Hombres unen fuerzas para prevenir la violencia contra la mujer

La violencia contra la mujer es un problema grande de la salud pública - y los hombres desempeñan un papel muy significativo en su prevención. El 7 de marzo en la Casa Estatal, hombres y adolescentes de todo el Estado se reunieron para participar en el Día de la Cinta Blanca de Massachusetts 2013. El evento proveyó una oportunidad para los hombres demostrar lo importante que es para ellos afrontar la violencia contra las mujeres, así como ser parte de su prevención.

Los hechos están claros. Un nuevo estudio conducido por los Centros para el Control y Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC, por sus siglas en inglés) reveló que:

- * Las mujeres experimentaron altas tasas de violencia por parte de sus parejas, violaciones, acechos, y a largo plazo, enfermedades crónicas y otros problemas de salud tales como trastorno por estrés postraumático (TEPT).

- * La mayoría de las violaciones y actos violentos a manos de la pareja se llevan a cabo por primera vez antes de los 24 años, destacando la importancia de prevenir la violencia antes de que ocurra y asegurar que todas las personas puedan vivir la vida a su máximo potencial.

- * Los esfuerzos de prevención deben comenzar temprano con la promoción de relaciones saludables y respetuosas, afrontando las creencias, actitudes y los mensajes erróneos que crean un ambiente que tolera la violencia sexual.

Es por dichas razones que la Campaña de la Cinta Blanca de Massachusetts tiene las siguientes metas:

- * Cambiar las actitudes sociales y las creencias que perpetúan y crean excusas para la violencia contra la mujer.

¡Aleluya, tenemos Papa!

El 2013 no marcó el fin del mundo, como creímos que el calendario azteca predecía, sino que nos trajo una noticia inesperada, especialmente para millones de católicos latinoamericanos.

En primer lugar, nos trajo la dimisión por propia decisión de un Papa desde 1294, Benedicto XVI debido a problemas de salud y, en segundo lugar, el anuncio de que un Cardenal argentino es nuestro nuevo Pontífice.

El Cardenal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, de 76 años, ha sido elegido por sus pares como el nuevo Papa, convirtiéndose en el primer pontífice de las Américas. Conocido por su humildad, ha elegido ser conocido como el Papa Francisco I en honor a San Francisco de Asís.

Bergoglio a menudo utilizaba el autobús para ir al trabajo en lugar de una limusina con chófer al que tenía derecho, cocinaba sus propias comidas y está comprometido con la justicia social. Él considera que el negocio esencial de la iglesia es la proyección social, en vez de batallas doctrinales.

Francisco I, el pontífice número 266 de la Iglesia Católica Romana es también el primer no europeo líder de la iglesia en más de 1,000 años.

En sus primeras palabras a la audiencia reunida en la Plaza de San Pedro dijo que estaba feliz de ser un obispo en Roma, pero los cardenales allí fueron al fin del mundo para encontrar un Papa. Pidió a la gente a orar por él.

Para algunos argentinos, el tener un Papa argentino es como ganar el Mundial de Fútbol. ¡Eso nos ayuda a medir su aceptación!

Para los católicos de todo el mundo Francisco I representa la esperanza. Él ha expresado su oposición al aborto, los matrimonios entre homosexuales y la adopción entre miembros del mismo sexo, tres asuntos al que muchos latinos han mostrado oposición, además del abuso sexual por parte de sacerdotes y la forma en que esto se manejado por Roma.

Siendo argentino, donde en 1994 hubo alegaciones de abuso sexual en 47 jóvenes seminaristas lo hace conocedor de la situación mundial.

Dios bendiga al nuevo Papa y lo guie para que logre la unidad tan necesaria dentro de la iglesia y sobre todo justicia para las víctimas de los depredadores.

Hallelujah, we have a Pope!

2013 did not mark the end of the world, as the Aztec Calendar predicted; instead it brought us unexpected news, especially for millions of Latin American Catholics.

First, it brought us the resignation by choice of a Pope since 1294, Benedict XVI due to health issues and second, the announcement that a Cardinal from Argentina is our new Pontiff.

Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, 76, has been elected by his peers as the new pope, becoming the first pontiff from the Americas. For his known humility, he has chosen to be known as Pope Francis I after St. Francis of Assisi.

Bergoglio often rode the bus to work instead of a chauffeur-driven limousine he was entitled to, cooked his own meals and is committed to social justice. He considers social outreach, rather than doctrinal battles, to be the essential business of the church.

Francis I, the 266th pontiff of the Roman Catholic Church is also the first non-European leader of the church in more than 1,000 years.

In his first words to the audience gathered St. Peter's Plaza he said he was happy to be a bishop in Rome, but the cardinals there went to the end of the world to find a Pope. He asked the people to pray for him.

For some Argentineans, having an Argentinean Pope is like winning the Soccer World Cup. That helps to measure his acceptance!


For Catholics all over the world Pope Francis I represents hope. He has expressed opposition to abortion, gay marriages and adoption amongst parents of the same gender, three issues to which many Latinos have shown opposition, in addition to the sexual abuse by priests and the way they were handled by Rome.

Being from Argentina, where in 1994 allegations of sexual abuse on 47 young seminarians surfaced makes him aware of the world situation.

God bless the new pope and guide him to bring the unity so much needed within the church and above all, justice for the victims of the predators.

Evite a los estafadores post-desastres

 ¿Alguna vez encendió la luz de un sótano oscuro y se estremeció al ver cucarachas escabullirse por los rincones? Yo sientolamismarepulsión cuando escucho acerca de estafadores inescrupulosos que se aprovechan de las víctimas de desastres naturales y provocados por el hombre.

La Better Business Bureau, la agencia para mejores prácticas empresariales, ha apodado a estas cucarachas humanas "cazadores de tormentas", porque aparecen de la nada después de cada tormenta o desastre significativo. De hecho, debido a que el fraude se esparció tanto después del huracán Katrina, el Departamento de Justicia creó el National Center for Disaster Fraud (Centro Nacional Contra Fraudes de Desastre), un centro de información para más de 20 agencias federales donde la gente puede denunciar sospechas de actividades fraudulentas vinculadas a desastres de toda clase.

Una estafa común se da cuando supuestos obreros de reparaciones aparecen en los vecindarios afectados, para engañar a los propietarios extenuados. Su discurso típico es: "Estamos realmente saturados pero si realiza un depósito en efectivo podemos hacer lugar en nuestra ocupada agenda". También tienden a asustar a la gente para que crea que su vivienda es peligrosa e insegura y a veces provocan daños durante su "inspección".

A menudo, estos "cazadores de tormentas" simplemente toman el dinero y huyen. O si regresan para hacer las reparaciones, su trabajo o los materiales son de mala calidad. Esto podría comprometerlo financieramente debido a que probablemente su seguro de vivienda no cubrirá reparaciones no autorizadas o fraudulentas.

A continuación, algunos consejos de la Better Business Bureau para evitar ser víctima de un cazador de tormentas.

- Consulte a su compañía de seguro para saber qué cubre su póliza y qué debe presentar específicamente. Solicite también que vengan a inspeccionar los daños y vea si cuentan con contratistas aprobados.
- Nunca contrate a un obrero o contratista en el acto. Obtenga al menos

tres presupuestos en base a las mismas especificaciones y materiales. Verifique las referencias, licencias y registros con la National Association of State Contractors Licensing Agencies (Asociación Nacional de Agencias Estatales de Concesión de Licencias de Contratistas - www.nascla.org/licensing_information); también lea las revisiones publicadas por la Better Business Bureau.

- Exija contratos por escrito que especifiquen el trabajo a realizar, los materiales a utilizar, fechas de inicio y finalización, responsabilidad para la remoción de escombros y detalle de los costos de mano de obra y materiales. Verifique que se incluya el nombre, dirección, número de teléfono y número de licencia del contratista, como también todas las promesas y garantías.

- Lea la letra pequeña. Algunos contratos dudosos incluyen cláusulas que permiten importantes tasas por cancelación si decide no contratar al contratista después de que su compañía de seguro haya aprobado el reclamo. Otros exigen que pague todo el costo si cancela después de haber expirado el periodo de cancelación.

- Solicite a su contratista que proporcione un comprobante del seguro vigente que cubra indemnización laboral, daños a la propiedad y responsabilidad personal.

- Es posible que le soliciten pagar un

depósito por adelantado para cubrir los materiales iniciales; entre un cuarto y un tercio es razonable contra entrega de los materiales en su domicilio y una vez que comiencen las obras.

- Nunca pague la totalidad por adelantado y no pague en efectivo. Exija que el contrato especifique un cronograma para liberar los pagos y, antes de realizar el último pago, solicite al contratista que entregue un comprobante que indique que se les pagó a todos los subcontratistas; de no ser así, usted podría ser responsable de pagarles.

Y finalmente, recuerde el dicho: "Si suena muy bien para ser verdad, probablemente no lo es." Si alguien lo presiona con tácticas de venta, exige el pago total por adelantado, solicita que usted consiga los permisos necesarios o le ofrece reducir costos con materiales sobrantes de otro trabajo, huya. Los resultados finales podrían ser desastrosos, encima usted ya pasó un desastre.

Avoiding Post-Disaster Scam Artists

Have you ever turned on the light in a dark basement and shuddered as cockroaches scurried away? I get that same sense of revulsion whenever I hear about unscrupulous swindlers taking advantage of the victims of natural and manmade disasters.

The Better Business Bureau has dubbed these human cockroaches "Storm Chasers" because they creep out of the woodwork after every major storm or disaster. In fact, because fraud was so widespread after Hurricane Katrina, the Department of Justice created the National Center for Disaster Fraud, a central information clearinghouse for more than 20 federal agencies where people can report suspected

fraudulent activities tied to disasters of all types.

One common scam is where supposed repair workers blitz impacted neighborhoods, hoping to ensnare frazzled homeowners. Their typical line is, "We're really slammed but with a cash deposit you can ensure a spot on our busy schedule." Or, they'll scare people into thinking their home is dangerously unsafe, sometimes actually creating damage during their "inspection."

Often, these Storm Chasers just take the money and run. Or, if they do show up and make repairs, their work or materials are shoddy. This could leave you on the hook financially since your homeowners insurance probably won't cover unauthorized or fraudulent repairs.

Here are a few tips from the Better Business Bureau to avoid becoming a Storm Chaser victim:

- Ask your insurance company about what's covered under your policy and specific filing requirements. Also ask them to survey the damage and see whether they have approved contractors.

- Never hire a laborer or contractor on the spot. Get at least three estimates based on the same specifications and materials. Check their references, licensing and registration information with the National Association of State Contractors Licensing Agencies (www.nascla.org/licensing_information); also read reviews posted by the Better Business Bureau.

- Require written contracts that specify

Las pólizas tienen deducibles. Un deducible es la cantidad que debe pagar antes de que la compañía de seguros le pague su reclamo.

Muchas de las pólizas tienen más de un deducible. Un deducible separado puede aplicar a los daños causados por tormentas de viento o granizo.

La cobertura de terremoto también tiene un deducible especial, pero usted debe comprar cobertura de terremoto y pagar más si quiere cobertura de terremoto.

IMPORTANTE SABER

Una póliza de seguro no es un contrato de mantenimiento. Si el techo es viejo usted debe pagar para reemplazarlo. Su compañía de seguros no paga por un techo nuevo si comienza a gotear. Usted debe mantener su propiedad para evitar tener pérdidas y para evitar que su seguro sea cancelado.

Una compañía puede no renovar el seguro si usted presenta un reclamo.

Una empresa puede cancelar o no renovar su póliza si las condiciones o el uso de su edificio cambia.

Si se muda de una casa a otra, debe cambiar el tipo de póliza sobre la vivienda en la que no vive. Si usted sufre una pérdida y tiene el tipo equivocado de seguro puede que no lo paguen por una pérdida.

Van a volver a producir los Twinkies y estoy ansiosa por comerme uno! Es posible que usted desee uno también cuando haya terminado de leer este artículo.

Hace un par de años cambie mi estilo de vida porque tenía que perder un poco de peso y los médicos me habían estado insistiendo que debía hacerlo porque tengo diabetes tipo 2 e hipertensión. En menos de dos meses, perdí 30 libras, mi diabetes bajó a un nivel normal, la presión sanguínea ya no era un problema y mi IMC (Índice de Masa Corporal) pasó de 31.4 a 29.3. Comí comidas saludables varias veces al día bajo el cuidado de Advanced Weight Loss en Andover y comencé un programa de ejercicios en la YMCA. Si alguien sabe los beneficios de salud que el cambio de estilo de vida causa, soy yo.

La obesidad infantil y un IMC alto pueden causar enfermedades cardíacas, diabetes tipo 2, asma y apnea del sueño entre otros graves problemas de salud en la edad adulta.

Desde hace varios años, las escuelas están entrando en la moda de medir el IMC de los niños y asesorar a los padres cuando estiman que sus hijos tienen sobrepeso u obesidad. Puedo apreciar el mensaje que la primera dama Michelle Obama y su campaña Vamos a Movernos están tratando de profundizar en nuestros cerebro. ¡Lo sé! Pero no debería ser el papel del gobierno controlar el peso de nuestros hijos o su


IMC. Además, muchas escuelas siguen ofreciendo donas, helados y máquinas con dulces a los estudiantes.

Antes que fuera insultada por la idea de que las escuelas necesitan meter la nariz en lo que es bonito o no (flaco no equivale a saludable por lo que deben estarse refiriendo a la estética), pensé en el niño que tendrá que traer a casa una carta con un mensaje de este tipo. El daño psicológico al niño podría ser peor que unas cuantas libras, además de exponerlo a él o ella a ser ridiculizado y burlado por sus compañeros.

Además de la mala nutrición, la mayoría de las escuelas han eliminado las clases de educación física y por lo general eso es todo lo que necesitan: a ponerse en movimiento y las libras saldrán solas.

Un buen ejemplo de ello es Sophia Griffin. Ella tenía 12 años cuando se dio cuenta de que 170 lbs era demasiado para ella. Ella tuvo la iniciativa de acudir a Advanced Weight Loss por sí misma y en sólo 9 meses, perdió 40 libras. Ella dice: "¡Nos encanta venir aquí!" La razón es porque Marielle Riendou y su personal animan a los niños a estar sanos y no hermosos. Y cuando una niña de doce años de edad, recibe elogios de sus amigos por su pérdida de peso, tiene que sentirse bien!

Vamos a mantener a las escuelas fuera de los asuntos de la familia.

Mayor Fiorentini has today announced that he will name James Waldron, former Mayor of Haverhill, as this year's Irish person of the Year. This will take place on Monday, March 18th at 9AM at Haverhill City Hall.

James Waldron was Mayor of Haverhill, elected in 1967 as the city's first "strong mayor" under the current form of government. He will be the official "Flag

raiser" raising the Irish Flag in celebration of St. Patrick's day and Irish American Heritage Month.

Mayor Fiorentini will read a proclamation declaring March as "Irish American Heritage Month" and following the flag raising, there will be a short reception in the Mayor's office.

Should schools be involved in your child's weight?

Twinkies are going back into production and I can't wait to have one! You might want one also when you are finished reading this story.

A couple of years ago I changed my lifestyle because I needed to lose some weight and doctors had been advising me to do so because I have Type 2 diabetes and high blood pressure. In less than two months, I lost 30 pounds, my diabetes went to normal levels, my blood pressure was no longer a problem and my BMI (Body Mass Index) went from 31.4 to 29.3. I ate healthy meals several times a day under the care of Advanced Weight Loss in Andover and started an exercise program at the YMCA. If anybody knows the health benefits of that it's me.

Childhood obesity and a high BMI can cause heart disease, Type 2 diabetes, asthma and sleep apnea among other serious health problems in adulthood.

For a few years now, schools are getting into the fashion of measuring children's BMI and advise parents when they estimate their offspring is overweight or obese. I can appreciate the message the First Lady Michelle Obama and her Let's Move Campaign is trying to drill in our brains. I get it! But it should not be the role of the government to control our children's

weight or BMI. Besides, many schools are still offering donuts, ice cream and candy machines to students.

Before I was insulted by the idea that schools need to get their nose into what's beautiful or not (slim does not equal healthy so they must be after aesthetics), I thought of the child having to bring home a letter with such message. The psychological harm to that child could be worse than a few pounds besides exposing him or her to ridicule and taunting from his peers.

Besides poor nutrition, most schools have eliminated physical education classes and usually that's all they need: to get moving and the pounds will roll off.

A good example of that is Sophia Griffin. She was 12 years old when she noticed that 170 lbs. was too much for her. She went to Advanced Weight Loss on her own and in just 9 months, she lost 40 lbs. She says, "We love coming here!" The reason is because Marielle Riendou and her staff encourage kids to become healthy, not beautiful. And when a twelve-year-old gets compliments from her friends on her weight loss, she has to feel great!

Let's keep the schools out of family business.

Profesores del Freedom Trail visitan Escuelas Públicas de Lowell

"¡Langostas, váyanse! ¡Langostas, váyanse!" eran los cánticos que se oían al final del pasillo a medida que los estudiantes de quinto grado de Daley Middle School en Lowell asumieron roles durante el programa del Freedom Trail® Foundation Scholars el martes, 26 de febrero. Presentado por la Asociación de Maestros de Massachusetts, en colaboración con la Fundación del Camino de la Libertad, este programa interactivo ayuda a educar en la historia a los estudiantes en los alrededores de Boston y en todo Massachusetts. Gracias a una dádiva de Eastern Bank, la visita marcará la segunda escuela servida por el Freedom Trail en Lowell y Lawrence.

El programa del Freedom Trail Scholars toma la historia de nuestra nación y la lucha por la libertad en el aula y ha impactado las vidas de más de 13,000 estudiantes. El programa proporciona una clase de una hora compuesta por dos actores que asumen múltiples roles para llevar los acontecimientos más importantes de la Revolución Americana en Boston a la vida. El programa incorpora a los estudiantes en el programa, permitiéndoles interactuar con los artistas, leer las partes de los documentos importantes y declaraciones, y reaccionar a los acontecimientos históricos. Los muchachos tuvieron una sesión de preguntas y respuestas a continuación de cada presentación. Los educadores también tienen acceso a la guía de recursos

Mayor Views Renovations of Home that was on the Top of the List for Turn-Around Abandoned Properties

Mayor James J. Fiorentini toured an abandoned property at 69 5th Avenue, which had been previously highlighted as part of an aggressive series of new measures designed to address neighborhood blight. The Mayor announced that the City's Health Department, Building Department, Inspectional Services Department, Community Development Department and the Haverhill Fire Department had been part of an enhanced Code Team that brought the property to the attention of the Attorney General Martha Coakley's Abandoned Housing Initiative (AHI).

The City working in collaboration with the AHI Team, brought the delinquent owners of this foreclosed property to the Northeast Housing Court. A property receiver, Don Settemoir, was subsequently appointed by the Housing Court to rectify long standing health, safety and building code violations that were the source of frequent neighborhood complaints. Issue addressed included: overgrowth and fallen trees on the property, replacement of broken windows and gutters. The addition of new siding, entryway doors and the replacement of the plumbing and heating systems was

also undertaken. The single family home is almost ready for re-sale as a market rate home.

There is no cost to the City to implement this program, the State covers all of the expenses and the City and the neighborhoods benefit. If you are aware of any homes that should be identified as abandoned properties, please call the City's Health and Inspectional Services Department at 978-374-2325.

Mayor Fiorentini stated: "This initiative not only helped turnaround an abandoned property, it also helped enhance the neighborhood.

"I want to thank Attorney General Martha Coakley's Office for working with us to help clean up these abandoned properties.

"By participating in the Property Receivership program, we are utilizing a tool that will provide for the rehabilitation of these properties without a cost to the City or liability. This leads to better housing and higher property values for the entire neighborhood. These efforts will improve public safety, provide for a cleaner city, and greater tax generation."



Mayor visits seniors at 25 Washington Square



Mayor James J. Fiorentini visited the elderly housing at 25 Washington Square under Haverhill Housing Authority to hear concerns and questions regarding environmental issues and living conditions nearby and inside the downtown area of Haverhill.

Residents addressed ongoing issues taking place, such as noise late at night, as well the lack of entertainment for older people. Mayor Fiorentini fielded further questions from residents about what else could be done to improve the city of Haverhill. Residents suggested more

maintenance outside of stores and streets, benches to sit on for those who need to rest, another super market. The Mayor thanked the residents for the feedback, and assured them that their thoughts and needs will not go unheard.

Mayor Fiorentini stated: "Meeting with residents is important to me as I hear about matters that concern them. Downtown has seen a lot of changes and we will continue to see more. Constituent service is a fundamental part of my being Mayor and I appreciate these residents taking time to come and speak with me."

Consejos del Seguro Social para la temporada de impuestos

Aunque no queremos arruinarle el día a nadie, debe saber que las lluvias en el mes de abril traen consigo mucho más que flores de primavera - también anuncian la llegada de fecha límite para presentar su declaración de impuestos. Así que, no espere hasta que empiece a llover para presentar su declaración de impuestos. Ya sea que usted es un dueño de una pequeña empresa, tiene algún negocio propio o está empleado por alguna empresa, los siguientes consejos de parte del Seguro Social le ayudarán en el proceso.

¿Están sus beneficios de Seguro Social sujetos a impuestos? Los beneficios de Seguro Social están sujetos a impuestos para algunas personas. Cerca de un tercio de las personas que reciben los beneficios de Seguro Social tienen que pagar impuestos. Si el total de sus ingresos, incluyendo los beneficios de Seguro Social, es \$25,000 o más y presenta una declaración de ingresos solo a su nombre, sus beneficios están sujetos a impuestos. (El monto mínimo de ingresos para parejas casadas que presentan sus impuestos en conjunto es de \$32,000.)

¿Recibiré algún formulario para propósitos de impuestos de parte del Seguro Social? Sí. De hecho, ya debió

haberlo recibido. El formulario para el año tributable 2012 se llama Social Security Benefit Statements (formulario SSA-1099) y se le envió por correo general a todos los beneficiarios y debe haberlo recibido a no más tardar del 31 de enero de 2013. Si recibe los beneficios de Seguro Social y todavía no tiene una copia del formulario 1099, puede obtener una copia por Internet en www.segurosocial.gov/1099.

Nuestro primer bebé nació en el 2012. ¿Necesitamos un número de Seguro Social para nuestro bebé? Sí. La gran mayoría de personas solicita el número de Seguro Social de su bebé mientras todavía están en el hospital, usando el mismo formulario que llenan para solicitar la partida de nacimiento. Pero, por si acaso no lo hizo así, necesitará solicitar el número de Seguro Social de su bebé para poder reclamarlo como dependiente en su declaración de impuestos. También necesitará el número de Seguro Social para poder solicitar ciertos beneficios del gobierno para su bebé o su familia. Infórmese mejor acerca

Social security and tax time

April's showers bring more than just May's flowers - they also bring the deadline day for filing taxes. Don't wait until the showers arrive to prepare for tax season. Whether you are a small business owner, a retiree, or a new parent, here are some Social Security tax tips that may help you.

Are Social Security benefits taxable? They are for some people. About one third of those receiving benefits must pay taxes on some of their Social Security. If your total income, including Social Security and all of your other taxable income, is \$25,000 or more and you file federal taxes as an individual, you'll need to pay federal taxes on some of your benefits. (That amount is \$32,000 for married couples filing a joint return.)

Will I get a tax form for my Social Security benefits? Yes. In fact, you should have already received it. Social Security Benefit Statements (Form SSA-1099) for tax year 2012 were mailed to beneficiaries and should have been received by January 31, 2013. If you receive Social Security and haven't received your 1099, you can request one online at www.socialsecurity.gov/1099.

We had our first child in 2012. Does our baby need a Social Security Number?

Yes. Most people apply for their baby's Social Security number while they're still in the hospital at the same time they apply for the birth certificate. But if you didn't, you'll need to apply for your child's Social Security number in order to claim the child as a dependent on your tax return. You'll also need it if you ever apply for government benefits on behalf of the child or your family. Learn more about Social Security cards and numbers at www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber.

I changed my name when I got married last year. Do I need to report it to Social Security? Yes. If you've legally changed your name due to marriage, divorce, court order, or for any other reason, make sure you change your name with Social Security, as well as with your employer. If you change with one source but not the other, it could cause your earnings to be improperly recorded. That could result in you not getting all the benefits you earned when you become eligible for Social Security in the future. The Vine collaborates with area agencies that work with individuals and families who live on the edge to give out advance tickets for the Free Market, which opens an hour early to give those people in need better access to the best items.

"We are open to all, regardless of need. No proof of identity, income, status, anything. We're here to welcome everyone and make sure everyone has access to the items they need or want to help provide a home for themselves and their families."

The Vine started the Free Market last year out of the belief that there is more than enough stuff to go around. The group attests that one of the main reasons for

Free Market's success last year was due mainly to the community atmosphere of Haverhill. For so many people and families in tough places, whenever they try to access services, something is demanded of them—identification, income documentation, proof of citizenship, etc. Melissa argues that with as much stuff as there is to go around—stuff that people don't need, things that people don't use—the free market demands only mindfulness for those less fortunate and gratitude towards what is had and given.

"I really think this is a great idea because it gives people who don't have a lot of things to have something," said Margarita Marte, a Haverhill resident.

Free lunch will be served from 12 PM to 1 PM - soups and breads.

The Free Market accepts donations that range from food all the way to clothes. However, helping can also be achieved by other means. The Vine encourages those who want to help to donate their time, with plenty of opportunities to help, both prior to the event and day of.

I own a small business. Can I report the W-2s of my employees online to Social Security? Yes, and we encourage you to do so at www.socialsecurity.gov/bso. Filing your W-2s electronically is free, fast, and secure! Plus there's an added bonus: when you file electronically, you receive an extra month to file because electronically filed W-2s aren't due until March 31st. You'll also receive an electronic acknowledgement receipt. And when you file electronically, you can print out your W-2s for your employees.

Does Social Security have any advice to make tax filing and future benefit applications go smoothly? We encourage you to carefully check your name, Social Security number and all of the data on your W-2s, your online Social Security Statement, and Social Security card to make sure they all match. If you don't have access to your card or Statement but know your Social Security number, make sure the number and information is correct on your W-2s. A mismatch could delay your tax refund and cause problems with your Social Security benefits in the future. Such errors are much easier to fix now. If you do notice an error, you should contact Social Security at 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778), or if the information on the W-2 is incorrect, notify your employer.

Rudiger tosses a 1-hitter on May 13th 1970

Frankie Rudiger the young right-hander pitched his Hancock Team to a 6/1 victory over Paul's Auto in fast pitch action on May 13th 1970.

Striking out nine and showing great control, he walked only one player. Frank still lives locally and is retired from the Eagle-Tribune and can be seen now a day in his new sport: roller blading. He was staked to an early lead in the 1st inning after a Bill Bateman single Don Overka homered to right field.

In the 3rd inning Bateman drills a long homer and Ruediger has all he needs. Bateman is a retired school teacher from the Bruce school and after an Overka walk and scored on John Lenihan double. He and Bateman were teammates in the Prospect Hill Little League. The youngest player on this Hancock Team just kept firing strikes and his team kept scoring.

In the 6th inning, Dick McCarron singled and Lenihan followed with another hit. McCarron scored as Ronnie Tourville of Haverhill hit and Dave Peters, a former LHS baseball captain scores Tourville with a single. The young pitcher showed great poise and a good variety of pitches with

good control to satchel the win for his team. It's May 1970 and a big night for young Frankie Ruediger as he spins a 1-hitter for a 6-1 win.

On Essex St Burger King was selling a whopper for 39 cents.

Finest (First National) is featuring NY sirloin at 87 cents a pound; sliced bacon 68cents a lb. Maxwell House coffee 59cents a one pound can, limit 3 per customer. Cream pies chocolate, coconut, banana or lemon 5 for a dollar; 6 one-pound loaves of Betty Alden white bread for a buck.

No, it's not the Twilight Zone, it's our city in 1970.

Message from State Rep. Frank Moran regarding The Circuit Breaker

I wanted to take the time to pass along some information to you regarding a tax credit program designed for Massachusetts seniors age 65 and older called "The Circuit Breaker." The Circuit Breaker is a property tax credit that was designed by the legislature with the hope of alleviating some of the burdens that property tax can create. In this brochure you will find information to help you determine your eligibility. This informational brochure is not an official tax document, therefore I encourage you to consult with a tax professional with your specific questions. WHAT IS THE CIRCUIT BREAKER?

It's called the Circuit Breaker Tax Credit because it's "triggered" like an electrical circuit breaker when property payments exceed 10% of a senior citizen's annual income.

Those who qualify will still be required

to pay property taxes to their local communities.

Seniors will receive a dollar credit on their Massachusetts state income taxes for every dollar that the total of their property tax, water and sewer bills exceed 10% of their income, up to the \$1,000 maximum.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Massachusetts residents who:

- Are age 65 and older before January 1, 2012 (for joint filers, it is sufficient if one taxpayer is 65 years of age or older.)
- Own or rent residential property in Massachusetts and occupy the property as primary residence.
- Have an annual income of \$53,000 or less for a single filer, \$67,000 or less for a head of household; or \$80,000 or less for joint filers.
- Have property assessed at no more than \$705,000.

WHO IS NOT ELIGIBLE?

- Married persons who do not file jointly for this credit.
- Those who are dependent on another

tax filer.

- Those who receive federal or state rent subsidy directly; or those who live in a property-tax exempt facility.
- Those whose property is assessed at a value of \$705,000 or more.
- Those who rent from a landlord who is not required to pay real estate taxes.

IS THERE A SPECIAL APPLICATION?

If qualified, you can claim the credit by submitting a completed Schedule CB, Circuit Breaker Credit, with your 2012 state income tax returns.

Eligible seniors must file a return and claim a refund even if they do not owe taxes. For your convenience, the worksheet on the following page is provided to give an idea of what your tax credit might be.

work to be done, materials to be used, start and end dates, responsibility for hauling away debris, and costs broken down by labor and materials. Verify that the contractor's name, address, phone number and license number are included, as well as any verbal promises and warranties.

- Read the fine print. Some shady contracts include clauses allowing substantial cancellation fees if you choose not to use the contractor after your insurance company has approved the claim. Others require you to pay the full price if you cancel after the cancellation period has expired.
- Ask your contractor to provide proof of current insurance that covers workers compensation benefits, property damage and personal liability.
- You'll probably be asked to pay an upfront deposit to cover initial materials – one-quarter to one-third is reasonable upon delivery of materials to your home and once work begins.
- Never pay in full in advance, and don't pay cash. Have the contract specify a schedule for releasing payments, and before making the final payment, ask the contractor to provide proof that all subcontractors have been paid – if not, you could be liable for their fees.

And finally, remember the adage, "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is." If someone uses high-pressure sales tactics, requires full payment upfront, asks you to get necessary permits or offers to shave costs by using leftover materials from another job – run. They're potentially disastrous to your bottom line – and you've been through one disaster already.

OTHER IMPORTANT INSURANCE TERMS

DEDUCTIBLE:



Policies have deductibles. A deductible is the amount that you must pay before the insurance company pays your claim.

Many policies have more than one deductible. A separate deductible may apply to damage caused by windstorm or hail.

Earthquake coverage also has a special deductible but you must purchase earthquake coverage and pay more if you want earthquake coverage.

IMPORTANT TO KNOW

An insurance policy is not a maintenance agreement. If your roof is old you must pay to replace it. The insurance company does not pay for a new roof if it starts to leak. You must maintain your property to avoid having losses and to avoid having your insurance cancelled.

A company may non-renew your insurance if you file a claim.

A company may cancel or non-renew your policy if the condition or use of your building changes.

If you move from one home to another you must change the type of policy on the home you do not live in. If you have a loss, and you have the wrong type of insurance you may not be paid for a loss.
