NUEVA base de datos de tratamientos de cambio de sexo infantil expone a hospitales de Massachusetts

NUEVA base de datos de tratamientos de cambio de sexo infantil expone a hospitales de Massachusetts. El organismo de control médico Do No Harm publicó una base de datos nacional, la primera de su tipo, de hospitales e instalaciones médicas que administran intervenciones médicas irreversibles a niños, incluidas cirugías, hormonas y bloqueadores de la pubertad. La base de datos Stop the Harm se puede encontrar en StopTheHarmDatabase.com. La base de datos revela que 671 niños de Massachusetts recibieron intervenciones médicas relacionadas con el cambio de sexo entre 2019 y 2023.

Hallazgos clave en Massachusetts:

- 300 pacientes quirúrgicos pediátricos de cambio de sexo
- 1856 prescripciones de hormonas y bloqueadores de la pubertad escritas para 386 pacientes pediátricos.
- \$10,021,217 obtenidos de tratamientos de cambio de sexo realizados a menores

El Boston Children's Hospital ocupa el sexto lugar en la lista de los "Doce Sucios" de Stop the Harm de los peores hospitales infantiles que promueven tratamientos de cambio de sexo para menores en el país. También es la segunda institución con mayor facturación por tratamientos de cambio de sexo en menores, y el médico con mayor facturación del país por tratamientos pediátricos de cambio de sexo también trabaja en el Boston Children's Hospital.

La base de datos Stop the Harm se actualizará periódicamente a medida que haya nuevos datos disponibles para que el público y los responsables de las políticas puedan exigir cuentas a las instituciones médicas.

A continuación, he incluido declaraciones de Chloe Cole, una activista de la destransición que realizó la transición médica a la edad de 12 años y recibió una mastectomía doble a la edad de 15 años, y del Dr. Stanley Goldfarb, presidente de la junta directiva de Do No Harm.

También encontrará una lista de los 10 hospitales e instalaciones con mayor facturación que administraron intervenciones médicas relacionadas con el cambio de sexo en Massachusetts junto con información adicional sobre la metodología utilizada para analizar los datos.

Chloe Cole, investigadora principal de Do No Harm y activista de la

destransición:

"Este nuevo proyecto de Do No Harm demuestra las mentiras del establishment médico y de los políticos radicales que argumentan que los casos como el mío son raros. Las estadísticas de esta base de datos representan a miles de niños que están siendo tratados como conejillos de indias para experimentos médicos no probados y, a veces, peligrosos. Espero que tanto los políticos como los padres utilicen esta base de datos para ver dónde se están realizando estos tratamientos y proteger a sus hijos de ser apresurados a recibir tratamientos irreversibles que alteran la vida".

Dr. Stanley Goldfarb, presidente de Do No Harm:

"Con el lanzamiento de la base de datos Stop the Harm, Do No Harm se suma a nuestra misión de exponer los peligros de la medicina de género pediátrica experimental y poner fin a esta práctica. Este proyecto, el primero de su tipo, ofrece a los pacientes, las familias y los responsables de las políticas un recurso que revela la omnipresencia de los tratamientos irreversibles de cambio de sexo para menores en Estados Unidos. Si bien estos datos representan la punta del iceberg, este es el primer paso para responsabilizar al sistema médico por participar, y a menudo promover, intervenciones médicas depredadoras y no científicas para niños vulnerables".

Metodología:

Do No Harm evaluó los datos de reclamos de seguros de 2019 a 2023 y compiló qué tratamientos relacionados con el cambio de sexo se administraban a menores y en qué hospitales.

Los tratamientos relacionados con el cambio de sexo son:

- Cirugías (modificación corporal)
- Hormonas
- Bloqueadores de la pubertad

El análisis de Do No Harm se centró exclusivamente en pacientes de entre 0 y 17,5 años e incluyó solo casos confirmados de tratamientos relacionados con la transición de género.

NEW database of child sex change treatments exposes Massachusetts hospitals

Medical watchdog Do No Harm released a first-of-its-kind national database of hospitals and medical facilities administering irreversible medical interventions to children, including surgery, hormones, and puberty blockers.

The Stop the Harm Database can be found at StopTheHarmDatabase.com. The database reveals that 671 Massachusetts children received sex change related medical interventions between 2019 and 2023.

Key findings in Massachusetts:

- 300 pediatric sex-change surgical patients
- 1856 hormone and puberty blockers prescriptions written for 386 pediatric patients.
- \$10,021,217 made from sex change treatments performed on minors

Boston Children's Hospital ranks sixth on Stop the Harm's "Dirty Dozen" list of worst-offending children's hospitals promoting sex change treatments for minors in the country. It is also the second-highest billed institution for sex change treatments on minors, and the nation's highest billed doctor for pediatric sex change treatments works at Boston Children's Hospital too.

The Stop the Harm Database will be updated regularly as new data is available so that the public and policymakers are able to hold medical institutions accountable.

Below I have included statements from Chloe Cole, a de-transition activist who was medically transitioned at the age of 12 and received a double mastectomy at the age of 15, and Dr. Stanley Goldfarb, Board Chair of Do No Harm.

You will also find a list of the top 10 billing hospitals and facilities that administered sex change related medical interventions in Massachusetts along with additional information on methodology used to analyze the data.

The stats in this database represent thousands of kids who are being treated like Guinea pigs for unproven, and sometimes dangerous, medical experiments. I hope politicians and parents alike use this database to see where these treatments are happening and protect their children from being rushed into irreversible, life-altering treatments."

While this data represents the tip of the iceberg, this is the first step in holding the medical establishment accountable for participating in, and often times promoting, predatory and unscientific medical interventions for vulnerable children."

Methodology:

Do No Harm assessed insurance claim data from 2019 to 2023 compiling what sex change related treatments were being administered to minors and at what hospitals

Sex change related treatments are:

- Surgeries (Body modification)
- Hormones
- Puberty blockers

Do No Harm's analysis focused exclusively on patients aged 0 to 17.5 years old and included only confirmed cases of gender transition-related treatments

Autoridad de Reurbanización de Somerville

El lunes 21 de octubre de 2024, apareció un artículo en The Boston Globe que recomiendo a todos que lean.

Los tribunales han decidido que la ciudad de Somerville debe pagar 28 millones de dólares a los propietarios previos de la propiedad que la Autoridad de Reurbanización confiscó en 2019 mediante dominio eminente.

La ciudad pagó 8,8 millones de dólares por una parcela de cuatro acres con un valor de 35,3 millones de dólares. Verá que la Autoridad de Reurbanización de Somerville pagó la propiedad, pero ahora la ciudad es responsable del reembolso de los propietarios.

Vote Sí en la Pregunta 2

Como profesor jubilado con más de 39 años de experiencia directa en el aula, le insto a votar SÍ en la **Pregunta 2** de la boleta, este noviembre. Al votar SÍ, pondrá fin a la prueba estandarizada estatal MCAS como requisito para graduarse de una escuela secundaria pública en Massachusetts.

Esta prueba ha sido una pesadilla para los estudiantes que completan su trabajo asignado y aprueban todos sus cursos, pero no pueden aprobar el MCAS; y, por lo tanto, no pueden obtener un diploma. Los estudiantes que tienen dificultades con este examen tienden a ser inmigrantes recientes que intentan aprender inglés, estudiantes con diversas discapacidades y estudiantes que muestran una gran ansiedad al realizar un examen. Sin un diploma, los estudiantes quedan marginados y no pueden ir a la universidad o ingresar a otras carreras productivas.

Otro resultado de tener el MCAS como requisito de graduación es que lleva la instrucción a lecciones de realización de exámenes, también conocidas como [“enseñanza para el examen”], donde se administran interminables pruebas MCAS de práctica. Este proceso repetido y enfoque limitado no proporciona a los estudiantes las habilidades necesarias para tener éxito en el mundo moderno. Las habilidades necesarias hoy en día incluyen la resolución de problemas, la capacidad de realizar investigaciones utilizando el método científico y aplicándolo a problemas del mundo real, saber cómo utilizar la

evidencia para persuadir a las personas en formato escrito y verbal, y adoptar la empatía. La empatía evoca un proceso de comprensión de la historia de una persona o un grupo y sus marcos culturales, junto con sus respectivas luchas psicológicas y políticas. Analizar e interpretar son pasos fundamentales para demostrar cómo estos marcos están entrelazados y mediados en el mundo que nos rodea. Esta comprensión o empatía nos ayuda a comprender relaciones complejas. Esta es una habilidad que un plan de estudios adaptado a una prueba sujeta a reglas nunca logrará.

Los datos, la información, la categorización y la recuperación sujetos a reglas ya se realizan mucho mejor por una máquina que por un ser humano. Si limitamos el aprendizaje de los estudiantes a habilidades que una computadora ya puede realizar mucho mejor, estamos fomentando la obsolescencia en lugar de preparar a nuestros estudiantes para el mundo moderno y sus complejos dilemas globales que requieren un pensamiento complejo y no el trabajo que un robot de IA puede producir.

Por las razones mencionadas anteriormente, le insto a votar SÍ en la **Pregunta 2** para poner fin a la prueba MCAS como requisito para graduarse de la escuela secundaria pública en Massachusetts.

Vote YES on Question 2

As a retired teacher with over 39 years of direct classroom experience, I am urging you to vote YES on ballot **Question 2**, this November. By voting YES, you will be ending the standardized state MCAS test as a requirement to graduate from a public high school in Massachusetts.

This test has been a nightmare for students who complete their assigned work and pass all their courses but are unable to pass MCAS; and are, therefore, unable to obtain a diploma. The students who struggle with this exam tend to be recent immigrants who are attempting to learn English, students with various disabilities, and students who exhibit high anxiety while taking a test. Without a diploma, students become marginalized and are unable to go on to college or enter other productive careers.

Another result of having MCAS as a graduation requirement is that it drives instruction into test-taking lessons, a.k.a. [“teaching to the test”], where endless practice MCAS tests are administered. This repeated process and narrow focus does not provide students with the skills needed to find success in the modern world. The skills needed today include problem solving, the ability to conduct research using the scientific method and applying it to real world issues, knowing how to

utilize evidence to persuade people in the written and verbal format, and embracing empathy. Empathy evokes a process of understanding a person or group’s history and their cultural frames, along with their respective psychological and political struggles. Analyzing and interpreting are critical steps in demonstrating how these frames are intertwined and mediated in the world around us. This understanding or empathy helps us to understand complex relationships. This is a skill that a curriculum tailored to a rule bound test will never accomplish.

Rule bound data, information, categorization and recall are already done far better by a machine than a human. If we limit student learning to skills a computer can already perform far better, than we are fostering obsolescence rather than preparing our students for the modern world and it’s complex global dilemmas that require complex thinking and not work that an AI bot can produce.

For the reasons mentioned above, I urge you vote YES on **Question 2** to end the MCAS test as a requirement for graduation from public high school in Massachusetts.

Poner fin a las admisiones por legado en Harvard es un imperativo moral

La política de admisiones por legado de Harvard es una práctica obsoleta que socava la meritocracia que dice defender. Al favorecer a los hijos de los exalumnos, Harvard perpetúa una desigualdad arraigada en los prejuicios de principios del siglo XX, que favorecen a las familias blancas adineradas, mientras que excluyen a los inmigrantes, judíos y minorías. Hoy en día, los legados representan el 14% de cada clase, con una asombrosa tasa de aceptación del 33%, en comparación con menos del 5% para todos los solicitantes.

Los defensores argumentan que las admisiones por legado mejoran los vínculos y las donaciones de los exalumnos. Sin embargo, con una dotación de 53 mil millones de dólares, Harvard no necesita depender de los legados para lograr la estabilidad financiera. Otras instituciones prestigiosas como el MIT, Caltech y John's Hopkins han prosperado después de eliminar las admisiones por legado, lo que demuestra que el mérito debe priorizarse sobre las conexiones familiares. Las admisiones por legado también obstaculizan la diversidad. A pesar de los

esfuerzos por aumentar la representación racial y socioeconómica, esta política beneficia predominantemente a los estudiantes blancos adinerados, perpetuando un ciclo de privilegio que contradice la misión de Harvard de ampliar el acceso.

Eliminar las admisiones heredadas también crearía oportunidades para los estudiantes subrepresentados, al tiempo que restauraría la confianza pública en las universidades de élite que enfrentan el escrutinio por favoritismo percibido. Al poner fin a esta práctica, Harvard podría dar ejemplo, reafirmando su compromiso con la equidad, la transparencia y un proceso de admisión basado en el mérito.

En el contexto actual, la equidad es esencial. Harvard debe elegir entre mantener el privilegio o abrazar un futuro más equitativo. Poner fin a las admisiones heredadas es un paso vital hacia la inclusión y la verdadera meritocracia. Ahora es el momento de que Harvard demuestre un verdadero liderazgo visionario.

Ending Legacy Admissions at Harvard as a Moral Imperative

Harvard's legacy admissions policy is an outdated practice undermining the meritocracy it claims to uphold. By favoring alumni children, Harvard perpetuates an inequality rooted in early 20th-century biases, one favoring wealthy white families, while excluding immigrants, Jews, and minorities. Today, legacies make up 14% of each class, with a staggering 33% acceptance rate, compared to under 5% for all applicants.

Proponents argue that legacy admissions enhances alumni ties and donations. However, with a \$53 billion endowment, Harvard needn't rely on legacies to achieve financial stability. Other prestigious institutions like MIT, Caltech, and John's Hopkins have thrived after eliminating legacy admissions, demonstrating that merit should be prioritized over family connections.

Legacy admissions also hinders diversity. Despite efforts to increase racial and socioeconomic representation, this

policy predominantly benefits affluent white students, perpetuating a cycle of privilege that contradicts Harvard's mission of broadening access.

Eliminating legacy admissions would also create opportunities for underrepresented students, while restoring public trust in elite universities facing scrutiny for perceived favoritism. By ending this practice, Harvard could lead by example, reaffirming its commitment to fairness, transparency, and a merit-based admissions process.

In today's context, fairness is essential. Harvard must choose between maintaining privilege, or embracing a more equitable future. Ending legacy admissions is a vital step toward inclusivity and true meritocracy. Now is the time for Harvard to demonstrate true visionary leadership.

El Seguro Social anuncia un aumento de beneficios del 2,5 por ciento para 2025

Los beneficios del Seguro Social y los pagos del Ingreso de Seguridad Suplementario (SSI) para más de 72,5 millones de estadounidenses aumentarán un 2,5 por ciento en 2025, anunció hoy la Administración del Seguro Social. En promedio, los beneficios de jubilación del Seguro Social aumentarán alrededor de \$50 por mes a partir de enero.

Durante la última década, el aumento del COLA ha sido en promedio de alrededor del 2,6 por ciento. El COLA fue del 3,2 por ciento en 2024.

Casi 68 millones de beneficiarios del Seguro Social verán un ajuste del costo de vida (COLA) del 2,5 por ciento a partir de enero de 2025. Los pagos aumentados para casi 7,5 millones de personas que reciben SSI comenzarán el 31 de diciembre de 2024. (Nota: Algunas personas reciben tanto beneficios del Seguro Social como SSI).

"Los beneficios del Seguro Social y los pagos del SSI aumentarán en 2025, lo que ayudará a decenas de millones de personas a mantenerse al día con los gastos incluso cuando la inflación ha comenzado a disminuir", dijo Martin O'Malley, Comisionado del Seguro Social.

Algunos otros ajustes que entran en vigencia en enero de cada año se basan en el aumento de los salarios promedio. Con base en ese aumento, el monto máximo de ingresos sujetos al impuesto del Seguro Social (máximo imponible) está programado para aumentar de \$168,600 a \$176,100.

El Seguro comienza a notificar a las personas sobre el nuevo monto de su beneficio por correo a partir de principios de diciembre.

Este año, por primera vez, los beneficiarios del Seguro Social recibirán

un aviso COLA recientemente diseñado y mejorado que facilita a los clientes encontrar la información que más necesitan. El aviso COLA simplificado ahora tiene solo una página, utiliza un lenguaje sencillo y personalizado y proporciona fechas exactas y montos en dólares del nuevo monto del beneficio de una persona y cualquier deducción. Las personas que tienen una cuenta personal de my Social Security pueden ver su aviso de COLA en línea, lo cual es seguro, fácil y más rápido que recibir una carta por correo. Las personas pueden configurar alertas de texto o correo electrónico cuando haya un nuevo mensaje, como su aviso de COLA, esperándolos en my Social Security.

Las personas deberán tener una cuenta personal de My Social Security antes del 20 de noviembre para ver su aviso de COLA en línea. Para comenzar, visite www.ssa.gov/myaccount.

La información sobre los cambios de Medicare para 2025 estará disponible en www.medicare.gov. Para los beneficiarios del Seguro Social inscritos en Medicare, el monto del beneficio de 2025 estará disponible a través del Centro de mensajes de my Social Security a partir de fines de noviembre. Aquellos que no hayan optado por recibir mensajes en línea recibirán su aviso de COLA por correo en diciembre.

Social Security Announces 2.5 Percent Benefit Increase for 2025

Social Security benefits and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments for more than 72.5 million Americans will increase 2.5 percent in 2025, the Social Security Administration announced today. On average, Social Security retirement benefits will increase by about \$50 per month starting in January. Over the last decade the COLA increase has averaged about 2.6 percent. The COLA was 3.2 percent in 2024.

Nearly 68 million Social Security beneficiaries will see a 2.5 percent cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) beginning in January 2025. Increased payments to nearly 7.5 million people receiving SSI will begin on December 31, 2024. (Note: Some people receive both Social Security benefits and SSI).

"Social Security benefits and SSI payments will increase in 2025, helping tens of millions of people keep up with expenses even as inflation has started to cool," said Martin O'Malley, Commissioner of Social Security.

Some other adjustments that take effect in January of each year are based on the increase in average wages. Based on that increase, the maximum amount of earnings subject to the Social Security tax (taxable maximum) is slated to increase to \$176,100 from \$168,600.

Confirman derechos de voto de los residentes de Lawrence

Fracasa la propuesta del alcalde de modificar el comité escolar y despojar a los residentes de sus derechos democráticos

LAWRENCE - En una medida decisiva, el Ayuntamiento de Lawrence votó en contra de la petición de autonomía del alcalde Brian DePena que habría eludido los derechos democráticos de los residentes de Lawrence y alterado por completo la estructura de gobierno de las escuelas públicas de la ciudad.

"Se han escuchado las voces del pueblo y ha prevalecido la democracia", dijo la presidenta del sindicato de docentes de Lawrence, Kimberly Barry. "El Ayuntamiento de Lawrence votó una vez más para proteger la verdadera voluntad del pueblo y mantener el gobierno de nuestras escuelas en manos de los elegidos por la comunidad".

Los cambios propuestos habrían eliminado la representación de los miembros del comité escolar de cada distrito, un sistema implementado en 2003 para garantizar una representación justa como parte de un acuerdo entre la Ciudad de Lawrence y el Departamento de Justicia de los EE. UU. según la Ley de Derechos Electorales de 1965. La comunidad expresó sus preocupaciones, enfatizando la importancia de mantener

un proceso democrático donde los ciudadanos tengan la libertad de votar por los miembros de su comité escolar en cada distrito.

Durante meses, el alcalde DePena ha estado tratando de alterar la composición del Comité Escolar de Lawrence, llenándolo con personas designadas por el alcalde y algunos miembros electos, todo mientras mantiene su papel como presidente. Cada iteración de su plan ha encontrado una fuerte oposición de la comunidad.

"Esta es la segunda vez que el alcalde ha intentado reformar el comité escolar y hacer retroceder el reloj de los derechos de voto y la representación en los últimos meses, y la segunda vez que ha sido rechazado", continuó Barry. "La gente de Lawrence no quiere esto. Los funcionarios electos en Lawrence no quieren esto. Es hora de que el alcalde desista".

Voting Rights of Lawrence Residents Upheld

Mayor's proposal to alter school committee and strip residents of their democratic rights fails

LAWRENCE - In a decisive move, the Lawrence City Council voted against Mayor Brian DePena's home rule petition that would have circumvented the democratic rights of Lawrence residents and completely altered the governance structure of the city's public schools.

"The voices of the people have been heard and democracy has prevailed," said Lawrence Teachers' Union President Kimberly Barry. "The Lawrence City Council once again voted to protect the true will of the people and keep the governance of our schools in the hands of those elected by the community."

The proposed changes would have eliminated the representation of school committee members from each district, a system put in place in 2003 to ensure fair representation as part of a settlement between the City of Lawrence and the U.S. Department of Justice under the Voting Rights Act of 1965. The community voiced their concerns, emphasizing the importance of maintaining a democratic process where

citizens have the freedom to vote for their school committee members in each district.

For months, Mayor DePena has been trying to alter the makeup of the Lawrence School Committee – stacking it with Mayoral appointees and some elected members all while maintaining his role as Chair. Each iteration of his plan has been met with strong opposition from the community.

"This is the second time the Mayor has tried to overhaul the school committee and turn back the clock on voting rights and representation in recent months, and the second time it has been rejected," continued Barry. "The people of Lawrence don't want this. The elected officials in Lawrence don't want this. It's time for the Mayor to move on."

The Lawrence Teachers' Union, Local 1019, AFT Massachusetts, AFL-CIO, represents all teachers, registered nurses, long-term substitutes and building-based educators in the city's public schools.

Faces of Faith – Cancer Survivorship - Photographic Exhibit

Launched in February 2007, the Faith Based Cancer Disparities Network (FBCDN) is committed to the improvement of the health and well-being of faith-based communities by reducing cancer mortality and morbidity and eliminating cancer disparities. This collaborative coalition consists of nine churches, the Black Ministerial Alliance of Greater Boston, Inc., the American Cancer Society and Dana-Farber/Harvard Cancer Center.

Over the past several years, the Network has had many accomplishments focused on supporting the congregations of churches through their ministries focused on health and wellness. In addition to providing a variety of resources, the Network has also developed and launched programs specifically for faith-based communities. These programs include a campaign to increase cancer screenings related to breast and colon, a program focused on physical activity entitled, Walk for Wellness, and most recently a photo exhibit called, The Faces of Faith Campaign.

Within communities of color, and more specifically faith-based congregations, there are parishioners who are cancer survivors, living vibrant lives, and willing

to impart their wisdom. Through an active dialogue members of the Network identified an opportunity to invite them to share their experiences of being a cancer survivor, and of the hope and strength they have found in the healing process. The primary goal of the project was to begin the process of breaking through the silence and to promote awareness that life with and beyond cancer can indeed be glorious, triumphant and most importantly, God filled.

After identifying and requesting cancer survivors within the Network churches to participate in a photo shoot, Faces of Faith was launched in March of 2013. Initially the idea was simply to have the photo campaign which included a brief testimony exhibited in the Network churches. Since the launch and in addition to the Network churches, the exhibit has been shown in variety of locations, including an art studio, colleges and universities, city and state government, neighborhood libraries, and local health care institutions. The Network could have never predicted the impact of this cancer survivorship photo exhibit.

Lanzada en Febrero de 2007, la Red de Disparidades de Cáncer Basadas en la Fe (FBCDN) está comprometida con la mejoría de la salud y el bienestar de las comunidades basadas en la fe mediante la reducción de la mortalidad y morbilidad por cáncer y la eliminación de las disparidades por cáncer. Esta coalición colaborativa está formada de nueve iglesias, la Alianza Ministerial Negra del Gran Boston, Inc., la Sociedad Americana del Cáncer y el Centro Oncológico Dana-Farber/Harvard.


En los últimos años, la Red ha tenido muchos logros centrados en apoyar a las congregaciones de iglesias a través de sus ministerios centrados en la salud y bienestar. Además de proporcionar una variedad de recursos, la Red también ha desarrollado y lanzado programas específicos para las comunidades religiosas. Estos programas incluyen una campaña para aumentar las pruebas de detección de cáncer relacionadas con el cáncer de mama y colon, un programa centrado en la actividad física titulado Walk for Wellness (Caminata para el Bienestar), y la mayoría de las actividades relacionadas con el cáncer.

Dentro de las comunidades de color, y más específicamente en las congregaciones basadas en la fe, hay feligreses que son

sobrevivientes de cáncer, viven vidas vibrantes y están dispuestos a impartir su sabiduría. A través de un diálogo activo, los miembros de la Red identificaron una oportunidad para invitarlos a compartir sus experiencias de ser sobrevivientes de cáncer, y de la esperanza y la fuerza que han encontrado en el proceso de curación. El objetivo principal del proyecto era comenzar el proceso de romper el silencio y promover.

Después de identificar y solicitar a los sobrevivientes de cáncer dentro de las iglesias de la Red que participarán en una sesión de fotos, se lanzó Faces of Faith (Rostros de Fe) en Marzo del 2013. Inicialmente, la idea era simplemente tener la campaña fotográfica que incluía un breve testimonio exhibido en las iglesias de la Red. Desde el lanzamiento y además de las iglesias de la Red, la exhibición se ha mostrado en una variedad de lugares, incluyendo un estudio de arte, colegios y universidades, gobierno de la ciudad y del estado, bibliotecas de vecindario e instituciones locales de atención médica. La Red nunca podría haber predicho el impacto de esta exposición fotográfica de sobrevivientes de cáncer.

a sus comunidades brindándoles atención culturalmente sensible.

Research rental companies on BBB.org, check the store policy regarding trying on costumes, inspect the condition of the outfit, and read the rental agreement carefully before signing anything.

Buy in bulk

It may seem counter-intuitive, but buying more can save you money! Buying in bulk lessens the cost per item. Budgeting can be especially handy on a night like Halloween, considering there might be more trick-or-treaters this year. Factory-wrapped candy will last a long time, even if you have leftovers. And let's be honest, leftovers are pretty tasty, even after Halloween.

Always check the return policy

Seasonal shops carry unique items for a short period in a temporary location or online. When shopping for a seasonal vendor, understand the store's return policy before purchasing. Remember: Buying a bunch of stuff with the intent of simply returning it after October 31 is considered fraud.

Shop smart online

When shopping from an online website, the first step is ensuring the URL starts with "HTTPS" and includes a lock symbol. The S in "HTTPS" stands for secure. Look up the website's privacy policy and contact information. If it is not clearly listed, or they only have an email as the point of contact, take that as a big red flag and shop elsewhere.

Also, be sure to use your credit card instead of your debit card, as credit cards

not only provide additional protection but also easier to dispute a fraudulent charge. See more tips for shopping online.

Seasonal stores

If you decide to shop from a seasonal store, ask whether or not they will be open after the holiday, how long they plan to stay open, and if they will accept returns after Halloween. If they plan to close up shop on November 1 or refuse returns after, either consider shopping elsewhere or take more time to be sure that item is exactly what you want before making the purchase.

More tips for seasonal "pop-up" stores:

- Ask the owner if there is a website in case you must contact them later.
- Save every receipt.
- Use a credit card to dispute problem charges with the issuer.
- Make sure you are clear on what items are FINAL SALE.

Attending a special event or visiting a haunted house

Before purchasing tickets, research the group offering the experience and make sure that there are no complaints about the company hosting the event.

- Check out the company at BBB.org. Read what previous customers say, and see how the business responds to complaints.
- Check BBB Scam Tracker and see if other consumers have filed a report about the event host.
- Search the business online by adding the words "Complaint," "Reviews," or "Scam" after their name for different search results.

Pair of Bomfim Goals Lift #6 Knights past CCRI

Haverhill, MA (October 16, 2024) – Sophomore Jadiel Bomfim (Nashua, NH) scored a pair of second half goals 29 seconds apart on Tuesday night as the Northern Essex Community College men's soccer team picked up their 10th straight victory and ran their shutout streak to five consecutive games and 479 consecutive minutes of play.

The win improves the Knights record to 10-2 and sets up a Saturday afternoon (4:30pm) showdown on the turf at Whittier Tech with Bunker Hill (9-2-1) with the post-season tournaments number one seed up for grabs.

Following a scoreless first half in which the NECC outshot CCRI 10-3, Bomfim broke the ice in the 59th minute

when he took a feed from Lucas Cantelli (Lowell) and delivered a strike past the keep for his ninth goal of the season. Less than 30 seconds later, he drilled a shot from 16 yards out that was saved by the goalkeeper, but the rebound landed on Bomfim's right foot and he drilled the ball into the upper right corner.

Will Paganini (Derry, NH) picked up his fifth straight shutout in net and his national leading eighth of the season making four saves and lowering his goals against average on the season to 0.58 which ranks sixth nationally.

Following Saturday's game against Bunker Hill, the Knights will close out the regular season on Tuesday October 22nd when they travel to Springfield Tech.

Knights up three spots to #6 in Week 7

NJCAA Poll

Haverhill, MA (October 14, 2024) – The Northern Essex Community College men's soccer team jumped up three spots this week to the number six position in the NJCAA Week 7 poll, following a 1-0 week where they picked up their fourth consecutive shutout with a 7-0 victory over MassBay Community College.

The number six national ranking is a new high-water mark for the program as they reached as high as number eight in the final poll of the 2023 season. For the Knights they have reeled off nine straight wins to sit at 9-2 and have held the opponent scoreless for the last 388 minutes dating back to September 24th in a 4-1 victory over Holyoke.

NECC has outscored the opponent 48-7 on the season including seven shutouts behind sophomore Will Paganini (Derry,

NH) who currently maintains a 0.64 goals against average on the season.

Offensively, the Knights are scoring 4.36 goals a game led by Jadiel Bomfim (Nashua, NH) and Sam Lucena (Tyngsborough) who both have eight goals a piece on the season. Christian Colem (Nashua, NH) is the teams point leader as he has 22 total points on seven goals and eight assists.

NECC enters a crucial week in the season with a pair of home games scheduled for Whittier Tech. First, on Tuesday the Knights will welcome Community College of Rhode Island to Haverhill for a 7:00pm matchup before entertaining perennial power Bunker Hill on Saturday at 4:30pm in a contest that will likely determine the post-season tournaments top seed.

National Rankings: Soccer holds at #6, Men's Basketball #5 in Preseason Poll

Haverhill, MA (October 21, 2024) – As fall sports begin to head into post-season play and winter sports get started, a pair of Northern Essex Community College programs find themselves among the nation's best. The Knights men's soccer program remains in the #6 position for a second consecutive week in the NJCAA Week 8 poll after entering the top ten in week six, while the NECC men's basketball team is ranked fifth in the preseason poll as they appear in the rankings for a 28th consecutive poll.

Men's Soccer

Winners of 11 straight games including six consecutive shutouts, the Knights have held the opposition scoreless over the last 569 minutes of game action heading into tomorrow's regular season finale on the road at Springfield Tech. NECC has secured the top seed in the Region 21 tournament, earning a first-round bye and will host a semi-final game on Friday November 1st at Whittier Tech.

Will Pagnini (Derry, NH) enters the final week of the season currently ranked fifth nationally with a 0.54 goals against average while leading all goalkeepers nationally with 11 victories.

Offensively, Jadiel Bomfim (Nashua, NH) leads the Knights offense with 12 goals and four assists for 28 points and is followed closely behind by Christian Colem (Nashua, NH) who enters the final week of the season with 22 points on seven goals and eight assists. Sam Lucena (Tyngsborough), Lucas Cantelli (Lowell) and Nikos Kakavitsas (Athens, GR) all have double digit points with 18, 14 and 11 respectively.

Jonathan Lopes (Nashua, NH) and Conor Fitzgerald (Danvers) have been anchoring the backline in front of Paganini that has held the opposition to just seven goals in 13 contests to date.

Men's Basketball

The back to back Region 21 Champions will feature a new look in the new season as they return just three players with previous experience in the Knights uniform, though a talented and deep roster should have the Knights in contention for a third straight trip to the national tournament.

Javien Kirmil (Lowell) who appeared in 33 games last season with 18 starts is back with Karl Wolfgang (Douala, CM) who saw action in 30 games with 13 starts will be joined by Ryan Pacy (Salem, NH) who returns from the 2022-23 team where he averages 8.8 points per game in 21 appearances while battling through injury.

Kirmil and Wolfgang combined for 14.4 points a game last season. The Knights have combined to go 65-4 over the last two years and have been unbeaten in league play during that time.

A trio of former Merrimack Valley stars in Joandy Rosario (Lawrence), Jeremy Valdez (Haverhill) and Alejandro Delgado (Haverhill) join the mix this season. Also joining the team and expected to make an immediate impact are Christian Sanders (East Boston) and Yunosuke Matsuda (Tokyo, JP).

The Knights are set to open up their season on Saturday November 2nd against Monroe-Bronx in Lincroft, NJ at the Brookdale Basketball Classic.


Need to have things



Corbett's Career Afternoon Catapults Football to Victory Over Stonehill



North Andover, Mass. – The Merrimack College football team took down Stonehill College on Saturday afternoon 48-28. Senior running back and Skyhawk transfer, Jermaine Corbett ran for 170 yards and two touchdowns in the victory against his former team.

The Essentials

How It Happened

On the opening offensive drive for the Warriors, Liam Davis knocked down a 26-yard field goal to put Merrimack up by three. After a stop on defense, the Warriors took back over on offense. On the fourth play of the drive, Ayden Pereira uncorked a 51-yard bomb to Jalen McDonald the first touchdown of the game. Later in the first, Merrimack quickly marched down the field. Corbett found the end zone for the first time of the afternoon to put the Warriors up three scores. In their first offensive possession of the second quarter, Merrimack had a methodical 14-play drive that ended with another Corbett touchdown. The Warriors found themselves up 24 halfway through the second stanza. Towards the end of the second quarter Davis would hit a 53-yard field goal which would break his previous high of 50 which was set just last week. Merrimack headed into the locker rooms up 27.

The Skyhawks found the end zone for the first time of the afternoon during

their first possession of the second quarter. Stonehill would score again the next time they got the ball to put the deficit down to 13. After a great kick return from Corbett it took just two plays for Brendon Wyatt to find the end zone. The Skyhawks answered with a touchdown of their own to get it back down to 13. In the fourth, Pereira would find Seth Sweitzer on a nine-yard pass and catch to put the Warriors up 20. Late in the fourth quarter, the Stonehill quarterback ran the ball in from four yards. With just over two minutes left in the game Malakai Anthony ran the ball 42-yards to the house, giving the Warriors a 20-point victory.

Notes & Numbers

Josh Addo led the team in tackles with seven on the afternoon, including one for a loss.

Nate Palanca Jr. and Grant Jackson both had interceptions for the Warriors. The pick for Jackson was his second of the season.

Wyatt finished the game with a career-high 101 rushing yards.

Up next

The Warriors stay at home for their penultimate home game of the season against Colgate University. Kick off is set for noon.

I want to congratulate Sarah Perez, the Executive Director at Federación Hispana de Comerciantes; she should be satisfied because it was her effort fighting for those merchants, attending city council meetings, and having discussions with them individually, that brought the struggle to this happy ending.

Personnel Director's dismissal

I requested any documents related to his firing, hoping to expand on what I wrote last week, but I have not heard back yet.

As you may imagine, there are rumors

galore, and while I give no credit if I cannot document something, some of the things I hear drive me crazy.

Somerville's Redevelopment Authority

There was an article in The Boston Globe on Monday, October 21, 2024 that I recommend everyone to read it.

The courts have decided that the City of Somerville must pay \$28 million to the prior owners of property that the Redevelopment Authority seized in 2019 by eminent domain.

The city paid \$8.8 for a four-acre parcel worth \$35.3 million. You will find that Somerville Redevelopment Authority paid for the property, but the city is now responsible for the owners' reimbursement.

I bring this to the community's attention because we have a very active LRA, and most Lawrence residents are unaware of what they are doing. I am so sorry that I have not attended the last couple of meetings, and although I watch them on Zoom, it's not the same because I miss a lot of what's being said.

We must be alert to everything the LRA does because they are dealing with very complex issues that we don't understand, and a mistake like Somerville's is not what Lawrence needs.




