Don Luis Bonilla (1920-2013)

Nuestro querido Don Luis Bonilla, falleció la noche del miércoles 6 de marzo, rodeado de familiares y amigos.

Don Luis Bonilla, más conocido como "El Muñequito de Oro", nació el día 19 de junio de 1920 en el pueblo de Aibonito, Puerto Rico. A la edad de un año, sus padres, Doña Vicenta González y Ramón Bonilla mudaron a la familia al pueblo de Caguas, donde Don Luis creció.

Desde temprana edad, Bonilla mostró interés por la música y a los 12 años ya asistía a una estación de radio conocida como "La Güira", cuando esta producía un programa titulado "Buscando Estrellas".

Don Luis comenzó a cantar a través de las emisoras radiales WVJP y WNEL con el grupo Rítmico Cagüeño, donde hacía la segunda voz. Ya Don Luis hacía alarde de su talento en las Parrandas de diferentes pueblos, tales como Gurabo, Yabucoa, Humacao, Cayey, Aguas Buenas, San Lorenzo, etc.

A la temprana edad de 24 años, Bonilla contrajo nupcias con Doña Francisca Rodríguez y tuvieron tres hijas. Bonilla llegó a la Ciudad de New York con su familia, donde se desempeñó en distintas actividades y no fue hasta el año 1979 que llegó a la Ciudad de Lawrence, donde abrió una dulcería en la calle Park.

Don Luis tenía una personalidad alegre, gustaba de hablar y compartir con las personas y siempre fue un amante de la música puertorriqueña. No nos sorprende que por estos últimos años haya convertido con el amor y el carisma que lo caracterizaba, el programa radial Así Canta Puerto Rico como su compromiso primordial con la comunidad.

Don Luis deja un inmenso vacío en la comunidad, sobre todo en María Ortiz y Luis David Hiraldo, que con él compartían el programa Así Canta Puerto Rico cada domingo.

No llenemos ese vacío con lágrimas por la pérdida, sino con alegres canciones y una plegaria de agradecimiento al Todo Poderoso por habernos concedido la dicha de tenerlo entre nosotros.

Our beloved Don Luis Bonilla, died Wednesday evening, March 6, surrounded by family and friends.

Don Luis Bonilla, better known as "The Golden Little Doll", was born on June 19, 1920 in the town of Aibonito, Puerto Rico. At the age of one year, his parents, Doña Vicenta Gonzalez and Ramon Bonilla family moved to the town of Caguas, where Don Luis grew up.

From an early age, Bonilla showed his interest in music and by the time he was 12, he was a regular at a radio station known as "La Güira", producing a program entitled "Stars Search".

Don Luis began singing at radio stations WNEL and WVJP with the group Rítmico Cagüeño, where he was the second voice. Don Luis already flaunted his talent thru Parrandas around different towns, such as Gurabo, Yabucoa, Humacao, Cayey, Aguas Buenas, San Lorenzo, etc.

At the young age of 24, he married Doña Francisca Rodríguez and had three daughters. Bonilla came to New York City with his family , where he served in various activities and it was not until 1979 that he came to the City of Lawrence, where he opened a candy store on Park Street.


Don Luis had a cheerful personality, liked to talk and share with people and was always a lover of Puerto Rican music. No wonder that in recent years he turned all the love and charisma that characterized it, over the radio program Asi Canta Puerto Rico as his primary commitment to the community.

Don Luis has left a huge void in the community, especially in Maria Ortiz and Luis David Hiraldo, with whom he shared the radio show every Sunday.

Do not fill these gaps with tears for the loss, but with lively songs and a prayer of thanks to the Almighty for giving us the joy to have him around.

“Dictators at Lunch”

SNHU will present the stage reading of the two-act drama entitled “Dictators at Lunch” by Professor Charles Wilbert on Thursday, March 14 at 7:00 p.m. at Walker Auditorium in Robert Frost Hall.

“Dictators at Lunch” centers on Juan Peron the Second on the verge of leaving Madrid, Spain, in April 1993, and flying to Buenos Aires to become South America’s newest dictator. A tiny political band in Madrid, however, is determined to stop the impostor. An intense game of cat and mouse quickly develops between the highly elusive Peron and Dr. Pedro Ortiz – leader of SNAP, the movement to eliminate dictators in the world.

“The drama is steeped in cloak and dagger, shadowy gunmen, potent vials, a Gothic setting, accidental American tourists, and boundless lust,” said Wilbert. “But beneath the theatrical intrigue lies the need of the world to eliminate the contemporary dictator – one who can, and usually does, command a massive military arsenal.”

A total of sixteen characters comprise the cast of “Dictators” with most of the parts being read by Wilbert’s colleagues in the School of Arts and Sciences at SNHU. Three members of the SNHU Drama Club will also read.

Charles Wilbert has taught at SNHU for over 40 years. Wilbert is an English professor and playwright-in-residence, specializing in playwriting and dramatic literature. He studied playwriting in New York City at the HB Studio and at the Roger Hendricks Simon Studio.

Wilbert has written over 20 plays, nearly all of them tested by a stage production at Southern New Hampshire University. A number of his dramas deal with historic figures such as Henry David Thoreau, Robert Falcon Scott, Gertrude Stein, Maxwell Bodenheim, and Thornton Wilder.

Las elecciones para la alcaldía de Lawrence - Parte I

¿Será fácil derrotar a William Lantigua?

El 5 de noviembre del presente año serán las elecciones para elegir al alcalde, al concejo, y al comité escolar de la ciudad de Lawrence, Massachusetts. El primero en postularse es el alcalde William Lantigua que aspira a su reelección. Y el primero en desafiarlo es el concejal Danny Rivera. Usualmente, en una campaña de reelección no participan muchos aspirantes, pero se espera que al menos dos más se sumen a la contienda; y si la justicia federal acusa formalmente al alcalde antes del mes de mayo, quizás otros más se atrevan a desafiarlo.

Muchos creen que estas elecciones serán una de las más reñidas en toda la historia de Lawrence. Las controversias y la mala imagen pública creada por los errores y poco tacto político del titular, probablemente polarizará la ciudad entre los que quieren darle cuatro años más, y los que harán todo lo que esté a su alcance para impedirlo.

En Lawrence, a los políticos latinos de la primera generación, como ocurrió con otras inmigraciones anteriores, se le ha facilitado obtener sus éxitos políticos porque han encontrado un electorado recién llegado, que desconoce la cultura política de los Estados Unidos; y que además, carece de la experiencia e información para identificar realmente a los políticos por sus altos estándares éticos, por las soluciones que proponen y por sus prácticas políticas, y no por lo que simulan.

De todos, William es quien mejor ha sabido aprovechar la realidad de Lawrence, por eso algunos lo consideran el más hábil, aunque su formación política haya sido empírica. Él conoce la idiosincrasia y límites de su comunidad, sabe lo que tiene que decirle y lo que tiene que hacer. Además, dedica tiempo para visitar los bares, bodegas, y otros sitios frecuentados por latinos, que son la mayoría de los votantes de la ciudad.

La maquinaria electoral del alcalde nunca ha parado de trabajar. Cuenta con el apoyo de varios comunicadores en la radio en español que trabajan para el ayuntamiento o que se identifican con su administración. Tenemos informaciones de que en algunas bodegas están inscribiendo nuevos votantes, bajo el argumento de "que tenemos que apoyar al dominicano que los gringos quieren sacar".

Pese a William tener tantos obstáculos en su contra, no será tan fácil derrotarlo como algunos piensan. Lo peor que pueden hacer sus contrincantes es subestimarlo. Y si la pasión por sacarlo los lleva al fanatismo, podrían cometer muchos errores que el titular aprovecharía a su favor. Tres errores graves en que podrían incurrir los retadores:

- 1) convertir la necesidad de sacarlo en algo personal, demostrando desesperación y usando ataques que no tengan como referencia las grandes soluciones para el futuro de la ciudad;
- 2) creer que la percepción que tienen de William, es la misma que tienen todos los latinos; y
- 3) no ser capaces de crear una gran coalición para derrotarlo, no meramente de líderes, sino de los diferentes grupos étnicos que habitan en la ciudad.

Los adversarios de Lantigua, para poder vencerlo, deberían tomar en cuenta lo siguiente:

- 1) Él es un trabajador político incansable, que dará el todo por el todo para ganar estas elecciones ya que no tiene nada que perder;
- 2) Comprende perfectamente la importancia del dominio del padrón electoral y cómo utilizarlo, no sólo para conectarse con los votantes, sino para sacarlos a votar;
- 3) Tiene coraje para el accionar político, pues no le tiene miedo a los riesgos, ni a equivocarse;
- 4) Toma las decisiones sin titubear, a sabiendas de que no todos van a estar de acuerdo, pues esa es la lógica de la política;
- 5) En una campaña electoral, cuando se ve en situaciones difíciles responde con todo lo que tiene, pues al fin y al cabo, el objetivo para él es ganar, sin importar el cómo lograrlo;
- 6) Sus adversarios tienen que trabajar para ganar, ya que si perdieran y William lo tomara a lo personal por las razones que fueren, no esperen de él misericordia, cuando traten de aspirar para otras posiciones;
- 7) Utiliza algunas de las artimañas de los políticos tradicionales dominicanos, ejemplo el clientelismo político;
- 8) Tiene a su favor el poder que le confiere su condición de titular.

Una debilidad de algunos opositores a Lantigua es que no le reconocen nada positivo. Todo es tiniebla con respecto a él. Si quieren tener credibilidad deben tratar de ser objetivos en sus evaluaciones. Decía Juan Pablo Duarte, el padre de la patria dominicana, "¡Sed justo lo primero, si queréis ser felices!"

Veamos este ejemplo: Algunos reconocen que los representantes estatales son los que traen el dinero para que arreglen las calles. Sí, pero es el alcalde quien las arregla. A los que se la han arreglado están agradecidos del alcalde, por ende, no sirve de nada discutir con ellos, aún si la suya no haya sido reparada en más de veinte años.

Algunos latinos nos han señalado, que valga la aclaración no simpatizan con el alcalde, que sienten ahora una mejor atmósfera cuando visitan el ayuntamiento, y que no se sienten intimidados como antes, cuando se encuentran con un policía. A lo mejor es una percepción, pero se convierte en la realidad de quienes así lo interpretan. Y esos son los elementos a tomar en cuenta por la oposición si quiere ser efectiva.

La percepción que tienen muchos adversarios sobre William es que: No es un líder moderno y que su estilo de gobernar es verticalista. Lo perciben como egocéntrico, incluso como un megalómano con ansias de reconocimientos. Consideran que su arrogancia y falta de diplomacia le han afectado bastante en su desempeño como alcalde.

Sin embargo, todas esas consideraciones son subjetivas en una campaña política. ¿Lo perciben así todos los votantes? ¡Por supuesto que no! De ahí que, esa valoración que tienen sobre William le podría ayudar con algunos, pero no con todos. Con relación a la investigación federal contra el alcalde, hemos escuchado de algunos de sus seguidores decir que ya que no han podido

acusarlo oficialmente tendrán que recurrir a tácticas sucias. Previendo esa posibilidad, los seguidores del titular, como no se duermen en sus laureles, han comenzado ya a contrarrestar los posibles efectos señalando que esa es una campaña sucia en contra del alcalde por ser dominicano. Si lo llegaran a acusar formalmente, sus adversarios tendrían que hilar muy fino y no hacer leña del árbol caído, porque podrían convertir a William en una víctima del sistema, ante los ojos de muchos latinos.

Los aspirantes tienen un gran reto por delante. No es tan simple como parece. Si quieren ganar la contienda no pueden creer que su percepción, sea la misma que tienen todos los lawrencianos sobre el alcalde, porque no es así. Tampoco deben actuar en el terreno de William, porque ahí perderían. Tienen que salirse de las cuerdas en el argot boxístico, y obligarlo a que pelee en el territorio de ustedes. Eso sólo se logra con un mensaje correcto y propositivo, en el contacto directo con los votantes.

En nuestro próximo artículo de la serie continuaremos con las luces y sombras de William Lantigua, y nos preguntaremos: ¿Deberían los votantes de Lawrence darle cuatro años más?

The first candidate to announce his candidacy is William Lantigua, for re-election as Mayor. The first to challenge him is City Councilor at-Large Daniel Rivera. Usually, in a campaign for re-election, there aren't many candidates. It is anticipated that at least two other candidates will enter the race. Furthermore, if the Justice Department formally indicts the current Mayor before the month of May, there may be several more candidates considering running.

Many believe that this election will be one of the most hard-fought in the history of the City of Lawrence. The controversies generated and the bad public image created by the mistakes and political tactlessness of

HypnoBirthing classes are currently being taught in Haverhill

Imagine relaxation while giving birth. Disregard for a minute the pain, stress and anxiety that normally follows it; the screaming and tears. Instead, picture the smooth and easy delivery of a new born baby, smiling, perhaps even laughing in excitement of a new life ready to start in those palms. Such a thing may sound inconceivable, but thanks to HypnoBirthing, it is possible.

Lori Ratchin, a certified Hypnotherapist who has supported over 80 women in HypnoBirthing, reaffirms the effectiveness of the technique: "It's very effective. It depends on one's commitment and one's willingness to practice. A little open mindfulness is very helpful. Because it's all in the mind—the business is in the mind. It's all in the mind. The mind is in charge and the body follows," said Ratchin.

According to The Mongan Method, developed by Maria Mongan, a pioneer, HypnoBirthing is a unique method of relaxed, natural childbirth education, enhanced by self-hypnosis techniques. It is comfortable birthing realized through deep relaxation and freedom from fear. Couples taking HypnoBirthing learn how to achieve profound relaxation together. Moreover, there's even a vocabulary associated with HypnoBirthing that teaches to reject references to difficulty during childbirth, replacing words like "contraction" and "pain," with terms such as "surge" and

"sensation" instead. It does not promote itself as pain free, but says it could reduce discomfort.

"It's like a self-hypnosis," said Joyce Poplar, a prenatal educator who teaches at Cleveland Clinic's Hillcrest Hospital. "They're in a deep, relaxed, limp state. Every single woman is imagining something different -- whether it's a place in their mind, an outdoor place such as a beach scene. It's feeling it, being aware of it and having a sensory perception on that beach scene, smelling the salt in the air, hearing the seagulls. They're completely there in a trance-like state."

Although its popularity has increased in recent times through word of mouth among pregnant moms and actresses such as Jessica Alba, Tiffani Thiessen, and model Miranda Kerr, Mongan is highly credited to modernizing and maintaining HypnoBirthing today. An award-winning hypnotherapist, Mongan is a former college dean who, early in her career, was named one of five outstanding educational leaders in New Hampshire, and was awarded a Ford Foundation Fellowship to Harvard University. Mongan holds several awards for distinguished service and achievement in the practice of hypnosis. In 2000 she was presented with the coveted NGH Charles Tebbetts Award for her contribution in advancing the awareness of hypnosis. In 2005 she became the first woman ever to receive the highest award given by the National Guild—Rexford L. North Award.

Mongan is said to have drawn her inspiration from English obstetrician Grantly Dick-Read and French obstetrician Michel Odent, both of whom first introduced the idea of using hypnotherapy for childbirth in the 1930's.

According to Mongan, it is physically impossible for the body to be relaxed in fight-or-flight mode. By replacing fear with relaxation, a different set of chemicals come into play: oxytocin, labor hormones called prostaglandins, and endorphins combine to relax the muscles and create a sense of comfort. WebMd, an online source of trustworthy information related to health, emphasizes on fear, explaining how it further incites pain during childbirth: "Fear during labor activates our primal fight-or-flight mechanism, causing stresshormones called catecholamines to slow down digestion, make the heart speed up, force blood to the arms and legs, and ultimately deplete blood flow to the uterus, creating uterine pain and hindering the labor process."

Research examining the benefits of hypnobirthing is few and far in between. A 2004 research review found insufficient evidence to show that the technique is effective. A 2006 research review, however, found that hypnobirthing reduced the use of pain medication during labor. So really, just how effect is the technique of HypnoBirthing?

From 2005 to 2010, only 23 percent of HypnoBirthing mothers bringing vaginally had epidural anesthesia, compared to the

national average of 71 percent. In a similar report received by the HypnoBirthing Institute, in which parents expressing their satisfaction with the birthing experience, 500 women wrote responses to the question "Apart from meeting your new baby, what was the best thing about your experience of giving birth?" The answers most often mentioned feeling powerful, competent, having their partner very involved and supportive, and very often included comments about the ease and comfort of labor and birthing. 77% said they would definitely use HypnoBirthing again and 19% said they may or may not. 87% said they would recommend HypnoBirthing to others.

HypnoBirthing classes are currently being taught in Haverhill (Bradford). Classes are Mondays from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. They cover what to expect during labor and birth, how fear affects labor, and how to prepare for your birth preferences. Fee includes textbook, two audio practice CDs, and handouts.

The classes, which are once a week for four weeks, are taught by Kim Bradlee, who is certified by the Hypnobirthing Institute. She is also a birth doula, and has been a homebirth midwife for over 10 years. Private and group classes are also available. Next classes will be: February 25, March 4 and 11. En consecuencia, puede decirse que el comunismo supuso un error mayúsculo conceptual y pragmático que tantos dolores y muertos causó cuando estuvo vigente, mientras que su hermano ideológico, el nazismo no fue un error sino una concepción vamos a llamarla infernal, que tuvo como consecuencia, entre otras, la extinción horrible con procedimientos crueles, de una parte importante de la humanidad, como era y es el pueblo judío.

El alcalde anuncia Proyecto de Mejoras de la Granja Tattersall

El Alcalde James J. Fiorentini anunció el proyecto de mejora de la Granja de Tattersall. La granja ubicada en 542 North Broadway en Haverhill era propiedad y operado por la familia de Tattersall cuando compró la propiedad en 1898. En 1999, Alice Tattersall querido de la familia 150 hectáreas agrícolas a la ciudad de Haverhill, la imposición de conservación específicos y abiertos restricciones preservación de espacios para mantener la granja de Tattersall y garantizar que se preserva y mantiene en lo más cercano a su estado actual y el estado durante años por venir.

La ciudad es requerida por la concesión para distribuir el costo total del proyecto de \$572,000, pero va a ser un reembolso de \$388,960 (68%) a través de la adquisición

de Parkland y renovaciones para las Comunidades Grant (PARC Grant) a través de la Mancomunidad de Massachusetts, el Tattersall Charitable Trust rembolsar a la Ciudad \$50,000 y la Ciudad pagará \$50,000 y el resto se pagó por la ejecución de obras públicas, de agua y de las divisiones de aguas residuales.

Mayor Announces Tattersall Farm Improvement Project

Mayor James J. Fiorentini announced the improvement project of the Tattersall Farm. The Farm located at 542 North Broadway in Haverhill was owned and operated by the Tattersall Family when they purchased the property in 1898. In 1999, Alice Tattersall willed the family's 150 acre farm to the City of Haverhill, imposing specific conservation and open space preservation restrictions to maintain the Tattersall Farm and ensure that it would be preserved and maintained in as close to its present state and condition for years to come.

This project will build a playground on the Tattersall Farm in a part of the City that has not had one in the past. There will be a playscape with a water component, an outdoor learning area, improved and expanded trails with educational signage added to the property. Additionally, the infrastructure will be improved with additional water supplies and expanded parking. This shared endeavor will enhance the facility with improved public access and usage through a community garden program. The goal of the restoration is to increase the available space on the Farm and to adequately provide for the public's agricultural utilization. The project will also allow for hosting major events, activities and educational programming.

The City of Haverhill and the Tattersall Farm Charitable Trust are committed to developing a range of partnerships to develop Tattersall as a place which connects the residents of Haverhill to nature, helping children and adults discover the beauty and promise of the living world.

The City is required per the grant to allocate the total cost of the project of

\$572,000, but it will be reimbursed \$388,960 (68%) through the Parkland Acquisition and Renovations for Communities Grant (PARC Grant) through the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, The Tattersall Charitable Trust reimburse the City \$50,000 and the City will pay \$50,000 with the remainder being paid for by Public Works, Water and Wastewater Divisions.

Mayor Fiorentini stated: "I want to thank the Patrick-Murray Administration and Secretary Richard Sullivan at the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs for offering a grant to cities to share in the cost to support the preservation and restoration of urban parks through the Parkland Acquisition and Renovations for Communities. Without the continued support of State Representative Brian Dempsey and State Senator Kathleen Ives, this project would only be a dream, they have made it a reality. "The residents of our City will be the beneficiaries of the new project and our children will enjoy a new playground to create memories."

Secretary Richard Sullivan stated: "Investing in land conservation and the improvement of public parks is a key priority of the Patrick-Murray Administration, especially in our Gateway Cities, like Haverhill", said Energy and Environmental Affairs Secretary Rick Sullivan. "This project

will not only contribute to the economic well-being of Haverhill, but it will help residents discover what nature has to offer right in their own backyards. It is a perfect example of the strategic investments that the Governor believes we need to make as a Commonwealth in order to help Haverhill grow and be a great place to live, work and play."

NOTES FROM YOUR LIBRARIAN

Hello Rumbo readers. I am excited because we made it to March. Even if the weather has been somewhat less than fantastic, just knowing spring is near works wonders for my morale. In fact, by the time you are reading this there will be only two weeks to the official start of the season.

Alas, of course, there is the negative aspect to this time of year—time to put together the budget for the 2014 fiscal year. Never any fun in the best of circumstance, budget writing in the post 2008 world is a nightmare. There is just not the money to spread around to cover so many things that are important to our communities. Of course the various municipalities count on the state for help and the states, in turn, count on the federal government and the federal government is so deep in debt as to be scary (or it would be scary if I could actually get my head around the numbers—I have no gift for mathematics and I think this is a situation where ignorance is, if not bliss, at least advantageous).

Each year around this time I feel it is my duty to remind people of the scope of services available through the library and to insist on the necessity of a public library to the well-being of a community, especially a community like Lawrence. It has become a bit of a cliché in the library world to talk about the internet and Google rendering libraries obsolete. The truth is that libraries and technology enhance one another. I have always been a library user. I don't think our parents and teachers could have persuaded any of us to ever leave the building!

Various complications with the setup of the city's network caused problems for us in the past as did personnel issues within the IT department when the network was first set up. I really want to thank Rob Harhan from IT for all the work he put into getting the wireless access available. Every time I see one city department helping out another it makes me happy. Rob really put in yeoman's work to get this set up for us and it is certainly not as if he had nothing else to do. I hope everyone comes down here to try it out. By the way, you will log in using your library card number. If you don't have a card be sure to get one.

I almost forgot to mention we have a new person on our staff. Miguelina Medina-Lopez is our latest hire. She started a couple of weeks ago and is already doing a lovely job and fitting in. Come by and say hello. See you at the library.

The residence, currently expanding to 21 private patient suites is located at 360 North Avenue in Haverhill. Each patient suite includes a private dressing area and bathroom, a family sitting area, sleeper-sofa for overnight guests, and private patio with views to surrounding nature. The suites are also equipped with a microwave,



refrigerator, flat screen TV, and CD/DVD player.

Common areas include a sanctuary, indoor and outdoor dining areas, libraries, living rooms and common gathering areas, play area for visiting children, spa/massage water therapy treatment room and gardens and walkways. A remembrance walkway wraps around the house and individuals can make a donation for a brick in memory of a loved one.

The hospice house is staffed with specially trained nurses who provide 24 hour care in collaboration with a team of physicians, aides, social workers, chaplains and volunteers.



THIS IS A PAID AD INSURANCE FRAUD



When we think of insurance fraud we usually think of staged accidents with phony injuries. Insurance companies think of "premium" fraud when they think fraud.

Premium fraud is when a person buys insurance but does not tell the complete truth on the application to try to lower their cost. Fraud does not pay!

AUTO

Fraud is not telling that your child has a license when buying car insurance because you don't want your rate to change. The state says you must add your child to your policy within 60 days of them obtaining a license. Fraud is not listing a spouse or family member because they have points on their license but they will drive the car. Fraud is saying that you live in a different city so your rate is less. Fraud is anyone lying to the company after a claim. If an unlisted operator has an accident (even if it's not their fault) your company can refuse to pay collision damage to your car, they can lower Property Damage to \$5,000 and lower the Optional Coverages if they pay a claim. Fraud is reporting your car stolen when it isn't. 85% of fraud is done by owners. Don't resort to fraud to help anyone.

Fraud is not admitting there is existing damage or that your company has issued a cancellation notice. Fraud is having a home based business and telling your company there isn't one. Fraud is adding an apartment without telling your company. If you lie, you can be cancelled for fraud.



the incumbent will probably polarize the city into those who will want four more years of the same, and those who will do everything possible to block a Lantigua victory.

The first generation of Latino politicians in Lawrence, as has occurred with other first generation immigrants, has had political success. This success was facilitated by a new electorate that is not completely aware of the political culture of the United States. In addition, this electorate lacks the experience and information to really understand and identify the politicians who offer sound solutions and who have high ethical standards. The new immigrant electorate is sometimes drawn to politicians who manipulate the public.

Of all the politicians in Lawrence, it is William Lantigua who has most taken advantage of this reality in Lawrence, and that is why some consider him the most skillful, even if he lacks a strong foundation in political science/governing. He recognizes the idiosyncrasies and the limits of his largely Latino community. He knows what he needs to preach to them. He knows what they want to hear and he knows what he has to do to be heard. He also dedicates his time to visiting the bars, bodegas, and other places frequented by the Latinos who make up the majority of voters in the city.

The political machine of the Mayor has never stopped working. He counts on the support of various Spanish radio personalities that he has hired to work for

the city, or who identify themselves with his administration. We are aware that in various bodegas they are registering new voters with the message that we have to vote for this Dominican Mayor because the "gringos have prejudiciously targeted him and want him out."

Even with so many mistakes and criticisms against the incumbent, it will not be easy to beat him as some might think. The worst thing his challengers can do is to underestimate him. Furthermore, if they give in to their personal passion to defeat him and become fanatics, they could make many errors that the Mayor could take advantage of. Three grave mistakes that his opponents can make are:

- 1) to make the need to defeat him into something personal, thereby showing desperation and attacking him on issues that are irrelevant to the greater good of the city;
- 2) to believe that the perception they have about William is uniformly shared by the entire Latino community;
- 3) and not putting together a large coalition to defeat him, including community leaders and voters from every ethnic group living in the city.

IN ORDER TO DEFEAT HIM, LANTIGUA'S OPPONENTS should consider the following:

- 1) he is a tireless political worker who will give it his all to win, knowing he has nothing to lose;
- 2) he understands perfectly well the

importance of knowing at least a certain section of the electorate and how to best utilize them, not only to connect with them, but also to get out their vote;

- 3) he has the courage to take political actions; he is not afraid to take risks or to make mistakes;
- 4) he makes decisions without hesitation, knowing that not everyone will be in favor of his decisions and knowing that this is part of the logic behind much politics;
- 5) he will use, in an election campaign when he is confronted with difficult situations or challenges, whatever method or means possible to win;
- 6) he will not consider "reaching out" to the losers if they consider running for any other political office because he will in all likelihood take their opposition personally;
- 7) he will utilize some of the tricks of traditional Dominican politicians that are used in his native country, including political patronage, rewarding those who support him with political favors;
- 8) he has the advantage of running as the incumbent.

One of the weaknesses of some of his opponents is the failure of recognizing anything positive about Lantigua. They interpret him as a constant "dark cloud" or sore eye for the city. If his opponents want any credibility they have to be objective in evaluating the Mayor. Quoting the person recognized as the "father of the Dominican Republic," Juan Pablo Duarte, "one must be judge fairly first, if you want to be happy"!

For example, people credit their State Representatives with bringing into the City of Lawrence the funds to fix the streets. Yes, but is the Mayor who does the job. For those people who have had their streets fixed, they are grateful to the Mayor. There is no use arguing with them even if you have not had your streets fixed in over twenty years!

Some Latinos aren't necessarily supporters of the Mayor but they feel, now that there is a Latino in office, that there is a better atmosphere when they visit City Hall. Similarly, perhaps they don't feel as intimidated as before when they used to encounter a police officer. It's probably just a perception from having a Latino Mayor but it's treated as reality and it's of little use for the opposition to argue against it if they are going to be effective.

The perception that many in the opposition have of William is that they believe that he is not a modern leader and that his approach to administration is top down (my way or no way). They see him as being egocentric, even a megalomaniac who craves constant recognition. They think that his arrogance and lack of diplomacy have hurt him in his role as Mayor.

However, all of the aforementioned characteristics that have been ascribed to him are subjective in a political election campaign. Do all the voters perceive him the same way? Of course not! This interpretation about Lantigua might help them with some voters, but not all. Regarding the federal investigation now underway against him, we hear some of his followers say that since they have not been able to officially indict him they will have to resort to "dirty tactics." Anticipating this as a possibility, Lantigua's followers are not resting on their laurels. They have already started preemptively countering these suspicions by putting out a message that the federal investigation is just a dirty campaign against a Dominican. If it does happen that he is officially indicted, his challengers must be forbearing and let the justice system do its job because Lantigua may end up being perceived as a victim of the system.

His challengers have a huge feat ahead of them. It is by no means simple. If they are going to defeat William, they cannot believe that everyone has the same perception of Lantigua in Lawrence. He has his diehard supporters. They also cannot plan on fighting a campaign in the same boxing ring that Lantigua uses because they would surely lose. Lantigua's challengers must come out from the ropes of his boxing ring and fight their own fight. If his challengers are going to succeed in defeating William, their fight has to be based on a just and honest message with a clear intent and purpose, and bring that message directly to every voter.

In our next article of this series, we will continue to examine William Lantigua's challenges and concerns, and ask ourselves: Is there any reason why the voters of Lawrence should give him four more years?
