

Posible atraco de \$2.7M en Lawrence

La Ciudad de Lawrence está investigando el posible robo de \$2.7 millones de la construcción de las escuelas Oliver and Leahy.

Un comunicado de prensa de la oficina del Alcalde Brian DePeña el jueves por la tarde informó a los medios lo sucedido y las medidas que han tomado. El mismo lee:

“Hoy en día, los ciberdelincuentes se hacen pasar por contratistas y proveedores con diversos esquemas ilegales para defraudar a entidades gubernamentales y corporaciones privadas en todo el mundo con la esperanza de interceptar pagos. Estos delincuentes son astutos y buscan continuamente formas de engañar a las instituciones.

“Recientemente, estos mismos tipos de delincuentes han intentado defraudar al sistema escolar de la ciudad de Lawrence haciéndose pasar por proveedores de servicios. Me gustaría informar a nuestros residentes que las autoridades locales y federales están investigando el asunto y parece muy prometedor.

“Para evitar futuros incidentes de esta naturaleza, he ordenado tanto a TI como a Finanzas que implementen salvaguardas sistemáticas y fortalezcan los procesos de verificación que nos alertarán sobre intentos cibernéticos fraudulentos”.

No se sabe si el dinero fue entregado o si se puede recuperar.

Possible scam of \$2.7 M in Lawrence

The City of Lawrence is investigating the possible theft of \$2.7 million from the construction of two schools.

A press release from Mayor Brian DePeña's office Thursday afternoon let the media know what happened and what measures they have taken. It reads:

“These days, cybercriminals pose as contractors and vendors with various illegal schemes to defraud government entities and private corporations around the world in the hope of intercepting payments. These criminals are cunning and continually look for ways to fool institutions.

“Recently, these same types of

criminals have attempted to defraud the City of Lawrence school system by posing as a service provider. I would like to inform our residents that local and federal authorities are investigating the matter and it looks very promising.

“To prevent future incidents of this nature, I have directed both IT and Finance to implement systematic safeguards and tighten verification processes that will alert us to fraudulent cyber attempts.”

There's no word as to whether the money was delivered or if it can be recovered.



Temporada de elecciones

Cuando el Presidente del Concejo, Marc Laplante, asistió a la reunión de la Junta de Registros el 22 de agosto de 2023, estaba preparado para explicarle la naturaleza de su denuncia. Se sintió decepcionado por no poder hacerlo mientras la Junta fallaba en contra de su oponente. Muchas personas en la audiencia no entendieron el motivo (incluido quien escribe) y lo explicaré ahora.

El señor Laplante estaba dispuesto a aportar pruebas de que había varios nombres mal escritos, direcciones erróneas y un par de firmas que entregó días antes que Germinudy Rosario, pero en su lugar contaron las de ella y no las de él.

Esos eran problemas que deberían plantearse y corregirse para que no suceda en futuras elecciones, pero el mayor problema fueron las firmas falsificadas. Según las normas de la Secretaría de Estado, la División Electoral permite que se certifiquen los nombres, incluso si sospechan que las firmas son fraudulentas, deberán certificarlas. Sólo previa impugnación ante la Junta de Registros se podrán anular estas firmas.

Cualquier persona interesada puede consultar los documentos de nominación de todos los candidatos en el sitio web de la ciudad Documentos de nominación y peticiones | Lawrence, MA, y encontrará el mismo tipo de problemas en los documentos de nominación de otros candidatos. El asunto es que la mayoría de los candidatos no tienen el conocimiento ni el deseo de desafiar a nadie, pero existe la posibilidad de sacar a un oponente de la boleta si sólo les interesa hacerlo.

Algunas personas encargadas de recoger firmas son vagas y creen que nadie se dará cuenta y firmarán con el nombre equivocado o incluso con la dirección equivocada. Al parecer, confían en que los trabajadores del Departamento de Elecciones lo aprobarán aunque noten las diferencias entre lo que firmaron y lo que aparece en sus actas. Esto se debe a que las reglas del Secretario de Estado indican que así debería ser. Le corresponde al oponente plantear estas diferencias a la Junta de Registros para descalificarlo.

En el caso de Laplante, no se le permitió impugnar las firmas falsificadas ya que su oponente no superó el primer obstáculo: proporcionar un documento de nominación firmado y certificado ante notario. La señora Rosario fue considerada

ilegible para ser candidata porque sus documentos no seguían las reglas y por lo tanto no hubo necesidad de que Marc presentara su caso ya que ella ya no era considerada una candidata válida.

Ese es otro error común de los candidatos sin experiencia. Cuando eso sucede, todas las firmas en esa página presentadas aunque sean correctas son automáticamente inválidas, pero un contendiente debe comunicarlo a la Junta.

Hablé con la secretaria municipal Eileen Bernal y cuestioné las acciones de los empleados del Departamento de Elecciones y ella dijo: "Hubo detalles menores pero hicieron un buen trabajo con el proceso siguiendo las reglas del Secretario de Estado".

Nuevamente, esa responsabilidad recae en los demás candidatos para asegurarse de que las cosas se hagan correctamente.

Ahora pensemos en los políticos que estamos eligiendo. Si son descuidados con su trabajo y permiten que cualquiera se acerque a sus electores para recoger firmas y este es el resultado, no deberían culpar al oponente que es inteligente y sabe cómo hacer funcionar el sistema.

Pero estas son las personas que se postulan para cargos públicos por las que votamos sin estar preparados y que creen que las buenas intenciones son lo que cuenta. Por ejemplo, el miércoles pasado Julio Merán entrevistó a Jessica Aquino, candidata al Concejo Municipal por el Distrito B. Joven, se expresa muy bien y con soltura en sus respuestas, pero me recordó a la Vicepresidenta Kamala Harris con su risa constante. Esa fue una entrevista seria, no un programa de entretenimiento.

Su comportamiento me desanimó hasta que se reveló. El Sr. Merán le preguntó si había visto los Estatutos de la Ciudad, si había leído las Reglas de Orden de Robert, las Reglas del Concejo Municipal y el presupuesto actual de la ciudad a lo que ella dijo que los había visto pero en un momento admitió que no le había mencionado una de esas cosas en las preguntas que él le había enviado.

¡Por eso las risas! Tenía demasiada confianza porque estaba preparada para cualquier cosa que él le arrojara. ¿Prepararía de la misma manera a alguien con quien él no está de acuerdo?

Siempre veo su programa porque Merán tiene el coraje de abordar temas importantes que a nadie más le importa tocar y se documenta antes de hablar pero este programa fue una gran decepción.

Elegir a los miembros del Concejo Municipal es la tarea más importante que tenemos cada dos años. Corremos el riesgo de terminar con personas como María De La Cruz en el Distrito A. Ella apenas sabe lo que se está discutiendo y, a veces, después de una discusión, termina votando en contra de lo que defendió o a favor de lo que se opuso.

Afortunadamente, no volverá a postularse y cree que su mandato ya terminó. Hace varios meses que no asiste a una reunión ni la ven por ningún lado y todavía está cobrando su salario. Que ese sea un ejemplo de cómo no votar.

Merán fue una decepción porque repitió que el presupuesto de la ciudad lleva unos \$45 millones para Misceláneos, lo que a su juicio es sospechoso. Esto no es una "caja chica"; es un monto requerido que la ciudad debe tener para emergencias y que

aparece en cada presupuesto, cada año.

Un buen ejemplo de ello es la recogida de nieve; como nadie sabe cuánta nieve tendremos cada año, el presupuesto exige una cantidad mínima y, al final del año, el saldo se puede transferir de ese fondo.

Asimismo, la recolección y reciclaje de basura; Si bien la ciudad tiene un presupuesto fijo, hay ocasiones en las que los gastos extra son inevitables. Y, negociaciones sindicales; si bien cada departamento tiene un presupuesto para salarios, mediante acuerdos sindicales se deben incrementar y proviene de ese fondo Misceláneo.

Tenga en cuenta que el "Efectivo gratis" (Free Cash) no se puede utilizar para ninguno de estos fines.

Según el Alcalde DePeña y la Concejala Ana Levy, esto se lo han explicado varias veces y él continúa con la insinuación.

Boston, MA – The Cancer FactFinder, un recurso en línea que examina mitos y desinformación sobre el cáncer, ahora está disponible en 8 idiomas adicionales: árabe, chino, criollo, francés, portugués, español, tagalo y vietnamita.

El sitio web proporciona información precisa y confiable sobre lo que causa y lo que no causa cáncer y ayuda a disipar conceptos erróneos comunes sobre la enfermedad. Lanzado en 2022, el sitio fue creado por un equipo del Centro Familiar Zhu para la Prevención Global del Cáncer de la Universidad T.H. Chan School of Public Health y el Centro para la Equidad y la Participación en el Cáncer del Dana-Farber/Harvard Cancer Center.

Para cada uno de los más de 60 temas del sitio web, como "Carne roja", "Estrés", "Terapia de reemplazo hormonal" o "Radón", el resumen proporciona información sobre:

- Lo que quizás haya escuchado;
- Lo que nos dice la ciencia;
- Cómo reducir su riesgo;
- Qué significa esto para mí; y
- Fuentes y enlaces para más información.

Cada afirmación sobre un tema, como "La carne roja causa cáncer", también viene con una interpretación de los hallazgos del equipo sobre la veracidad de una afirmación, como se indica a continuación.


• Lo más probable o definitivamente cierto: hay evidencia suficiente para sugerir que la afirmación es cierta.

• Falso: información errónea: hay evidencia suficiente para sugerir que la afirmación es falsa.



• Aún no estamos seguros; los científicos todavía están trabajando en ello: no hay evidencia suficiente para decir si la afirmación es cierta o no.

El equipo actualizará continuamente el sitio web con nuevos temas y agregará información adicional a los temas existentes. Las traducciones reflejan el deseo del equipo de ampliar el uso del sitio en el estado y más allá. "La información errónea sobre el cáncer puede afectar negativamente a cualquier persona, sin importar el idioma que hable. Es importante garantizar que todos puedan acceder a datos precisos sobre el cáncer; por eso hemos lanzado Cancer FactFinder en muchos idiomas comúnmente hablados", afirmó Timothy Rebbeck, Vincent L. Gregory, Profesor Jr. de Prevención del Cáncer y director del Zhu Family Center de la Harvard Chan School y profesor de oncología médica en el Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.



Los Médicos Peor Pagados en Massachusetts Manifiestan por un Contrato Justo y Tardado en Llegar

Más de un año después de sindicarse, los residentes de Gran Lawrence luchan por su bienestar básico

Lawrence, MA – El Martes, 29 de Agosto, los médicos residentes del Greater Lawrence Family Health Center (GLFHC) salieron a manifestar para exigir un contrato justo. Más de un año después de sindicalizarse con el Comité de Médicos Internos y Residentes (CIR/SEIU) en Marzo del 2022, los médicos todavía están en negociaciones para un contrato que apoya su bienestar, mientras atienden unos de los pacientes más vulnerables del estado.

Los residentes de Gran Lawrence siguen siendo los peor pagados en todo Massachusetts y están dedicados a proveer cuidado de alta calidad a las comunidades de color y mayoría inmigrante y de clase trabajadora que consideran el Valle de Merrimack su hogar. Además de un salario digno que alcance paridad con los programas vecinos, los residentes exigen un mejor apoyo de la salud física y mental. “La mayoría de los que elegimos entrenar en Lawrence lo hacemos porque estamos motivados a practicar la medicina de una manera que fomente un sistema de atención médica más equitativo y justo para todos”, dijo la Dra. Gabriela Velásquez. “Sabemos que merecemos un salario justo y digno y el apoyo para realizar este trabajo exigente y no sólo sobrevivir, sino prosperar”.

Los residentes se sintieron inspirados a organizarse no solo por su deseo de un sistema de salud más equitativo, sino también por la orgullosa historia de organización sindical de Lawrence, incluyendo las huelgas textiles de 1912. La acción se produce tras el reciente éxito contractual por parte de los residentes del Boston Medical Center, quienes consiguieron con éxito uno de los aumentos salariales más grandes del sindicato hasta la fecha a principios de este mes.

Para los residentes de primera línea de

GLFHC, que no han recibido un aumento salarial en más de cinco años, la disparidad salarial significativa del programa pone en peligro su capacidad de atender sus propias necesidades mientras atienden a los pacientes. “A muchos de nosotros nos resulta cada vez más difícil llegar a fin de mes”, dijo el Dr. Tong Yan. “Hace poco comencé a racionar mis medicamentos porque tenía dificultades para cubrir tanto su costo como mis otros gastos de vivir. GLFHC necesita garantizar que los residentes tengan el salario y los beneficios de salud que necesitamos para brindar de manera sostenible el cuidado de alta calidad que nuestros pacientes merecen”.

Los residentes se unieron en solidaridad con oficiales elegidos, incluyendo la Consejera de Lawrence, Celina Reyes, quien afirmó que “estos médicos dedicados dan atención excepcional a miles de personas en todo el Valle de Merrimack, y estoy orgullosa de estar junto a ellos mientras luchan por un contrato justo. Gran Lawrence, un año de espera es suficiente. Esta comunidad depende de sus residentes para mantenerse saludables y prosperar. Es hora de finalizar un contrato que garantice que reciban la compensación y los beneficios esenciales para mantener su propio bienestar. para que puedan seguir sirviendo a nuestra comunidad.”

El Comité de Médicos Internos y Residentes (CIR) es el sindicato de médicos residentes más grande de Estados Unidos. Un local del Sindicato Internacional de Empleados de Servicios (SEIU), CIR representa a más de 30,000 médicos residentes. Lowest-Paid Doctors in MA Rally for Long Overdue Fair Contract

Over a Year Post-Unionization, Greater Lawrence Residents Fight for Their Basic Well-being

Lawrence, MA –On Tuesday, August 29, resident physicians at the Greater Lawrence Family Health Center (GLFHC) rallied to demand a fair contract. More than a year after unionizing with the Committee of Interns and Residents (CIR/SEIU) in March 2022, the doctors are still in negotiations for a contract that supports their well-being, as they care for some of the state’s most vulnerable patients.

Greater Lawrence residents remain the lowest-paid across Massachusetts, and are dedicated to providing top quality care to the largely immigrant and working class communities of color that call the Merrimack Valley home. In addition to a living wage that reaches parity with neighboring programs, the residents are calling for improved mental and physical health support. “Most of us who choose to train in Lawrence do it because we are motivated to practice medicine in a way that fosters a more equitable and just healthcare system for everyone,” said Dr. Gabriela Velasquez. “We know that we deserve a fair and livable wage and the support to do this taxing job and not just survive, but thrive.”

The residents were inspired to organize not only by their desire for a more equitable healthcare system, but by Lawrence’s proud history of union organizing, including the 1912 textile strikes. Their action follows the recent contract win by residents at Boston Medical Center, who successfully secured one of the union’s largest wage increases to date earlier this month.

For the frontline GLFHC residents,

who have not received a pay increase in more than five years, the program’s significant pay disparity jeopardizes their ability to care for their own needs as they care for patients. “So many of us find it increasingly hard to make ends meet,” said Dr. Tong Yan. “Just recently, I started rationing my medication because I was struggling to cover both its cost and my other living expenses. GLFHC needs to ensure that residents have the pay and health benefits we need to sustainably provide the high-quality care our patients deserve.”

The residents were joined in solidarity by elected officials, including Lawrence At-Large Councilor Celina Reyes, who stated that, “These dedicated physicians provide exceptional care to thousands across the Merrimack Valley, and I am proud to stand with them as they fight for a fair contract. Greater Lawrence, one year of waiting is long enough. This community relies on your residents to stay healthy and thrive. It’s time to finalize a contract that will ensure they receive the compensation and benefits essential to maintaining their own well-being, so they can continue serving our community.”

Educación para todos a un costo razonable

Hace varias semanas publiqué en este periódico dos artículos sobre educación, uno sobre la desafortunada decisión de la Corte Suprema contra las prácticas de Acción Afirmativa de dos universidades, votación que puso fin a los esfuerzos de nuestras escuelas de educación superior para poner el conocimiento a disposición de todos nuestros jóvenes estudiantes independientemente de su raza, y el otro sobre el financiamiento estudiantil de esa educación.

Cuando los Harvard del mundo cobren la misma matrícula que cualquier otra universidad, la demanda se aplanará y también lo hará la oferta".*

"Entonces, para terminar mi artículo con una breve conclusión impulsada por una larga introducción y presentación, mi posición es que la misma sociedad que paga tanto por el aprendizaje de los estudiantes antes de que sean mayores de edad, debería continuar su práctica después de que alcancen esa edad. No puedo concebir una mejor manera de

poner fin a la controversia en una sociedad que paga tanto por la educación de sus miembros jóvenes y los olvida cuando envejecen. Eso no me parece justo".

Ese artículo salió el 22 de julio de 2023. El 24 de agosto de 2023, la Gobernadora de Massachusetts, Maura T. Healey, anunció, y Rumbo reportó, que su administración estaba lanzando un nuevo programa que establecía un colegio comunitario gratuito para residentes de Massachusetts mayores de veinticinco años y otorgó \$100,000 a cada uno de los 15 colegios comunitarios del estado para apoyar la rápida implementación del programa este otoño.

"Al hacer que la universidad comunitaria sea completamente gratuita para cualquier adulto mayor de 25 años en Massachusetts sin un título, la Administración Healey-Driscoll está haciendo una inversión histórica en la fuerza laboral de nuestro estado y brindando a cientos de miles de adultos un camino claro hacia una carrera" Fuente: Jim Vander Hooven, presidente de Mount Wachusett Community College y presidente del Consejo de Presidentes de Colegios Comunitarios según lo informado por la Oficina Ejecutiva de Educación.

Para mí fue como ver la luz que nos habíamos propuesto al final del túnel de educación financiera tal y como la imaginamos y es suficiente satisfacción. Hace de nuestro punto de vista un punto al servicio de nuestros lectores.

Education for all at a reasonable cost

Several weeks ago I published in this newspaper two articles about education, one about the unfortunate Supreme Court decision against the Affirmative Action practices of two universities, a vote that ended the efforts of our schools of higher learning to make knowledge available to all our young students regardless of race, and the other about the students financing of that education.

I presented the financial analysis of a Massachusetts Department of Education report where they listed the yearly educational expenses of every school system in the state. To make that report more meaningful I only used the numbers of the towns served by the Rumbo newspaper.

As I was closing that second report, I suggested a tuition-free university system and supported my view with these closing paragraphs: *"We want to have fair institutions of higher learning but are not willing to put our wallets where our mouths are and make them tuition fair by leveling their tuitions with our tax contributions. When the Harvards of the world charge the same tuition as any other university, demand will flatten and so will supply."*

"So, to end my article with a short conclusion driven by a long introduction and presentation, my position is that the same society that pays so much for student learning before they are of legal age should continue its practice after they reach that age I cannot conceive of any better way to end the controversy in a society that pays

so much for the education of its young members and forgets them when they age. That doesn't sound fair to me."

That article came out on July 22, 2023. On August 24, 2023, Massachusetts Governor Maura T. Healey announced, and Rumbo reported, that her administration was launching a new program establishing free community college for Massachusetts residents aged twenty-five and older and awarded \$100,000 to each of Massachusetts' 15 community colleges to support the quick implementation of the program this fall. "By making community college completely free for any adult over 25 in Massachusetts without a degree, the Healey-Driscoll Administration is making an historic investment in our state's workforce and providing hundreds of thousands of adults with a clear pathway to a career" Source: Jim Vander Hooven, president of Mount Wachusett Community College and chair of the Community College Council of Presidents as reported by the Executive Office of Education.

For me, it was like seeing the light we had proposed at the end of the financial education tunnel as we envisioned, and is enough satisfaction. It makes our point of view a point at the service of our readers.

"Nothing is more powerful than an idea whose time has come," said famous French writer Victor Hugo. Our idea has finally found its way, but it has a long way to go.

And that is our point of view today. So long.

Artificial Intelligence should change how you use the internet

How can you trust anything online in the time of deepfakes, and powerful AI?

If you've been following AI technology, you're probably feeling both amazed and concerned at how advanced it's getting.

The truth is, even I am genuinely surprised at how powerful it is.

Deepfakes are AI generated fake videos of people. They look realistic, and they can even mimic the voice and talking patterns of the people they are imitating.

That means completely fake videos can change narratives and slander people's reputations.

And this is just the start. As time progresses it will get more and more realistic, to the point that no one will be able to tell which videos are real and which videos are fake.

Then you add something like ChatGPT into the mix, that can easily create Wharton Business School level essays in a matter of seconds. It is clear to see how dangerous the world of AI is getting.

Especially in a time of censorship and search manipulation. That's why it's important that you do your due diligence when forming opinions online.

5. Be Aware of Technology – Finally, it is important that you familiarize yourself with the most current technology. You do not have to become an expert by any means, but just by knowing the potential of modern tech, you can understand it's dangers.



3 razones por las que el examen físico anual de regreso a clases de su hijo es el momento perfecto para hablar sobre la salud mental

Cuando se trata de la salud general de su hijo, visitas “well-child”, o visitas médicas de rutina para niños, son el momento perfecto para asegurar que el desarrollo holístico de su hijo esté progresando como debería. Ya que estamos en la temporada de regreso a clases, ahora es el momento perfecto para hablar de la salud física y mental de su hijo con su pediatra o su médico de familia.

¿Qué son las visitas “well-child”?

Una visita “well-child”, a veces referida como una visita médica de rutina, es una cita anual en la que el médico de su hijo evalúa su crecimiento y desarrollo. Estos exámenes suelen consistir en:

- Examen físico, incluyendo la evaluación de su crecimiento y desarrollo
- Inmunizaciones de rutina para prevenir enfermedades como sarampión, polio, hepatitis B, varicela, tos ferina y otras enfermedades graves
- Pruebas de audición y visión
- Un momento oportuno para que los formularios deportivos de su hijo sean firmados y aborden cualquier problema relacionado con el deporte, como lesiones anteriores
- Y un examen de salud mental

¿Cuándo programo una visita “well-child”?

No espere. Programe la cita hoy ya que la disponibilidad de su pediatra se agotará rápidamente en agosto y septiembre.

Para los niños más pequeños, estas citas suelen ocurrir justo después de los cumpleaños, pero a medida que crecen, pueden ocurrir alrededor del comienzo del año escolar, ya que los niños mayores y los adolescentes pueden necesitar formularios para participar en deportes.

Además, recibir inmunizaciones de rutina ayuda al sistema inmunológico de su hijo a desarrollar los anticuerpos para protegerlos de enfermedades contagiosas como la influenza, las paperas, el sarampión y el tétano. El médico de su hijo sabrá qué vacunas son apropiadas para su edad. No

tenga miedo de hacer preguntas. Puede consultar la lista completa de vacunas para niños y adolescentes recomendadas por los Centros para el Control y Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC).

¿Por qué es bueno hablar de salud mental en su próxima visita?

Así como los niños pueden aprender a entender los problemas médicos que afectan sus cuerpos – como, por ejemplo, que el asma puede hacer que sus pulmones se aprieten y puede ser útil usar un inhalador para ayudarlos a respirar más fácilmente – los padres y los médicos pueden ayudarles a entender que los problemas de salud mental son tan importantes como los problemas físicos. Aquí le presento algunas razones por las cuales la salud mental es tan importante:

1. En los últimos años ha habido un aumento significativo de los problemas de salud mental entre los adolescentes. No es ningún secreto que la pandemia del COVID-19 fue una fuente de estrés para muchos. Según datos del 2022 recopilados por los CDC, más del 37% de los estudiantes de secundaria reportaron tener problemas de salud mental durante la pandemia, y un 44% adicional reportó sentirse persistentemente triste o desesperado el año pasado.

2. Muchos jóvenes no reciben tratamiento. Hablar de salud mental puede parecer desalentador o confuso, especialmente para los niños. Por ejemplo, Mental Health America informa que alrededor del 60% de los jóvenes con depresión grave no reciben tratamiento, incluso en estados con mayor acceso a servicios de salud mental.

3. Si no se tratan, los problemas de salud mental de los adolescentes pueden continuar en la adultez. La salud mental durante la adolescencia tiene un mayor impacto en la adultez de lo que muchas personas piensan. Los datos de los CDC sobre la salud mental de los niños muestran que los diagnósticos de TDAH, ansiedad, depresión y otros trastornos mentales se vuelven cada vez más frecuentes con la

edad, y los problemas de comportamiento son más comunes entre los niños de 6 a 11 años que entre los niños mayores o menores.

La escuela ya es un entorno bastante desafiante, así que asegúrese de hablar con el médico de su hijo sobre los cambios en el estado de ánimo, el comportamiento, el rendimiento académico o la disposición para asegurarse de que sus necesidades sean abordadas y sus preocupaciones

escuchadas, dándole a su hijo las habilidades para sobresalir tanto dentro como fuera del aula.

3 Reasons Your Child’s Annual Back-to-School Physical Is The Perfect Time To Talk About Mental Health

When it comes to your child’s overall health, well-child visits are the perfect time to ensure your child’s holistic development is progressing as it should. Since it’s back-to-school season, now is the perfect time to discuss your child’s physical and mental health with their pediatrician or your family doctor.

What is a well-child visit?

A well-child visit, sometimes referred to as a physical, is an annual appointment in which your child’s physician assesses their growth and development. These check-ups typically consist of:

- Physical examination, including assessing their growth and development
- Routine immunizations to prevent diseases like measles, polio, hepatitis B, chickenpox, whooping cough, and other serious diseases
- Hearing and vision tests
- An opportune time to have your child’s sports physical forms signed and address any sports-related concerns such as prior injuries
- And a mental health screening

When do I schedule a well-child visit?

Don’t wait. Schedule the appointment today as your pediatrician’s schedule will fill up fast in August and September.

For younger children, these appointments typically occur right after their birthday, but as they age, they may begin seeing their doctor closer to the start of the school year, as older kids and teenagers may also need to have physical forms in order to participate in sports.

Additionally, receiving routine immunizations helps your child’s immune system build the antibodies to help protect them from contagious diseases such as Influenza, Mumps, Measles, and Tetanus. Your child’s doctor will know which immunizations are appropriate for their age. Don’t be afraid to ask questions. You can refer to the full list of child and adolescent vaccines recommended by the Centers for Disease Control.

Why discuss mental health at your next well-child visit?

Just as children can learn to

understand medical problems that affect their bodies – like how asthma can make their lungs tighten and it can be helpful to use an inhaler to help them breathe more easily -- parents and doctors can help them understand that mental health concerns are just as important as physical concerns. Here’s why that’s so important:

1. There has been a sharp increase in adolescent mental health issues in recent years. It’s no secret that the COVID-19 pandemic was a source of stress for many. According to a 2022 set of data collected by the CDC, more than 37% of high school students reported experiencing poor mental health during the pandemic, with an additional 44% reporting they felt persistently sad or hopeless over the past year.

2. Many young people don’t receive treatment. Talking about mental health can seem daunting or confusing, especially for kids. For example, Mental Health America reports that about 60% of youth with major depression don’t receive treatment, even in states with higher access to mental health services.

3. If left untreated, adolescent mental health issues can carry into adulthood. Mental health during adolescence has a greater bearing on one’s adult life than many people realize. CDC data on children’s mental health show that diagnoses of ADHD, anxiety, depression, and other mental disorders become increasingly prevalent with age, and behavioral problems are more common among kids aged 6-11 than older or younger children.

School is a challenging enough environment as it is, so be sure to talk to your child’s doctor about changes in mood, behavior, academic performance or disposition to better ensure their needs are addressed and their concerns are heard, giving your child the skills to excel both inside and outside the classroom.

Elections Season

When Council President Marc Laplante attended the Board of Registrars' meeting on August 22, 2023, he was prepared to explain the nature of his complaint to the board. He was disappointed in not being able to do it while the Board ruled against his opponent. Many people in the audience did not understand the reason (including this writer) and I will explain it now.

Mr. Laplante was ready to provide evidence that there were several misspelled names, erroneous addresses, and a couple of signatures that he delivered days before Germinudy Rosario yet, hers were counted, instead.

Those were problems that should be brought up and corrected so it won't happen in future elections but the biggest problem was the forged signatures. According to the Secretary of State's regulations, the Election Division correctly allowed the names to be certified. Even if they suspect that the signatures are fraudulent, they must be certified. Only upon a challenge before the Board of Registrars can these signatures be overturned.

Anyone interested can check the nomination papers of all candidates on the city's website Nomination Documents and Petitions | Lawrence, MA, and you'll find the same type of problems in other candidates' nomination papers. The issue is that most candidates don't have the knowledge or desire to challenge anyone but there's the possibility of knocking an opponent off the ballot if they only care to do so.

Some people in charge of collecting signatures are lazy and believe that no one will notice and sign with the wrong name or even the wrong address. Apparently, they are confident that the Elections Department workers will approve it even if they notice the differences between what they signed and what appears on their records. That's because the rules from the Secretary of State indicate that they should. It's up to the opponent to bring up these differences to the Board of Registrars to disqualify him or her.

In Laplante's case, he wasn't allowed to challenge the forged signatures since his opponent did not clear the first hurdle of providing a signed nomination paper that was notarized. Ms. Rosario was deemed illegible to be a candidate because her papers did not follow the rules and thus there was no need for Marc to present his case since she was no longer considered a valid candidate.

That's another common mistake of inexperienced candidates. When that happens, all the signatures on that page improperly filed are automatically invalid but it has to be brought to the Board's attention by a contender.

I spoke with City Clerk Eileen Bernal and questioned the actions of the Elections Department employees and she said, "There were minor details but they did a good job with the process following the Secretary of State's rules."

Again, that responsibility falls on the other candidates to make sure things are being done correctly.

Now, let's think about the politicians we are electing. If they are sloppy with their work and allow just anyone to reach out to their constituents to collect signatures and this is the result, they should not blame the opponent who's intelligent and knows how to work the system.

But these are the people running for office that we vote for unprepared and who believe that good intentions are what counts. For example, last Wednesday, Julio Merán interviewed Jessica Aquino, candidate for City Council District B. Young, well-spoken and delivered her answers with ease, but reminded me of Vice President Kamala Harris with her constant laughter. That was a serious interview, not an entertainment program.

I was turned off by her demeanor until she gave it away. Mr. Merán asked her if she had seen the City Charter, if she had read Robert's Rules of Order, the City Council Rules, and the current city budget to which she said that she had seen them but at one point she admitted that he didn't mention one of those items in the questions that he had sent her.

That's why the laughter! She was over-confident because she was prepared for whatever he would throw at her. Would he prepare in the same way someone with whom he disagrees?

I always watch his program because Merán has the courage to tackle important issues that no one else cares to touch and he documents himself before speaking but this program was a big disappointment.

Electing members of the City Council is the most important task we have every two years. We run the risk of ending up with people like María De La Cruz in District A. She hardly knows what's being discussed and sometimes after a discussion, she ends up voting against what she argued for or in favor of what she opposed.

Fortunately, she won't be running again and thinks her term ended. She

has not been to a meeting in several months or been seen anywhere and she's still collecting her salary. Let that be an example of how not to vote.

Merán was a disappointment because he kept repeating that the city budget carries some \$45 million for Miscellaneous which is "suspicious" in his opinion. This is not "petit cash"; it's a required amount that the city must have for emergencies and that appears in every budget, every year.

A good example of that is snow removal; since no one knows how much snow we'll have each year, the budget calls for a minimal amount and, at the end of the year the balance can be transferred from

that fund.

Also, the trash collection and recycling; while the city has a set budget, there are times when extra expenses are unavoidable. And, union negotiations; while each department has a budget for salaries, upon union agreements they must be increased and it comes from that Miscellaneous fund.

Keep in mind that "Free Cash" cannot be used for any of these purposes.

According to Mayor DePeña and Councilor Ana Levy, this has been explained to him several times and he continues with the insinuation.

Cancer FactFinder Website Translated into 8 Languages

Boston, MA – The Cancer FactFinder, an online resource examining myths and misinformation about cancer, is now available in 8 additional languages: Arabic, Chinese, Creole, French, Portuguese, Spanish, Tagalog and Vietnamese.

The website provides accurate and reliable information about what does and does not cause cancer and helps dispel common misconceptions about the disease. Launched in 2022, the site was created by a team from the Zhu Family Center for Global Cancer Prevention at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health and the Center for Cancer Equity and Engagement at the Dana-Farber/Harvard Cancer Center. For each of the more than 60 topics on the website, such as "Red Meat," "Stress," "Hormone Replacement Therapy," or "Radon," the summary provides information about:

- What you may have heard;
- What science tells us;
- How to reduce your risk;
- What this means to me; and
- Sources and links for more information.


Each claim about a topic, such as "Red meat causes cancer," also comes with an interpretation of the team's findings about a claim's veracity, as noted below.

- Most likely or definitely true: There is sufficient evidence to suggest that the claim is true.
- False—misinformation: There is sufficient evidence to suggest that the claim is false.



- We're not sure yet—scientists are still working on it: There is not sufficient evidence to say whether the claim is or isn't true.

The team will continuously update the website with new topics and add additional information to existing topics. The translations reflect the team's desire to expand use of the site in the state and beyond. "Cancer misinformation can negatively impact anyone, no matter what language they speak. It's important to ensure that everyone can access accurate cancer facts - that's why we have launched the Cancer FactFinder in many commonly spoken languages" said Timothy Rebbeck, Vincent L. Gregory, Jr. Professor of Cancer Prevention and director of the Zhu Family Center at Harvard Chan School and professor of medical oncology at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.


Concord Chorus open rehearsal - join us!
