# Rivera declara victoria sobre Lantigua

Al día siguiente de la publicación de los resultados provisionales de las elecciones celebradas el 5 de noviembre, el candidato Daniel Rivera convocó a una conferencia de prensa frente al ayuntamiento donde rodeado de prensa y miembros de su campaña reafirmó su victoria sobre el titular.

Rivera, un concejal de dos de términos se adjudicó la victoria basado en los números no oficiales donde muestra que ha superado al Alcalde Lantigua por 60 votos. Rivera obtuvo 7625 mientras que Lantigua recibió 7565.

En la conferencia de prensa Rivera leyó la siguiente declaración: "Yo los he convocado por dos razones. En primer lugar, decir a todos los ciudadanos de Lawrence que trabajaré incansablemente para unir verdaderamente esta ciudad. Tenemos grandes retos que afrontar aquí en Lawrence. Estoy listo. También contamos con el beneficio de muchos activos - nuestra gente, ante todo. Estoy correctamente y

# Rivera declares victory over Lantigua

The day after the publication of the provisional results of the election held November 5th, the candidate Daniel Rivera called a press conference outside City Hall where surrounded by press and members of his campaign reaffirmed his victory over the incumbent.

Rivera, a two-term councilor has declared his victory based on unofficial numbers which shows that he has beaten Mayor William Lantigua by 60 votes. Rivera received 7,625 to Lantigua's 7,565.

At the press conference Rivera read this statement: "I have called us together for two reasons. First, to tell all the citizens of Lawrence that I will work tirelessly to truly unite this city. We have great challenges to face here in Lawrence. I am ready. We also have the benefit of many assets – our people first among them. I will properly and professionally get to work.

"This brings me to the second thing I wish to relate. I will be assembling a transition team to help heal and help this

# Aún sin ganador

Tradicionalmente, la noche de elecciones sabíamos cuáles eran los candidatos electos, siempre basados en resultados no oficiales. No ha sido así este año. Han pasado 3 días y a pesar de que el campo de Daniel Rivera clama victoria, el campo de William Lantigua aún no se da por vencido.

La razón no es solo que los separan 60 votos, sino una serie de irregularidades ocurridas durante las elecciones, tales como el mal funcionamiento de algunas máquinas así como un grupo de 54 votantes a los cuales se les permitió votar aunque sus nombres no aparecían en las listas y ahora hay que determinar si deben ser aceptados o no.

A esto hay que añadir los votos en ausencia que aún pueden arribar antes del día 15 de este mes. Conocedores del sistema electoral local, estiman que nada de esto alterará los resultados conocidos, aunque puede haber sorpresas.

Afortunadamente, no hemos visto nunca antes darle la importancia que al resultado de estas elecciones se le está dando, tanto en la forma ordenada que se efectuaron sin incidentes notables con la excepción del mal funcionamiento de algunas máquinas, algo que nadie puede prevenir ni evitar.

Ambos candidatos están siendo representados en el proceso que se está llevando a cabo, que está bajo la lupa del Departamento Estatal de Elecciones el cual ha enviado personal para supervisar todas las operaciones, así como la Policía de Lawrence que ha mantenido guardia las 24 horas del día de todo el material electoral.

Esperamos que, cuando se dé el resultado final, el ganador, sea Lantigua o Rivera, este sea aceptado sin discusión alguna.

# Still without a winner

Traditionally, on election night, we knew who the elected candidates were, always based on unofficial results. That has not happened this year. It's been three days and although Daniel Rivera's supporters are claiming victory, William Lantigua's are not giving up.

The reason is not only that 60 votes separate them, but a series of minor irregularities during the election, such as malfunctioning of some machines as well as a group of 54 voters who were allowed to vote even though their names were not on the voting list and now have to determine whether they should be accepted or not.

To this must be added the absentee ballots, if any, still due to arrive before the 15th of this month. Knowledgeable in the local electoral system consider that none of this will alter the known results, although there may be surprises.

Fortunately, we have not seen before so much attention given to the outcome of an election as this one is getting, not only for the orderly way they were conducted, uneventful except for the malfunction of some machines, something that no one can prevent or avoid.

Both candidates are being represented in the process that is taking place, which is under scrutiny of the State Elections Department which sent staff to oversee all operations and Lawrence Police who has maintained a 24-hour guard of all election materials.

We hope that when finally, the winner is announced, Lantigua or Rivera, this is accepted without question.

Al día siguiente de la publicación de los resultados provisionales de las elecciones a la alcaldía de Lawrence, el Alcalde William Lantigua llamó a una conferencia de prensa afuera de su oficina de campaña, donde rodeado de su abogado Salim Tabit y miembros de su campaña dijo que los votos aún están siendo contados, por lo que es prematuro declarar quién es el ganador.

Según explicó el Abogado Tabit a los miembros de la prensa reunidos frente a la oficina de campaña de Lantigua, hay unos 54 votos provisionales de individuos que se presentaron a votar y sus nombres no aparecían en las listas a los cuales se les permitió votar pendiente a que sus nombres aparecieran en los registros de votantes que se encuentran en el Departamento de Elecciones.

A esto hay que añadirle los votos en ausencia que aún no se han contado ya que no han arribado al Departamento de Elecciones. Según el Departamento de correos los votos en ausencia echados al correo el mismo día de las elecciones, 5 de noviembre, desde distintas partes del territorio nacional o internacional tienen hasta 10 días para arribar a Lawrence, o sea, hasta el 15 de noviembre.

Para garantizar la limpieza del proceso electoral, todas estas operaciones se están llevando a cabo bajo el escrutinio de miembros del Departamento de Estado, los miembros del Board of Registrars y los

# "Not so fast," said Lantigua

The day after the publication of the provisional results of the elections for mayor of Lawrence, Mayor William Lantigua called a press conference outside his campaign office, where surrounded by his lawyer Salim Tabit and members of his campaign, he said the votes are still being counted, so it is premature to declare who the winner is.

As explained by Attorney Tabit to members of the press gathered outside Lantigua's campaign office, there are 54 provisional ballots from individuals who turned out to vote and their names were not on the lists but were allowed to vote pending that their names appear on the voting records in the Department of Elections.

To this, the absentee ballots which have not been counted yet must be added as many have not arrived at the Election Department. According to the Post Office, absentee ballots cast and mailed on Election Day, November 5th, from different parts of the country or abroad have up to 10 days to arrive in Lawrence or until November 15.

To ensure clean elections, all these operations are being carried out under the scrutiny of members of the Department of State, members of the Lawrence Board of Registrars, lawyers from both camps, Sal Tabit and David Torrisi representing Lantigua and Rivera, respectively, and members of the Lawrence Police Department.

After the press conference, Mayor Lantigua moved inside the campaign office and spoke to a group of supporters gathered in the room about what had happened outside.





# La Cámara votó promulgar leyes de Reforma del Welfare

*DiZoglio: "Tenemos que combinar las reformas con vías hacia la autosuficiencia."*

La Representante Estatal Diana DiZoglio (D- Methuen) se ha unido a sus colegas en la Cámara de Representantes de Massachusetts en el voto para aprobar la legislación adicional de reforma de bienestar público diseñada tanto para reducir el fraude en el sistema y ayudar a los beneficiarios de asistencia social en su lucha por encontrar trabajo y poner fin a su dependencia de la asistencia pública.

Entre las disposiciones de la legislación están la represión de los residentes de fuera del estado recogiendo pagos de asistencia social y los traficantes de cupones para alimentos. Los beneficios serán suspendidos por los destinatarios que no notifiquen al estado de un cambio de dirección.

El proyecto de ley incluye una disposición que obliga a los receptores adultos que no están inscritos a tiempo completo en una escuela secundaria o un programa educacional con el propósito de buscar empleo a través de un nuevo

programa Camino a la autosuficiencia, diseñado para colocar a los recipientes del bienestar público en un trabajo con los empresarios regionales. Según la legislación, los solicitantes adultos deben realizar una búsqueda de empleo inicial antes de recibir asistencia en efectivo y prueba de ello debe ser proporcionada al estado.

La nueva legislación viene de la mano de medidas de reforma del bienestar aprobadas en el Presupuesto FY'14. Entre las reformas aprobadas luego fueron el requisito de tarjetas EBT para incluir una foto de identificación y la creación de una junta de verificación estatal y Grupo de elegibilidad para investigar y prevenir el fraude y el abuso de los beneficios públicos.

"Tenemos que combinar las reformas mientras que adquieren medios de autosuficiencia", dijo DiZoglio. "Habiendo co-auspiciado varios proyectos de ley para reformar el sistema de asistencia social me alegra de ver que estas medidas pasan junto a componentes clave destinados a fomentar la independencia económica y el éxito entre las familias que luchan en nuestras comunidades."

# House Votes to Enact Welfare Reform Legislation



*DiZoglio: "We Must Combine Reforms with Pathways to Self-Sufficiency"*

State Rep. Diana DiZoglio (D-Methuen) has joined her colleagues in the Massachusetts House of Representatives to vote to enact additional welfare reform legislation designed to both reduce fraud in the system and assist welfare recipients in their struggle to find jobs and end their reliance on public assistance.

Among the legislation's provisions are crackdowns on out-of-state residents collecting welfare payments and food

stamp traffickers. Benefits will be suspended for recipients who fail to notify the Commonwealth of an address change.

The bill includes a provision that mandates adult recipients who are not enrolled full-time in a secondary school or educational program to seek employment through a new Pathways to Self-Sufficiency program, designed to place welfare recipients in jobs with regional employers. Under the legislation, adult applicants must conduct an initial job search prior to receiving cash assistance and evidence of this must be provided to the Commonwealth.

The new legislation comes on the heels of welfare reform measures passed under the FY'14 Budget. Among the reforms then passed were the requiring of EBT cards to include photo IDs and creation of a state verification and eligibility Task Force to investigate and prevent fraud and the abuse of public benefits.

"We must combine reforms with pathways to self-sufficiency," said DiZoglio. "Having co-sponsored several bills to reform our welfare system, I am glad to see these measures pass alongside key components meant to foster economic independence and success among struggling families in our communities."





# Robo a empujones

# La FDA está por completar la eliminación de los inhaladores a base de clorofluorocarbono

La Administración de Alimentos y Medicamentos (FDA, por sus siglas en inglés) completará la eliminación gradual de todos los productos inhaladores médicos que contienen clorofluorocarbonos (CFC) para el 31 de diciembre de 2013. Este esfuerzo se lleva a cabo en cumplimiento con un tratado internacional de protección de la capa de ozono establecido para descontinuar la producción de numerosas sustancias a escala mundial, entre ellas los clorofluorocarbonos, que contribuyen a la reducción del ozono.

Aunque la mayoría de los productos inhaladores que contienen clorofluorocarbonos ya han sido descontinuados por la FDA, dos aún existen en el mercado: el aerosol inhalador Combivent y el Maxair Autohaler. No obstante, estos productos ya no estarán disponibles después de fines de este año. Quienes padecen asma o la enfermedad pulmonar obstructiva crónica (EPOC) y usan estos inhaladores deben consultar con su profesional de la salud para que les prescriba un tratamiento alternativo.

Los inhaladores son productos cruciales para quienes sufren de asma o de EPOC. En los Estados Unidos, más de 25 millones de personas padecen de asma, una enfermedad que afecta las vías respiratorias en los pulmones y puede ocasionar tos, problemas para respirar, respiración sibilante y opresión o dolor en el pecho. Además, 15 millones de personas han sido diagnosticadas con EPOC, una grave enfermedad pulmonar degenerativa. Los síntomas pueden incluir opresión en el pecho, tos crónica y exceso de flema.

"Los clorofluorocarbonos se usaban como propulsores para expeler el fármaco de los inhaladores y que los pacientes pudieran inhalar la medicina", señaló el Dr. Badrul Chowdhury, director de la División de Productos Pulmonares, de Alergia y Reumatología del Centro para la Evaluación e Investigación de Medicamentos de la FDA. "Por más de dos décadas, la FDA y la EPA [Agencia de Protección Ambiental de los Estados Unidos] han colaborado para descontinuar los clorofluorocarbonos en los inhaladores; un proceso que incluye la participación del público, comisiones consultivas, los fabricantes y grupos interesados".

La mayoría de los inhaladores que usaban clorofluorocarbonos ya han sido descontinuados por la FDA. El inhalador que más se usaba —el inhalador a base de clorofluorocarbono albuterol— fue descontinuado en 2008 y reemplazado con inhaladores que usan propulsores llamados hidrofluorocarbonos (HFA). Hay muchos inhaladores seguros y eficaces disponibles para tratar los síntomas del asma y de la EPOC. Todos ellos necesitan receta médica, misma que debe prescribir un profesional de la salud acreditado (un médico, un asistente médico o una enfermera practicante).

"La colaboración de la EPA y la FDA ha facilitado una transición segura y gradual a los inhaladores sin clorofluorocarbonos en los Estados Unidos", afirmó Drusilla Hufford, directora de la Sección de Protección Estratosférica de la Oficina de Aire y Radiación de la EPA. "Esta medida representa una contribución importante al esfuerzo global por reparar la capa protectora de ozono de la Tierra y salvar millones de vidas mediante la prevención del cáncer de piel".

Los clorofluorocarbonos dañan la capa

de ozono, una delgada capa externa de la estratosfera que actúa como el escudo de la Tierra contra la radiación solar. Los Estados Unidos y la mayoría de los demás países firmaron un acuerdo en 1987, conocido como el Protocolo de Montreal Relativo a las Sustancias que Agotan el Ozono, para descontinuar la producción y uso mundiales de los clorofluorocarbonos. En los Estados Unidos, los clorofluorocarbonos han sido eliminados de productos tales como aerosoles para el cabello, desodorantes y sistemas de aire acondicionado.

La FDA, una agencia del Departamento de Salud y Servicios Humanos de los Estados Unidos, protege la salud pública asegurando la integridad, eficacia y seguridad de los medicamentos humanos y veterinarios, vacunas y otros productos biológicos para uso humano y dispositivos médicos. La agencia también es responsable por la protección y seguridad del suministro de alimentos de nuestra nación, cosméticos, suplementos dietéticos, productos que emiten radiación electrónica, y de regular los productos del tabaco.

## Elections are over!

There were funny moments, too. Although we complained about the personal attacks on the radio and the lack of respect given to candidates and their supporters, at times I had to laugh. A couple of days before the big day, Fifi Garcia (a Dan

Rivera supporter) said on her program on WCEC 1490 AM that she was going to do a survey among the listeners. When she started receiving calls praising Mayor Lantigua's work she said, "Why don't they call their own programs?" I still chuckle when I remember that.

I know I'm going to lose friends because of these comments. It happens after every election period. I guess some politicians don't really have thick skin.

## Amesbury: Another Lawrence?

A similar situation is taking place in Amesbury with Mayor-elect Ken Gray and Mayor Thatcher Kezer preparing for a recount. Gray won by 2 votes.

The Secretary of State's office is involved there just like in our city. Mayor Kezer also has until November 15 to decide if he wants the recount. The recount will include counting all ballots cast for all the candidates for mayor, blanks cast, all spoiled and unused ballots, and absentee ballot envelopes and applications.

## Veterans' Day

Another Veterans' Day that goes forgotten. We had a problem in Lawrence some years ago regarding the observance of Veterans Day and Memorial Day but it seemed to have improved recently.

Apparently, Jaime Melendez, the director of Veterans Services in Lawrence has become too comfortable in his position.

# NECC, MCC Sign Transfer Agreement with U.K. University

Northern Essex Community College and Middlesex Community College have signed an international-education articulation agreement with Bath Spa University (BSU) in Bath, England, that allows students to complete either a semester abroad or an associate degree in selected programs at either college then transfer to BSU to complete a bachelor's degree.

The memorandum of agreement between the three institutions was signed recently by NECC President Lane Glenn, Middlesex President Carole Cowan, and BSU Vice-Chancellor Christina Slade in a ceremony at MCC's historic John Nesmith House.

"This new agreement will open up study abroad opportunities for our students, who can now choose to study for a semester or for two years at Bath Spa University," says Yeager.

If a student elects to transfer after earning an associate degree, the NECC programs that will transfer include liberal arts: biology option, liberal arts: writing option, liberal arts: history option, liberal arts: journalism communications option; liberal arts: philosophy option, and liberal arts. Students can transfer into seven programs at BSU, including Creative Writing, History, Biology, Literature and Religions, Philosophy, and Ethics - with more programs to be added in the future.

"We have created a full transition to finishing a bachelor's degree at NECC for the liberal arts programs listed above," Yeager says.






