Potholes occur when the surface of the road has a crack and water gets into the crack and freezes then warms up and freezes again due to weather conditions. Mayor Fiorentini stated: "Potholes are a big problem after the winter and I want to encourage residents to report any potholes on our streets and be entered to win one of 3 gift cards. "We want to keep our streets clear of any dangerous obstacles and with the help of residents, we will fill every pothole within 2 business days."

¡Esté preparado, esté alerta, podría ocurrir en cualquier lugar!

Desde el horrible acto de terrorismo perpetrado el 11 de septiembre, 2001, contra las Torres Gemelas en Nueva York, el país y el mundo ha vivido con el temor de que, de alguna manera, podría volver a ocurrir. ¡Y así fue!

Varios otros intentos de sabotaje terminaron en eso, sólo intentos.

No fue hasta el 15 de abril 2013 en el Maratón de Boston cuando los hermanos Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, de 19 años y Tamerlan Tsarnaev, de 26 años, supuestamente plantaron las bombas que mataron a tres espectadores inocentes, dejando a más de 170 mal heridos.

Ese acto generó una semana de infierno en Boston, lo que terminó cinco días más tarde con la captura del hermano más joven y la muerte del mayor, dejando tras de sí a un oficial de policía de MIT muerto y un policía de la Autoridad de Massachusetts Bay Transportation gravemente herido de un balazo, luchando por su vida en un hospital de Boston.

Ambos hermanos son inmigrantes procedentes de Chechenia, una región conflictiva cuya guerra civil con Rusia ha generado olas de extremistas del Islam.

Max Boot, un alto miembro del Consejo de Relaciones Exteriores en Nueva York, y autor de "Los ejércitos invisibles", ve los atentados de Boston Maratón como un modelo para el futuro del terrorismo - y una llamada de atención para las ciudades convencidas de que no puede sucederles.

"Somos uno. Somos Boston. Somos fuertes. Somos Boston fuerte", fue el mensaje en el Fenway Park de la otra noche.

Estamos de acuerdo con ese mensaje y añadimos: ¡Todos somos fuertes, Somos Americanos Fuertes!

Be prepare, be alert, it could happen anywhere!

Since the horrible act of terrorism perpetrated on September 11, 2001 against the Twin Towers in New York City, the country and the world have been living in fear that, somehow, it could happen again. And it did!

Several other attempts of sabotage ended in that, just attempts.

It was not until April 15th 2013 at the Boston Marathon when Brothers Dzhokhar Tsarnaev, 19, and Tamerlan Tsarnaev, 26, allegedly planted the bombs, killing three innocent bystanders, leaving more than 170 badly hurt.

That act generated a week from Hell in Boston, which ended five days later with the capture of the youngest brother and the killing of the older, leaving behind a dead MIT Police Officer and a Mass. Bay Transportation Authority police officer badly hurt with a gunshot, fighting for his life in a Boston Hospital.

Both brothers are immigrants from Chechnya, a restive region whose civil war with Russia has spawned waves of Islam extremists.


Max Boot, a senior fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations in New York, and author of "Invisible Armies," sees the Boston Marathon bombings as a blueprint for future terrorism -- and a wake-up call for cities convinced it can't happen to them.

"We are one. We are Boston. We are strong. We are Boston strong," was the message at Fenway Park the other night.

We agree with that message and add: We are all strong. We are Americans Strong!

Desde Mi Esquina

Preparándose para un año electoral

Este fin de semana, el Alcalde de Lawrence William Lantigua inauguró su sede de campaña en el 203 Essex St. Hubo comida y muchos amigos que pasaron por allá para desearle lo mejor.

Mientras tanto, Marcos Devers celebró una tan mencionada reunión para anunciar que él también será un candidato a la alcaldía de Lawrence. Su fiesta se celebró en Rio Bar and Grill.

No tenemos todos detalles para ofrecer porque no asistimos a ninguna aunque me veo obligada a no ignorarlos.

Previniendo la violencia

Durante el último par de semanas he estado hablando acerca de la violencia que se respira en nuestras ciudades, y creo que los legisladores están tratando con el problema de manera equivocada.

Mucho se dice en Washington sobre el control de armas y después de mucho debate, no pudieron llegar a ningún tipo de medida que nos daría un poco de tranquilidad. El argumento sobre la verificación de antecedentes es inútil porque el individuo en busca de un permiso para portar un arma no es probable que sea un asesino de masas. Mientras que las armas deben estar registradas, muchas personas necesitan legítimamente protección en algún momento de sus vidas.

Para probar mi punto, los bombardeos del Maratón de Boston es un buen ejemplo. Las mentes criminales encontrarán la manera de adquirir armas o hacerlas con artículos comunes y corrientes en el hogar. Ese es el tipo de prevención que tenemos

que estudiar para evitar convertirse en víctimas.

El argumento de la inmigración es demasiado simplista cuando se trata de estos asesinatos en masa. Esos crímenes atroces han sido cometidos por los estadounidenses nacidos en este país, así como los residentes permanentes legales como es el caso del reciente atentado. Solemos escuchar las explicaciones de su carácter y personalidad por parte de las personas que los conocían y nos preguntamos por qué nadie se dio cuenta de la inestabilidad mental, como en el caso de Newtown, Connecticut. Estaba siendo educado en casa porque no podía adaptarse a la escuela.

No seremos capaces de descubrir todas las mentes perturbadas de la sociedad, pero debemos estar atentos, incluso con nuestros propios familiares. Tenemos que ser más cuidadosos en nuestra vida diaria, más observadores de nuestro entorno.

Esa no es forma de vivir, usted pudiera decir. Es un signo de los tiempos. Los estadounidenses tienen tanto miedo de perder su libertad que están perdiendo sus vidas en el proceso de ser libre. No quiero vivir bajo una dictadura, pero estoy comenzando a entender por qué ha sido tan difícil deshacerse del comunismo en Cuba. Las personas no son libres de moverse y su paradero debe ser de conocimiento común. Incluso cuando alguien recibe un visitante, el vecino a cargo de la Comisión de Defensa de la Revolución, viene a comprobar el propósito de la visita.

Por supuesto, eso es una situación extrema, pero funciona en el control del miedo y la obediencia. Tenemos que aprender a sacrificar algunas de nuestras libertades hasta poder dominar la forma de descubrir y tratar las posibles amenazas.

Abordar el tema de la salud mental es vital. La semana pasada escribí sobre la juventud de Lawrence que enfrenta a todo tipo de presiones - económicas, sociales, culturales y de los padres - mientras que son rodeados por la proliferación de armas en esta ciudad. La cárcel no es la respuesta igual que la excusa de la inmigración.

Todo el esfuerzo puesto en Washington con respecto a los controles "universales" de antecedentes será mejor empleado en la expansión de la atención de la salud mental.

Por favor, eche un vistazo al poema "La Tierra Corrupta" en la página 16, escrito en inglés por uno de los estudiantes que participan en el Lawrence Youth Team. Estos jóvenes no han tenido los mejores modelos a seguir y, a veces sienten que no hay esperanza. De los 88 en el programa, cuatro han estado en las noticias por meterse en problemas. El resto de ellos están trabajando duro para conseguir una educación, tener éxito y tienen esperanza para el futuro. Esa es una manera de lidiar con el problema.

El 11 de mayo, la Ciudad de Lawrence tendrá un día de compra de armas y el Departamento de Policía recuperará cualquier tipo de arma - sin hacer preguntas. Ellos recibirán una tarjeta de regalo que van desde \$50 a \$150 y tendremos muchas menos armas en las calles.

Por favor, apoye el programa de comprar las armas.

Fraude es no admitir que hay un daño o problema existente o que su compañía actual ha sometido una orden de cancelación. Fraude es tener un negocio en su hogar y decirle a la compañía de seguro que ese no es el caso. Fraude es añadir un apartamento sin decirle a su compañía de seguro. Si usted miente, su seguro puede ser cancelado por fraude.

GLCAC Welcomes New COO and Development Director

Executive Director Evelyn Friedman has appointed Rosa Talero as Chief Operating Officer and Tracey Chalifour as the new Director of Development and Planning for the Greater Lawrence Community Action Council Inc. The two new members of senior management add a combined three decades of professional experience in operations and fundraising for non-profit organizations.

Filling a newly created position, Talero is responsible for overseeing all internal operations of the \$34 million social services agency with about 300 employees in 18 programs. Chalifour is replacing Maureen Mulcahy who is retiring after more than 45 years with the agency. Chalifour will concentrate on private fundraising, grant applications and strategic planning.

"The experience and skills that Rosa and Tracey bring to GLCAC will help us to improve our service delivery and expand our reach as we strive to help families achieve self-sufficiency. Improving our internal operations while seeking private funding sources are two priorities I have for this agency," said Friedman, who assumed leadership of GLCAC in September 2012.

Talero brings more than two decades of experience in community, economic and housing development, and specifically 11 years of first-hand, non-profit management experience. She most recently served as Director of Operations for the City of Boston's Department of Neighborhood Development, where she oversaw internal operations including human resources, technology initiatives, policies and procedures, budget planning and internal communications. In addition, she managed the department's real estate portfolio.

Prior to that, Talero worked for the City of Miami's Department of Community Development. A native Spanish-speaker, Talero holds a master's in business administration from the University of

Massachusetts-Boston, and a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Bogotá Jorge Tadeo Lozano.

Chalifour joins the agency with a successful track record of grant writing, fundraising, special event planning, and marketing and communications for non-profit organizations in the economic development and health care sectors.

She joins GLCAC from Winchester Hospital where she served as the Stewardship and Communications Liaison, a multi-faceted role that included writing grant proposals, maintaining existing donor relationships, planning events, and development of communication collateral and annual reports.

Prior to that she worked as Special Events Manager for Partners HealthCare's North Shore Medical Center, where she directed an annual fundraising event that topped \$5 million over five years. Previously, she served as Membership and Marketing Manager for the Greater Merrimack Valley Convention & Visitors Bureau, where her duties included production of the annual visitor guide with distribution of 100,000 copies.

A certified project management professional, Chalifour holds two bachelor's degrees from UMass-Amherst, in business administration and in hospitality administration.

GLCAC last year served 29,000 individuals in Greater Lawrence. NECC Receives \$1.24M for Science Labs in Haverhill and Lawrence

The Massachusetts Life Sciences Center (MLSC) recently announced \$1.3 million in grants for life-sciences-related capital projects in Northeastern Massachusetts. This total includes \$1.24 million for Northern Essex Community College (NECC) to renovate its laboratory space to accommodate the rapidly growing enrollment of students in laboratory sciences, and a \$50,000 planning grant for Middlesex Community College (MCC) to expand its biotechnology facilities. The MLSC has funded Science, Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) education in Northeastern Massachusetts through a variety of grants, including more than \$500,000 that the MLSC announced this past December for equipment and supply grants to vocational technical schools and public high schools in Northeastern Massachusetts.

"Supporting innovation propels our economy forward and prepares our citizens for the 21st century global marketplace," said Governor Deval Patrick. "Our innovation economy relies on a well-educated, well-skilled workforce, and these grants will expand opportunity and grow jobs in communities throughout the Commonwealth."

Through the MLSC, Massachusetts is investing \$1 billion over 10 years in the growth of the state's life sciences supercluster. These investments are being made under the Massachusetts Life Sciences Initiative, proposed by Governor Patrick in 2007, and passed by the State Legislature and signed into law by Governor Patrick in 2008.

"High schools and community colleges like Northern Essex and Middlesex are training the next generation of Massachusetts' life sciences workers," said Dr. Susan Windham-Bannister, President & CEO of the MLSC. "We want to ensure that these schools have the first-rate training facilities they need to prepare young people to successfully compete for jobs at all levels in the life sciences. A recent study shows that the life sciences sectors are now creating jobs faster than any other sector in the state, so employers will be relying on this talent pipeline."

With the \$1.24-million grant from the MLSC, NECC plans to build a new lab at its Lawrence campus and to renovate lab spaces at both the Haverhill and Lawrence campuses. NECC offers an Associate's degree in Laboratory Science that is focused on training laboratory technicians to work in the analytical chemistry and biotechnology fields. Since the program's inception three years ago, enrollment has tripled. The Laboratory Science Program is currently supported by a National Science Foundation Advanced Technological Education grant that enabled the purchase of equipment and supplies, the fostering of collaborations with regional industry, and partnerships with regional K-12 schools.

"This generous funding will allow us to dramatically improve lab facilities on our Haverhill and Lawrence Campuses," said NECC President Lane Glenn. "Our students will benefit as well as the local companies which count on the college to provide employees with the very latest skills."

"This grant will help us reach our goal

of creating modern labs for our students, and we will be able to accomplish this in just three years as compared to our original plan of 10 years," said Dr. Noemi Custodia-Lora, NECC Assistant Dean of Foundational Studies and Liberal Arts & Sciences. "The new labs will enhance the student experience, better preparing them for the next level, whether transfer to a four-year school or joining the regional workforce."

"There is a need for laboratory technicians that are trained and educated in basic safe laboratory procedures to generate reliable quality data for the life sciences industry," said David Legg, vice president of quality assurance at Charm Sciences, Inc., in Lawrence, Mass. "With increased laboratory automation and data analysis, many laboratory processes do not require the traditional four-year degree of a Lab Analyst. Associate degree programs like NECC's Laboratory Science Program produce graduates that can fill this need between candidates with no laboratory experience or training and those with a Bachelor's degree."

"As a lab science student, I know how important it is to have access to state-of-the-art labs," said NECC Lab Science Program student April Anamisis. "That way we're well prepared for internships and/or transfer to four-year colleges and universities."

Custodia Lora co-wrote the grant with Wendy Shaffer, dean of development, and Judy Zubrow, dean of foundational studies and liberal arts and sciences.

MCC was granted \$50,000 to complete a comprehensive planning study to identify the best approach for expanding its biotechnology facilities. This will include a clean room to support increased enrollment and workforce development, education and training.

"The college is thrilled with the support this grant will provide to Middlesex to allow us to utilize both industry and technical experts to review and consider updates to our facilities which will benefit our students, our business partners, and the local economy," said MCC President Carole Cowan. "Biotech is one of the most exciting, successful and dynamic programs we have at the college, and this grant helps ensure that future graduates of the program will find continued success in this critical industry."

The Technical Training Foundation also contributed to the project with a \$200,000 donation, bringing total funding for the project to \$1.44 million. The Technical Training Foundation was created by Dr. Ibrahim El-Hefni, a native of Egypt who was a longtime resident of North Andover and a successful business owner. Before his death he created the Technical Training Foundation, now carried on by his widow Wensley El-Hefni and his daughter Suzanne Wright.

Also in attendance to celebrate the announcement were State Representatives Linda Dean Campbell, Frank Moran, and Lenny Mirra. Representative Campbell spoke on behalf of legislators.

Investigador de UMass Lowell desarrolla la terapia de cáncer de mama

Método de envío de drogas permitiría a los médicos personalizar el tratamiento del paciente

Un investigador de la Universidad de Massachusetts en Lowell, que está desarrollando un tratamiento especializado para pacientes con cáncer de mama ha recibido más de \$725,000 del Instituto Nacional del Cáncer de los Institutos Nacionales de Salud para avanzar en su trabajo.

El Ingeniero Químico Prof. Prakash Rai de Lowell está creando un método de liberación de fármacos con un agente de imagen que permite a los médicos ver drogas inyectadas mientras se dirigen a las células cancerosas. La subvención NIH exige que Rai y su equipo se centren en el desarrollo de sistemas de liberación de fármacos para dos de las formas más letales de cáncer de mama, conocidas médicaamente como el receptor humano del factor de crecimiento epidérmico 2 positivo (HER2+) y triple-negativos de cáncer de mama.

En 2012, más de 290,000 mujeres fueron diagnosticadas con cáncer de mama y 40,000 murieron a causa de la enfermedad, de acuerdo con estimados de la American Cancer Society.

El agente de imagen es entregado junto con la medicina del cáncer inyectada y ayudará al médico a guiar el tratamiento, ayudará a reducir los daños colaterales a las células sanas y puede disminuir la dosis de drogas de un paciente, reduciendo los efectos secundarios tóxicos, de acuerdo con Rai.

"Si tiene éxito, estas terapias dirigidas, guiadas por imagen, debería tener un impacto significativo en la atención clínica de los pacientes con cáncer de mama mediante la mejora de la supervivencia y calidad de vida en general", dijo.

Rai y su equipo planean combinar varios medicamentos que han demostrado potencial en el tratamiento del cáncer con el agente de imagen en un tamaño nanométrico dirigido para dispensar la droga con un sistema llamado teranóstica

nanoconstruct (TNC). El tamaño de las nanopartículas, que miden milmillonésimas de un metro, hace posible la entrega de moléculas de fármaco directamente a las células cancerosas.

Las investigaciones de Rai están a la vanguardia de teranóstica, un campo emergente de la medicina que combina terapias y diagnósticos para ayudar a los médicos a desarrollar tratamientos altamente individualizados y orientados en función del perfil de salud de un paciente. La medicina teranóstica utiliza la nanotecnología para ayudar a detectar, ver y tratar las enfermedades al mismo tiempo.

"A pesar que la nanomedicina teranóstica como un campo todavía está en su infancia, en un futuro cercano se espera un impacto significativo en la atención al paciente por lo que es posible tratar a cada paciente con un trato personalizado a su enfermedad", dijo Rai.

El método de distribución del fármaco que él y sus investigadores están desarrollando se puede utilizar para ayudar a tratar otros tipos de cáncer y puede ser adaptado para tratar otras enfermedades, incluyendo la aterosclerosis y las enfermedades infecciosas y neurodegenerativas, añadió.

UMass Lowell Researcher Develops Breast Cancer Therapy Drug-Delivery Method Would Allow Physicians to Tailor Patient Treatment

A UMass Lowell researcher who is developing a specialized drug treatment for breast cancer patients has received more than \$725,000 from the National Cancer Institute at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to advance his work.

Chemical Engineering Prof. Prakash Rai of Lowell is creating a drug-delivery method with an imaging agent that would allow doctors to see injected drugs as they target cancer cells. The NIH grant calls for Rai and his team to focus on developing drug-delivery systems for two of the deadliest forms of breast cancer, known medically as the human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 positive (HER2+) and triple-negative breast cancer.

In 2012, more than 290,000 women were diagnosed with breast cancer and 40,000 died from the disease, according to American Cancer Society estimates.

The imaging agent delivered along with injected cancer medication will help physicians guide treatment, should help reduce the collateral damage to healthy cells and may decrease a patient's drug dosage, reducing toxic side effects, according to Rai.

"If successful, these image-guided, targeted therapies should make a significant

impact on the clinical care of breast cancer patients by improving survival and overall quality of life," he said.

Rai and his team plan to combine several drugs that have shown potential in cancer treatment with the imaging agent into a single nanometer-sized targeted drug-delivery system called a theranostic nanoconstruct (TNC). The size of the nanoparticles, which measure only billionths of a meter, make it possible to deliver drug molecules directly to cancer cells.


Rai's research is at the forefront of theranostics, an emerging field in medicine that combines therapeutics and diagnostics to help doctors develop highly individualized and targeted treatments based on a patient's health profile. Theranostic medicine uses nanotechnology to help detect, see and treat disease at the same time.

"Although theranostic nanomedicine as a field is still in its infancy, in the near future it is expected to significantly impact patient care by making it possible to treat each patient with a personalized treatment to his or her disease," Rai said.

Los padres de hijos con necesidades especiales ya tienen bastante de qué ocuparse atendiendo las necesidades de salud, educativas y emocionales de sus niños; además de tener que arreglárselas con ingresos drásticamente reducidos por tener que trabajar menos horas o pagar a alguien para que cuide de los niños. Por eso, no es de sorprender que muchos de estos padres no hayan tenido tiempo para elaborar un plan financiero a largo plazo en caso de que sus hijos necesiten cuidado cuando ellos no estén.

Además, si no es cuidadoso, usted o un familiar bienintencionado podrían, sin saberlo, hacer que los niños pierdan el derecho a futuros beneficios si no encamina la herencia correctamente.

A continuación, un breve resumen de los programas de asistencia del gobierno:

La Administración del Seguro Social brinda dos tipos de cobertura por discapacidad: Seguridad de Ingreso Suplementario (SSI) y Seguro por Incapacidad del Seguro Social (SSDI). Las reglas y los requisitos de elegibilidad difieren entre los dos programas; y los beneficios difieren si se trata de niños o de adultos.

En pocas palabras, SSI es un programa de asistencia en efectivo basado en las necesidades y es para personas incapacitadas de cualquier edad pertenecientes a familias de bajos ingresos con recursos limitados. Los niños califican para beneficios de SSI si reúnen estrictos requisitos que se detallan en la Publicación 05-11000 de SSA (www.ssa.gov/pubs/11000.html).

SSDI es un programa aparte, financiado a través de deducciones de nómina (parte de FICA). A pesar de que, en ocasiones, los hijos reciben pagos de SSDI si sus padres son discapacitados, su elegibilidad depende de la condición de discapacidad de los padres, no de ellos. No obstante, después de cumplir 22 años, los hijos con discapacidades podrían calificar para SSDI por su propia cuenta, siempre y cuando al menos uno de los padres califique para recibir beneficios del Seguro Social.

Las reglas de elegibilidad y las definiciones de SSI y SSDI son complejas. Para ver si su hijo reúne los requisitos, llame al Seguro Social al 1-800-772-1213 o consulte en la pestaña "Incapacidad" y

"SSI" en www.ssa.gov/espanol. Un recurso particularmente útil es la Publicación No. 05-10026 de SSA, "Benefits for Children with Disabilities" (Beneficios para niños con incapacidades).

Muchas familias, sin saberlo, ponen en peligro la elegibilidad de su hijo discapacitado para recibir beneficios del gobierno, al abrir cuentas a nombre del hijo o al designarlos como beneficiarios. Lamentablemente, las leyes federales establecen que los beneficiarios de SSI, Medicaid y muchos otros programas de asistencia del estado quedarán descalificados si poseen recursos superiores a los \$2,000. Por lo tanto, si el tío Jerry deja \$10,000 para su hija en su testamento, ella podría perder los beneficios. Una buena alternativa es crear un fideicomiso para necesidades especiales, cuyos activos puedan ser utilizados por su fideicomisario para administrar las finanzas y los efectos personales de la persona discapacitada. Los fideicomisos se rigen por las leyes estatales y deben ser establecidos por un abogado familiar especializado en estas cuestiones legales.

Algunos padres nombran al fideicomisario como beneficiario de las pólizas de seguro de vida para asegurar una fuente de financiación en caso de que fallezcan antes que su hijo (esté al día con el pago de las primas). Otros recursos de financiación posibles son el dinero en efectivo, acciones y otras inversiones, planes de jubilación, beneficios por fallecimiento, el producto de la venta de una vivienda y herencias de otros familiares o amigos. Asegúrese de que el fideicomisario, y no el hijo, sea nombrado como beneficiario.

Preparar un fideicomiso para necesidades especiales puede ser costoso, quizás hasta varios miles de dólares, dependiendo de su situación. Pero sopesese eso contra la posibilidad de que su hijo pierda los beneficios del gobierno para toda la vida a causa de una herencia accidental; y hablando de eso, informe a familiares o amigos de confianza bienintencionados acerca de la existencia del fideicomiso.

Maximize Your Disabled Child's Government Aid

Parents of special needs children have enough on their plates just tending to the health, educational and emotional needs of their kids – not to mention often having to cope with drastically lowered income because of reduced work hours or having to pay someone else for childcare. So it's not surprising that many of these parents haven't had time to hatch a long-term financial plan in case their kids need care after they're not around.

Fortunately, many government programs and community resources are available to help relieve the financial burden of parenting special needs children. But eligibility criteria are complicated and the application process time-consuming. Plus, if you're not careful, you or well-meaning relatives could inadvertently disqualify your kids for future benefits by not structuring their inheritances correctly.

Here's a brief overview of key government assistance programs:

The Social Security Administration provides two types of disability coverage: Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Income (SSDI). Rules and eligibility requirements differ between the two programs – and benefits differ for children and adults.

In a nutshell, SSI is a needs-based, cash-assistance program for disabled people of any age in low-income families with limited resources. Children qualify for SSI benefits if they meet certain strict criteria outlined in SSA Publication 05-11000 (www.ssa.gov/pubs/11000.html).

SSDI is a separate program funded by payroll deductions (part of FICA). Although children sometimes receive SSDI payments if their parents are disabled, their eligibility is based on their parents' disability status, not on their own. However, after turning 22, already disabled children may qualify for SSDI on their own if at least one parent qualifies for Social Security benefits.

Eligibility rules and definitions for SSI and SSDI are complex. To see if your child qualifies, call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213, or search the Disability and SSI tabs at www.ssa.gov. One particularly helpful resource is "Benefits for Children with Disabilities," SSA Publication No. 05-10026.

Many families inadvertently jeopardize their disabled child's eligibility for government-provided benefits by opening accounts in the child's name or designating them as beneficiaries. Unfortunately, federal law dictates that recipients of SSI, Medicaid and many state assistance programs will be disqualified if they have resources worth over \$2,000. So, if Uncle Jerry leaves your daughter \$10,000 in his will, she could lose her benefits.

One good alternative is to create a special needs trust, whose assets can be used by its trustee to manage the finances and personal effects of a disabled person. Trusts are governed by state laws and should only be drafted by an attorney familiar with this area of law.

Some parents name the trust as beneficiary of life insurance policies to

Payments to 4.2 Million Borrowers Covered by Foreclosure Agreement Began

Payments to 4.2 million borrowers are scheduled to begin on April 12 following an agreement reached by the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency and the Federal Reserve Board with 13 mortgage servicers.

The agreement, which was reached earlier this year, provides \$3.6 billion in cash payments to borrowers whose homes were in any stage of the foreclosure process in 2009 or 2010 and whose mortgages were serviced by one of the following companies, their affiliates, or subsidiaries: Aurora, Bank of America, Citibank, Goldman Sachs, HSBC, JPMorgan Chase, MetLife Bank, Morgan Stanley, PNC, Sovereign, SunTrust, U.S. Bank, and Wells Fargo.

The payments will range from \$300 to \$125,000. For borrowers whose mortgages were serviced by 11 of the 13 servicers—all servicers but Goldman Sachs and Morgan Stanley—checks will be sent in several waves beginning with 1.4 million checks on April 12. The final wave is expected in mid-July 2013. More than 90 percent

of the total payments to borrowers at those 11 servicers are expected to have been sent by the end of April. Information about payments to borrowers whose mortgages were serviced by Goldman Sachs and Morgan Stanley will be announced in the near future.

In most cases, borrowers will receive a letter with an enclosed check sent by the Paying Agent—Rust Consulting, Inc. Some borrowers may receive letters from Rust requesting additional information needed to process their payments. Previously, Rust sent postcards to the 4.2 million borrowers notifying them of their eligibility to receive payment under the agreement.

Rust is sending all payments and correspondence regarding the foreclosure agreement at the direction of the OCC and the Federal Reserve.

Borrowers can call Rust at 1-888-952-9105 to update their contact information or to verify that they are covered by the agreement. Information provided to Rust

will only be used for purposes related to the agreement. Borrowers should beware of scams and anyone asking them to call a different number or to pay a fee to receive payment under the agreement.

Accepting a payment will not prevent borrowers from taking any action they may wish to pursue related to their foreclosure. Servicers are not permitted to ask borrowers to sign a waiver of any legal claims they may have against their servicer in connection with accepting payment.

In determining the payment amounts, borrowers were categorized according to the stage of their foreclosure process and the type of possible servicer error. Regulators then determined amounts for each category using the financial remediation matrix published in June 2012 as a guide, incorporating input from various consumer groups. Regulators have published the payment amounts and number of people in each category on their Web sites at www.occ.gov/independentforeclosurereview and

www.federalreserve.gov/consumerinfo/independent-foreclosure-review-payment-agreement.htm

While the agreement ended the Independent Foreclosure Review for the 13 companies identified above, the review continues for OneWest, Everbank, and GMAC Mortgage.

Regulators continue to monitor the servicers' actions to correct the unsafe and unsound mortgage servicing and foreclosure practices required by other parts of regulators' enforcement actions, which remain in effect.

Regulators have issued guidance to the servicers under foreclosure-related enforcement actions directing a review before foreclosure sales for all pending foreclosures. These reviews help prevent avoidable foreclosures by ensuring foreclosure-prevention alternatives are considered and foreclosure standards are met. Regulators encourage borrowers needing foreclosure prevention assistance to work directly with their servicer or contact the Homeowner's HOPE Hotline at 888-995-HOPE (4673) (or at www.makinghomeaffordable.gov) to be put in touch with a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development-approved nonprofit organization that can provide free assistance.

ensure a source of funding if they die before their child. (Stay current on your premiums.) Other possible funding sources include cash, stocks and other investments, retirement plan death benefits, home sale proceeds and inheritances from other relatives and friends. Just make sure that the trust—not the child—is named beneficiary.

Preparing a special needs trust can be expensive—possibly several thousand dollars, depending on your situation. But weigh that against the prospect of your child losing out on a lifetime of government-provided benefits because of an accidental inheritance—speaking of which, be sure to let any well-meaning relatives or friends know about the trust.

Meanwhile, Marcos Devers held a much touted gathering to announce that he will also be a candidate for mayor of Lawrence. His dinner party was held at Rio Bar and Grill.

We don't have any details to provide you because we did not attend either one although I am compelled not to ignore them.

Preventing violence

For the past couple of weeks I have been talking about the violence that permeates our cities and I believe the legislators are dealing with that problem the wrong way.

A lot is being said in Washington about gun control and after much debate, they failed to come up with any type of measure that would give us some peace of mind. The argument over background checks is futile because the individual looking for a permit to carry a weapon is not likely to be a mass murderer. While guns should be registered,

many people need them legitimately for protection at some time in their lives.

To prove my point, the Boston Marathon bombings are a good example. Criminal minds find the way to acquire weapons or make their own with common ordinary household goods. That is the type of prevention we have to study to avoid becoming victims.

The immigration argument is too simplistic when it comes to these mass killings. Those heinous crimes have been committed by Americans born in this country as well as legal permanent residents as is the case with the recent bombings. We usually listen to explanations of their character and personality by the people who knew them and wonder why no one noticed the mental instability like in the case of Newtown, Connecticut. He was being schooled at home because could not adapt to school.

We will not be able to uncover all of the perturbed minds in society but we must be vigilant even with our own relatives. We must be more careful in our daily lives, more observant of our surroundings.

That is no way to live, you may say. It's a sign of the times. Americans are so afraid of losing their freedom that they are losing

their lives in the process of being free. I don't want to live under a dictatorship but I am beginning to understand why it has been so difficult to get rid of Communism in Cuba. People are not free to move around and their whereabouts must be common knowledge. Even when someone receives a visitor, the neighbor in charge of the Committee for the Defense of the Revolution comes around to check the purpose of the visit.

Of course, that's an extreme situation but it has worked in controlling the fear and the obedience. We must learn to sacrifice some of our liberties until we master how to discover and treat the potential threats.

Tackling the mental health issue is vital. Last week I wrote about the youth of Lawrence coping with all kinds of pressures from economic, social, cultural and parental, while surrounded by the proliferation of guns in this city. Jail is not the answer any more than the immigration excuse.

All the effort being placed in Washington dealing with the "universal" background checks will be better spent providing expanded mental health care.

Please take a look at the poem "Corrupted Earth" in this page, written by one of the students participating in the Lawrence Youth Team. These young people have not had the best role models and at times feel there's not hope. Out of 88 in the program, four have been in the news for getting into trouble. The rest of them are working hard getting an education, having success and hope for the future. That's one way to deal with the problem.

On May 11, the City of Lawrence will have a gun buy back day and the Police Department will retrieve any type of weapon – no questions asked. They will receive a gift card ranging from \$50 to \$150 and we will have that many less guns in the streets.

Fraud is not admitting there is existing damage or that your company has issued a cancellation notice. Fraud is having a home based business and telling your company there isn't one. Fraud is adding an apartment without telling your company. If you lie, you can be cancelled for fraud.



**Khandi: Arabian: Senior - Female**




