
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Neil Perry took charge of his duties as Mayor of Methuen on Monday, January 6, 2020 at Methuen High School with the commitment of bringing about changes to the city.

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

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## Joel Javier Named 2019 Youth of the Year by Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence

When Joel Javier was 13 years old, he says he didn't get good grades and was sometimes picked on due to his "awkwardness." His parents gave him a summer membership to the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence, and to his relief, he quickly found a group of friends with common interests at the Clubhouse Network Computer Lab.

"The club changed me," said Javier, now a senior at Greater Lawrence Technical School and member of the honor roll or high honor roll for the last three years. "The staff taught me how it is okay to be who you are, and how I do not need to have everyone like me in order to do so. You can't be someone if no one was there to help build you up."

Javier, who is widely recognized at the Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence as a role model for younger youth members, was recently selected as the 2019 Youth of the Year. Established in 1947, Youth of the Year is the Boys & Girls Club of America's premiere recognition program for club members 14 to 18 years old, promoting values of leadership and service, academic excellence and healthy lifestyles. The nominees, all of whom exemplify the critical impact that Boys & Girls Clubs have on the lives of young people, progress from their local club to the state, regional and national levels. The National Youth of the Year, who is installed by the President of the United States, serves as an exemplary ambassador for Boys & Girls Club youth and a strong voice for all of the nation's young people.

Samantha Sullivan, a club board member who served on the Youth of the Year Selection Committee, said the panel was impressed with Javier's maturity and civic-minded outlook. Five candidates were evaluated based on interviews, grades, club and community activities and multiple essays.

"It was a very difficult task to select a winner from this group of extraordinary applicants," Sullivan said. "It was great to hear their stories about the positive impact

the club has made on all of their lives."

Javier said it "means the world to me" to be selected as Youth of the Year. "I'm really honored to be chosen by this club which shaped me as a person and helped me grow up."

In fact, Javier credits his involvement with the Clubhouse Network Computer Lab with his decision to apply to Greater Lawrence Technical School, where his major course of study is information technology. He is also treasurer of the Keystone Club, a service group for high school-aged youth members which helps serve supper to younger club kids, cleans up around the club and assists staff in various capacities.

In addition, Javier teaches coding in the Clubhouse Network Computer Lab, travels to peer leadership conferences throughout country, has participated in the Highland Street Foundation Youth Philanthropy Initiative and maintains a healthy lifestyle, as taught by the club.

Ultimately, Javier aspires to study information technology in college. In the meantime, he intends to continue setting an example for younger youth members while progressing as far as possible in the Youth of the Year competition.

"I am forever grateful for what the club has done for me, and for the friends I made there," Javier said.

The Boys & Girls Club of Lawrence provides a safe, after-school haven for nearly 4,000 youth members to come for nightly meals, homework help, fitness and nutrition programs, college and career planning and lasting personal relationships. The new elected officials in Lawrence took their oath this week to the satisfaction of some of the residents who think we have a well-balanced Council.

The optimism is even greater towards the School Committee which has been a disaster during the last two years. Not all districts had been represented by the lack of interest in participating. This year it has been quite the opposite; there were candidates who, at the last minute, ran a stickers campaign.

# Desde Mi Esquina

## Inauguración de Lawrence

No hubo muchas sorpresas en la inauguración de la nueva generación de miembros del Concejo Municipal porque solo hubo un cambio y es alentador ver que tenemos una buena representación en el Comité Escolar de Lawrence. No conozco a Rafaela Pichardo (Distrito C), pero la felicito por tener el coraje de dirigir una campaña por escrito. Como una persona madura, estoy segura de que ella traerá sus experiencias de vida a esa junta. Joshua Alba (Distrito D) y Jonathan Guzmán (Distrito F) son jóvenes, ardientes y francos, lo que me da esperanza.

Hemos estado siguiendo a Jonathan Guzmán desde que estaba en Lawrence High School como una persona solidaria que se involucró en muchas actividades de la comunidad. Incluso le dedicamos nuestro editorial el 15 de febrero de 2014. Fundó el Club Humanitario en Lawrence High School en 2011, con el objetivo de brindar a sus compañeros la oportunidad de involucrarse en la comunidad, organizando un Blood Drive a través de la Cruz Roja, organizó una recaudación de donaciones de médula ósea para eliminar el cáncer de sangre-DKMS que salvó la vida del pequeño Jerry, un niño de 5 años, que fue diagnosticado con leucemia mieloide aguda en 2012. Fue instrumental en enseñar a otros estudiantes la importancia del liderazgo. Durante los últimos cuatro años, Jonathan asistió a UMass y regresó para servir a su ciudad.

Sabemos que el comité escolar no tiene ningún poder desde el establecimiento de la Alianza para la Educación y, como resultado, no tiene responsabilidad. Sin embargo, el Alcalde Dan Rivera, que se desempeñó como orador invitado según lo sugerido por Kendrys Vasquez, les dio una charla sobre el poder y la responsabilidad.

"Ustedes tienen el poder de obtener mejores almuerzos para los estudiantes", dijo el alcalde. "Todos tenemos la responsabilidad de representar a toda la ciudad. El poder es lo fácil de hacer; la responsabilidad es lo que te mantiene despierto por la noche", agregó Danny.

Al dirigirse al Concejo, dijo que "sin el Concejo anterior, no podríamos tener los años de bajos impuestos que tuvimos".

La parte principal de la ceremonia es cuando levantan la mano derecha y juran defender la Constitución del Commonwealth de Massachusetts y la Ciudad de Lawrence, así que hablé con el Concejal del Distrito E, David Abdo, Presidente del Comité de Personal sobre Evan Silverio y Álvaro Pérez quienes están sirviendo ilegalmente en la Lawrence Redevelopment Authority (LRA). Le recordé que la ley estatal y los requisitos de la ciudad dicen que deben ser residentes de Lawrence. Su respuesta fue que tendrá que consultar con Marc Laplante porque él es el parlamentario.

Como puede ver, cumplir con la ley en Lawrence es selectivo.

Hubo algo que me molestó al comienzo de la ceremonia cuando la pastora Mercedes Martínez Arias de la Iglesia Ministerio Evangelístico dio la invocación leyendo un pasaje de la Biblia. Luego, ella presentó a su esposo (que no estaba en el programa).

No tenía nada que leer, pero habló de improvisto quejándose varias veces sobre las

"divisiones" en esta ciudad. Tanto la pastora Martínez Arias como su esposo hablaron en español.

Entonces el Reverendo Christopher J. Casey, V.F. de Nuestra Señora del Buen Consejo en Methuen dio la Oración por la Seguridad Pública en inglés.

El secretario municipal Maloney y el alcalde hablaron en inglés y la ceremonia también fue en inglés, al igual que el Himno Nacional. ¿Quién estaba creando la "división" de la que habló?

Más tarde descubrí que la pastora Mercedes Martínez Arias es la madre de Kendrys.

## Lawrence pierde millones de HUD

Hace un mes escribí sobre el Departamento de Vivienda y Desarrollo Urbano con respecto a la financiación de la Subvención para la reducción del riesgo de pintura a base de plomo y la Subvención para la producción de viviendas saludables. La ciudad de Lawrence no recibió ninguna subvención.

Debido a que tengo tantas preguntas, solicité bajo la Ley de Libertad de Información el monitoreo más reciente de HUD realizado al Desarrollo Comunitario, pero no contenía una carta de rechazo y tenía que solicitarse por separado.

Mientras tanto, el informe de monitoreo de 155 páginas que me enviaron contenía muchos hallazgos. Faltaban muchos documentos, cálculos de ingresos que eran inexactos, así como costos y records de tiempo empleado.

Para empeorar las cosas, la ciudad tuvo que devolver al gobierno federal \$134,630.84 de la Beca de Soluciones de Emergencia (ESG) de 2017.

El 28 de octubre de 2019, Robert Shumeyko, director de la Oficina de Planificación y Desarrollo Comunitario en Boston, escribió a Vilma Martínez-Domínguez, directora de Desarrollo Comunitario en Lawrence, aconsejándola sobre 10 Hallazgos en su monitoreo *in situ* del 14 al 15 de agosto. Le dieron 30 días para responder con las acciones correctivas que se habían tomado o una explicación si no estaba de acuerdo con su carta.

En una carta fechada el 22 de noviembre de 2019, Vilma Martínez-Domínguez, directora de Desarrollo Comunitario, escribió para aclarar algunas de sus preocupaciones, reunir los documentos faltantes y hacer correcciones de números. Ahora tenemos que esperar la última palabra con los motivos de la negación que causó la pérdida de millones a Lawrence.

## Estacionamiento alrededor de Museum Sq.

No parece haber ningún progreso con el estacionamiento de Museum Square desde que se cerró el verano pasado debido a las condiciones que se está desmoronando. No se permite estacionar en las calles que rodean el edificio durante el día y la gente tiene miedo de caminar por la noche, por lo que la ciudad está pagando por un servicio de traslado las 24 horas del día para acomodar a los inquilinos que ahora se ven obligados a estacionarse en otros lugares, principalmente



el Buckley Garage a pocas cuadras de distancia.

Pero durante las últimas semanas, varios residentes en los apartamentos de Museum Sq. me han llamado para quejarse de los autos estacionados día y noche en las entradas con letreros de "No estacionar" y en el césped alrededor del edificio. Lo que más les molesta es que la policía los multa y los remolca, selectivamente. Algunos tienen un lugar seguro durante la noche junto a la puerta principal.

De esta manera, cuando ofrezcas consejos o crítica constructiva para mejorar el desempeño y crecimiento profesional de tu

equipo, el empleado, en vez de considerarlo un ataque o crítica negativa, lo percibe como un consejo positivo y una ayuda bien recibida."

Dicho esto, no cabe duda que la comunidad hispana tiene la capacidad de posicionarse como un grupo de influencia en el ámbito económico y establecer una industria sostenible en el tiempo que refleje el trabajo tan importante al que se dedican diariamente. Pero, para lograr el crecimiento de la industria de paisajismo y jardinería, como el crecimiento de las empresas en esta industria, el apoyo de los líderes, dueños, y gerentes es crucial y sus consejos y guía van a permitir que los hispanos continúen desarrollándose profesionalmente

# El Censo crea alboroto con un aumento salarial por hora para los trabajadores del censo de 2020 en Massachusetts

**¡Pague esas facturas de Navidad ganando hasta \$27.50 por hora trabajando en su propia comunidad!**

Con menos de tres meses hasta el inicio nacional del Censo 2020, la Oficina del Censo de EE.UU. anunció que aumentará los salarios por hora en todas las ciudades y pueblos de MA. Los salarios de los trabajadores del censo en los condados de Suffolk, Essex, Norfolk y Middlesex aumentarán a \$27.50 de \$25.00 por hora.

Las nuevas tasas de pago para los trabajadores del censo aumentarán a \$22.00 de \$19.00 por hora para áreas ubicadas en el oeste de MA, incluidas las ciudades y pueblos en los condados de Worcester, Franklin, Hampshire, Hampden y Berkshire, y el sureste de MA, incluidos los condados de Plymouth, Bristol, Barnstable, Dukes y Nantucket. Los aumentos de la tasa de pago entran en vigencia el lunes 6 de enero para miles de puestos de enumerador a tiempo parcial necesarios para realizar un recuento completo y preciso de la capital del estado y las ciudades más pobladas. ## U.S. Census Bureau Creates a Buzz with Hourly Wage Increase for 2020 Census Workers in Massachusetts

**Pay Off Those Holiday Bills by Earning up to \$27.50 an Hour Working in Your Own Community!**

With less than three months until the national kick-off of the 2020 Census, the U.S. Census Bureau announced it will boost hourly wages in all MA cities and towns. Wages for census workers in Suffolk, Essex, Norfolk, and Middlesex counties will increase to \$27.50 from \$25.00 per hour.

New pay rates for census workers will increase to \$22.00 from \$19.00 per hour for areas located in western MA, including cities and towns in Worcester, Franklin, Hampshire, Hampden and Berkshire counties, and southeastern MA, including Plymouth, Bristol, Barnstable, Dukes, and Nantucket counties. The pay rate increases are effective Monday, January 6 for thousands of part-time enumerator positions needed to conduct a complete and accurate count of the state's capital and most populous cities. The pay rate increase was instituted to attract more qualified candidates to conduct door-to-door enumeration for the 2020 Census in familiar neighborhoods starting this spring. To apply, residents must possess the following qualifications:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have a valid Social Security number
- Be a U.S. citizen\*
- Have a valid email address
- Be registered with the Selective Service System or have a qualifying exemption, if you are a male born after Dec. 31, 1959

The 2020 Census Jobs website allows applicants to apply for a range of positions, including census takers, recruiting assistants, office operations supervisors, clerks, census field supervisors and other positions by completing a single application online. Census jobs offer flexible work hours, including daytime, evenings and weekends, paid training, and travel reimbursement. The

Census jobs are a great way for seasonal workers, students, retirees and workers in the gig economy to line up spring and summer employment opportunities.

Applicants will be placed in an applicant pool for 2020 Census positions in which they qualify for as jobs become available in their area. \* Non-citizens may be hired in certain circumstances. Lorena came to that position in the summer of 2018 with a myriad of hopes and ideas and has been able to realize them all in such a short time. We asked her about her reasons for leaving the city and she assured us that it was a very difficult decision.

"My husband and I thought about it very carefully," Lorena told me. "I love my job here and it is hard breaking getting away from something you have a passion for."

She went on to tell me that the time spent as recycling coordinator for the City of Lawrence had been very rewarding. She was given absolute freedom to plan, propose and execute changes to benefit the city with total support from the administration.

After establishing the current recycling system, Lorena dedicated most of her time to

educating the community on its benefits and she was able to create educational materials. Her next plan involves teaching residents the advantages of composting to use in their gardens and flower beds.

"Beginning with every city employee I have worked with, there was total cooperation from everyone," Lorena told me.

So why is she leaving?

The conversations Lorena had with her husband encompassed finances involving two separate day cares. They have a 4-year-old girl and a new born boy which takes a big bite of anyone's salary but the decision came down to time: The time spent as a family.

Lorena leaves her job because she spends almost every night out attending meetings. If not at council meetings, she participates at community gatherings or meetings of neighborhood associations. That is time taken away from her young family and it is her biggest concern. She will be missed.

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## Qué deben saber los preparadores de impuestos acerca de un plan de seguridad de datos

Con la temporada de presentación de impuestos a solo unas cuantas semanas, los profesionales de impuestos que tienen un plan de seguridad de datos deben revisarlo para que esté actualizado. Aquellos que no tienen un plan deben crear uno y usar la siguiente información para comenzar. Tener un plan de seguridad de datos escrito no es sólo una buena idea, es la ley federal.

Los ladrones de identidad se dirigen a los profesionales de impuestos debido a los datos de los clientes que tienen en su poder. Los ladrones usan datos robados de los preparadores de impuestos para crear declaraciones falsas que pueden ser más difíciles de detectar para el IRS.

### Empezar a usar un plan

Para comenzar con un plan de seguridad de datos, los profesionales de impuestos deben revisar la Publicación 4557, Protección de los datos de los contribuyentes (PDF, en inglés). Esta publicación ayuda a los preparadores a:

Comprender las medidas críticas de seguridad que todos los profesionales de impuestos deben poner en marcha, incluyendo una lista de verificación de elementos para un plan de seguridad de datos.

Seguir la Regla de protección de la Comisión Federal de Comercio (en inglés).

Centrarse en áreas clave como el manejo y capacitación de los empleados, los sistemas de información y la búsqueda y manejo de fallos del sistema.

### Requisitos del plan

Estos elementos son necesarios al escribir y seguir un plan de seguridad de datos:

Elija uno o más empleados para coordinar el programa de seguridad de la información.

Identificar los riesgos de la información del cliente.

Evaluuar las medidas de seguridad para controlar estos riesgos.

Diseñar e implementar un programa de protección.

Seleccionar proveedores de servicios que puedan mantener las medidas de seguridad adecuadas.

Asegurarse de que el contrato requiera que el proveedor mantenga las medidas de seguridad y supervisa su manejo de la información del cliente.

Supervisar y probar regularmente el programa.

Cambiar el programa de seguridad según sea necesario. Esto debe ocurrir si alguna parte necesita actualización, o cuando los empleados se van o se unen a la empresa.

## Lawrence inauguration

There were not many surprises at the inauguration of the new crop of members of the city council because there was only one change and it is encouraging seeing that we have good representation in the Lawrence School Committee. I don't know Rafaela Pichardo (District C) but I congratulate her for having the courage to run a write-in campaign. As a mature person, I'm sure that she'll bring her life experiences to that board. Joshua Alba (District D) and Jonathan Guzman (District F) are young, fiery and outspoken which gives me hope.

We have been following Jonathan Guzman since he was at Lawrence High School as a caring individual who got involved in many community activities. We even dedicated our editorial to him on February 15, 2014. He founded the Humanitarian Club at Lawrence High School in 2011, with the objective of providing his peers with an opportunity to get involved in the community, hosting a Blood Drive through the Red Cross, a Bone Marrow Drive to Delete Blood Cancer-DKMS saving little Jerry's life, a 5-year-old boy, who was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia in 2012. He was instrumental in teaching other students the importance of leadership. For the past four years Jonathan was attending UMass and is back to serve his city.

We know the school committee doesn't have any power since the establishment of the Alliance for Education and, as a result, no responsibility. Yet, Mayor Dan Rivera who served as guest speaker as suggested by Kendrys Vasquez, lectured them on power and responsibility.

"You have the power to get better lunches for students," said the mayor. "We all have the responsibility to represent the whole city. Power is the easy thing to do; responsibility is what keeps you up at night," Danny added.

In addressing the council, he said that, "Without the past council, we could not have the years of low taxes we had."

The main part of the ceremony is when they raise their right hand and swear to uphold the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the City of Lawrence so I spoke to District E Councilor David Abdoo, Chair of the Personnel Committee about Evan Silverio and Alvaro Perez who are serving illegally on the Lawrence Redevelopment Authority (LRA). I reminded him that state law and city requirements say they must be Lawrence residents. His response was that he'll have to check with Marc Laplante because he is the parliamentarian.

As you can see, abiding by the law in Lawrence is selective.

There was something that bothered me at the beginning of the ceremony when Pastor Mercedes Martinez Arias of Iglesia Ministerio Evangelístico gave the invocation by reading a bible passage. Then, she introduced her husband (who was not on the program).

He did not have anything to read but spoke off the cuff complaining several times about the "divisions" in this city. Both Pastor Martinez Arias and her husband spoke in Spanish.

Then Rev. Christopher J. Casey, V.F. of

Our Lady of Good Counsel in Methuen gave the Prayer for Public Safety in English.

City Clerk Maloney and the mayor spoke in English and the ceremony was in English as well, just like the National Anthem. Who was then creating the "division" that he spoke about?

Later I found out that Pastor Mercedes Martinez Arias is Kendrys' mother.

## Lawrence loses millions from HUD

One month ago I wrote about the Department of Housing and Urban Development regarding the funding for Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Grant and the Healthy Homes Production Grant. The City of Lawrence was not awarded either grant.

Because I have so many questions, I requested under the Freedom of Information Act the most recent HUD monitoring done to Community Development but it did not contain a letter of denial and it had to be requested separately.

Meanwhile, the 155-page monitoring report I was sent did contain many Findings. There were many documents missing, income calculations that were inaccurate as well as costs and time sheets.

To make things worse, the city had to return to the Federal government \$134,630.84 from the 2017 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG).

On October 28, 2019, Robert Shumeyko, director of the Office of Community Planning and Development in Boston wrote to Vilma Martinez-Dominguez, director of Community Development in Lawrence advising her of 10 Findings in their August 14-15 onsite monitoring. She was given 30 days to respond with the corrective actions that had been taken or an explanation if she disagreed with his letter.

In a letter dated November 22, 2019, Vilma Martinez-Dominguez, director of Community Development wrote to clarify some of their concerns, gathering the missing documents and making corrections of numbers. We now have to wait for the final word with the reasons for the denial causing the loss of millions to Lawrence.

## Parking around Museum Sq.


There doesn't seem to be any progress going on with the Museum Square Parking Garage since it was shut down last summer due to crumbling conditions. There is no parking allowed on the streets surrounding the building during the day and people are afraid to walk at night, so the city is paying for a shuttle to run back and forth 24 hours each day to accommodate the tenants who are now forced to park in other places, mainly the Buckley Garage a few blocks away.

But during the past few weeks, several residents at Museum Sq. apartments have called me complaining about the cars parked day and night by the entrances with "No Parking" signs and on the grass around the building. What annoys them most is that police ticket them towing them away – selectively. Some have a secured spot through the night by the front gate.

I took some pictures during the day



and some nights and sure enough, it was confirmed. Funny that one night I got out of my car for a better angle and when I returned, there were two police officers in a cruiser behind, waiting for me to get going.

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# DiZoglio, MVPC anuncia alcance de trabajo para la Comisión del Distrito del Río Merrimack

La Senadora Estatal Diana DiZoglio (D-Methuen) y la Comisión de Planificación del Valle de Merrimack han anunciado la finalización de un alcance de trabajo para la Comisión del Distrito del Río Merrimack (MRDC).

El MRDC, que se financiará con fondos asegurados por DiZoglio a través del Presupuesto Estatal del Año Fiscal 2020, es una comisión inclusiva de partes interesadas locales, desde profesionales de gestión de aguas residuales hasta ambientalistas y funcionarios electos, así como representantes de agencias estatales, encargadas de evaluar el estado actual del Río Merrimack y estrategias de mapeo para garantizar la salud y seguridad del Merrimack en el futuro.

El alcance del trabajo de la Comisión, preparado por la firma de consultoría e ingeniería ambiental con sede en Andover Brown y Caldwell, describe el desarrollo de un marco para la toma de decisiones y las prioridades de financiación asociadas con el MRDC, incluida una visión unificada y una declaración de objetivos regionales. El marco consolidará la información pertinente, alentará la comunicación y respaldará los objetivos regionales para las partes interesadas a lo largo del Merrimack.

"El Río Merrimack ha sido durante mucho tiempo un recurso confiable en Nueva Inglaterra, proporcionando energía, agua potable, asimilación de aguas residuales, oportunidades recreativas, hábitat acuático de aguas cálidas y frías, pesca de conchas y belleza estética para nuestra región", dijo Kirk Westphal, agua líder de recursos en Brown y Caldwell. "En las últimas décadas, ha sido el escenario para la revitalización económica de las comunidades que bordean sus costas. Se han realizado muchos estudios para comprender mejor aspectos específicos del río, pero hasta ahora la información se ha descentralizado y las prioridades para la cuenca no siempre se han coordinado regionalmente. El trabajo que la Senadora DiZoglio y la Comisión han permitido tendrá como objetivo proporcionar un marco unificador para conocer y cuidar el río y las comunidades a las que sirve".

Si bien se han realizado estudios sobre el Río Merrimack en las últimas décadas, incluidos informes del Cuerpo de Ingenieros del Ejército de EE.UU., La EPA y el Departamento de Servicios Ambientales de New Hampshire, existe un sentimiento entre las partes interesadas de que dichos datos son difíciles de acceder, centrados en cuestiones muy específicas y no es útil para tomar decisiones informadas sobre futuras mejoras al río.

"Este alcance de trabajo es esencial para hacer avanzar la comisión, ya que reunimos a expertos de todo el Merrimack para abordar los problemas relacionados con la contaminación, incluida la descarga de los desbordamientos de alcantarillas combinadas (OSC)", dijo DiZoglio. "El grupo ya se ha reunido un par de veces para escuchar a expertos y discutir estrategias. Sin embargo, debido al retraso en la recepción de los fondos que se les asignaron durante el proceso presupuestario, ha faltado la estructura necesaria para garantizar que los resultados se obtengan de esas discusiones. Ahora que los fondos han sido asignados, pueden entrar en cosas concretas para la planificación estratégica. Este es un paso muy importante para establecer objetivos a corto y largo plazo para mantener nuestro río limpio, saludable, seguro y hermoso".

Se incluyen en el alcance del trabajo seis tareas específicas para establecer el marco MRDC, con una finalización estimada de cuatro a seis meses en total:

- Una evaluación de necesidades, compilando todos los estudios relevantes sobre el Río Merrimack de las últimas dos décadas e identificando lagunas de datos, inconsistencias en la calidad de los datos y objetivos no abordados, entre otros temas. En esta etapa, también se compilarán todos los requisitos reglamentarios para las comunidades y los servicios públicos a lo largo del río.
- El establecimiento de pautas para una cámara de compensación de datos consolidada para el Río Merrimack, con tipos de datos que incluyen usos del río, datos de calidad del agua y datos de fuentes de contaminación, entre otros. También se establecerán pautas para un Plan de Proyecto de Garantía de Calidad (QAPP), un documento diseñado para gobernar el campo, el laboratorio y los procedimientos para la recopilación de datos en curso y en el futuro.
- La formación de un comité directivo y un grupo de asesoramiento técnico para ayudar a garantizar que los datos correctos se desarrolle y apliquen para apoyar las decisiones regionales y para ayudar a priorizar y abogar por la financiación en función de las necesidades identificadas. Las partes interesadas pertinentes, incluidos los grupos ambientales, los funcionarios electos, los funcionarios de salud pública y otros expertos tendrán roles en estos grupos.
- La facilitación de talleres para ayudar a elaborar el marco, articulando objetivos de consenso para el Río Merrimack y determinando los roles y responsabilidades de las partes interesadas participantes en el futuro.
- Desarrollar el marco con cuatro objetivos principales en mente: integración consistente de las prioridades regionales, defensa unificada para financiamiento e investigación, decisiones basadas en datos y un enfoque en los usos del Río Merrimack.
- La presentación del marco.

"Un Río Merrimack limpio y saludable es vital para mí, tanto profesional como personalmente", dijo Lane Glenn, presidente de Northern Essex Community College. ## DiZoglio, MVPC Announce Scope of Work for Merrimack River District Commission

State Senator Diana DiZoglio (D-Methuen) and the Merrimack Valley Planning Commission have announced the finalization of a scope of work for the Merrimack River District Commission (MRDC).

The MRDC, which will be funded through monies secured by DiZoglio through the Fiscal Year 2020 State Budget, is an inclusive commission of local stakeholders — from sewage management professionals to environmentalists to elected officials — as well as representatives from state agencies, charged with assessing the current health of the Merrimack River and mapping out strategies to ensure the health and safety of the Merrimack moving forward.

The Commission's scope of work, prepared by the Andover-based environmental engineering and consulting firm Brown and Caldwell, outlines the development of a framework for decision-making and funding priorities associated with the MRDC, including a unified vision and statement of regional goals. The framework will consolidate the pertinent information, encourage communication and support regional objectives for stakeholders along the Merrimack.

"The Merrimack River has long been a reliable resource in New England, providing power, drinking water, wastewater assimilation, recreational opportunities, warm and cold water aquatic habitat, shell-fishing, and aesthetic beauty to our region," said Kirk Westphal, water resources leader at Brown and Caldwell. "In recent decades, it has been the stage for economic revitalization of the communities that line its shores. Many studies have been undertaken to better understand specific aspects of the river, but until now the information has been decentralized, and priorities for the basin have not always been regionally coordinated. The work that Senator DiZoglio and the Commission have enabled will aim to provide a unifying framework for knowing and caring for the river and the communities it serves."

While there have been studies of the Merrimack River in recent decades, including reports from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, EPA and New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, there is sentiment among stakeholders that such data is difficult to access, focused on very specific issues and not helpful toward making informed decisions regarding future improvements to the river.

"This scope of work is essential to moving the commission forward, as we bring together experts from all along the Merrimack to address issues around pollution, including discharge from combined sewer overflows (CSOs)," said

DiZoglio. "The group has already met a couple of times to hear from experts and discuss strategy. Due to a lag time in receiving funds that were appropriated to them during the budget process, however, it has lacked the structure needed to ensure results are produced from those discussions. Now that the funds have been allocated, they can get into the meat and potatoes of strategic planning. This is a hugely important step needed to set both short and long-term goals for keeping our river clean, healthy, safe and beautiful."

Included in the scope of work are six specific tasks toward establishing the MRDC framework, with an estimated completion of four to six months in total:

- A needs assessment, compiling all relevant studies on the Merrimack River from the past two decades and identifying any data gaps, data quality inconsistencies and objectives not addressed, among other issues. At this stage, all regulatory requirements for communities and utilities along the river will also be compiled.
- The establishment of guidelines for a consolidated data clearinghouse for the Merrimack River, with data types including river uses, water quality data and pollution source data, among others. Guidelines will also be established for a Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP), a document designed to govern the field, laboratory and procedures for ongoing and future data collection.
- The formation of a steering committee and technical advisory group to help ensure the right data is being developed and applied to support regional decisions and to help prioritize and advocate for funding based on identified needs. Pertinent stakeholders, including environmental groups, elected officials, public health officials and other experts will have roles in these groups.
- The facilitating of workshops to help craft the framework, articulating consensus goals for the Merrimack River and determining the roles and responsibilities of participating stakeholders moving forward.
- Developing the framework with four principal goals in mind: consistent integration of regional priorities, unified advocacy for funding and research, data-driven decisions, and a focus on uses of the Merrimack River.
- The presentation of the framework.
