El festival se llevó a cabo el domingo 11 de agosto en el Derry-Salem Elks Lodge en Shadow Lake Road.

El Departamento de Policía de Salem trajo un crucero policial y una motocicleta al festival, y también organizó una mesa donde entregaron un kit de inicio para que los niños se convirtieran en policías o policías, insignias, pegatinas y bolígrafos.

Las familias también fueron bienvenidas a llevar kits de eliminación de medicamentos gratuitos en la mesa, que permiten a las personas deshacerse de los medicamentos recetados no utilizados y no deseados adecuadamente en el hogar. Los kits de eliminación de drogas fueron donados por la Rx Abuse Leadership Initiative (RALI) de New Hampshire, una coalición de grupos

locales, estatales y nacionales que trabajan para combatir la crisis de los opioides.

"Gracias al Derry-Salem Elks Lodge por organizar este gran evento e invitar al Departamento de Policía de Salem a asistir", dijo el oficial de Asuntos Comunitarios Brian Lawrence. "Fue una gran oportunidad para conectarnos con las familias locales y entregar kits de eliminación de drogas a padres y adultos junto con divertidas pegatinas, insignias y bolígrafos para niños".

El Departamento de Bomberos de Salem también asistió al evento y realizó una demostración de cómo los socorristas usan herramientas hidráulicas para sacar a las personas de un vehículo después de un accidente. El Departamento de Bomberos de Salem tuvo vehículos de emergencia en exhibición en el festival.

El evento también contó con un muro de escalada, tobogán, música y comida.

Salem Police Department Attends Derry-Salem Elks Lodge Kids Festival

Deputy Chief Joel Dolan is pleased to share that the Salem Police Department attended the Derry-Salem Elks Lodge's Kids Festival over the weekend.

The festival was held on Sunday, Aug. 11, at the Derry-Salem Elks Lodge on Shadow Lake Road.

The Salem Police Department brought a police cruiser and motorcycle to the festival, and also ran a table where they gave out a starter kit for children to become a policeman or police woman, badges, stickers and pens.

Families were also welcome to take free drug disposal kits at the table, which allow people to dispose of unused and unwanted prescription drugs properly at home. The drug disposal kits were donated by the Rx Abuse Leadership Initiative (RALI) of New Hampshire, a coalition of local, state and national groups working to combat the opioid

crisis.

"Thank you to the Derry-Salem Elks Lodge for hosting this great event, and inviting the Salem Police Department to attend," Community Affairs Officer Brian Lawrence said. "It was a great opportunity for us to connect with local families, and give out drug disposal kits to parents and adults along with fun stickers, badges and pens for kids."

The Salem Fire Department also attended the event, and performed a demonstration of how first responders use hydraulic tools to extricate people from a vehicle after a crash. The Salem Fire Department had emergency vehicles on display at the festival.

The event also featured a rock climbing wall, water slide, music and food.



Habitat aims to improve home affordability through new advocacy campaign



We are mobilizing to influence policy and system changes

As we celebrate our 35th year of serving local families, Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity (MVHFH) is delighted to have provided affordable housing for 104 families. These successes show us that, if we work together, we can make a difference in the struggle towards home affordability within our communities, but we still have work to do. It is more apparent than ever when you realize that, one in

every seven of our neighbors spend more than half of their income on housing. In the 22 communities where Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity builds, a single-family home has a Median price of \$437,000. Those renting can expect to pay an average of \$1350 a month. The living wage, which is the income level required to cover all necessary expenses in Merrimack Valley, for a family with 2-adults and 2-children, is \$6,284/month. Pre-school teachers only earn, on average, \$5,100/month. A nurse's assistant makes \$2,800/month. How do these families afford to live where they work? They don't,

and you will cross paths with one of these families today! The stability that housing should bring continues to remain out of reach for many people that call Merrimack Valley home.

Because of the urgent need for advocacy around affordable housing, Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity is joining Habitat organizations across the country to launch a new national advocacy campaign aimed at improving home affordability for 10 million people in the U.S. over the next five years.

Enfoque en el éxito: puntajes de los exámenes de AP

Estudiantes de Notre Dame Cristo Rey High School demuestran preparación universitaria

Los cursos AP (Advanced Placement) no son para los débiles de corazón. Brindan a los estudiantes de secundaria la oportunidad de obtener créditos universitarios antes de poner un pie en el campus, lo que significa que el trabajo es exigente y los exámenes son rigurosos. El College Board publicó recientemente los puntajes de todos los exámenes AP tomados por estudiantes de todo el mundo durante el año escolar 2018-2019.

Los estudiantes de Notre Dame Cristo Rey High School (NDCR) sacaron la pelota del parque.

Un puntaje del examen AP de 3 ó más (de 5) se considera un "puntaje de calificación". Los puntajes de calificación en los cursos AP demuestran la capacidad del estudiante para abordar el trabajo de nivel universitario, y casi todos los colegios y universidades en los EE.UU. otorgan crédito y colocación por estos puntajes. Así es como los estudiantes de NDCR se desempeñaron en varias áreas clave:

Juniors:

- El 100% de los estudiantes matriculados en el curso de español AP de NDCR (18) obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación en comparación con el 90% en Massachusetts y el 88.3% a nivel mundial: cinco estudiantes también recibieron el puntaje más alto posible de 5.
- Seis estudiantes obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación en el curso de Lenguaje y Composición AP de NDCR. Un estudiante obtuvo el puntaje más alto de 5.

Seniors:

- El 50% de los estudiantes inscritos en el extremadamente desafiante curso de literatura española de AP de NDCR obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación. Dos estudiantes obtuvieron el puntaje más alto de 5.
- El 40% de los estudiantes inscritos en el curso de Literatura Inglesa AP de NDCR obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación. Esta fue la primera vez que la escuela facilitó este curso.

En su anuncio de los puntajes a la

facultad y al personal de NDCR, el Dr. Anthony Zavagnin, el director de la escuela, dijo: "Se dedicó mucho tiempo, energía y amor a la planificación, enseñanza y calificación de estas clases. ¡Lo más importante, los maestros pudieron hacer que los estudiantes creyeran en sí mismos!"

Los puntajes de calificación obtenidos por los estudiantes en NDCR son especialmente impresionantes en comparación con los puntajes de calificación obtenidos por los estudiantes que asisten a la escuela secundaria pública en Lawrence:

- Literatura y composición en inglés AP: el 40% de los estudiantes de NDCR obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación, mientras que el 14.3% de los estudiantes de otras escuelas obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación.
- Literatura y cultura española AP: el 50% de los estudiantes de NDCR obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación, mientras que el 0% de los estudiantes de otras escuelas obtuvieron un puntaje de calificación.
- El 43% de los estudiantes de NDCR en los grados 11 y 12 participan en clases AP en comparación con el 19% de participación en la escuela secundaria pública en Lawrence.
- El 28% de los estudiantes de NDCR en los grados 11 y 12 recibieron un 3 ó más en los exámenes AP en comparación con el 10% en la escuela secundaria pública en Lawrence.

Según el Dr. Zavagnin, "la investigación demuestra que incluso si un estudiante no obtiene un puntaje de 3 o más en el examen, la exposición a los rigores de una clase AP permite un tremendo crecimiento académico en todos los estudiantes que toman el curso".

Spotlight on Success: Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Scores

Students at Notre Dame Cristo Rey High School Demonstrate College Readiness

AP courses are not for the faint of heart. They give high school students the chance to earn college credits before they ever set foot on campus, which means the work is demanding and the exams are rigorous. Last week, the College Board released scores for all AP Exams taken by students across the world over the course of the 2018-2019 school year.

Students at Notre Dame Cristo Rey High School (NDCR) hit it out of the park.

An AP Exam score of 3 or higher (out of 5) is considered a "qualifying score." Qualifying scores in AP courses demonstrate a student's ability to tackle college-level work, and nearly all colleges and universities in the U.S. grant credit and placement for these scores. Here's how NDCR's students performed in several key areas:

Juniors:

- 100% of the students enrolled in NDCR's AP Spanish Language course (18) earned a qualifying score compared to 90% in Massachusetts and 88.3% globally - five students also received the highest possible score of 5.

- Six students earned a qualifying score in NDCR's AP Language and Composition course. One student earned the top score of 5.

Seniors:

- 50% of students enrolled in NDCR's extremely challenging AP Spanish Literature course earned a qualifying score. Two students earned the top score of 5.

- 40% of students enrolled in NDCR's AP English Literature course earned a qualifying score. This was the first time the school facilitated this course.

In his announcement of the scores to NDCR's faculty and staff, Dr. Anthony Zavagnin, the school's principal, said, "So much time, energy, and love was put into the planning, teaching, and grading of these classes. Most importantly, teachers were able to get students to believe in themselves!"

The qualifying scores earned by students at NDCR are especially impressive when compared with the qualifying scores earned by students attending the public high school in Lawrence:

- AP English Literature and Composition:

40% of NDCR's students earned a qualifying score, while 14.3% of students at other schools earned a qualifying score.

- AP Spanish Literature and Culture: 50% of NDCR's students earned a qualifying score, while 0% of students at other schools earned a qualifying score.

- 43% of NDCR students in grades 11 & 12 participate in AP classes as compared to 19% participation at the public high school in Lawrence

- 28% of NDCR students in grades 11 & 12 received a 3 or higher in AP exams as compared to 10% at the public high school in Lawrence

According to Dr. Zavagnin, "Research demonstrates that even if a student does not score a 3 or above in the exam, the exposure to the rigors of an AP class allows for tremendous academic growth in all students who take the course."

Gifting the city away - one parking space at a time

For the past few months I have been following the tactics of Mayor Dan Rivera and how he is trying to keep residents preoccupied with the parking lots dilemma, while freeing himself to do misdeeds someplace else.

Trying to keep track of his actions has been very difficult because let's face it, we have many other important news and events to highlight in Rumbo. Still, by consulting with architects and engineers who have the knowledge, I armed myself with enough understanding to bring you a clearer picture of what the mayor is trying to do.

Hancock St. lot

A few weeks ago, Mayor Dan Rivera razed a house on Hancock St. and gave the land to the neighborhood for parking. One of the abutters was interested in buying it which would have kept the land on the tax rolls. If the lot was too small to build a house, selling the land would have brought a few crumbs of revenue.

Instead, Danny decided to give it to the neighbors for parking. Sounds good but, it was not his land to give away. Besides, decisions such as that one should be approved by the City Council. Even District D Councilor Jeovanny Rodriguez thanked him for this action. I don't know what he was thinking!

City Hall parking lot

Then the mayor decided to grant a favor to the new owners of 226-232 Common St. That building had been empty since the 70s. The Trejo Brothers (Jesus Manuel and Maxwell) purchased it for the bargain price of \$435,000 due to the lack of parking in that area of downtown.

I am also concerned about potential health risks from what was once held in that building (possibly asbestos, lead paint, hazardous chemicals/metals residue, etc.) It was active in the 1960s so it was built earlier than that when there were few regulations. In a conversation with the Director of Inspectional Services Michael Armano to find if the building has been inspected, he told me that he doesn't know of any inspection, but will let me know if he hears otherwise.

I checked the alley between the Bay State Building and this one on Common St. and found that trucks usually enter to pick up trash in the dumpster at the end. This alley turns to the left connecting with the other alley running behind city hall's parking lot and the businesses facing Essex St. I see no reason why that door entering the parking facilities yet to be built in the basement of 226-232 Common St. cannot be opened through the alley.

District D Councilor Jeovanny Rodriguez has suggested building a 3 or 4 story-garage where the parking lot is located to allow for more cars. If the mayor succeeds in giving away 3 or 4 spaces for the building's garage opening as the Trejo Brothers want, we will never be able to improve it because we could never get that land back.

Pacific Mills' private parking for tenants

I requested documentation about the land under the bridge (Amesbury St.) because it has been converted into private parking for their tenants. According to Brian Peña, Water Commissioner and Acting DPW

Director, "The DPW performed cleanup and abatement of graffiti under the bridge, as part of our normal course of business." And he added, "I would estimate total cleanup costs to be approximately \$5,000, including fuel and materials."

The Assessors' office sent me several pages including a map of that area showing that a large portion behind the building belongs to Pacific Mills. Then, I requested from City Engineer Milagros Puello more information about ownership of the land under the bridge but she has not responded.

Through the people I contacted, I learned that the land shown was originally the old railroad right of way for the train that crossed the river to the Station that was where the Claddagh Bar is today (and prior to that it was the old McCartney's men store). The bridge is city owned and so is the land lying below it.

I remember writing a couple of years ago about many files and maps in the engineer's office on all the city bridges with history, cost, etc. I was told that City Assistant Engineer Andy Wall, a civil engineer who worked for the city for 17 years was fired by the mayor and replaced him with Theodoro Rosario, an agronomist. In order to clean the office, Rosario threw them out when they should have been sent to the library.

Museum Square Garage

Speaking of parking facilities, the Museum Square Garage situation is getting ugly. Danny was very disrespectful to Jeovanny Rodriguez Tuesday night. He told him that he cannot interpret the contract between Museum Square and the City because he is not an attorney. Well, he is a civil engineer and can certainly judge what the garage needs. Rodriguez should have responded that neither is the mayor an attorney.

My findings are as follows: The City must hire a structural engineer to assess conditions and create bid documents outlining exactly what needs to be done and what it would cost. Knowing the way Rivera works, he probably has nothing and doesn't know what to do or he is just going to "find" someone to do the work.

Some of the councilors have been asking for some paperwork on what needs to be done, materials being used, estimate cost in order to put it out for bids. That is the normal procedure and the mayor is providing nothing yet he said that \$3.75M is just a down payment on the total cost that no one knows how high it will go.

A little side history I learned on the garage. It is a precast concrete structure. The beams were built to specifications at a concrete plant and put together on site. The deck (parking surface) was also constructed off site at the plant. There are joints where the parts come together. These joints are part of the problem as water and salt have weakened or eroded them.

The beams have been exposed to salt from the cars which have caused some of the reinforcement steel to corrode, expand and weaken the beams. Salty water penetrates unsealed concrete and causes a condition called efflorescence. It shows up as white patches or streaks. These conditions can be remedied by a competent bridge repairing company. Garages are more bridge structure than you think.

Museum Square Garage



Regalando la ciudad: un espacio de estacionamiento a la vez

Durante los últimos meses, he seguido las tácticas del Alcalde Dan Rivera y cómo está tratando de mantener a los residentes preocupados por el dilema de los estacionamientos, mientras se libera de cometer fechorías por otro lugar.

Intentar hacer un seguimiento de sus acciones ha sido muy difícil porque, admitámoslo, tenemos muchas otras noticias y eventos importantes que destacar en Rumbo. Aún así, al consultar con arquitectos e ingenieros que tienen el conocimiento, me armé con suficiente comprensión para brindarle una idea más clara de lo que el alcalde está tratando de hacer.

Lote en Hancock St.

Hace unas semanas, el Alcalde Dan Rivera derrumbó una casa en la calle Hancock y le dio el terreno al vecindario para que se estacionen en él. Uno de los colindantes estaba interesado en comprarlo, lo que habría mantenido el terreno en las listas de impuestos. Si el lote fuera demasiado pequeño para construir una casa, la venta de la tierra habría traído algunas migajas de ingresos.

En cambio, Danny decidió dárselo a los vecinos para que se estacionen. Sueno bien, pero no era su tierra para regalar. Además, decisiones como esa deben ser aprobadas por el Concejo Municipal. Incluso el Concejal del Distrito D, Jeovanny Rodríguez, le agradeció por esta acción. ¡No sé lo que estaba pensando!

Estacionamiento del Ayuntamiento

Luego, el alcalde decidió otorgar un favor a los nuevos propietarios de 226-232 Common St. Ese edificio había estado vacío desde los años 70. Los hermanos Trejo (Jesús Manuel y Maxwell) lo compraron por el precio de ganga de \$435,000 debido a la falta de estacionamiento en esa área del centro de la ciudad.

También estoy preocupada por los posibles riesgos para la salud de lo que una vez estuvo en ese edificio (posiblemente asbestos, pintura con plomo, productos químicos peligrosos/residuos de metales, etc.) Estaba activo en la década de 1960, por lo que se construyó antes de eso cuando había pocas regulaciones. Estuve conversando con el Director de Servicios de Inspección Michael Armano para averiguar si ha sido inspeccionado pero no sabe de ninguna inspección y me dejará saber si hay algo diferente.

Revisé el callejón entre el Bay State Building y este en Common St. y descubrí que los camiones generalmente entran para recoger la basura en el contenedor de basura al final. Este callejón gira a la izquierda y se conecta con el otro callejón que corre detrás del estacionamiento del ayuntamiento y las empresas que dan frente a Essex St. No veo ninguna razón por la cual esa puerta para entrar al estacionamiento que aún no se ha construido en el sótano de 226-232 Common St., no pueda abrirse por ese callejón.

El Concejal del Distrito D, Jeovanny Rodríguez, sugirió construir un garaje de varios pisos donde se encuentre el estacionamiento para permitir más autos. Si el alcalde logra regalar 3 ó 4 espacios para la apertura del garaje del edificio como lo desean los hermanos Trejo, nunca podremos mejorarlo porque nunca

podríamos recuperar esa tierra.

Estacionamiento privado para inquilinos de Pacific Mills

Solicité documentación sobre la tierra debajo del puente (Amesbury St.) porque se ha convertido en estacionamiento privado para sus inquilinos. Según Brian Peña, Comisionado de Agua y Director Interino de DPW, "El personal de DPW limpió el área y eliminó el grafito debajo del puente como parte normal de su día de trabajo." Despues añadió, "Yo estimo el costo total de la limpieza en aproximadamente \$5,000, incluyendo combustible y materiales."

La oficina de Asesores me envió varias páginas, incluido un mapa del área que muestra que una gran parte detrás del edificio pertenece a Pacific Mills. Luego, solicité a la ingeniera de la ciudad, Milagros Puello, más información sobre la propiedad de la tierra debajo del puente, pero ella no ha respondido.

A través de las personas que contacté, supe que la tierra mostrada era originalmente el antiguo ferrocarril para el tren que cruzaba el río hasta la estación que estaba donde está hoy el Bar Claddagh (y antes de eso era la vieja tienda de McCartney para hombres). El puente es propiedad de la ciudad y la tierra que está debajo por ende, es de la ciudad.

Recuerdo que escribí hace un par de años acerca de muchos expedientes y mapas en la oficina del ingeniero sobre todos los puentes de la ciudad con historia, costo, etc. Me dijeron que el alcalde despidió al ingeniero asistente de la ciudad Andy Wall, un ingeniero civil que trabajó por 17 años para la ciudad y lo reemplazó con Theodoro Rosario, un ingeniero agrónomo. En su interés de limpiar la oficina, Rosario los echó a la basura cuando deberían haber sido enviados a la biblioteca.

Garaje de Museum Square

Hablando de estacionamientos, la situación de Museum Square Garage se está poniendo fea. Danny fue muy irrespetuoso con Jeovanny Rodríguez el martes por la noche. Le dijo que no puede interpretar el contrato entre Museum Square y la Ciudad porque no es abogado. Bueno, él es ingeniero civil y ciertamente puede juzgar lo que necesita el garaje. Rodríguez debería haber respondido que el alcalde tampoco es abogado.

Mis conclusiones son las siguientes: La Ciudad debe contratar a un ingeniero estructural para evaluar las condiciones y crear documentos de licitación que describan exactamente lo que hay que hacer y lo que costaría. Sabiendo cómo Rivera trabaja, probablemente no tiene nada y no sabe qué hacer o simplemente va a "encontrar" a alguien que haga el trabajo.

Algunos de los concejales han estado solicitando algunos documentos sobre lo que hay que hacer, los materiales que se utilizan, el costo estimado para presentarlo a las licitaciones. Ese es el procedimiento normal y el alcalde no proporciona nada, pero dijo que \$3.75M es solo un anticipo del costo total que nadie sabe qué tan alto será.

Un poco de historia secundaria que aprendí sobre el garaje. Es una estructura prefabricada de hormigón. Las vigas se construyeron según las especificaciones en una planta de concreto y se ensamblaron

en el sitio. La cubierta (superficie de estacionamiento) también se construyó fuera del sitio en la planta. Hay articulaciones donde las partes se unen. Estas articulaciones son parte del problema ya que el agua y la sal las han debilitado o erosionado.

Las vigas han sido expuestas a la sal de los automóviles, lo que ha provocado

que parte del acero de refuerzo se corroa, expanda y debilite las vigas. El agua salada penetra en el hormigón sin sellar y causa una condición llamada eflourfesence. Aparece como manchas blancas o rayas. Estas condiciones pueden ser remediatas por una compañía competente de reparación de puentes. Los garajes tienen más estructura de puente de lo que se piensa.

NECC Chemistry Professor Publishes Debut Children's Book Registration is Open for NECC's 7th Annual Campus Classic Road Race

Try mixing the rhymes of Dr. Seuss and the enthusiasm of Bill Nye the Science Guy and you might have something that looks a lot like "Francesca and the Genie of Science," a new children's book by Northern Essex Community College's own Dr. Mike Cross, professor of chemistry.

The book, created with the intention of inspiring young minds with scientific fun facts, covers the story of its title character, Francesca, and the microwave mishap that leads her to the Genie of Science and to a subsequent journey of growth and scientific inquiry.

A resident of Atkinson, NH, Cross says that the idea for the book resulted from his experience in reading stories to his own children.

"I have three kids and I've always loved reading to them," he says. "After reading 'Fox in Socks' for the millionth time to my son, I thought of how much fun it would be for me to write a children's book of my own."

And so, with the help of illustrator James Goodwin, he set about doing just that, creating a rhymed 24-page story to entertain children and their guardians alike. The book, now available online, was officially published in June. Signed copies will also be sold during NECC's annual Homecoming day on October 5, 2019.

Cross notes that all proceeds from "Francesca and the Genie of Science" will benefit the NECC Fund, which provides critical support for scholarships and academic programs on campus.

"I'm extremely grateful for the NECC Fund," Cross says of the decision to allocate proceeds in this way. "Because of these funds I've been able to purchase the supplies that I



needed to work on projects that have really helped my students...I felt that donating the proceeds of the book to the NECC Fund would be a good way to give back."

The possibility of future publications is not out of the question. Cross is now working on his second book – a science fiction novel set in a dystopian future.

Mike Cross holds a Ph.D. in organic chemistry from the University of Utah, where he specialized in oxidative lesions in DNA and RNA. He teaches courses in chemistry and forensic science at NECC and is a member of the NECC Speakers Bureau, through which professional staff and faculty members have the opportunity to present lectures to public and private school systems, libraries, service clubs, and more.



City Council Ordinance Committee meeting



La División de Salud de Andover alerta a la comunidad después de que los mosquitos dan positivo por EEE

El Director de Salud Pública Thomas Carbone, el Jefe de Policía y el Director de Manejo de Emergencias Patrick Keefe, el Jefe de Bomberos Michael Mansfield y el Gerente de la Ciudad Andrew Flanagan buscan brindar a los residentes información y recordatorios de seguridad después de que los mosquitos en Andover dieron positivo para Encefalitis Equina Oriental (EEE).

La División de Salud de Andover fue notificada el viernes que dos grupos de mosquitos en el área de Abbot Street dieron positivo por el virus EEE. Los mosquitos probados quedaron atrapados el 13 de agosto y pertenecían a una especie que se sabe que pica a los humanos.

Como resultado de estas pruebas positivas, el Distrito de Control de Mosquitos y Manejo de Humedales del Noreste de Massachusetts está desplegando una trampa de mosquitos suplementaria en el área este fin de semana. Larvicide también se desplegará en los próximos días.

La Junta de Salud de Andover se reunirá el lunes por la noche para discutir los resultados positivos de las pruebas. Se anticipa que la pulverización de mosquitos adultos desde aplicadores basados en camiones ocurrirá en un área específica el martes por la noche o el miércoles si llueve el martes. Un entomólogo estatal también asistirá a la reunión de la Junta de Salud como recurso.

Los residentes pueden ver el plan de respuesta de arbovirus de la ciudad de Andover aquí.

Como siempre, la División de Salud de Andover insta a todos los residentes a leer y seguir estos importantes consejos de seguridad:

Evite las picaduras de mosquitos

- Tenga en cuenta las horas pico de mosquitos: las horas desde el anochecer hasta el amanecer son las horas pico de picadura de muchos mosquitos. Considere reprogramar actividades al aire libre que

ocurran durante la tarde o temprano en la mañana. Si está afuera en cualquier momento y nota que hay mosquitos a su alrededor, tome medidas para evitar ser picado moviéndose adentro, cubriéndose y/o usando repelente.

- La ropa puede ayudar a reducir las picaduras de mosquitos: aunque puede ser difícil hacerlo cuando hace calor, usar mangas largas, pantalones largos y calcetines mientras está al aire libre ayudará a mantener a los mosquitos lejos de su piel.

- Aplique repelente de insectos cuando salga al aire libre. Use un repelente con DEET, permethrina, picaridina, IR3535 o aceite de eucalipto de limón de acuerdo con las instrucciones en la etiqueta del producto. Los productos DEET no deben usarse en bebés menores de dos meses de edad y deben usarse en concentraciones de 30 por ciento o menos en niños mayores. El aceite de eucalipto de limón no debe usarse en niños menores de tres años. Los productos de permethrina están diseñados para su uso en artículos como ropa, zapatos, mosquiteros y ropa de campamento y no deben aplicarse directamente sobre la piel.

Su hogar a prueba de mosquitos

- Drene el agua estancada: muchos mosquitos ponen sus huevos en agua estancada. Limite la cantidad de lugares alrededor de su casa donde se reproducen los mosquitos, ya sea drenando o deshaciéndose de los elementos que retienen el agua. Revise las canaletas y desagües de lluvia. Vacíe las macetas no utilizadas y las piscinas para niños y cambie el agua en los baños para pájaros con frecuencia.

- Instale o repare las pantallas de ventanas y puertas: a algunos mosquitos les gusta entrar. Manténgalos afuera colocando pantallas ajustadas en todas sus ventanas y puertas.

Según los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades, el virus EEE es una causa rara de infecciones cerebrales o encefalitis. Se informan muy pocos casos humanos en los EE. UU. Cada año, pero el EEE puede ser fatal o dejar a las víctimas con complicaciones graves y problemas neurológicos.

Andover Health Division Alerts Community after Mosquitoes Test Positive for EEE

Director of Public Health Thomas Carbone, Police Chief and Emergency Management Director Patrick Keefe, Fire Chief Michael Mansfield and Town Manager Andrew Flanagan seek to provide residents with information and safety reminders after mosquitoes in Andover tested positive for Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE).

The Andover Health Division was notified Friday that two mosquito pools in the Abbot Street area tested positive for the EEE virus. The mosquitoes tested were trapped on Aug. 13 and were of a species that is known to bite humans.

As a result of these positive tests, the Northeast Massachusetts Mosquito Control and Wetlands Management District is deploying a supplemental mosquito trap to the area this weekend. Larvicide will also be deployed in the coming days.

The Andover Board of Health will meet Monday evening to discuss the positive test results. It is anticipated that adult mosquito spraying from truck based applicators will occur in a targeted area on Tuesday night or Wednesday if there is rain on Tuesday. A state entomologist will also attend the Board of Health meeting as a resource.

As always, the Andover Health Division urges all residents to read and follow these important safety tips:

Avoid Mosquito Bites

- Be aware of peak mosquito hours: The hours from dusk to dawn are peak biting times for many mosquitoes. Consider rescheduling outdoor activities that occur during the evening or early morning. If you are outdoors at any time and notice mosquitoes around you, take steps to avoid being bitten by moving indoors, covering up and/or wearing repellent.

- Clothing can help reduce mosquito bites: Although it may be difficult to do

when it's hot, wearing long sleeves, long pants and socks while outdoors will help keep mosquitoes away from your skin.

- Apply insect repellent when you go outdoors. Use a repellent with DEET, permethrin, picaridin, IR3535 or oil of lemon eucalyptus according to the instructions on the product label. DEET products should not be used on infants under two months of age and should be used in concentrations of 30 percent or less on older children. Oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under three years of age. Permethrin products are intended for use on items such as clothing, shoes, bed nets and camping gear and should not be applied directly to your skin.

Mosquito-Proof Your Home

- Drain standing water: Many mosquitoes lay their eggs in standing water. Limit the number of places around your home for mosquitoes to breed by either draining or getting rid of items that hold water. Check rain gutters and drains. Empty any unused flowerpots and wading pools and change water in birdbaths frequently.
- Install or repair window and door screens: Some mosquitoes like to come indoors. Keep them outside by having tightly-fitting screens on all of your windows and doors.

Information about EEE and reports of current and historical EEE virus activity in Massachusetts can be found on the MDPH website here.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention the EEE virus is a rare cause of brain infections or encephalitis. Very few human cases are reported across the U.S. each year, but EEE can be fatal or leave victims with serious complications and neurological problems.


Exhibit traces early book history

Booklovers will enjoy viewing "From Script to Print, Without a Computer," an exhibit of handwritten and early printed books on display at the Nashua Public Library from August 3-30.

These works from a local private collector trace the transition from handwritten books to early printed ones, primarily in Western Europe. They include pen-and-ink pages from handwritten books from the 1200s to the late 1400s, and pages from printed books from the late 1400s to the mid-1500s. Also included are a few non-Western, handwritten works done as late as the 1600s and 1700s.

A multilingual display

The handwritten manuscript pages are in Latin, Hebrew, Arabic, and Oriya (a language of the Indian state of Orissa). Also included are pages from hymnals in



Gregorian Chant notation.

The Latin manuscripts are mainly texts for the Mass, the Divine Office, and books of hours. The Hebrew manuscript contains writings from the Torah, and the Arabic manuscript contains prayers for the well-being of the bearer.

The arrival of moveable-type

The advent of moveable-type printing by Gutenberg around 1440 marked the twilight of handwritten books. Yet scribes, sensing their impending unemployment, continued to turn out very elaborate works well into the 1500s, one of which is in this show.


