

MCC Student Advances in Career Thanks to Metallica Scholarship

After a devastating earthquake in 2010, Magnusson Chery, of Billerica, made the difficult decision to move away from his parents in Haiti to come to the United States. Eager to learn, he enrolled in an electronics course at Middlesex Community College, fully funded by Metallica's Foundation, All Within My Hands, through the Metallica Scholars Initiative. While allowing him to focus on his studies, the opportunity also jumpstarted his new career.

"My experience has been great," Chery said. "Since I'm new to the manufacturing field, I've learned a lot of new information on how things work. I don't have any background in the electronics field, but I was looking to pursue a career that I find rewarding, so I got curious since I like working with my hands and being productive."

In the of Summer 2022, Middlesex was selected from a competitive field of community colleges across the country to receive \$100,000. With the funding, MCC's Corporate and Community Education and Training division worked with MassHire Lowell to develop an electronics course to teach participants the knowledge and skills they need to be hired into entry-level positions in the advanced manufacturing field.

Chery has learned a range of skills throughout the course, from a basic math refresher to specific software programs he will use in the field, including AutoCad, Solidworks and Soldering. As a quick and adaptable learner, he appreciated being able to practice these new skills hands-on to create something relevant to a real-world job. He considers the course to be a solid foundation for his new career.

"The benefits of this course have been really tremendous," he said. "I can take the skills and become more competitive in the job market and manufacturing industry that is in much need of new employees. The way the program was set up felt like a buffet – so many skills to learn and choose from that gave me a strong idea of what I want to learn."

After a friend sent him information on the class, Chery decided to enroll because it was offered on MCC's Bedford campus, which is close to his home. Throughout his time in the program, he found guidance and support that he feels will lead to his success now and in the future.

"This course will help me reach my goals because of the help of some amazing professors," Chery said. "I like that the program promotes a team environment and that all the faculty and staff members are always ready to help. I just want to thank the professors and coordinators for taking their time to make the program a success."



After completing the course in May 2023, Chery plans to find a job in the electronics field and enroll in MCC's Engineering Technology associate program for the Fall 2023 semester.

"Enrolling in the course was one of the best decisions I've made," Chery said. "[The course] showed me I can create things from my mind and make it a reality. Maybe one day I will create something fun and useful to society."

1 Update your contact info with MassHealth. Call 1-800-841-2900 or log in to your account at MAHealthConnector.org.

2 Report any household changes, such as a new job, address, or income change for all members of your household.

3 Look for a blue envelope in the mail, and read all mail from MassHealth. You may be sent forms to complete and return.

Mientras trataba de explicar mi versión de la historia, seguía diciendo que estaba agradecido porque ese día tomó la decisión de obtener una educación y tener una buena vida.

"Fui a UMass y me gradué con una licenciatura y por eso, le agradezco", dijo mientras lo llamaban por su nombre a la consulta.

Esa es una historia con un final feliz porque me alegro cada vez que veo a un graduado universitario; la educación es la clave del éxito y estoy realmente feliz por él. Pero me entristece que su único recuerdo de mí sea negativo, especialmente cuando debe estar equivocado porque no fui yo las dos veces.

A algunas personas les encanta hacer historias en las redes sociales y se preguntan si esto ha sido el resultado de algún comentario. Yo los veo y elijo ignorarlos.

La comunidad celebra la inauguración del proyecto de la nueva escuela Leahy

El Alcalde Brian A. DePeña, junto con la Autoridad de Construcción Escolar de Massachusetts (MSBA), miembros de la delegación local y estatal electa, representantes de las Escuelas Públicas de Lawrence y el Departamento de Obras Públicas, tuvieron el honor de llevar a cabo una ceremonia de inauguración de la nueva Escuela Francis M. Leahy.

La Escuela Francis M. Leahy se une al proyecto Oliver en curso como el primer edificio escolar nuevo de Lawrence en más de dos décadas. El nuevo Leahy atenderá a estudiantes de tres escuelas actuales en una instalación completamente moderna, regresará a las clases que fueron reubicadas debido al hacinamiento y brindará un viaje educativo continuo de K-8 para más familias en la parte norte central de la ciudad.

Se estima que este proyecto estará abierto en el otoño de 2025, con un costo de aproximadamente \$103 millones, el 40 por ciento de los cuales será provisto por la Ciudad de Lawrence. El resto de la inversión provendrá del MSBA.

“Estar presente en la creación de nuevas oportunidades para la educación de nuestros niños es una de las prioridades de mi administración. Un agradecimiento especial a la Autoridad de Construcción Escolar de Massachusetts (MSBA), el Departamento Escolar de la Ciudad de Lawrence, nuestra delegación estatal y los concejales por el apoyo y su amor por la educación y, por supuesto, a Pat Mariano, padres, niños de nuestro escuelas, y a todos aquellos que se unieron a nosotros en esta ceremonia de inauguración de la nueva escuela Francis M. Leahy”, dijo el Alcalde Brian A. DePeña.

“La inauguración de la Escuela Leahy representa el compromiso de nuestra ciudad de garantizar que los estudiantes de Lawrence reciban los recursos educativos necesarios para que prosperen dentro

y fuera del aula”, dijo el Representante Estatal Frank A. Morán (D – Lawrence). “Me gustaría agradecer a todos los padres y defensores que ayudaron a hacer realidad este proyecto, especialmente a Pat Mariano del Comité Escolar de Lawrence. El futuro es brillante para los estudiantes de Lawrence y estoy emocionado de celebrar la finalización de este proyecto en el futuro”.

“Creo que 'agradecido' es el término correcto hoy”, dijo el Superintendente Interino de LPS, Juan Rodríguez, quien agradeció la colaboración del Alcalde DePeña, los funcionarios electos locales, la MSBA y la ciudad y la comunidad escolar para que el proyecto se hiciera realidad. Y el Sr. Rodríguez continuó, “Se nos recuerda una vez más cuánto valora la comunidad la educación de nuestros hijos, y ese valor colectivo significa que dentro de dos años, este edificio de última generación abrirá para atender a los estudiantes de este vecindario”.

Si bien será un edificio contemporáneo con un diseño ecológico totalmente accesible, también conservará numerosos componentes arquitectónicos originales de la construcción de 1921. Con la estrecha colaboración de la Comisión Histórica de Lawrence, se identificaron varias tablas, rollos, capiteles y emblemas para retirarlos, restaurarlos y reinstalarlos en el nuevo edificio.

“Si bien me complace que los líderes de nuestra ciudad, a través de la asistencia de nuestros socios estatales, hayan trabajado juntos para la nueva Escuela Leahy sin aumentar los impuestos, no podemos alejarnos y decir que esto es suficiente. Solo con la asociación crítica de padres y educadores se cumplirá la promesa educativa de la nueva Leahy, o cualquiera de nuestros otros edificios más nuevos”, dijo el presidente del Concejo Municipal de Lawrence, Marc Laplante.

Community Celebrates Groundbreaking for New Leahy School Project Anticipated Opening 2025

Mayor Brian A. DePeña, along with the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA), members of the Elected Local and State Delegation, Representatives of Lawrence Public Schools, and the Department of Public Works, had the honor of holding a groundbreaking ceremony for the new Francis M. Leahy School.

The Francis M. Leahy School joins the ongoing Oliver project as Lawrence's first new school building in more than two decades. The new Leahy will serve students from three current schools in a fully modern facility, returning classes that were relocated due to overcrowding and providing a continuous K-8 educational journey for more families in the North Central portion of the City.

It is estimated this project will be open in the fall of 2025, with a cost of approximately \$103 million, 40 percent of which will be provided by the City of Lawrence. The remaining investment will come from the MSBA.

“Being present in the creation of new opportunities for the education of our children is one of the priorities of my administration. Special thank you to the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA), the School Department from the City of Lawrence, our state delegation, and the councilors for the support and their love for education, and of course to Pat Mariano, parents, kids from our schools, and to all those who joined us in this Groundbreaking Ceremony for the New Francis M. Leahy School”, said Mayor Brian A. DePeña.

“The groundbreaking of the Leahy School represents our city's commitment to ensuring that the students of Lawrence are provided with the educational resources necessary for them to thrive inside and

outside of the classroom,” said State Representative Frank A. Moran (D – Lawrence). “I would like to thank all the parents and advocates who helped to make this project a reality – especially Pat Mariano of the Lawrence School Committee. The future is bright for the students of Lawrence, and I am excited to celebrate this project's completion in the future.”

“I think ‘grateful’ is the correct term today,” said Interim LPS Superintendent Juan Rodríguez, who credited the collaboration of Mayor DePeña, local elected officials, the MSBA, and the city and school community with the project becoming a reality. And Mr. Rodríguez continued, “We're reminded once again how much the community values education for our children, and that collective value means that two years down the line this state-of-the-art building will open to serve the students in this neighborhood.”

While it will be a contemporary building with a fully accessible, green design, it will also preserve numerous original architectural components of the 1921 construction. With the close collaboration of the Lawrence Historical Commission, several tablets, scrolls, spires, and emblems were identified for removal, restoration, and re-installation in the new building.

“While I am pleased that our city leaders, through the assistance of our state partners, have worked together for the new Leahy School without increasing taxes, we cannot walk away and say that this is enough. Only with the critical partnership of parents and educators will the educational promise of the new Leahy, or any of our other newer buildings, be fulfilled”, said Lawrence City Council President Marc Laplante.

This workshop is open to all members of the public, and will provide a chance for community members to share stories about their Lowell housing experiences, create a housing vision and housing goals together with the community, and map the opportunities in their neighborhood.

The feedback gathered at the workshop will be used in the Lowell Forward Comprehensive Plan and the Lowell Forward Housing Production Plan. Doors will open at 6:15pm for registration, refreshments, and snacks. All ages are welcome to attend. Khmer, Portuguese, and Spanish interpretation will be provided at the event. Project Background

This is the second City-wide workshop of the Lowell Forward Comprehensive Plan. Lowell Forward will engage the community to create a shared vision and framework to shape Lowell's future. These goals and strategies will guide policy, zoning changes, and other ways the City can make the vision a reality. As part of the Lowell Forward Comprehensive Plan, the City partnered with NMCOG to develop a Housing Production Plan (HPP) consistent with the standards of the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD). This standalone document will cover a five-year period and provide regulatory and non-regulatory strategies to create and preserve affordable and market rate housing opportunities in the City.

The HPP includes:

- **DATA:** An assessment of housing needs and demand based on existing conditions, demographic and development trends and projections, and regional growth factors.

- **PUBLIC INPUT:** The feedback and shared vision built through outreach to community members in all neighborhoods with diverse lived experiences.

- **LIMITATIONS:** An analysis of physical and regulatory development constraints.

- **LOCATIONS:** Identification of specific sites for housing production.

- **GOALS:** Housing goals, including an annual numeric housing production target.

- **STRATEGIES:** Implementation strategies to work toward goals. Provide tools to engage with community members, identify areas and sites for housing production and those for preservation, determine constraints and barriers, and develop housing goals and implementation strategies.

Esta solicitud parece un aviso sobre su hipoteca. Aquí le mostramos cómo detectarlo

Si recibe una carta inesperada de su compañía hipotecaria, ¡fíjese bien! Según numerosos informes de BBB Scam Tracker, las cartas son una solicitud engañosa de un servicio de garantía para el hogar. Aquí se explica cómo detectar el esquema.

This solicitation looks like a notice about your mortgage. Here's how to spot it

Cómo funciona esta estafa

Recibe una carta que parece provenir de su proveedor hipotecario. Supuestamente es del "Departamento de garantía del hogar" de la compañía y afirma que la garantía de su hogar debe renovarse.

Antes de preocuparte, mira de cerca la carta y mira lo que está pasando. Un informe de BBB Scam Tracker notó: "En la parte inferior de la carta en letra pequeña está el comentario: 'No todos los consumidores tienen cobertura previa. No estamos afiliados a su hipoteca actual'".

Si no lee la letra pequeña (o no aparece en la carta que recibe), es probable que le preocupe que la garantía de su casa haya vencido y que su hipoteca esté en riesgo. No tendrá que tratar con su prestamista hipotecario si llama al número y "renueva" su garantía. En su lugar, habrá dado dinero e información personal a una empresa que emplea tácticas publicitarias engañosas.

Este esquema es similar a las llamadas de garantía extendida de automóviles. El producto puede ser real, pero realmente necesita algo más. Además, desea evitar hacer negocios con una empresa que recurre a técnicas de venta engañosas.

Cómo evitar estafas similares:

- **Ir a la fuente.** Si recibe alguna correspondencia sobre su hipoteca o garantía de vivienda de la que no está seguro, no utilice la información de contacto del mensaje. En su lugar, llame a su prestamista directamente para preguntar sobre el asunto. Busque su información de contacto por separado en su factura hipotecaria o busque la línea de servicio al cliente de su prestamista en su sitio web.

- **Tenga cuidado con las ofertas o amenazas de alta presión.** No permita que los estafadores lo presionen para que actúe de inmediato, incluso si dicen que podría perder su casa. Si alguien intenta usar tácticas de miedo, deje de comunicarse con ellos y comuníquese directamente con su banco o prestamista.

- ¿Comprar una garantía para el hogar? Consulte este consejo de BBB sobre garantías para el hogar para obtener más consejos.

This solicitation looks like a notice about your mortgage. Here's how to spot it

If you get an unexpected letter from your mortgage company, look closely! According to numerous BBB Scam Tracker reports, the letters are a deceptive solicitation for a home warranty service. Here's how to spot the scheme.

How this scam works

You receive a letter that appears to come from your mortgage provider. It's allegedly from the company's "Home Warranty Dept," and claims that your home warranty must be renewed.

Before worrying, look closely at the letter and see what's happening. One BBB Scam Tracker report noticed: "At the very bottom of the letter in small print is the comment, 'Not all consumers have previous coverage. We are not affiliated with your current mortgage.'"

If you don't read the fine print (or it doesn't appear in the letter you receive), you'll likely be concerned your home warranty has lapsed, and your mortgage is at risk. You won't be dealing with your mortgage lender if you call the number and "renew" your warranty. Instead, you will have given money and personal information to a company that employs deceptive advertising tactics.

This scheme is similar to the extended car warranty calls. The product may be real, but you truly need something else. Also, you want to avoid doing business with a company that resorts to misleading sales techniques.

Read the full alert for another variation of this scam.

How to avoid similar scams:

- **Go to the source.** If you receive any correspondence about your mortgage or home warranty that you aren't sure about, don't use the contact information in the message. Instead, call your lender directly to inquire about the matter. Look up their contact information separately on your mortgage bill or search for your lender's customer service line on their website.

- **Watch out for high-pressure offers or threats.** Don't let scammers pressure you to act immediately, even if they say you could lose your home. If someone tries to use scare tactics, stop communicating with them and contact your bank or lender directly.

Where will my work be shown?

Do artists receive a portion of the artwork sale?

Yes, artists split proceeds 50/50 with Essex Art Center. You are welcome to donate more than 50% should you choose to.

I participated last year but my piece didn't sell. Can I try selling it again this year? No, please refrain from re-submitting. We are eager to see your latest work!

Can anyone submit?

Yes, artists of all ages are encouraged to submit.

What mediums will be included?

All mediums will be considered.

Are there any size requirements?

No. But keep in mind that it's difficult for us to accommodate any work beyond 48" in height or width.

Does my artwork need to be framed?

All 2D work must be dropped off "ready to hang," either framed or on canvas/panel with a hanging mechanism (D-rings or wire) on the back. Picture hanging wire is preferred. Unfortunately, we are not able to frame or install hardware.

How do I take a good photo of my work?

Place your work against a neutral white or grey background. Ensure there are no shadows and the light is uniform throughout the work. You can learn more here.

NECC Celebrates Class of 2023


Over 700 students are now part of the Northern Essex Community College alumni family. Four hundred of those students, along with their families and friends, gathered under the tent on the Haverhill Campus for the 61st annual Commencement Ceremony this past Saturday.

The now-graduates processed into the tent behind the Stuart Highland Pipe Band— a Northern Essex tradition. NECC President Lane Glenn opened the ceremony with words of encouragement for the class of 2023: "Today means you're ready – whether you think so or not. Ready to take on life and the world. You endured the challenges of the pandemic. You beat many odds to get to this day. And what a glorious spring day we have to celebrate."

Ember Spera, who earned their American Sign Language Interpreting Certificate, gave the student's address. In a poignant twist, Spera signed their speech while friend and classmate Jess Myer read the words aloud.

Spera's parents are Deaf, and this speech represented a special full-circle moment. When Spera was in high school, they had planned to give an address at graduation, but the interpreter never showed up. "Looking back, NECC changed my course of path and my life. My 18-year-old concept of a community college looks nothing like the real one. I found more community here than in some 4-year programs. I invested my time and energy, and the return is priceless," they shared.

Spera plans to work as a freelance interpreter. They also hold associate degrees from Northern Essex in liberal arts and communication/journalism and a bachelor's degree in journalism from UMass Amherst.




Though Spera was a tough act to follow, NECC alum and radio host Justin Aguirre '09 provided a rousing and deeply personal featured address. Aguirre came to NECC in 2006 as a recovering drug addict and convicted felon. He credits then-journalism professor, now Dean of Liberal Arts Amy Callahan, for taking him under her wing and

showing him what was possible.

"My story is one of hope. Never give up on your dreams. Wherever you are going from here, whether to another school or into a career - remember to aim high and never give up. Don't give in to that little voice in your head. If nobody told you they love you Today, you're hanging out with the wrong

people. You should be told every day. "

Aguirre transferred to Salem State after earning his associate degree in journalism/communication from Northern Essex. He is now the executive producer and co-host of the popular Billy and Lisa in the Morning Show on Kiss 108.



Emeritus Recipients

Two long-time members of the college's faculty and staff received emeritus status:

Mark Palermo retired in 2021 after 36 years at Northern Essex. He started as an ESL instructor and later taught Spanish and medical Spanish. Palermo also volunteered to teach classes for older learners, established the NECC chapter of Amnesty International, and founded the Northern Essex foreign film festival, an annual event that ran for several years and later became the Lawrence Film Festival held at Lawrence's Heritage State Park.

Linda Murphy retired from Northern Essex in 2021 after 40 years of service to the college. She served as curriculum coordinator for developmental mathematics. In 2002, Murphy was honored with the NISOD excellence award. Her leadership and passion for math found her serving as project manager for the Commonwealth's 100% math initiative, promoting the reform of math curriculum and pedagogy. In



2014, Murphy launched an open-source modularized developmental math curriculum to build a pathway into college-level math.

At Northern Essex, the emeritus rank is an honor that recognizes sustained excellence in performance, character, and meritorious service to the college.

Social Justice Award

Northern Essex professor of philosophy Meredith Gunning is this year's recipient of the Social Justice Award.

The award recognizes individuals, groups, departments, or initiatives at the college that promote values such as a commitment to equity and diversity or the advancement of human rights and social justice.

President Glenn recognized Gunning's work with the Community Outreach Group, which aims to be a bridge



between the college and its surrounding neighborhoods. The group has collected canned goods for food banks, items for holiday gifts, clothing for homeless shelters; cleaned parks; and raised funds for charitable organizations.

He also cited her ongoing participation in workshops and conversations on anti-racism and equity issues and how she has applied these to her courses. "On a recent sabbatical, she worked specifically to 'decolonize' her curriculum, to include more works of philosophers of color in her courses. Meredith's influence has extended to, and beyond, the more than 10,000 students she has taught in more than 400 sections of philosophy classes in her career."

In honor of the year the college was founded, the Social Justice Award comes with a cash prize of \$1,961, which the recipient can use to advance social justice initiatives at Northern Essex.

Several other honors that have been awarded at commencement in the past are now part of the NECC Impact Awards.

Freedom Trail® Foundation Expands Tours

As the weather warms, the Freedom Trail Foundation's 18th-century costumed guides are out on the Trail in full force offering an expanded menu of fun and educational tours.

During May, the Freedom Trail Foundation will add to its current weekly tours departing from the Boston Common. The current tour schedule will offer additional Walk Into History® Tours from the Boston Common Visitor Information Center to include tours on the hour every hour on Saturdays and Sundays, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The Foundation will also offer tours departing from the ArtsBoston booth for the first time since 2022, including Walk Into History Tours, on Saturdays at 10:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. and Sundays at 10:30 a.m., and North End Tours on Saturdays at 1:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. and Sundays at 1:30 p.m.

"Boston's official Freedom Trail® Tours are a great way to start one's Freedom Trail experience and visit historic sites, while getting out in the fresh air for exercise," said the Foundation's executive Director Suzanne Segura Taylor. "We are excited to add to our menu by bringing back tours departing from Faneuil Hall and to work with local partners to help build business in Downtown Boston."

Walk Into History Tours are the official 90-minute walking tour of the Freedom Trail featuring tales of high treason, mob agitations, revolutionary actions, and partisan fights, walking to 11 of Boston's historic Freedom Trail sites to and from

Boston Common and Faneuil Hall. The North End Tour features stops along the Trail including the Paul Revere House, Old North Church, Copp's Hill Burying Ground, and other historic places in Boston's oldest neighborhood.

Led by 18th-century costumed guides, Freedom Trail Foundation walking tours are \$17 for adults, \$15 for seniors/students, and \$8 for children, and include a \$1 donation to the Freedom Trail Foundation's Preservation Fund. Tickets may be purchased at the Visitor Information Center on Boston Common, Artists for Humanity and Crabby Jack's shops inside historic Faneuil Hall, Samuel Adams Downtown Boston Taproom, Old Town Trolley locations and ticket booths, and online at TheFreedomTrail.org.

All walking tours are available for group tours year-round by appointment and are perfect for tourist groups, family outings, birthday parties, company parties, corporate activities, team building, and more, and may be booked via phone reservation at (617) 357-8300.



El desarrollo de las habilidades de resucitación cardiopulmonar (RCP) puede comenzar apenas a los 4 años y más adelante cuando los niños crecen, de forma tal que para los 10 años puedan realizar compresiones efectivas en el pecho en maniqués de entrenamiento, de acuerdo con una nueva declaración científica de ILCOR, la American Heart Association y el Consejo Europeo de Resucitación publicada hoy en el periódico icónico de la American Heart Association, revisado por pares *Circulation*.

El grupo de autores de científicos de resucitación de todo el mundo revisó más de 100 artículos de investigación sobre la capacitación de estudiantes sobre RCP. La revisión determinó que los niños de edad escolar están altamente motivados por aprender habilidades que salvan la vida y con frecuencia “multiplican” su capacitación al transmitir lo que han aprendido a los demás.

“Capacitar a los estudiantes se ha convertido en un elemento clave para aumentar el número de personas listas para realizar RCP cuando se produce un paro cardíaco fuera de un hospital, y potencialmente aumentar las tasas de RCP y supervivencia al paro cardíaco a nivel

mundial”, dijo Bernd W. Böttiger, M.D., M.L., FAHA, presidente del grupo de redacción de declaraciones y profesor titular y jefe del Departamento de Anestesiología y Medicina de Cuidados Intensivos en el Hospital Universitario de Colonia, Alemania. “Esta revisión de la investigación busca incentivar a los médicos, legisladores, funcionarios de escuelas locales y el público en general a actuar en una emergencia cardíaca cuando sea posible”.

“Como la mayoría de los paros cardíacos fuera de un hospital sucede en el hogar, es importante que todos los miembros de la familia comprendan qué hacer si alguien tiene un paro cardíaco”, dijo Comilla Sasson, M.D., Ph.D., FAHA, miembro del comité de redacción de declaraciones, médica en ejercicio de medicina de emergencia y vicepresidente de ciencia e innovación en la American Heart Association. “Desarrollar habilidades a una edad temprana, que se refuerzan de forma consistente durante sus años en la escuela tiene el potencial de educar a generaciones de estudiantes y sus padres sobre cómo responder a un paro cardíaco, realizar compresiones en el pecho y respiraciones de rescate, usar un DEA y en definitiva aumentar la supervivencia”.

Un paro cardíaco fuera del entorno de un hospital es una causa principal de muerte en todo el mundo. Las tasas de supervivencia oscilan entre 2 % y 20 % en todo el mundo, y son particularmente bajas sin el reconocimiento y la acción inmediata de las personas cercanas.

De acuerdo con la declaración, incluso si los niños son demasiado jóvenes o pequeños para realizar una compresión efectiva del pecho, pueden comenzar a aprender los pasos y el ritmo de la RCP apropiado y comenzar a aprender sobre los DEA. La investigación ha encontrado resultados impactantes en la ampliación de la preparación de la comunidad cuando los niños en edad escolar comparten lo que aprenden con sus familias, sus amigos y vecinos.

Además de lo que se puede hacer en las escuelas, las familias deben tener un plan de respuesta ante emergencias cardíacas. Cree un plan en el hogar y practique regularmente delegando los pasos siguientes:

1. ¿Quién llamará al 911? Use un teléfono celular. Coloque el teléfono en altavoz mientras habla con el despachador de emergencias y comienza a aplicar RCP.
2. ¿Quién comienza la RCP? Duplique o triplique las probabilidades de supervivencia al realizar RCP con las manos de inmediato.
3. ¿Quién abrirá la puerta? Asegúrese de que entrada no está cerrada con llave, para dar a los primeros respondedores un acceso sencillo a su residencia.

Esta declaración científica ha sido preparada por el grupo voluntario de redacción en representación del Comité de Unificación Internacional en Resucitación. Las organizaciones miembro del comité

incluyen a la American Heart Association y el Consejo Europeo de Resucitación. Las declaraciones científicas promueven una mayor conciencia sobre las enfermedades cardiovasculares y los ataques cerebrales y ayudan a facilitar la toma de decisiones informadas sobre el cuidado de la salud. Las declaraciones científicas describen lo que se sabe actualmente sobre un tema y qué áreas necesitan más investigación. Si bien las declaraciones científicas informan el desarrollo de pautas, no hacen recomendaciones de tratamiento. Las pautas de la American Heart Association proporcionan las recomendaciones de práctica clínica oficiales de la Asociación.

Pitching staff highlights nine selected to Region 21 Baseball All-Region Teams

The Northern Essex Community College pitching staff swept all three pitching positions on the All-Region First Team to highlight six first team selections and nine total honorees for the Region 21 Champion Knights as All-Region selections were released on Monday following a vote of the Regions baseball coaches.

Jairo Vazquez (Lawrence), Tristan Ciampa (Wilmington) and Jagger Iovinelli (Huntington Beach, CA) swept all three pitching spots on the first team as they carried the bulk of the pitching load for the Knights throughout the season. Heading into District Championship weekend around the country Vazquez leads the country on both ERA (1.19) and strikeouts per nine innings (16.81) whiel ranking third in total strikeouts with 99 in 53 innings of work. Ciampa joins Vazquez among the nations ERA leaders as he ranks fourth at 1.54. Iovinelli picked up the final spot on the first team as he currently sits with a 2.28 ERA. The trio has combined to go 23-1 on the mound this season.

Joining the pitching staff on the first team, were infielder Anthony Marcano (Boston), right fielder Cooper Smith (Bloomington, MN) and designated hitter Richard Matos (Boston). Marcano currently ranks second in the nation in slugging

percentage at 1.044, eighth in batting average .495 and tied 10th in home runs with 11. Matos is among the nations top 10 in RBI's as he ranks ninth with 68, while also adding a .430 batting average and .807 slugging percentage. Smith's eight triples rank among the country's top ten, while he is batting .425 on the season.

Kameron Levesque (Hooksett, NH) was NECC's lone representative on the All-Region second team as the Region 21 Tournaments Most Outstanding Player as he is batting .380 on the season with five home runs and five home runs. Jomar Moreta (Lynn) and Lucas Berube (Dighton) were both selected to the Honorable Mention squad. Moreta who has come on strong down the stretch, finding a spot in the everyday lineup and is batting .407 in 22 games played from the leadoff position in the lineup. While splitting time at catcher, Berube has played in 15 of the nights while batting .349.

NECC will look to make its nine overall and second consecutive appearance in the NJCAA World Series as they head to Brooklyn, NY this weekend to take on Kingsborough Community College in the Northeast District Tournament, in a best of three series where the winner will advance to the World Series on beginning on May 27th in Greeneville, TN
