Senator William (Mo) Cowan visited Northern Essex Community College's Lawrence Campus on Tuesday, May 28, to learn how the college is partnering with local employers to prepare students for careers.

The Senator heard from NECC President Lane Glenn, college administrators, a local employer, and three students who are enrolled in or have recently graduated from high-demand programs. State Representatives Diana DiZoglio and Marcos Devers were also in attendance as well as members of the college's board of trustees.

Emily Ramirez of Lawrence, a 2010 graduate of Lawrence High School and the newly elected student representative to the Northern Essex Board of Trustees, is studying Engineering Science at Northern Essex. She started at a larger university but found the big lecture courses were not a good fit for her, and she shared how much she appreciates Northern Essex's accessible faculty.

Omar Anagam, also of Lawrence, graduated from Northern Essex's Respiratory Care program this spring. The father of three enrolled in the program after being laid off two years ago. After taking his boards in June, he will immediately start looking for a fulltime job in his field. Omar commented on the "amazing lab equipment" including the sophisticated mannequins that are used in clinical instruction.

Lindsey Curole of Merrimac graduated from the Lab Science program this year and is now attending UMass Lowell and working as a lab technician for Charm Sciences, a Lawrence company that manufactures food safety, water quality and environmental diagnostic tests.

One of Curole's supervisors, David Legg, Vice President of Quality Assurance at Charm Sciences, also attended the meeting, shared how the college worked with his company to develop an associate

degree in lab science, one of the few applied science degrees offered in Massachusetts.

"At Charm Sciences, we employ over 100 life science employees with a bachelor's degree or higher but we've recently created a technician position that's well suited for associate degree graduates," he said. "Lindsey started last summer as an intern and is now employed by us."

Following the meeting, President Glenn took Senator Cowan on a neighborhood tour, sharing plans for what he calls a complete urban campus in the city.

Stops on the tour included already existing college buildings such as the Dmitry Building on Franklin St.; the Louise Haffner Fournier Education Center on Amesbury St; and iHealth—an innovative public/private partnership designed to prepare adults for careers in health care-on Franklin St. President Glenn also pointed out three new projects: the El Hefni Allied Health & Technology Center on Common St., which will open this fall; 420 Common St., another public/private partnership which will feature a community bookstore and café as well as college classrooms; and the site of the former Registry of Deeds on Common St., which will become a green space with parking.

"Enrollments are surging in Lawrence; and we are expanding our campus to address the need in the city," said Lane Glenn. "This is all due to partnerships, partnerships with private funders and with local employers. They appreciate what we're doing and they're investing in us."

Calling community colleges "engines for economic development," Senator Cowan said "You should be proud of the work you are doing...you are educating students for transfer as well as immediate entry in the workforce."

Senator Cowan was appointed to the United States Senate in February to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of John F. Kerry, who is currently Secretary of State.

That afternoon was the announcement of the new name for the South Lawrence East School Fifth Grade Academy which was created this school year and will increase to sixth grade next year. In a party atmosphere in the auditorium, several students testified to what the school means to them.

Students Rachel Taveras, Damien Paniagua, Jackie Colon, Darlyn Jennieca and Sam Vasquez addressed the audience recounting their experiences in the 5th. Grade Academy. Rachel Taveras said, "it was like having a second family". Damien Paniagua was grateful to Ms. Silva for teaching him decimal numbers "again and again until she was sure I understood them."

Darlyn Vasquez left us with a good advice, "Always try, never stop learning and always communicate with respect. These are our three main rules and are important because they'll keep you safe, focused and help us learn."

"My mother still can't pronounce the name of the school where I work," said Mr. Gabe Olmeda, English Language Learning Teacher to the audience the afternoon when they were celebrating the renaming of the South Lawrence East Fifth Grade Academy. Olmeda said students had difficulty writing

such a long name in the MCAS forms. "It was a mile long," he said.

"Well, I stand before you today with great news. Finally, we changed our ridiculously long name and replace it with something shorter and full of even more significance. SPARK Academy!" Olmeda said.

At that point, all students jumped for joy clapping because that was their favorite name but it had been kept as a surprise.

"Spark is an appropriate metaphor for our program. In our school, we are creating the spark for health and fitness to elevate our heart rates through rigorous exercises and igniting the spark for learning in demanding academic classes. That is our promise to our students, but we are simply providing the spark. A spark as good as the fire it builds."

But it depends on you, the students, to turn that spark into a flame of passion for healthy living and an intellectual mind. After leaving the school, we hope to develop its flame in a fire that improves our world and our community with a positive change. But remember, it starts with a spark. With that, I welcome you all to the Spark Academy," concluded Mr. Olmeda.

Then two teachers and two students came on stage showing the banner with the new name as the audience showed their approval.

Afterwards, everyone enjoyed a banquet hosted by the students' parents.


In the story on Northern Essex Community College Commencement published last week, we identified this picture as being Karla Cruz, another remarkable student described in the article.

El presupuesto de Haverhill

El Alcalde de Haverhill James Fiorentini presentó el presupuesto del año fiscal del 2014 al concejo municipal y dijo que la ciudad está en la mejor forma financiera desde el 2008. Pero aún así, tiene que aumentar los impuestos a la propiedad por 2-1/2%, el máximo permitido por la ley para equilibrar el presupuesto sin diezmar servicios.

Por favor, lea la historia en la página 7 donde explica que el presupuesto de \$162.6 millones subió aproximadamente \$8.2 millones en comparación con el presupuesto de este año. Sin este aumento, tendrán que hacer recortes en las escuelas y departamentos de policía. Además, no habrá dinero para mejorar los parques y patios de recreo o reforzar la reserva de efectivo tan importante de la ciudad.

El presupuesto de Lawrence

El Alcalde William Lantigua presentó un presupuesto equilibrado para el año fiscal del 2014 al concejo municipal el pasado martes. Para sorpresa de muchos, no habrá ningún despido de policías o bomberos. Esto incluye un aumento de impuestos a la propiedad que va a ser motivo suficiente para que muchos otros formen un alboroto.

¿Se imagina las críticas si llega a incluir la pérdida de personal de seguridad? ¡No podemos ganar!

Sin embargo, no escucho quejas de Haverhill sobre el aumento de los impuestos e incluso pagan por el presupuesto de su departamento escolar a diferencia de Lawrence que lo recibe de parte del Estado.

Gilda Duran me explicaba que siempre paga con un cheque personal cuando Carmenza Bruff se unió a nosotros. Gilda le preguntó cómo ella paga por el aparcamiento mensualmente en el garaje y nos habló de un incidente reciente.

Carmenza fue a su Colombia natal de vacaciones hace unos meses y se olvidó de pagar por el aparcamiento para el próximo mes por adelantado. Cuando regresó, su tarjeta había sido bloqueada. Ella habló con Justo y trató de pagar en efectivo porque ella había dejado su chequera en casa. García la dejó entrar y le dijo que podía traerlo al día siguiente. "Te conozco bien; lo puedes traer mañana, porque no puedo aceptar dinero en efectivo."

Ya que era una contradicción con lo que se había publicado, les pregunté si podía usar sus nombres. Ambos estuvieron

de acuerdo, pero Carmenza dijo: "Por supuesto que puedes, ya que, si alguna vez me acusan falsamente, espero que alguien levanta la mano para decir la verdad."

Algún día sabremos la verdad. Mientras tanto, el Eagle-Tribune y el Boston Globe han publicado varios artículos con serias acusaciones en su contra.

¿Actúa la policía cuando la necesitamos?

Hace unos días una mujer atacó al Alcalde Lantigua frente a una licorería. Michelle Mitchell de Derry, New Hampshire, trató de arrebatar de su mano algo que el alcalde estaba bebiendo en una bolsa de papel preguntándole, "¿Qué estás bebiendo?"

Ella se fue pero fue arrestada de inmediato por la policía en North Lawrence, siendo acusada de asalto y agresión.

Eso me hizo pensar en otro incidente el pasado mes de abril, cuando Antonio Arévalo vandalizó el coche del alcalde cargándolo con basura, llenó de billetes de





Mayor introduces \$163.6 Million "restorative budget"

"Clean streets, safe streets, good schools"

Mayor James J. Fiorentini today introduces a \$163.6 million dollar restorative budget for the next fiscal year.

In contrast to previous budgets that have called for sharp cutbacks in spending, closing fire stations and turning off street lights, this budget calls for restoring some, but not all, services that have been cut over the last decade.

"From the time the Hale debt hit us over a decade ago, we have had to make a series of budget cuts to keep our City fiscally solvent. We were able to build up our financial reserves from 2004 until 2008, only to have to make a second series of cuts from when the recession hit.

"Over the years, we have had to cut 26% of our work force. Today, we have the fewest number of employees in City Hall per capita of any city in the State.

"This budget is able to restore some of the necessary services cut over the years. The budget also sets aside over \$1.5 million in reserves for the next rainy day that is

sure to come someday. This budget restores some services today and saves money for tomorrow."

In preparing the budget, the Mayor cut \$600,000 from the budget requests given to him by department heads. "We have to maintain fiscal stability and provide for today while saving for tomorrow."

In announcing the budget and restoration of services, the Mayor noted that many of these budget restorations would not be possible without the \$2.4 million in Hale debt assistance provided to the City.

"Thanks to Representative Dempsey we are able to restore some of the services that were cut from 2003 to 2008."

The budget includes a \$4.6 million increase for public education which Fiorentini called "our highest budget priority and the key to a good future."

The budget also calls for adding three (3) additional police officers, bringing the complement to the highest level since the start of the recession.

"Continuing to keep our citizens safe is always a top priority", said Mayor Fiorentini. "Crime is down three (3) years in a row, but we want to add officers to help maintain our current trend."

"This would not have been possible without the additional assistance provided to the City by Representative Dempsey."

The budget re-opens the public library on Sundays during the school year for the first time in over a decade.

"Our library is one of our greatest treasures, said Mayor Fiorentini. "Sunday used to be our busiest day. Since the Hale debt hit over a decade ago, we have not been able to keep it open on Sunday. We are thrilled to be able to bring back Sunday openings."

The budget re-opens, on a trial basis, a portion of the Rte. 110 park along River Street that has been closed for almost two decades. "As we move forward to recognize the river as one of our top assets in the City, we are working so that people can get to use it."

The budget also calls for adding funding for parks, playgrounds and highways to give residents more 'quality of life' services.

"Our goal has always been the same" said Mayor Fiorentini. 'Clean streets, safe streets, good schools.' This budget works to improve all three and to restore services in those key areas.

Mayor James J. Fiorentini and Artist of the Month, Linda Koutoulas





WHAV Names 'Corporate FM' Documentary Panel Movie's New England Premiere Takes Place June 19 in Haverhill



Kevin McKinney

McKinney's feature documentary work includes camera and sound on "Body of War," directed by veteran talk-show host Phil Donahue and Ellen Spiro. He is a winner of the Aspiring Filmmakers Award for his previous film Planet Trash. McKinney graduated from the University of Kansas with a double major in Sociology and Theatre/Film. He believes the sociological impact of radio for local community support is more powerful than the Internet or any other technology.



Donna L. Halper

Dr. Halper has spent more than 40 years in broadcasting and print journalism, and has often been called upon to comment on trends in media. She has made guest appearances on PBS, NPR, the History Channel and local radio and television stations. While she was in radio, she discovered the rock group RUSH, who dedicated two albums to her, and she appears in a 2010 documentary about them. She is a director of the Massachusetts Broadcasters Hall of Fame and recently published the book "Boston Radio 1920-2011."



William J. Macek

Macek, a nine-term Haverhill city councilor, has been on the board of the Massachusetts Broadcasters Association since 2007 and currently serves as radio chair. Since 2006 Macek has been owner of WPKZ, Fitchburg, 1280 AM and 105.3 FM. Previously he owned WMOO FM, Derby, Vt. and WIKE, Newport, Vt., and WINQ-FM, Winchendon, Mass. Previously, he was a professional radio announcer from 1973 to 2005 and founded Macek and Co. real estate in 1976. He has been an attorney in the general practice of business and family law since 1996 and is a member of the Massachusetts Bar Association.



Dan Kennedy,

Kennedy is a regular panelist on "Beat the Press," WGBH-TV's weekly roundtable program on media issues; maintains a weblog, "Media Nation;" and contributes articles to the Huffington Post and Harvard's Nieman Journalism Lab. From 2007 to 2011, he wrote a weekly online column for The Guardian's "Comment is Free America" section.



Previously, he served as the Boston Phoenix's media columnist from 1994 through 2005 and remained a contributor until the newspaper's closing earlier this year. While at the Phoenix, he was the recipient of the 2001 Rowse Award and the Association of Alternative Newsweeklies' 1999 award for media reporting.

Kennedy was also a reporter for The Daily Times Chronicle, Woburn, Mass., for 10 years. He has published two books, "Little People: Learning to See the World Through My Daughter's Eyes" and "The Wired City."

Marc Lemay

Lemay is heard weekdays on WHAV as host of Greater Lawrence Family Health Center's "Health Minute." He entered radio as a 13-year-old intern at WALE AM 1400, Fall River.



When the station was sold in 1989, he was there to sign off WALE one night and sign on again as WHTB the next morning.

In 1990, Lemay moved to WHAV as news director. After three years at WHAV, Lemay went to work in other areas of communications including Yellow Pages, newspaper publishing, graphic design, television (public access) and Internet.

In 2004, Lemay returned to radio when he joined WCCM. There, he served as afternoon drive host, production director, IT manager, morning show news anchor/co-host and finally morning show host.

"Corporate FM: The Killing of Local Commercial Radio" features interviews with Jewel, The Flaming Lips' Wayne Coyne, former Butt Hole Surfers manager Tom Bunch and a wide array of DJs and experts who have witnessed radio's destruction from the inside. McKinney warns "the death of privately operated local radio stations is not just destroying the stations that are bought up, but damning the future of all stations on the dial—the public and college stations as well. The entire medium of radio becomes threatened when there are only two stations worth listening to."

The WHAV call letters have been associated with local broadcasting since 1947. WHAV is today operated by Public Media of New England Inc., a not-for-profit corporation. Since 2004, the call has served the Merrimack Valley's pioneer Internet radio station at [WHAV.net](http://www.WHAV.net) and a number of public access cable television stations in Andover, Haverhill and Methuen, and Plaistow and Sandown, N.H. The station is also heard over AM 1640 in northern Haverhill and Plaistow, N.H.

Las elecciones para la alcaldía de Lawrence, III ¿Podrá la oposición obtener la victoria?

En una democracia, ningún político puede creerse invencible. Desde el momento que lo crea, estará destinado a fracasar. Ese ha sido el error de algunos políticos latinos de la Ciudad de Lawrence.

Un candidato efectivo es aquel que no da lugar para triunfalismos. A lo interno de su campaña, se ve a sí mismo con humildad, y trabajar como si estuviera arrancando por primera vez. Siempre enfocado en lo básico. Y con la determinación de llegar en primer lugar. Claro está, proyectando hacia afuera la percepción de que será el ganador. El votante latino se inclina por el candidato que percibe como triunfador.

Esa es la imagen que ha proyectado el Alcalde William Lantigua. Sin embargo, no olvidemos que la imagen no representa necesariamente la realidad.

¿Cómo surgió entonces esta percepción de un William invencible? Desafortunadamente, Marcos Devers, hoy representante estatal, contribuyó a crear ese mito cuando trató de desafiarlo para la posición de representante, en las primarias demócratas, el 19 de septiembre del 2006. Se lo advertimos a Marcos, pero no escuchó. Ni siquiera porque lo habían sacado de la boleta electoral, aun así, quiso continuar desafiándolo, esta vez, usando boletas con pegatinas (stickers). El sentido común nos decía, que si atraer al electorado a votar en unas primarias era difícil, mucho más lo era, lograr que votaran con pegatinas cuando eso no era parte de la cultura política de los latinos y, sobre todo, no había los recursos logísticos y económicos para poder tener éxito.

Por el infantilismo político de Marcos en ese entonces, y su creencia de ser

invencible, contribuyó a que perdiera la imagen que proyectaba de ser el político latino más fuerte y con mayores posibilidades de convertirse en el alcalde de la ciudad, para las elecciones del 2009. Incluso, la opinión de muchos era que a William debían dejarlo como representante, y a Marcos proyectarlo para la alcaldía.

Mientras William aseguraba su representación en el estado, su candidato para gobernador, Thomas Reilly, quedó en tercer lugar en esas primarias, siendo derrotado abrumadoramente por Deval Patrick. Esa derrota de William pasó desapercibida por la quietud de Devers. Esa no había sido ni la primera ni la última de las derrotas obtenidas por Lantigua, apoyando o dirigiendo activamente candidaturas locales o estatales. Veamos otros ejemplos.

Su candidata Eileen Donoghue perdió contra Niki Tsongas, en las primarias demócratas, de las elecciones especiales para el 5to distrito congresional de Massachusetts, el 4 de septiembre del 2007. Tampoco tuvo éxitos otra de sus candidatas en las primarias presidenciales demócratas del 2008, ganándose Barack Obama a Hilary Clinton.

Una elección que tuvo mucha repercusión en los periódicos de mayor circulación, fue cuando William perdió su puesto en la directiva del Partido Demócrata del estado, a manos del concejal de 25 años de edad, Kendrys Vásquez, el 6 de marzo del 2012.

Estos ejemplos demuestran que el mito del William invencible podría ser cuestionado de manera inteligente por la oposición. Depende de cómo lo hagan.

Lo paradójico es, que Devers ha estado siempre del lado de los que le ganaron a Lantigua. Esos dos políticos casi siempre han estado en bandos opuestos. Son considerados como el aceite y el agua. Tienen dos visiones y filosofías políticas diferentes. No nos ha extrañado para nada, que una vez más, Marcos haya decidido enfrentarlo. Son los eternos rivales en la política lawrenciana.

La euforia de muchos conocidos que se oponen al alcalde llega a veces a lo inverosímil. Su infantilismo los lleva a creer que es posible derrotarlo en las preliminares del 17 de septiembre. ¡Qué ilusos! Pero aunque no tenga el apoyo económico como antes, por la campaña negativa a su alrededor, en verdad, William no necesita mucho dinero para dirigir una campaña electoral; lo más importante ya lo ha creado con muchos votantes latinos: imagen pública. Como dice la expresión española: "hasta los perros lo conocen". Al menos que se vea obligado a contrarrestar una campaña negativa hacia su persona. Tenemos el presentimiento de que habrá una guerra sicológica en esta contienda para obtener votos.

Quienes tienen que lograr suficiente dinero son los candidatos opositores. Y tienen posibilidades para obtenerlo, no sólo en Lawrence, sino también en otros pueblos y ciudades donde tienen una opinión muy negativa de nuestro alcalde. Incluso, lograr ahí, voluntarios que vengan a sumarse a sus campañas.

Can the opposition obtain victory?

In a democracy no politician can claim to be invincible. From the moment he or she believes so they are destined to failure. This has been the error of some political leaders in the City of Lawrence. An effective candidate or politician is one that doesn't buy into a self-serving attitude of invincibility.

Within his or her campaign, they should always view themselves with humility and always work as if it was his or her first campaign. Candidates should always be focused on the basics and never lose sight of the fundamentals of a political campaign. However, to the general public the candidate should always give the assurance that his or her campaign will be the winning one because of their work ethics. The Latino voters will always be more inclined to vote for a perceived winner.

This is the image that Mayor Lantigua has projected. However, we cannot forget that what is projected is not necessarily the reality.

How then did the perception of Mayor Lantigua as invincible come to be? Unfortunately, Marcos Devers, currently State Representative, contributed in creating the spark for this to happen when he tried challenging then State Representative William Lantigua in the primary elections on September 19, 2006. We warned Marcos about it, but he wouldn't listen. Even after they took him off the official ballot, even still, he wanted to continue to challenge Lantigua. He insisted and decided to run a sticker campaign. Common sense tells us that it is hard enough trying to get out the vote in a regular primary election, so of course it would be much more difficult running on stickers, especially when needing to inform the Latino voter population who culturally are not accustomed to voting for a sticker candidate. More importantly was the fact that Marcos did not have the logistics or the economical means to carry out a sticker campaign in order to be successful.



in home-grown renewable energy and energy efficiency projects like AEP.

The program also reflects our commitment to the environment, through the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. By the numbers, the 25 percent energy and emissions reductions we have targeted across all AEP sites will eliminate an estimated 135,000 metric tons of greenhouse gas emissions each year. That's the equivalent of taking more than 28,000 passenger vehicles off the road or using some 313,000 fewer barrels of oil annually!

The benefits are not limited to reducing costs and protecting our environment. AEP will create as many as 4,000 new jobs in the fast-growing clean energy sector, reflecting the Administration's commitment to expanding employment and economic development opportunities.

The 700 sites slated for upgrades include state-run skating rinks, police barracks, courthouses, entire college campuses, and even the State House, comprising more than 4,000 buildings and 58 million square feet of property. The work will range from simple fixes, like retrofitting lights, to major overhauls that could include installation of updated heating and cooling systems, better insulation, and clean renewable energy systems.

In Lawrence and Haverhill, for example, energy and water upgrades to Northern Essex Community College will include interior and exterior lighting replacements, lighting controls, door weatherization, hot water system improvements, water

conservation, and energy management upgrades. The upgrades will lead to annual savings of \$350,000 and reduce electricity consumption on campus by some 3.2 million kWh per year, or 41% of total campus electric consumption. The electricity reduction is equivalent to the annual electric consumption of 394 Massachusetts homes, while the overall project will reduce annual emissions of greenhouse gases by an estimated 1,060 metric tons, equivalent to removing 221 cars from the road each year.

For a project this comprehensive to be successful, everybody has to be on board. The Patrick-Murray Administration has asked agencies from across state government and other stakeholders to work together to make these projects a reality. The Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance, the Department of Energy Resources, the Executive Office of Labor and Workforce Development, public higher education campuses, the Massachusetts Departments of Conservation and Recreation and Transportation, and the electric and gas utilities are all key partners in the AEP.

The initiative is driven by the goals of this Administration's Leading by Example (LBE) Program, which set aggressive targets for state facilities regarding greenhouse gas emission reductions, energy efficiency, renewable energy, green buildings and water conservation. Both LBE and AEP are supporting the statewide emissions reduction goals laid out in the

2010 Massachusetts Clean Energy and Climate Plan for 2020.

These investments have helped earn Massachusetts the No. 1 in the nation ranking for energy efficiency by the American Council for an Energy Efficient Economy for the last two years. We are committed to continuing to earn that designation, and build on successes to date, through programs like AEP that are contributing to a cleaner energy future for Massachusetts.

Honoring Old Glory on Flag Day



The Flag Manufacturers Association of America (FMAA) proudly celebrates the 233rd birthday of the U.S. flag on Flag Day, June 14, and encourages all Americans to join in the celebration and honor our nation's great symbol by flying their American flag during National Flag Week.

On June 14, 1777, within a year of achieving independence, the Founding Fathers gave the United States its first symbol with the message, "The Flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white, that the Union be 13 stars, white on a blue field representing a new constellation."


The idea of an annual day specifically celebrating the flag is believed to have first originated in 1885. Bernard J. Cigrand, a school teacher in Fredonia, Wisconsin, arranged for his pupils to observe June 14 as the "birthday of the Flag", since that was the date the Continental Congress had officially adopted the Stars and Stripes as the Flag of the United States. The first observance of Flag Day included a small American Flag that stood in a bottle on the teacher's schoolroom desk.

Flag Day was officially established by the Proclamation of President Woodrow Wilson on June 14, 1916, calling for a nation-wide observance. While Flag Day was celebrated in various communities for years after Wilson's proclamation, it was not until August 3, 1949 that President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th of each year as National Flag Day.

Hola, queridos lectores de Rumbo. Por fin hace calor de verdad. ¡Yo estaba a punto de desesperarme! Por supuesto, cada año tenemos problemas cuando empezamos a usar el aire acondicionado aquí en la biblioteca, porque tan pronto se pone agradable afuera, aquí el calor se vuelve horrible. Espero que podamos resolver este problema en los próximos días. Por el momento, no voy a dejar que nada me impida disfrutar del mes de junio.

Mi marido Norm y yo fuimos a ver la nueva versión de The Great Gatsby el otro día. Para ser honesta, tengo sentimientos encontrados al respecto. Haverhill's City Budget

Haverhill Mayor James Fiorentini presented the FY'14 budget to the City Council and said the city is in the best financial shape since 2008. But still, the City must increase property taxes by 2-1/2%, the maximum allowed by law to balance the budget without decimating services.

Please read the story on page 7 where he explains that the \$162.6 million budget went up about \$8.2 million, compared to this year's budget. Without this increase, they will have to make cuts in the schools and police departments. Also, there will be no money to improve parks and playgrounds or bolster the city's critical cash reserve.

Lawrence City Budget

Mayor William Lantigua presented a balanced FY'14 budget to the City Council last Tuesday. To the surprise of many people, there won't be any layoffs of police officers or firefighters. It includes a property tax increase which is going to be reason enough for many others to go on a rampage.

Can you imagine the criticisms if it included the loss of safety personnel? We can't win!

I don't hear complaints from Haverhill about the tax increase and they even pay for their school department budget unlike Lawrence that gets it from the State.

Justo García's arrest and the garage situation

While we allow the legal system to take its course, we should not be so quick to point fingers and spread rumors. Some of them are heard so often that end up in the

newspapers and that legitimizes them. It has been reported that three years ago Mayor Lantigua changed the method of payment at the garage to "only cash accepted" but I found two customers who attest that Justo Garcia refused to accept any payment that was not a check.

Gilda Duran was explaining to me that she always pays with a personal check when Carmenza Bruff joined us. Gilda asked her how she pays for parking at the garage and she told us about a recent incident.

Carmenza went to her native Colombia on vacation a few months ago and forgot paying for parking for the upcoming month. When she returned, her card was blocked. She spoke to Justo and tried paying in cash because she had left her checkbook at home. Mr. Garcia let her in and told her that she could bring it the next day. "I know you well; you can bring the check tomorrow because I cannot accept cash."

Since it was a contradiction with what had been published, I asked them if I could use their names. They both agreed but Carmenza said, "You certainly can because, if I am ever accused falsely, I hope somebody raises a hand to tell the truth."

Some day we'll know the truth. In the mean time, the Eagle-Tribune and Boston Globe have published several articles with very serious accusations against him.

Police action when we need it?

A few days ago a woman attacked Mayor Lantigua in front of a liquor store. Michelle Mitchell from Derry, New Hampshire was trying to slap a drink in a paper bag from his hand asking him, "What are you drinking?"

She drove away and was quickly arrested by Lawrence Police in North Lawrence. She was charged with assault and battery.

That got me thinking about the incident

last April, when Antonio Arevalo vandalized the mayor's car by loading it with trash and stuffing lottery tickets in the muffler and putting rock salt in the gas tank. The damages were upward of \$3,000, although the police report says that Mr. Arevalo called it a "childish prank." Blocking the muffler with the lottery tickets is attempted murder, if you ask me.

He was caught thanks to video cameras in the neighborhood and he admitted to it but he was sent home and noting has happened and no charges have been filed against Mr. Arevalo.

That also reminds me that since the beginning of 2010 it was discovered that the former employees of the Information Technology Department had stolen over \$9.7 million and nothing has been heard about that case, either.

But the television cameras were waiting for Justo Garcia to be arrested. They were also at the donut shop at six o'clock in the morning when they went to arrest James Stokes. I wonder who called them.

China: Raíces del Oriente


El Movimiento Pro Cultura (MPC) realizó exitosamente su cuarta entrega del espectáculo cultural denominado "Raíces", el cual fue celebrado a casa llena el pasado sábado, 4 de mayo, en el auditorio de la Escuela Intermedia South Lawrence East, de la Ciudad de Lawrence, Massachusetts.

En una maravillosa combinación de movimientos similares a ballet, gimnasia y acrobacia, el programa de este año fue el mejor de todos los que el Movimiento Pro Cultura ha presentado. Desde el colorido de los trajes, la música y las gentiles sonrisas de las bailarinas, disfrutamos de más de dos horas de un espectáculo que pocas personas tienen la facilidad de ver.

Esta vez, el evento cultural fue dedicado a exponer música y danzas oriundas del continente asiático, representado por China, un país que cuenta con casi 5 mil años de existencia sobre la faz del planeta. China estuvo siendo representado magistralmente por seis organizaciones y tres músicos, un dúo y una solista, cuyo nivel de profesionalidad dejó agradablemente sorprendida a una audiencia que aplaudió constantemente cada pieza ejecutada por estos excelentes artistas.

Las compañías de danza participantes fueron: Chinese Folk Art Workshop, American Chinese Art Society, Wang YMCA, Cambridge Center for Chinese Culture and Dance Revelasian. La música tuvo su representación en las manos de los maestros Hongwei Gao, en la ejecución del Er Hu y de Ping Li, en la ejecución del Dulcimer, ambos virtuosos de sus respectivos instrumentos. A estos destacados músicos siguió la participación de la "Guzheng & Dulcimer Youth Band", y para culminar esta impactante entrega, el segmento musical cerró con un "solo" de Dulcimer a cargo de Amy Huang, una destacada miembro de esta banda juvenil, quien ha ganado por dos años consecutivos el Concierto y Competencia Anual de Músicos de Instrumentos Chinos (2012 y 2013).

El espectáculo "China: Raíces del Oriente", título dado esta vez por el MPC a este evento anual, generó recaudaciones económicas que permitirán a esta organización sin fines de lucro, continuar con el programa de becas estudiantiles conque ha socorrido modestamente a estudiantes



de escasos recursos que se preparan para continuar con su educación académica en otros niveles de su carrera estudiantil.

La recaudación fue de cerca de \$4,500. Las becas serán cuatro de \$500: dos para la Lawrence Family Development Charter School y dos para Lawrence High School (INT y PFA). Además, donarán \$500 a los muchachos del departamento de teatro, para ayudarlos con el viaje que harán a Escocia para participar en un festival con una obra relativa a la Ciudad de Lawrence y sus inmigrantes.

La mayor satisfacción de la noche fue cada vez que miré hacia atrás y vi que había

personas asistentes de pie por la forma abrumadora conque nuestra comunidad respondió. Este es el mejor ejemplo de cómo nosotros podemos contribuir al progreso de nuestros jóvenes.

China: Roots of the East

The Pro Culture Movement (PCM) successfully conducted its fourth installment of the cultural show called "Raíces" (Roots), which was held to a full house on Saturday, May 4, in the South Lawrence East Middle School auditorium in Lawrence, Massachusetts.

In a wonderful combination of movements similar to ballet, gymnastics and acrobatics, the program this year was the best one presented by the PCM. From the colorful costumes, the music and the gentle smiles of the dancers, we enjoyed over two hours of a show that few people have the opportunity to see.

This time, the cultural event was dedicated to expose the music and dances native of Asia, represented by China, a country with almost 5000 years of existence on the face of the planet. China was brilliantly portrayed by six organizations and three musicians, a duet and solo, whose level of professionalism left pleasantly surprised an audience that constantly applauded each piece performed by these excellent artists.

The dance companies participating were: Chinese Folk Art Workshop, American Chinese Art Society, Wang YMCA, Cambridge Center for Chinese Culture and Dance Revelasian. The music had its representation in the hands of masters Hongwei Gao, playing the Er Hu and Ping Li with the Dulcimer both virtuosos of their respective instruments. These outstanding musicians were followed by the "Guzheng & Dulcimer Youth Band", and to end this amazing delivery, they closed their musical segment with a solo performance of Dulcimer by Amy Huang, a prominent member of this young band, who has won for two consecutive years the Annual Concert and Competition of Chinese Instruments and Musicians (2012 and 2013).

The funds generated by the "China: Roots of the East" event will allow this nonprofit organization, to continue the scholarship program that has helped students of modest resources getting ready to continue their academic education at other levels.

They raised about \$4,500 and will be giving out four \$500 scholarships: two for the Lawrence Family Development Charter School and two for Lawrence High School (INT and PFA). In addition, they will donate \$500 to the students of the theater department, to help with their trip to Scotland to participate in a theatre festival with a performance about the City of Lawrence and its immigrants.

The greatest satisfaction of the night was every time I looked back and saw that there were people in attendance standing, a sign that our community responded overwhelmingly. This is the best example of how we can contribute to the progress of our youth.

The positive reactions from the audience have committed PCM once again to continue this annual cultural delivery, with the usual challenge to overcome the most recent one. The PCM has gladly accepted this challenge, so that already has begun work corresponding to the fifth version of "Roots".



ELECTIONS

Both Marcos' political immaturity in those days, and his belief that he was invincible, contributed to his loss of the image he wanted to create that he was the political figure with the most strength and the most capabilities to become mayor of the City of Lawrence in the Mayoral election of 2009. And interestingly enough, at the time it was the opinion of many was that William should stay on as Representative and Marcos become the mayoral candidate.

While William secured his position as State Representative, his candidate for governor, Thomas Reilly, came in third place in the primary elections, being defeated by a sizable margin by Deval Patrick. The defeat of William's candidate went unnoticed due to Marcos' quixotic thinking.

This was not the first, nor probably will it be the last political defeat that William will encounter supporting or running political campaigns locally or at the state level. There are past examples.

For one, William's candidate Eileen Donoghue lost against Niki Tsongas in the Democratic primaries for the special elections for the 5th Congressional District of Massachusetts held September 4, 2007. For another, he also wasn't victorious backing another candidate, this time in the primaries for the Presidency of the United States in the Democratic primary in 2008. Barack Obama won over Hilary Clinton.

One of the elections that had major consequences and also received lots of media attention was when William lost his elected position on the Democratic Party State Committee to a young City Councilor, 25-year-old Kendrys Vasquez on March 6, 2012.

These examples demonstrate that the fiction that William has created of being invincible can be thrown into doubt depending on how an intelligent political strategy is employed by his opposition.

The paradox is that Devers has always been on the winning side of campaigns and/or supported those candidates that have beaten Lantigua's. These two politicians have been on opposite sides most of the time. They are like oil and water. Politically speaking they have two different visions and philosophies. This is why it does not surprise us that once again Marcos has decided to challenge William for the Mayoral position in Lawrence. They are the extreme political rivals in the City of Lawrence.

The optimism of many of the Mayor's opponents has led them to believe that he can be defeated in the September 2013 primaries... How imaginative! This can only be possible if an unforeseen situation occurs influencing the political paradox that is the City of Lawrence. Presently we can't see this happening.

Another factor that leads the Mayor's opponents to feel convinced that Lantigua can be defeated is their argument that he has limited financial resources and can't raise the significant amount of money needed to sustain a Mayoral campaign. This is only true to a certain point. He can count on the support of a portion of the individuals that he gave jobs to while in office and also some small business owners that support him. Even though he will not have the monetary support as from before William does not need a lot of money to mount a political campaign, the most important part of which he has already created with many Latino

voters - political image. There is a saying in Spanish that applies here: "Even the dogs know him". At the very least he will be forced to counter negative campaigning to his person. We have a feeling that there will be a psychological battle in this race to win votes.

The ones that have to raise sufficient campaign funds are the opponents. And they have a chance to get it, not only from Lawrence, but also from other towns and cities where some people have a very negative view of our Mayor. There are also volunteers from out of town who will join the opposing campaigns.

If the primaries were to happen today in Lawrence, it would be difficult to determine who can win in the final election in November due to the lack of public surveys. Some of the recall participants consider that since more than 5000 voters signed the petition, Lantigua's days are numbered. However, it is not as easy as many of these folks think. The Mayor has the advantage of running as an incumbent. There are also several months left before the November elections where there is still ample time for many things to happen that can affect the outcome of the elections both positively or negatively for all the contenders.

We are sure about one thing: non-Latino voters will come out to vote in large numbers in this fall's election, different from 2009, when some didn't pay much attention to it, thinking that the elections then were a matter to be decided by Latino voters. However, this time around the majority of the media outlets will remind them that it is their moral duty to go out to vote. The Latino candidate that is able to

win the majority of the non-Latino sector will have the best opportunity to win the election in November.

But which of the Mayor's opponents will have the best chances?

El alcalde lleva como ventaja ser el titular. Y quedan varios meses todavía de aquí a noviembre, cuando eventualidades podrían pasar afectando positiva o negativamente a los contendientes.

De una cosa sí estamos seguros: Que el votante no latino saldrá a votar en masas en noviembre, diferente al 2009, cuando algunos de ellos no le prestaron atención porque consideraban que eso era un asunto a decidir por los latinos. Pero esta vez, los periódicos de mayor circulación del área les recordarán permanentemente a esos votantes que es su deber moral salir a votar. El candidato latino que en noviembre logre atraerse a ese sector, tiene una gran posibilidad de ganar las elecciones. Pero, ¿quién de los retadores podría tener más posibilidades?
