

"Las autoridades federales y estatales están investigando al Alcalde William Lantigua, de Lawrence sobre posible corrupción y otras faltas, la intensificación de la controversia que rodea al líder de una de las ciudades con más problemas

Lawrence Mayor meets with Hispanic Media

On Wednesday, April 27, 2011, Lawrence Mayor William Lantigua met with Hispanic local media at his office located at City Hall for over one hour and a half. From a list of 27 representatives of talk radio shows, T.V. and newspapers, 13 attended. (Read complete list on page 31).

Lantigua did not allow videotaping at the press conference. Only audio and T.V. (Mass T.V.) and explained that he wanted to follow the same format he did with the traditional media (English-speaking media).

"The reason for this meeting is because in my opinion, the Spanish-speaking population of Lawrence is not aware of what is going on," expressed the Mayor in his opening remarks. Lantigua was referring to the numerous articles being published for the past couple of weeks in the traditional media in English about an investigation by federal and local law enforcement for corruption within his administration.

"Everything those newspapers have been informing is totally false," stressed Lantigua.

His decision for calling this meeting was welcomed by the majority of the attendees, especially because most of them are not fluent in English. Ernesto Bautista, producer of Mass TV expressed his personal gratitude to the mayor and speaking for the group said that, "I'm tired of learning from the English media what is going on in my city."

"That is why I wanted to have this meeting with you without the need of a


Activities will begin on the North Common by the bandstand at 8:00 AM with free t-shirts, coffee and pastries and will end at the same place for lunch at 1:00PM.



Desde Mi Esquina

Estado de la Ciudad

A fin de aclarar cierta confusión creada por la noticia de que el Alcalde William Lantigua ofrecerá el "Estado de la Ciudad" el 3 de mayo, esto se llevará a cabo en el marco de la reunión del Concilio de la Ciudad a partir de las 7:00 PM.

Por alguna razón, la gente comenzó a llamar a nuestra oficina preguntando si lo estaría haciendo a las 6:30, antes de la reunión ordinaria y si el Presidente del Concilio, Frank Morán le "permitiría" interferir en la reunión del concilio. Además, existen dudas porque no aparece listado en la agenda del día 3 de mayo.

fue acusado de nepotismo por conseguir trabajo con la ciudad para los miembros de su familia, fui a la estación de policía para averiguar cuánto tiempo su primera esposa lleva trabajando en la Dirección General de Tráfico. Los oficiales se rieron porque ella ha estado allí desde hace más de diez años. Sabemos que Mayra Lantigua fue nombrada miembro de la Comisión de Licencias por el Alcalde Michael Sullivan hace seis años y se ha dicho que su hija Vanessa obtuvo un puesto de maestra en las Escuelas Públicas de Lawrence después de graduarse.

Tras de comprobar el empleo de Vanessa, me encontré con que ella es lo que llaman una "educadora con base en el edificio" (building based educator = maestro suplente.) Ella gana \$100 por día sin beneficios. Si no trabaja, no cobra los \$100 y que sólo fue capaz de conseguir el trabajo después de trabajar para el sistema escolar cada verano mientras iba a la escuela.

Fue muy gracioso cuando los rumores se regaron el año pasado acerca de cómo le había dado a su hijo un puesto también. El niño sólo tenía 8 años de edad.

Ahora, el ex alcalde Sullivan está propagando rumores de que Lantigua ha viajado a la República Dominicana en



siete ocasiones desde que asumió el cargo, insinuando que debe haber algo de credibilidad a los cargos de lavado de dinero. No sé si Lantigua está lavando dinero de drogas o no, pero me gusta la precisión y él admite que ha dado cuatro viajes. Si usted cree que son demasiadas vacaciones para el alcalde de una ciudad con problemas, puede que tenga razón, pero ¿por qué exagerar los hechos, a menos que la intención es la de avivar las llamas de la discordia.

El taller tuvo lugar exclusivamente en español. Conversando con un miembro de personal le expresé mi preocupación porque estaban violando la ley. Le pregunté cómo se sentiría si yo ponga un aviso en la puerta diciendo 'blancos solamente' Una violación de los derechos civiles y no es legal de acuerdo con DOE y la ley."

Bueno, ¡ya me conocen bien! Lo comprobé y esta es la respuesta que recibí: "Talleres de entrenamiento se pueden hacer en cualquier idioma, incluyendo el lenguaje por señas, con el fin de comunicarse con los padres. DOE (Departamento de Educación) no tiene una política de solamente inglés para los padres. Eso sería contrario a la ley. ¿Recuerda la ley de inglés solamente que no pasó?

Camión de DPW destrozó auto en Lawrence

Uno de los camiones de mantenimiento de alcantarillado del DPW de Lawrence conducido por el empleado de Obras Públicas Anthony J. Matteo, rozó un coche estacionado ilegalmente en la calle Park en la intersección con la calle Lawrence el martes, 26 de abril, mientras que una mujer embarazada y su pequeño hijo de 3 años de edad estaban sentados en el interior.

La conductora del coche, María Tejada, residente del 2 de la calle Inman, dijo al Oficial de LPD Maurice Aguilera que había estacionado su coche un sedán Toyota Camry gris del 2003 a un lado de la calle Park "por un segundo, mientras que entré en la tienda a comprar algo."

Ella dijo que acababa de pagar cuando escuchó un fuerte golpe y salió para encontrar su auto destrozado con su sobrina Diana Pérez y su hijo de 3 años de edad en el interior.

Según el informe policial presentado por Oficial Maurice Aguilera, con la ayuda de Michael Laliberté y Gary Yancey, la policía, los bomberos de Lawrence y el personal de Patriot Ambulance tuvieron que utilizar medios mecánicos para extraer a Pérez y su hijo. Ambos, madre e hijo fueron trasladados en ambulancia al Hospital General de Lawrence.

El impacto parece haber forzado el vehículo sobre la acera y lo obligó a



estrellarse contra el poste eléctrico #3488 de la Ciudad de Lawrence. El vehículo sufrió grandes daños, mientras que el camión de la ciudad sufrió daños en la escalera de pasajeros y la caja de herramientas. El Sr. Mateo declaró que no sufrió lesiones como consecuencia del accidente y se negó a recibir atención médica, según el informe.

Matteo, 32, residente de Sweet Hill Road, Plaistow, NH, dijo a la policía que él estaba conduciendo por la calle Park cuando intentó pasar a un auto que estaba estacionado en el lado de la carretera. "Revisé mis espejos y todo y pensé que cabía. La escalera del camión debe haber cortado la puerta del lado del conductor,

porque lo siguiente que sé es que esto (el accidente) ocurrió", escribió Aguilera en su informe.

Los registros indican que en 2005, Matteo fue arrestado y se enfrentó a la terminación después de que chocó mientras conducía un camión barre-nieve de 10 ruedas contra dos coches en la Calle

Enséñele a sus hijos sobre las tasas de interés

Una de las lecciones financieras más valiosas que puede compartir con sus hijos antes de que se vayan del nido es explicarles qué son las tasas de interés y cómo funcionan. Las transacciones financieras importantes que van a realizar en la edad adulta probablemente se verán afectadas de alguna manera por las tasas de interés, ya sea como prestamista o como prestatario.

Aquí hay información de fondo que será útil para guiar esas conversaciones:

Tasas de interés para los prestamistas. Cualquier persona que tenga una cuenta de ahorros o tenga bonos del gobierno o comerciales está, en efecto, prestando dinero a esas instituciones y ganando intereses sobre el préstamo. Sin embargo, a menos que compre bonos municipales libres de impuestos, este ingreso por interés está probablemente sujeto a impuestos, así que mire y busque tarifas favorables para maximizar sus ganancias y ayudar a compensar la inflación. Compare las tasas de interés de los Certificados de Depósito de los bancos, las cuentas de ahorros y las cuentas corriente en www.bankrate.com, para encontrar las entidades crediticias para las cuales usted es elegible, visite www.creditunion.coop.

Tasas de interés para los prestatarios. Las tasas de interés tienen aún más impacto en usted como prestatario, especialmente para las grandes compras. Por ejemplo: la mayoría de las hipotecas son de 15 a 30 años, por lo que la reducción de la tasa de interés en uno o dos puntos podría ahorrar decenas o cientos de miles de dólares durante la vida del préstamo. Y las tasas de las tarjetas de crédito pueden variar en 10 puntos o más, dependiendo de su calificación crediticia.

La mayoría de las tasas de interés para los prestatarios se expresan en términos de tasa de porcentaje anual (APR). Con las tarjetas de crédito, el emisor puede cobrar una APR fija, o cambiarla a medida que las tasas de interés bancarias varíen ("tasa variable"). Cada período de facturación, la compañía cobra una fracción de la tasa anual, denominada la "tasa periódica", sobre los saldos pendientes. Con las hipotecas, la APR también toma en cuenta los puntos, comisiones de apertura, las primas de seguro hipotecario y otros cargos.

Las tasas de interés también puede depender de:

Si el préstamo es "garantizado" (por una garantía, como una casa o un automóvil) o "sin garantía" (no vinculado a garantías - como las tarjetas de crédito - por lo que

el prestamista se basa en su promesa de devolver el dinero). Debido a que son más riesgosas para el prestamista, los préstamos sin garantía suelen tener mayores tasas de interés.

La calificación crediticia: Las personas con calificaciones crediticias más altas se consideran menos riesgosas y, por consiguiente, obtienen las tasas mucho más favorables.

Duración del plazo: Las tasas de préstamos a largo plazo suelen ser más altas que los de corto plazo, porque a mayor duración del préstamo, mayor será el riesgo para el prestamista de que usted pueda entrar en mora.

Fijo vs. Ajustable. Las tasas de interés de las hipotecas son fijas durante toda la vida del préstamo, o ajustables a intervalos predeterminados para una parte o la totalidad del período del préstamo. Por lo general están vinculados a un índice tal como la Nota del Tesoro a 10 años. Cuando los índices de las tasas son relativamente altos, muchos optan por una hipoteca a tasa ajustable (ARM), que por lo general tienen una tasa de inicio más baja y por lo tanto es






The bill sets up a Financial Literacy Trust Fund within the state Treasurer's Office to encourage financial literacy and education for residents, businesses, educational institutions, community organizations and other entities that will promote financial literacy throughout the Commonwealth.

"The Financial Literacy Trust Fund will help us to promote basic money management and will lead to more financial stability for Massachusetts families that need it most."

"This Trust Fund will provide important training to our fellow citizens, particularly in gateway cities, on issues such as household budgeting, saving more, consumer protection, and the power of compound interest in long-term financial planning," said Treasurer Grossman. "We believe that a little education goes a long way toward ensuring fiscal stability, and this program avoids any additional burden on the taxpayer."

"The Commonwealth of Massachusetts is deeply committed to providing students with high quality instruction in the subjects that will set them on a path for a bright future and financial literacy is critical to that success," said Education Secretary

The fund will be administered by the state treasurer along with a 20 member board of trustees. The board will include 6 non-

voting members of the legislature and 14 voting members including representatives from the Treasurer's office, the Attorney General's office, the office of Consumer Affairs and Business Regulation, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Executive Office of Education, the Executive Office of Housing

and Economic Development and additional stakeholder designees.

The fund will accept private contributions, publicly or privately-funded grants and funds appropriated by the state or federal government to advance its mission of encouraging financial literacy and education.

financieros del estado, de acuerdo con los agentes del orden y una persona que fue entrevistada por el FBI", dijo el Globe el 23 de abril de 2011, y continuó:

"El FBI, el fiscal del distrito de Essex, y otras agencias están estudiando los tratos de Lantigua con compañías que trabajan para la ciudad y en su continua batalla pública con el Departamento de Policía de Lawrence, de acuerdo con los funcionarios, que hablaron bajo condición de anonimato debido a que la investigación está en curso. Los oficiales de policía están particularmente interesados en el control del alcalde sobre el cual las empresas obtienen el negocios de remolques con la ciudad y a quiénes le es permitido para operar compañías de taxis.

Una persona que ha sido repetidamente entrevistada por los investigadores estatales y federales, dijo que los agentes estaban muy interesados en las conexiones financieras de Lantigua, en su caso, a una media docena de bares y discotecas, algunas de las cuales abrieron desde que asumió el cargo en 2010.

La esposa de Lantigua ha sido miembro de la Comisión de Licencias que controla los establecimientos que pueden vender alcohol, la policía dice que Lantigua regularmente frecuenta los clubes tales como Centro.

"Ellos quieren saber acerca de esos lugares", dijo la fuente, que habló bajo condición de anonimato. "Hay un montón de preguntas", concluyó El Globe.

Estas informaciones son totalmente falsas. Mi récord ha sido más que investigado. No sé qué más puedo explicar. A veces pienso que estoy perdiendo mi tiempo", expresó Lantigua.

Lantigua responde, esta vez en español, a los cargos impuestos por The Globe:

1 No hay control sobre cuáles empresas obtienen el negocio de remolque de la ciudad. La ciudad no tiene contrato con ninguna de las cuatro empresas que han estado operando dentro de la ciudad desde la administración anterior.

2 ¿Qué empresa está autorizada para operar taxis? Lantigua dijo que no ha hablado con ninguna compañía de taxis y que no se ha formado ninguna nueva empresa, con la excepción de la fusión de dos empresas para convertirse en una. Él dijo que Melix Bonilla ha sido el encargado de organizar las compañías de taxis mucho antes de él ser elegido alcalde. "Las empresas de taxis son autorizadas tanto por la Policía de Lawrence como el concilio de la ciudad, no el alcalde", dijo Lantigua.

3 "El Globe pregunta de mis relaciones financieras con los establecimientos que venden alcohol, tales como el club nocturno Centro, ya que mi esposa es miembro de la Comisión de Licencias", dijo Lantigua. "Cuando me postulé para alcalde, yo dije: Si tengo que cambiar mi estilo de vida, ¡no me elijan! Me gusta bailar bachata es por eso que voy a

clubes nocturnos y con respecto a Mayra Lantigua, ella fue nombrada a la junta por el ex alcalde Sullivan.

"Yo fui elegido para hacer cambios fundamentales y los estoy haciendo. He sido acusado de lavado de dinero, tráfico de armas y drogas. Sin embargo, con la presión de las falsas acusaciones, no he dejado de mover nuestra comunidad hacia adelante", dijo el alcalde.

Dominicana, pero desde que fue elegido, ha estado allí tres veces, invitado por las autoridades dominicanas, donde ha sido premiado por sus logros en este país. "He pagado por los viajes con mi propio dinero, aún cuando, si el alcalde es invitado para representar a la ciudad, podría obtener un reembolso."

Después de comprobar su pasaporte, Lantigua llamó a Rumbo para corregir su declaración anterior. "En realidad, he estado allí cuatro veces. Tres en comisión de servicio y la más reciente a la boda de mi hermanita."

State of the City Address

In order to clarify some confusion created by the news that Mayor William Lantigua will be offering a "State of the City Address" on May 3rd, it will take place as part of the City Council meeting starting at 7:00 PM.

For some reason, people started calling our office wondering if he would be doing it at 6:30, prior to the meeting and if Council President Frank Moran would "allow" him to interfere with the regular council meeting. Also, there were doubts because it was not shown on the agenda for May 3rd.

According to the City Charter, the mayor was required to render a statement in writing to the City Council in February but, considering that Mayor Patricia Dowling refused to come before that board, it was changed to require the mayor to do it personally as part of the Mayor's Communications section.

Call me a stickler

There is nothing worse than arguing with someone who checks facts and comments before opening her mouth!

When Mayor William Lantigua was accused of nepotism for getting his family jobs with the city, I went to the police station to find out how long his first wife had been working in the Traffic Department. They laughed because she has been there for over ten years. If you move from one home to another you must change the type of policy on the home you do not live in. If you have a loss, and you have the wrong type of insurance you may not be paid for a loss.



1969 FAST PITCH PLAYOFF TITLE

Before a jam packed crowd at the Hayden Schofield the Funky Broadway team that won the league's title and the Hancocks took the field.

George Simonian still of Methuen and Frank Benjamin (I hope I spelled this name correctly) were the Managers of these teams. George gave the ball to his star pitcher Don McCleod and I answered with the big right-hander Sherm Anderton from Rockport, MA. I came to know Sherm when we both worked for the Power Co., and one day he stopped me at an ice cream shop as I was leaving my day's work in Rockport and he remembered me from a tournament my team the Hancocks and his team the Cape Ann Vets played in.

He said if I ever needed a pitcher he would be glad to come to Lawrence to pitch for us. Dick Krauss our star pitcher was injured and unable to pitch so I accepted Sherm's offer and he did come to Lawrence for four years becoming a fans' favorite and they called him the "Big Tuna." He loved the crowds and the back and forth ribbing with them.

The Hancocks were hot in these playoffs but Sherm was microwave hot throughout the semis and now the finals. League officials stated that this pitcher's performance was the best in the league's 19 year history. On the previous Tuesday he blanked the Bill Timmons led Herman Hall 5/0 and came back on Wednesday to shut them out again 6/0.

Opening the finals on Thursday he gave up 1 run to the Funky Broadways and won 9/1. He came back on Friday to beat the Broadways again this time 10/1. The Broadways were this year's season champs with an 18/10 record and the Hancocks were runner ups at 17/11.

The Hancocks were looking to beat the Funky Broadways for the second year for the league title and these two teams were always at their best when meeting in any games whether in seasonal playoffs or in tournaments and matched up well with player for player and all games between the two teams brought out huge crowds.

In this 3rd game in the finals it was no exception and in the first inning, former

LHS pitcher and captain (now an outfielder for the Hancocks) and a left-handed batter crunched a one out Don McLeod pitch deep to left field for a home run. We didn't know at the time that it was all the Rockport Tuna would need it was 1/0 Hancocks.

The second run of the night was registered in the fifth when Don Overka doubled to left and after one out Dick McCarron crunched a line drive single off a McLeod rise ball to left and that scored Overka. The final Hancock run was when Chris DeCesare, still of Methuen and now selling and teaching golfers at Kazangian's golf in the Valley, doubles splitting the left and center fielders.

Bobby Deduca the youngest player on the Hancocks and a real good tennis player still lives in Methuen and watched his son Beau have a fine high school career for the Rangers. 

Interest rates for borrowers. Interest rates have even more impact on you as a borrower, especially for large purchases. For example: Most mortgages are for 15 to 30 years, so reducing the interest rate by a point or two could save tens or hundreds of thousands of dollars over the life of the loan. And credit card rates may vary by 10 points or more, depending on your credit rating.

Most borrower interest rates are expressed in terms of annual percentage rate (APR). With credit cards, the issuer may charge a fixed APR, or change it as bank interest rates vary ("variable rate"). Each billing period, the company charges a fraction of the annual rate, called the "periodic rate," on outstanding balances. With mortgages, the APR also factors in points, origination fees, mortgage insurance premiums and other fees.

Interest rates may also depend on:

Whether the loan is "secured" (secured by collateral such as a house or car) or "unsecured" (not tied to collateral – like credit cards – so the lender relies on your promise to pay it back). Because they're riskier for the lender, unsecured loans typically have higher interest rates.

Credit score – people with higher credit scores are deemed less risky and therefore get much more favorable rates.

Term length – long-term loan rates are usually higher than short-term rates,

because the longer the loan, the greater the risk to the lender that you might default.

Fixed vs. adjustable. Home mortgage interest rates are either fixed for the life of the loan or adjustable at predetermined intervals for part or all of the loan period. They're usually tied to an index such as the 10-Year Treasury Note. When rate indexes are relatively high, many opt for an adjustable rate mortgage (ARM), which typically has a lower beginning rate and is therefore more affordable initially. However, when rates climb due to inflation or other factors, monthly ARM payments can rise sharply, which is why many people prefer the more dependable fixed rate.

Bottom line: Many factors in setting interest rates are beyond our individual control; however, teach your kids that they can control their own credit score, which can have a tremendous impact – good or bad – on interest rates.



UMass Lowell Breaks Ground on \$40 Million Academic Building

New Facility Will Be Home to Popular Majors, Support Growth in Enrollment

UMass Lowell broke ground today on a new \$40 million, 69,000-square-foot academic building that will be home to three of the university's most popular majors in health and social sciences and represents the second major construction project underway at the university.

The Health and Social Sciences Building – which will support more than 800 construction and related jobs – will also help UMass Lowell make room for its growing student body, which has seen a 30 percent increase in undergraduates since 2007. The Health and Social Sciences Building will be home to the criminal justice, nursing and psychology programs.

Speakers at the groundbreaking ceremony included Massachusetts Secretary of Education Paul Reville, Division of Capital Asset Management Commissioner Carole Cornelison, UMass Lowell Chancellor Marty Meehan, local and state elected officials, and UMass Lowell students Djwan Scott, a nursing major, and Michael Reid, the student trustee.

"The students who will study in this new building will help advance a vibrant society," Meehan said. "So many of our students are committed to making a difference, both while they are here and after they graduate. They help our communities thrive. We salute our students and the faculty who inspire them."

The building will offer traditional classrooms and faculty offices, as well as specialized labs, such as simulated hospital rooms and other health-care settings, and research space designed for social sciences. Other features include: conference space that will allow more room for students and faculty to collaborate with partners on experiential education and other projects; a four-story atrium lobby that will promote interaction between faculty and students; sustainable design features such as energy-efficient climate control, strategic use of natural light to reduce electric costs, water-

efficient landscaping that does not require irrigation; three-quarters of the construction debris from the project will be recycled.

The architects on the building are Cambridge Seven Associates Inc., a leading design firm that has won awards for its work on academic buildings. Gilbane Building Co. is the general contractor and the Division of Capital Asset Management, the state's real estate and construction arm, is managing the project.

The Health and Social Sciences Building will have the capacity to serve nearly 900 students and more than 140 faculty members and, when completed during the 2012-2013 academic year, will free up space in existing academic buildings for other departments to expand.

The groundbreaking marks the official start of the second major construction project at UMass Lowell; the new Emerging

Technologies and Innovation Center is underway on North Campus. While South Campus buildings have undergone renovations over the years, the Health and Social Sciences Building is the first new construction from the ground up since the mid-1970s.

"These two buildings symbolize a revitalization of UMass Lowell's campus complex on both sides of the Merrimack River. The simultaneous projects are part of the first major physical transformation of the university in more than three decades," said Meehan.

In addition to the new buildings, UMass Lowell has made a series of significant property acquisitions since 2009: the UMass Lowell Inn & Conference Center, the Tsongas Center at UMass Lowell and University Crossing, formerly St. Joseph's Hospital. In addition, UMass Lowell plans


to construct two new parking garages, one each on the North and South campuses, and a residence hall on East Campus.

Funding for the new Health and Social Sciences Building was provided through the Commonwealth's Higher Education Bond Bill of 2008.

"The Patrick-Murray Administration remains firmly committed to providing the support our public campuses need to provide an excellent education for all students," said Reville. "We are fortunate to educate highly motivated students and to work with talented faculty and staff and these funds will ensure they have access to the facilities they need to be successful."

"Today, we celebrate another milestone in the Patrick-Murray Administration's commitment to building world-class public higher education facilities," said Cornelison.

to use mechanical means to extract Perez and her son. They were both taken away in an ambulance to be checked at Lawrence General Hospital.

The impact appears to have forced the vehicle up onto the sidewalk and forced it to crash against City of Lawrence pole #3488. The vehicle sustained extensive damage while the city truck sustained damage to the passenger side step ladder and side utility box. Mr. Matteo stated he sustained no injuries as a result of the accident and refused medical attention, according to the report.

Matteo, of 32, Plaistow, N.H., told

police that he was driving on Park Street when he tried to pass a car that was parked on the side of the road. "I checked my mirrors and everything and thought I had it. The stepladder on the dump truck must have clipped the driver's side door, because the next thing I know this (accident) happened," wrote Aguiler in his report.

Records indicate that in 2005, Matteo was arrested and faced termination after he rammed a 10-wheel plow truck he was driving into two cars on Congress Street. A small bag of marijuana was found in the truck's cab. Then Mayor Michael Sullivan wanted to fire him, but his union reached an

agreement with the city allowing him to return to work.

In 2008, the city again tried to fire

Matteo for smoking marijuana on the job.

An arbitrator said the city didn't have the

grounds to fire him and he was allowed to return to work.

Matteo, along with another DPW worker and a Supervisor were caught dumping snow into the North Canal by the Court House on February 1st, 2011. Matteo and the other worker were suspended for 5 days. The supervisor was fired.

According to City of Lawrence Human Resources Director Frank Bonet, Matteo was tested immediately after the accident mentioned above, for substance use. "Results are due within 48 hours," said Bonet.

During our CrossOver show last Saturday, Richard Aybar and I received a call from someone criticizing the Lawrence Police Department. He mentioned an incident of a neighbor of his who had a windshield broken by a teenager. Police was called and upon questioning the delinquent who simply said he has no money to repay it, the officer told the car owner there was nothing that could be done and left without pressing charges against the teenager.

A few days later, the caller's car was the victim this time but did not bother to call police saying they wouldn't do anything – like before. Richard and I told him that it was a mistake because it could only encourage that behavior knowing that nothing would happen to them. I went to the police station personally and explained those incidents to some of the officers and they could not understand why that happened. One thing is for sure, we cannot let them get away with it.

Caller: They said that you can go at any time and file a report with them. I think that besides getting an official report for your benefit, you should ask them to investigate who broke the windows each time and have due process. While you are at it, have them find out who was the officer who let the first truant go unpunished.

Two weeks ago we published a police report showing how crime has increased in

the city. It also shows that Calls for Service went down by 11.4% between 2009 and 2010. Now we know the reason; crimes are going unreported and then we complain about the police.



translator," said the Mayor and assured that this kind of meetings won't be the last.

Without mentioning the names of the newspapers, Lantigua was referring to the reports that appeared first in The Boston Globe:

"Federal and state authorities are investigating Mayor William Lantigua of Lawrence on possible corruption and other wrongdoing, intensifying controversy surrounding the leader of one of the state's most financially troubled cities, according to law enforcement officials and one person who was interviewed by the FBI," said the Globe on April 23, 2011 and continued:

"The FBI, the Essex district attorney, and other agencies are looking into Lantigua's dealings with companies that work for the city and into his ongoing public battle with the Lawrence Police Department, according to the officials, who spoke on the condition of anonymity because the investigation is ongoing. Law enforcement officials are particularly interested in the mayor's control over which companies get towing business with the city and who is permitted to operate taxicabs.

One person who has been repeatedly interviewed by state and federal investigators said the agents were very interested in Lantigua's financial connections, if any, to half a dozen bars and nightclubs, some of which opened since he took office in 2010.

Lantigua's wife has served on the Licensing Commission that controls which establishments can sell alcohol; police say that Lantigua regularly frequents downtown clubs such as Centro.

"They want to know about those places," the person said, speaking on condition of anonymity. "There are a lot of questions," ended The Globe.

"This information is totally false. My record has been more than investigated. I don't know what else I can explain. Sometimes I think I'm wasting my time," expressed Lantigua.

Lantigua responds, this time in Spanish, to the charges printed by The Globe:

1 There is no control over which companies get towing business from the city. The city has no contract with any of the four companies that have been operating within the city since the day of the former administration.

2 Which companies are permitted to operate taxicabs? Lantigua said that he has not talked to any taxi cab companies and no new company has been formed, except for the merger of two companies to become one. He said that Melix Bonilla has been in charge of organizing the taxi cabs long before he was elected mayor. "Taxi cabs companies are authorized by both, the Lawrence Police and the City Council not the mayor," said Lantigua.

3 "The Globe questions my financial connections with establishments that sell alcohol as Centro Night Club, since my wife serves on the Licensing Commission," said Lantigua. "When I ran for mayor, I said: If I have to change my life style, don't elect me! I like to dance to Bachata that is why I go to night clubs and with respect to Mayra Lantigua, she was appointed to that board by former Mayor Sullivan.
